SECTION B: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

The City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2011 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website at www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm or by contacting City Engineering Division, Room 115, City-County Building, 210 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., Madison, WI 53703.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102 "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103 "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

Section 102.1: Pre-Qualification of Bidders

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be pre-qualified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)1. of the Madison General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms. The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

Section 102.4: Proposals

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid must be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. 2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a nonresponsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

2.2 Contract Compliance

2.3 Certification of SBE by City of Madison

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit **Schedule C, SBE Certification Application** to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Department by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of Schedule C is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 1.2. Submittal of Schedule C by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4.2.2.3 **SBE Contact Report, SBE-3. and SBE-4.** (A separate Contact Report must be completed for each SBE which is not utilized.)

2.5 **Appeal Procedure**

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed nonresponsible for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the Director of Public Works and received within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

A bidder which is deemed nonresponsive may not appeal the City's decision to deny eligibility for award of contract.

2.6 **SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract**

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation. Failure to provide a satisfactory explanation in these variances may result in the City invoking the sanctions contained in Paragraph 5(g) of the Agreement contained within this project manual.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the City of Madison Affirmative Action Department. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Department a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Department will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

2.7 **SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines**

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

WEST LAKELAWN PLACE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT - 2012 CONTRACT NO. 6311

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.10 MINIMUM RATE OF WAGE SCALE

If required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

- Building and Heavy Construction
- Sewer, Water, and Tunnel Construction
- Local Street and Miscellaneous Paving Operations
- Residential and Agricultural Construction

All bidders are notified that all labor employed on City contracts must be paid in accordance with the minimum rate of wage scale included in the Contract Documents.

For the information of the employees working on the project, a copy of the wage scale included in the contract documents and the provisions of Section 66.0903(8) of the Wisconsin Statutes shall be kept posted by the employer and in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the site of the project.

The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of each employee who worked on such City project and all other projects the employee worked in the same period, and the Contractor must keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. Such records shall, in addition, set forth the full weekly wages earned by each such employee and the actual hourly wage paid to that employee. The Contractor shall submit payroll records to the Engineer every week for those periods when work is being done on the project. Said submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

The Contractor shall ensure that employees shall be paid unconditionally and shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the City of Madison "Minimum Rate of Wage Scale" and that each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to such employee. Questions regarding an employee's classification or rate of pay within that classification, shall be resolved by the practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Therefore, rate of pay, classification and work jurisdiction disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determinations by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

All decisions of the Engineer shall, when so requested, be rendered in writing. They shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

Any change proposed by a Contractor in SBE subcontractors, vendors or suppliers from those SBEs indicated on the SBE Compliance Report must be approved by the Engineer and the City's Manager of the Affirmative Action Division (hereafter, AAD). When requested, such decision shall be rendered in writing. Such decisions shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor or the affected SBE applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

In the event the Engineer and the AAD disagree over the proper decision to be made regarding an SBE, the Mayor shall appoint a third person to resolve the disagreement, within 30 days of appointment. The decision thus rendered may be reviewed by the Board of Public Works upon request of the Contractor or the affected SBE as set forth in Sections 105.1 and 105.2 of the City's standard specifications.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall use care around existing trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps and driveways that are indicated on the plans to remain. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees, other than those shown on the plan to be removed, shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2.

The Contractor shall coordinate their work to allow access to utility companies to resolve any conflicts that may arise.

The Contractor shall work closely with MG&E to protect the underground concrete electrical conduit system and to work around the gas main. Gas main is assumed to be directly above the existing location of the water main system. The Contractor and MG&E shall develop a plan acceptable to MG&E to install City utilities.

The Contractor shall maintain access for mail delivery, food service and garbage/recycling pickup for all properties in the project area. The prosecution of work has been phased to allow access from Langdon Street or Lakelawn Place (from N Henry Street) at all times.

During work at the north end of the cul-de-sac between 233 & 244 W Lakelawn Place safe access to building front entrances shall be maintained at all times. Use of safety fencing and/or other materials shall be used to insure safe access.

All staging and construction equipment must be stored within project limits.

Contractor shall coordinate utility lateral work with Businesses to provide access at all times, and perform work in business desired time frames as much as possible.

