## 2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

### 2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to $60 \%$ for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count $60 \%$ of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an ad hoc basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

### 2.3 Certification of SBE by City of Madison

The Affirmative Action Division maintains a directory of SBEs which are currently certified as such by the City of Madison. Contact the Contract Compliance Officer as indicated in Section 2.2 to receive a copy of the SBE Directory or you may access the SBE Directory online at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm.

All contractors, subcontraciors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access the Targeted. Business Certification Application online at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

### 2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

### 2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:
2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.
2.4.1.2 Using the City of Madison's directory of certified SBEs to identify SBEs from which to solicit bids.
2.4.1.3 Assuring that SBEs are solicited whenever they are potential sources.
2.4.1.4 Referring prospective SBEs to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division for certification.
2.4.1.5 Dividing total project requirements into smaller tasks and/or quantities, where economically feasible, to permit maximum feasible SBE participation.
2.4.1.6 Establishing delivery schedules, where requirements permit, which will encourage participation by SBEs.
2.4.1.7 Providing SBEs with specific information regarding the work to be performed.
2.4.1.8 Contacting SBEs in advance of the deadline to allow such businesses sufficient time to prepare a bid.
2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. $5 \%$ above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.
2.4.1.10 Contacting SBEs which submit a bid, to inquire about the details of the bid and confirm that the scope of the work was interpreted as intended.

### 2.4.2 Reporting SBE Utilization and Good Faith Efforts

The Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report is to be submitted by the bidder with the bid: This report is due by the specified bid closing time and date. Bids submitted without a completed SBE Compliance Report as outlined below

2.4.2.1 If the Bidder meets or exceeds the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
2.4.2.1.1 Cover Page, Page C-6; and
2.4.2.1.2 Summary Sheet, C-7.
2.4.2.2 If the bidder does not meet the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
2.4.2.2.1 Cover Page, Page C-6;
2.4.2.2.2 Summary Sheet, C-7; and
2.4.2.2.3 SBE Contact Report, C-8 and C-9. (A separate Contact Report must be completed for each applicable SBE which is not utilized.)

### 2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed non-responsible for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the City Engineer and received within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

### 2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

### 2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:
A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
B. A business that has averaged no more than $\$ 4.0$ million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of $\$ 1.32$ million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

## SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

## LOWER BADGER MILL CREEK SANITARY SEWER INTERCEPTOR PHASE 2 CONTRACT NO. 7291

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

## SECTION 102.10: PREVAILING WAGE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below.
$\square \quad$ Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked.
If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:


Building or Heavy Construction
Sewer, Water, or Tunnel Construction
Local Street or Miscellaneous Paving Construction
Residential or Agricultural Construction
When multiple boxes are checked, worker's wages may vary according to the type and area of work performed. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine and apply the appropriate wage rate for the specific work assigned.

## SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than $\$ 54,000$ for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than $\$ 264,500$ for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

## ARTICLE 103 AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT

The Contractor shall execute signing of this contract completely prior to SEPTEMBER 2, 2014. No extension to the above date will be permitted.

## ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

This project involves the installation of 832 feet of 27 inch, $1444^{\prime}$ of 24 inch, 5507 ' feet of $21^{\prime \prime}$ inch diameter sewer. The project scope includes a bore and jack pipe crossing of Mineral Point Road as well as ditch grading work and road work.

Roadwork will consist of

- Pioneer Road: $120^{\prime}$ north of Fallen Oak to 200 ' north of Tumbledown Trail

New Road to consist of $12^{\prime \prime}$ crushed aggregate base course consisting of 6 " depth of gradation 1 and $6^{\prime \prime}$ depth of gradations 2 and gradation 3 (top few inches for leveling
purposes only) with a total depth $4^{\prime \prime}$ of 12.5 mm , Type E-1 asphaltic pavement. $2.25^{\prime \prime}$ binder and $1.75^{\prime \prime}$ of surface course.

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

## ARTICLE 104.4 INCREASE OR DECREASE QUANTITIES

The Contractor shall note that some bid item quantities may increase or decrease based on what is encountered in the field. If the actual field conditions vary from the plan quantity, no additional compensation shall be given for increasing or decreasing quantities. Any overruns shall be paid for under the appropriate bid item(s) without any penalty or change to the bid price for the associated bid item. The Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any deletions to the contract. No change to the unit bid price will be allowed for changes to the quantities.