There is a grocery store at 228 Langdon Street that shall have access maintained at all times. Any work directly in front of the store entrance shall be coordinated with the store manager before work is completed.

A private developer will be constructing a building, 229 W Lakelawn Place, during the time of this project. Contractor shall coordinate construction with the private developer's builder Landgraf Construction, Mark Landgraf, 608-274-4700(office) or 608-577-2047(cell). It shall be expected that

Langdon St may be partially closed to traffic for 1 day between the hours of 8:30am and 4:00pm. Two(2)-way traffic on Langdon St shall be maintained at all times, flaggers may be necessary. Before any work on Langdon St is allowed the contractor shall provide, and have approved by the City Traffic Engineer, an acceptable traffic control plan.

Contact Mark Winter, Traffic Engineering Division, 266-6543, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on or before MAY 21, 2012. The total time of completion of the contract shall be SIXTY (60) CALENDAR DAYS.

Phase 1 – W Lakelawn Place (Langdon Street to Lakelawn Place) – shall be completed by JULY 7, 2012.

Work at the intersection of North Henry Street and Lakelawn Place shall begin only after vehicle access has been restored from Langdon Street to West Lakelawn Place.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received.

SECTION 203.2 DISPOSING OF MATERIALS

The Contractor shall comply with Section 203.2 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction with regard to salvaging castings.

BID ITEM 20336 - PIPE PLUGS

Structures and pipes called out for removal and/or abandonment shall have the existing pipes plugged at the structure or at the pipe ends, as noted in the plans, and shall be paid for under this bid item. This includes plugs necessary to abandon sanitary sewer laterals. All work under this item shall comply with Article 203 of the Standard Specifications.

BID ITEM 30207 – TYPE ‘H’ CONCRETE CURB & GUTTER (HAND FORMED)

Concrete curb and gutter shall be placed with joint filler between the curb and gutter and existing concrete wall per Section 303.2(d).

ARTICLE 501 STORM SEWER STRUCTURES

501.1 Description

STORM SEWER GENERAL

The storm sewer designer for this project is Corey Stelljes. He may be contacted by phone at (608) 266-9721 or by email at cstelljes@cityofmadison.com.

Reconnection of existing pipes at new structures, or new pipes at new structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

installation of sanitary lateral pipe at the proposed sewer main. If the Contractor starts excavation for the lateral at the property line, it shall be at the Contractor's risk. No Utility Line Openings (ULOs) will be granted for the inability to locate the sanitary lateral at the property line. Any extra sidewalk removal caused by looking for an existing sanitary lateral at the property line will not be compensated to the Contractor. Contractors are encouraged to have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal. Each sanitary lateral shall have a maximum of 4 sidewalk squares and 20' of curb and gutter removed and replaced. No additional compensation shall be awarded beyond this amount for the replacement of a sewer lateral.

Work under this bid item shall also include the installation of pressure sanitary lateral in the location where the proposed sanitary sewer main is pressure sewer main. Sanitary sewer laterals shall be constructed of pressure pipe (AWWA C900 DR18) where the corresponding main is pressure pipe. All necessary fittings for pressure pipe laterals shall be considered incidental to the cost of the lateral.

The ductile iron fittings which are utilized with the AWWA C900 pipe do not properly connect to ASTM D3034 SDR-35. The proposed pressure sanitary lateral shall be installed in conformance to the section 503.3 of City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction latest edition.

BID ITEM 50354 – RECONNECT SANITARY LATERAL

Ductile Iron Wye Fittings shall be used where the pressure sewer main and laterals are being installed. Pressure Sewer lateral shall be installed where pressure sewer main is called for on the plan set.

The first 5 feet of pipe shall be included with this bid item regardless of pipe type or fittings used. Beyond 5' shall be paid for separately Bid Item 50353 SANITARY SEWER LATERAL)

The first 5 feet of sewer lateral pipe/ fittings measured from the sewer main shall be considered the reconnect for all sewer lateral reconnections. Lateral connections connecting to sewer access structures shall be paid for separately as a sanitary tap. 5' of lateral pipe is not considered incidental to the sanitary tap connection.