## ARTICLE 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The City is in the process of reconstruction on South Point Road from Valley View Road to Mineral Point Road which also includes a road closure. The City will not allow closure of South Point Road and Pioneer Road at the same time. No work shall be done on Pioneer Road until there is a hard road surface (asphalt surface or binder) on South Point Road. Temp Asphalt (Cold Asphalt Patch) will not be considered an acceptable hard asphalt surface over the winter months. This may result in the sewer project being completed in 2015. The Contractor will be compensated for one Mobilization (BID ITEM 10914 MOBILIZATION) regardless if the work is completed in 2014 or 2015. If the Contractor elects to stop work and remobilize in the spring, the contractor will not be paid for an additional mobilization.

Final pavement surface course on Pioneer shall not be installed after October $15^{\text {th }}$ 2014. It is anticipated that final paving on Pioneer Road will be completed in the Spring, 2015.

This project involves the installation of sanitary sewer within sanitary sewer easements. A large amount of the land is being utilized for farming. The temporary easement for the Keleny property ( 7486 Valley View Road) will expire at the end of 2014. Any work after 2014 on the Keleny property shall be restricted to the limits of the permanent easement. It is expected that this contract will be completed by the end of 2014 but if the contract does extend into 2015, work on the Keleny property shall only be completed within the permanent easement as shown on the plan set. The Keleny's have requested that access to their property be limited to driveway only and have requested that orange safety construction fence be installed after the trees in the permanent easement have been removed.

Contractor shall exercise caution when working in the area of the overhead power lines on Pioneer Road, Valley View Road and Mineral Point Road.

If the contractor decides to do construction work during the winter months, the contractor shall use cold weather protection measures incidental to the contract work completed.

Maintaining access is a high priority for the project. Tumbledown Trail is a cul-de-sac street where there are homes under construction and where deliveries are expected while the Pioneer Road work is underway. 3577 and 3581 Pioneer Road share a driveway, 3612 \& 3624 Pioneer are businesses that have truck traffic throughout the day. Contractor shall provide and remove a temporary driveways to maintain access to properties if the contractor and property owners cannot agree upon on a time period of temporary closure (BID ITEM 90071 INSTALL AND REMOVE TEMPORARY DRIVEWAY). The Contractor may also install a gravel trench patch (BID ITEM 50227 UTILITY TRENCH PATCH TYPE IV) if access to a property cannot be maintained through the old road. Access shall be provided to Keleny's property 7486 Pioneer Road at all times during construction.

There are 2 different seed mixes being called for with this project. The temporary seed mix is to be utilized in the lands being used for cropland, and the sun terrace seed mix is to be used in the remaining
disturbed area not being used as cropland (road terraces and through Veridian's Birchwood Point plat(STA $84+34$ to north project limits).

## ARTICLE 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable, complete Traffic Control Plan including all necessary phases, to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, at 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd, Suite 100, Madison, WI 53703, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this article of the Special Provisions. The contractor shall not start work on this project until the City Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

Moving traffic control devices as construction progresses shall be considered incidental. The Contractor shall also install and maintain modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The General Contractor shall be responsible for making daily inspections of the traffic control to ensure that all required signs are in place and all warning lights are functional.

The City is in the process of reconstructing South Point Road from Valley View Road to Mineral Point Road which also includes a road closure. The City will not allow closure of South Point Road and Pioneer Road at the same time. No work shall be done on Pioneer Road until there is a hard road surface (asphalt surface or binder) on South Point Road. If there is not a hard road surface on South Point Road by Oct 19th, work on Pioneer Road and the sewer north to Mineral Point shall be delayed until 2015 until the asphalt plants reopen.

Pioneer Road may be closed to through traffic (open to local traffic), at Valley View Road and Mineral Point Road in order to install the new sewer between STA $40+00$ to STA $50+40$ on the plan set. Local and emergency vehicle access shall be maintained at all times. The duration of the closure shall at a maximum of 28 CALENDAR days.

All informational message board signs shall be installed one week ahead of road closure. One electronic message board should be placed north of the proposed sewer construction work, 100' south of Mineral Point Road, the message shall read "PIONEER ROAD CLOSED, AT MINERAL POINT, DATE TO DATE". Another electronic message board should be placed south of the proposed sewer construction work 100' north of Valley View Road, the message shall read "PIONEER ROAD CLOSED, AT VALLEY VIEW, DATE TO DATE". The location and the message on the electronic message boards may be changed during the project. The contractor shall consider these changes incidental to providing the message boards.

During the closure of Pioneer Road barricades shall be placed north of the Valley View Road - Pioneer Road intersection for northbound traffic and south of the Mineral Point Road - Pioneer Road intersection for southbound traffic. A sign on the barricades shall read: "ROAD CLOSED TO THRU TRAFFIC". Additionally "ROAD CLOSED AHEAD" signs with a "PIONEER ROAD" plaque shall be placed 200 ' in advance of Pioneer Road in both directions on Valley View Road and Mineral Point Road.

The contractor shall maintain all travel lanes on Mineral Point Road at all times, including the duration of work for the pipe crossing of Mineral Point Road. (BID ITEM 90077 BORE AND JACK 21" DIAMETER SANITARY SEWER AND CASING).

Prior to construction, the Contractor shall provide the Engineer, City and local police department with the name and telephone number of a local person responsible for emergency maintenance of traffic control.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681, one (1) working day prior to placement of the plates.

It is anticipated that a temporary driveway will be needed to provide access to the shared driveway on Valley View Road (STA 44+65, 3581 and 3577 Pioneer Road) PAYABLE UNDER BID ITEM 90071 INSTALL AND REMOVE TEMPORARY DRIVEWAY WITH CULVERT.

The Contractor shall provide ADA/Handicap Accessible pedestrian access, where such accommodations are originally available, at all intersections within the construction area at all times.

Access to all driveways within the project limits shall be provided at all times. Interruption of access to a property, which is necessary for the project, shall be granted only after discussion(s) with the affected property owner(s)/occupants and only for times and durations that will minimize impact on the property owner(s)/ occupants. Contractor shall provide 3 days advance notice when a driveway be closed for the project.

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

Contact Luke Peters, Traffic Engineering Division, 267-1969, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

## ARTICLE 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

Upon completion of all concrete work, final surface course of pavement, landscaping, topsoil and seed, City Construction Engineer shall certify that it is complete and shall contact the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, 266-4767. The Contractor shall leave all barricades and traffic control in place until such time that the permanent pavement marking and signing has been installed by the City. The City shall notify the Contractor when the final pavement marking and signing is complete and the Contractor shall remove all temporary construction signs and barricades within 24 hours of the notification.

## ARTICLE 108.2 PERMITS AND LICENSING

The City of Madison shall submit a DNR Notice of Intent (NOI) to obtain coverage under the Construction Site General Permit No. WI-S067831-2 for construction site erosion control.

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permit by properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Construction Engineer or his designees. This work will be paid for under the appropriate contract bid items or, if appropriate items are not included in the contract, they shall be paid for as Extra Work. A copy of the permit is available at the City of Madison, Engineering Division office.

The NOI permit covers trench dewatering to a maximum of 70 gallons/minute from the project provided appropriate control measures are in place. The City's obtaining this permit is not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction.

The proposed sewer work on Pioneer Road will require a Right of Way (R.O.W.) permit from the Town of Middleton. The City of Madison will obtain this permit. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to conform to all of the criteria of the Town Middleton R.O.W. permit.

The proposed sewer work across Mineral Point Road will require a Right of Way (R.O.W.) permit from the Dane County. The City of Madison will obtain this permit. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to conform to all of the criteria of the Dane County permit.

## ARTICLE 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor may begin work on before September 22, 2014 or earlier if the contract is full executed by the City prior to that date. The project as a whole shall be completed by May 22, 2015. The total number of calendar days for completion of the project work is 110 CALENDAR DAYS. At the Contractor's choice, the contractor will be allowed to shut down on one instance upon providing notice to the construction engineer. Upon restarting work, the Contractor shall continue work continuously until project completion.

No work shall be done on Pioneer Road until South Point Road is open to general traffic upon completion of the South Point Road Reconstruction project which is expected to be around October 19 ${ }^{\text {th }}, 2014$.

Due to the flat slopes of the proposed sewer throughout the project, the Contractor shall be required to start at the low end of the sewer and work up grade. The Contractor shall not be allowed to construct the sewer north from Pioneer Road to Mineral Point Road until the sewer in Pioneer Road is installed.