BID ITEM 50390 - SEWER ELECTRONIC MARKERS

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction latest Edition Section 503.3(c), each sanitary lateral shall have a minimum of two (2) electronic markers with the City providing the Contractor with the required number of electronic markers. For sanitary laterals, which only include the installation of a wye, a marker ball shall be installed directly above the wye connection to the main.

SECTION 601 ELECTRICAL, GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The City of Madison Traffic Engineering Division will remove existing light poles and install new light poles as necessary.

The existing signal and lighting conduits, handholes, and manholes shall be protected during construction. If the contractor believes that damage to such conduits is unavoidable, the contractor shall not damage or remove such conduits until the City Traffic Engineering electrical inspector has reviewed and approved such actions. Any damage or removal of City electrical conduit, wire, or structures, without the specific approval by the City Traffic Engineering electrical inspector shall be promptly repaired or replaced by and at the expense of the contractor.

SECTION 703 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Perform all work in accordance with these provisions and the City of Madison Standard Specifications adopted March 1, 2011. Keep all valves accessible and functioning throughout the duration of the work or directed otherwise by the Water Utility representative.

SECTION 703.8 PIPE LAYING AND BEDDING

In addition to the City of Madison Standard Specifications adopted March 1, 2011, provide adequate support and protection whenever nearby utility features are exposed during water main installation activities. The utility supports shall be designed so that any loads imposed by the water main installation do not sag or overstress the nearby utility feature. Water main pipe or fitting materials may not be used to provide support to other utility features. In areas where the proximity of other utility features impedes the ability to safely obtain compaction requirements of approved backfill material then approved bedding material shall be used as backfill to at least the top of upper-most pipe, conduit, or structure. Providing adequate utility support and providing bedding material backfill, as needed, shall be considered incidental to installing water main pipe and fittings.

BID ITEM 70451 - FURNISH AND INSTALL CURB STOP

Due to the unpredictable nature of Bid Item 70451, the unit bid price is to be the set price regardless of the quantity encountered during construction. This item will not be eligible for renegotiation under Section "104.5 – Increased Items" of the 2011 Standard Construction Specifications.

BID ITEM 90030 - 48" DIA PRECAST CATCHBASIN WITH SNOUT

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include furnishing and installing a 48" DIA precast catchbasin, including the castings noted on the storm schedule. Height of the structures and depths of the sumps shall be as noted on the Storm Sewer Schedule.

Manufacture and installation of precast catchbasins shall conform to the requirements for precast structures contained in Article 507 of the Standard Specifications, and shown on S.D.D. 5.7.5 and 5.7.6. A field-poured bench at the base of the structure is not required. Contractor shall submit Shop drawings for approval by the City, as required by Section 507.3(b) of the Standard Specifications.

The Snout[□] Oil-Water-Debris Separator (Manufactured by Best Management Products, Inc. www.bmpinc.com) shall be installed inside the catch basin over the outgoing pipe. Model numbers for the type of Snout to be installed on each catch basin are noted on the Storm Sewer Schedule and shown on the Drawings. Installation of these devices shall be per the manufacturer's recommendations. Manufacturer's recommendations and details of these devices are included with these Special Provisions.

This item includes the model 18R snout device.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

48" Precast Catchbasin with Snout shall be measured as a complete unit installed in the field.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

48" Precast Catchbasin with Snout shall be measured as described above and shall be paid at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work set forth in the description above and all work described in Section 507.4(b) of the Standard Specifications.

BID ITEM 90031 - SIDEWALK TRENCH DRAIN

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include providing and installing a sidewalk trench drain, as shown in detail 5.7.36 of the City of Madison's Standard Detail Drawings and modified to fit a 4' wide sidewalk section.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Sidewalk trench drain shall be measured as a complete unit as installed in the field.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Sidewalk trench drain shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 90034 – FURNISH AND INSTALL CIPP TO REHABILITATE 12” VP STORM

Work under this item shall include lining existing 12” VP storm sewers on W Lakelawn Ave. with Cured-in-Place Pipe (CIPP). Work shall be in accordance with Article 509 of the Standard Specifications. References to sanitary sewer in Article 509 shall be understood to refer to storm sewer in this case, where applicable. Files (mpg) of the CCTV inspection of the existing storm sewer are available for review by the Contractor at <ftp://ftp.cityofmadison.com/>, in the folder called Lakelawn Storm. This pipe will be cleaned by City crews prior to lining. The apron end at the downstream end of the pipe to be lined is located near the lake shore of Lake Mendota. There is not access for any machinery to this point. Any equipment needed at this downstream end must be carried there by hand which will require descending stairs. The contractor is highly encouraged to visit the site prior to bidding.