Pioneer Road may be closed to traffic for a maximum duration of 28 calendar days.
If the Contractor begins work in Pioneer Rd in 2014, the contractor shall be required to complete all work on Pioneer except the final bituminous surface layer before suspending operations for the winter. Final pavement surface course on Pioneer shall not be installed until after October 15 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, 2014. It is anticipated that final paving on Pioneer Road will be completed in the Spring, 2015. A gravel road or temporary cold patch asphalt surface shall not be allowed for the duration of the winter on Pioneer Road. Once the work is started on Pioneer Rd, the Contractor shall continue work on Pioneer Rd through completion except for the single suspension of the work which is allowed for the Winter of 2014-2015.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer. The Contractor shall limit workdays to 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

## ARTICLE 109.9 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

## PIONEER ROADWORK

If the Contractor begins work on Pioneer Rd in 2014, the fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the Pioneer Rd right of way, except for the final bituminous pavement surface layer, prior to Nov, 26,2014 shall be $\$ 670$ per calendar day for every day that the work shall remain incomplete or until such time as the work within the Pioneer Rd right of way resumes in the spring of 2015.

The fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the Pioneer Road right of way within 28 Calendar Days shall be $\$ 670$ per calendar day for every day that the work shall remain incomplete.

## PROJECT IN ENTIRITY

The fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for failure to complete all work contained within this project within 110 calendar days shall be $\$ 670$ per calendar day for every day that the work shall remain incomplete.

The fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for failure to complete all work contained within this project prior to May 22,2015 shall be $\$ 670$ per calendar day for every day that the work shall remain incomplete.

## LIQUIDATED DAMAGES GENERAL

In no event shall the cumulative fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for this project exceed $\$ 670$ per calendar day.

If one or more project milestone is missed, the fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages shall remain $\$ 670$ per day.

## BID ITEM 20101 - FINISH GRADING

## DESCRIPTION

FINISH GRADING shall include grading the sides slopes of the roadways and ditches to match the existing grading and sloping or as directed by the Construction Engineer. All work shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

FINISH GRADING shall be measured by Lump Sum.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

FINISH GRADING shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above including all work, materials, labor, and incidentals.

## BID ITEM 20217 - CLEAR STONE 3"

## DESCRIPTION

Clear Stone shall meet the requirements for Gradation Number One (No. 1) of the Standard Specifications, commonly known as three-inch clear stone. The clear stone shall be utilized in BID ITEM 21011- CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE and as part of the construction of BID ITEM 21014 - CLEAR STONE BERM.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Clear Stone shall be measured by the ton in place.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

Clear Stone shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above including all work, materials, labor, and incidentals.

## BID ITEM 20218 - CRUSHED STONE (SAS ACCESS ROADS)

Bid Item CRUSHED STONE (SAS Access Roads) shall conform to the Standard Specifications - Article 202. Bid Item Crushed Stone (SAS Access Roads) shall be $10^{\prime \prime}$ in depth and shall be Gradation No. 2 Crushed Stone and shall be subject to the approval of the City Engineer

This bid item shall be used for the crushed stone used for constructing a 12 wide SAS Access Road Temporary in accordance of S.D.D. 5.1.4 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 ed. and also is included on details page of the plan set. There will be no topsoil above the SAS access road in the farm fields.

SAS Access Road shall be installed from STA18+32 to STA 40+00 and STA 68+10 to 84+35.

## BID ITEM 20314 - REMOVE PIPE STORM

## DESCRIPTION

Remove pipe storm shall include all storm pipes removed below the roadway that are called out for replacement with the project including but not limited to the $5^{\prime} \times 10^{\prime}$ box culvert located at STA 49+60. All pipe remove shall be completed in accordance with Article 203 of the City of Madison Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 Edition. Temporary driveway culverts removed shall be paid for separately (SEE BID ITEM 90071 INSTALL AND REMOVE TEMPORARY DRIVEWAY WITH

CULVERT). It is noteworthy that the plans call for saving the driveway culverts. If culverts that are called for being saved are damaged or removed by the contractor, they shall be replaced at the expense of the contractor. Removal of the Apron Endwalls per lineal foot shall be paid for under this bid item.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

REMOVE PIPE STORM shall be measured by the LINEAL FOOT

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

REMOVE PIPE STORM shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above including all work, materials, labor, and incidentals.