Any additional spot repairs of damaged sections of pipe (either shown on the TV report above, or incurred prior to or during construction) required to successfully line the pipe shall be considered incidental to this bid item. Cleaning of the pipe as needed to complete the lining shall be considered incidental to this bid item. Contractor is encouraged to complete pipe lining at the start of the project to avoid damage to the existing VPs during construction activities.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Furnish and Install CIPP to rehabilitate 12” VP storm shall be measured as complete when each completed unit is installed in the field.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Furnish and Install CIPP to rehabilitate 12” VP storm shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 90035 – WATER MAIN SUPPORT OR TEMPORARY WATER BYPASS

This item is being bid as an option for replacing the existing sanitary sewer main on W Lakelawn Pl while keeping water service to the properties served from the water main at the same location. The water main

BID ITEM 90080 – INSTALL CONCRETE ENCASED CONDUIT

DESCRIPTION

The work to be done under this item consists of providing concrete covering around conduit that will not have at least 18" of cover. This will likely be needed when the conduit crosses some MG&E packages or other utilities. All work shall be done in accordance with pertinent provisions of the Standard Specifications, plans, and as hereinafter provided.

MATERIALS

All materials furnished and installed by the contractor shall meet the specifications of the City Standard Specifications.

CONSTRUCTION

1. Provide double layer visqueen or other City approved plastic covering below the concrete encasement to isolate this encasement from the utility package being crossed.
2. Provide a minimum of four inches of concrete cover on the top and both sides of the conduit for the length of the conduit that has less than 18" of cover.
3. The areas where this is required will be identified by the City during construction activities.
4. Provide forms on both sides and smooth trowel the top of the encasement.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Install Concrete Encased Conduit, complete and accepted, shall be measured by length in linear feet, in a horizontal plane along the centerline of the conduit. One concrete encasement may be for a single or double conduit.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Install Concrete Encased Conduit will be paid for at the contract unit price per linear foot, which price shall be payment in full for furnishing and installing materials including concrete masonry and all miscellaneous hardware necessary to integrate the components into a single unit; for disposal of surplus materials; and for all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

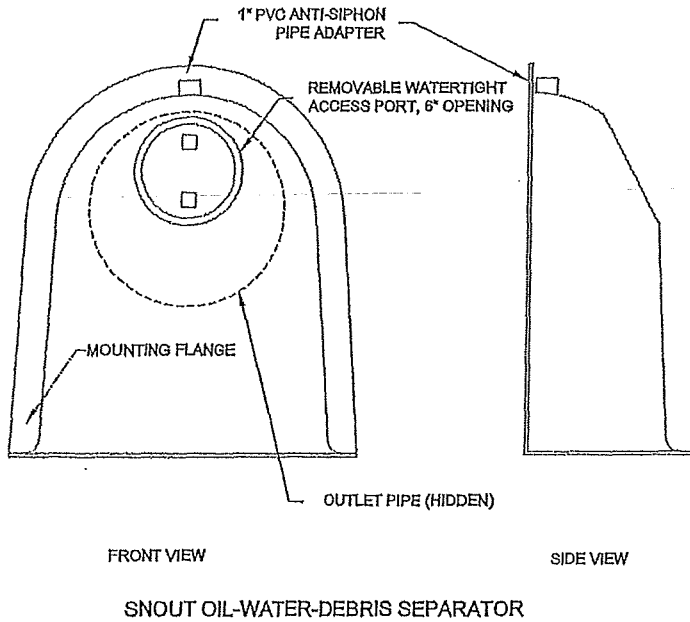

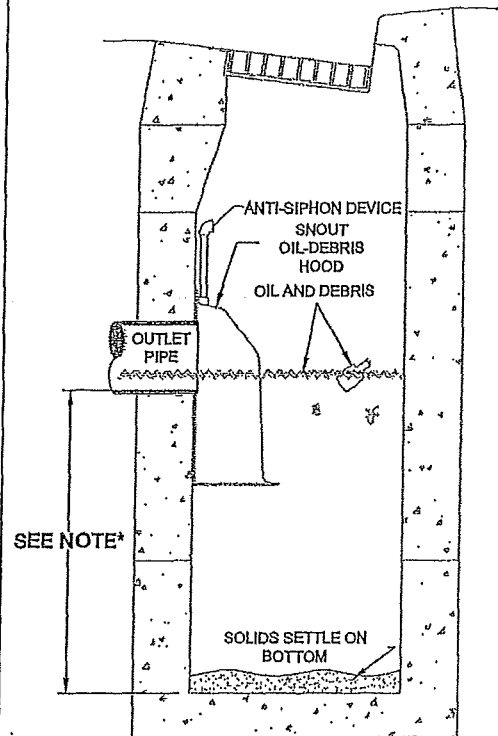

CONFIGURATION DETAIL

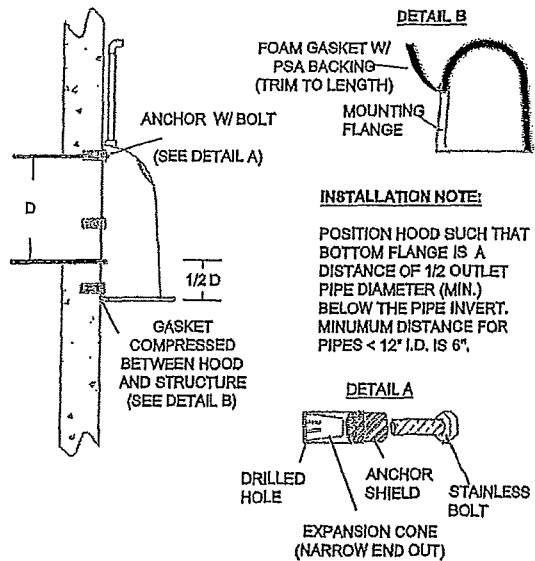


TYPICAL INSTALLATION

SECTION G: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 29 day of February in the year Two Thousand and Twelve between RAYMOND P. CATTELL, INC., hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted FEBRUARY 28, 2012, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of THREE HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY-TWO DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$327,462.00) being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
4. **Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors**

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided.

“Public Works” shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

“Building or work” includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

“Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing” means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

“Employees working on the project” means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

“Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics” include preapprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer’s objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor’s subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor’s subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor’s weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourneypersons. Apprentices and subjourneypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

- a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.
- b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

5. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement

Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national origin and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Director of Affirmative Action.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract.

SECTION H: PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE BOND

This document **MUST BE POSTED** by the **CONTRACTING AGENCY** in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place on the site of the project. A local governmental unit may post this document at the place normally used to post public notices if there is no common site on the project. This document **MUST** remain posted during the entire time any worker is employed on the project and **MUST** be physically incorporated into the specifications and all contracts and subcontracts. If you have any questions, please write to the Equal Rights Division, Labor Standards Bureau, P.O. Box 8928, Madison, Wisconsin 53708 or call (608) 266-6861.

The following statutory provisions apply to local governmental unit projects of public works and are set forth below pursuant to the requirements of s. 66.0903(8), Stats. .

s. 66.0903 (1) (f) & s. 103.49 (1) (c) "PREVAILING HOURS OF LABOR" for any trade or occupation in any area means 10 hours per day and 40 hours per week and may not include any hours worked on a Saturday or Sunday or on any of the following holidays:

1. January 1.
2. The last Monday in May.
3. July 4.
4. The first Monday in September.
5. The 4th Thursday in November.
6. December 25.
7. The day before if January 1, July 4 or December 25 falls on a Saturday.
8. The day following if January 1, July 4 or December 25 falls on a Sunday.

s. 66.0903 (10) RECORDS; INSPECTION; ENFORCEMENT.

(a) Each contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent performing work on a project of public works that is subject to this section shall keep full and accurate records clearly indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person performing the work described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

- (a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.
2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages.
5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.