## BID ITEMS 20402 \& 20404 - CLEARING AND GRUBBING

The tree diameters shown on the plan set reflect the tree diameters measured when the project was originally designed in 2006. The City intends to provide staking of the easement limits and prospective bidders are encouraged to view the project site prior to submitting a bid. Brush removal shall be considered incidental to this bid item. Areas needing to be cleared are STA $12+50$ to $18+25$, STA $20+00$ to STA $39+75$, STA $51+25$ to $53+75$, STA $63+25$ to $65+25$, and STA $84+00$ to $84+75$.

Tree removals on the Keleny property, 7486 Valley View Road, shall include all of the trees located within the $20^{\prime}$ wide permanent easement. The City requests that the Contractor limits the tree removal on in the $20^{\prime}$ wide Temporary Easement area to only what needs to be removed to build the proposed sewer. However, if trees already appear to be dead, they can be removed with the project. The Temporary Easement is not to be cleared to the easement limits.

If there are trees from neighboring properties that will be in conflict with the proposed easement sewer work, the contractor shall only prune limbs and not remove the trees. Pruning will be considered incidental to the Clearing and Grubbing.

## BID ITEM 20701 - SUN TERRACE SEEDING

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction for seed mix, installation seed rate and method including mulching, fertilizing soil stabilization and watering. This seed mix shall be utilized on Valley View Road(STA 10+00 to STA 18+32 Pioneer Road (STA $40+00$ to STA $68+10$ ) and the north end of the project: STA $84+35$ to STA $87+89$ ).

## BID ITEM 20703 - TEMPORARY SEEDING

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction for seed mix, installation seed rate and method including mulching, fertilizing soil stabilization, and watering. This seed mix shall be utilized on the lands being utilized for farming: (STA $18+32$ to STA $40+00$ and STA $68+10$ to $84+25$ ). Temporary seeding shall not be placed over the gravel SAS access road.

## BID ITEM 21014 - CLEAR STONE BERM FOR EROSION CONTROL

Work under this item shall include installation of an erosion control berm as directed in the field for erosion control. This item shall include the following:

1. Typical berm height of three (3) feet
2. Depth of berm from front to back will vary with height but will typically include $1: 1$ siopes and a two (2) foot flat top. So for standard height the depth will be eight (8) feet;
3. Width as determined in the field;
4. Consist of three (3) inches clear stone paid under BID ITEM 20217;

Payment shall be on as each berm is constructed, and includes all necessary maintenance (as directed by the Construction Engineer) and removal of the berm. Payment for the required stone shall be per ton and paid under BID ITEM 20217.

## BID ITEM 21064 - EROSION MATTING CLASS I TYPE B

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. This item shall be used on the graded flow channels and the steep sideslopes as directed by the Construction Engineer. Where erosion matting is used, mulch shall not be used as part of the seeding.

## BID ITEM 21011 - CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. The Construction Engineer shall locate construction Entrances and the Contractor based on site needs.

## ARTICLE 501 - SEWERS AND SEWER STRUCTURES

## SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

The Sanitary Sewer Designer for this project is Mark Moder, Phone: 261-9250, mmoder@cityofmadison.com.

Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing new PVC ASTM F679, PS115 at the sizes and locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications. The project also includes a $75^{\prime}$ long bore and jack of $21^{\prime \prime}$ diameter sewer main with casing across Mineral Point Road.

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include the Neenah R-1550-0054 with the new City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 ed.). Castings and frames not located within the pavement limits shall be drilled and tapped by the Neenah Foundry with 4 stainless steel hex bolts on SAS locations called for on the plan set (See Sheet U-19 Structure Table).

All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during the installation of a structure shall be replaced by the Contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish.

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation. Noteworthy, are the deep excavations in Pioneer Road(STA $40+00$ to $44+00$ ) and the Jovanovic property (STA $21+90$ to $24+00$ \& STA $37+00$ $40+00$ ).

## BID ITEM 50212 - SELECT FILL FOR SANITARY SEWER

All fill material used in the sanitary sewer trench shall comply with the typical trench compaction requirements (SDD 5.2.1 and 5.2.2). On-site Trench excavation material may be used as backfill material provided that it is in conformance with the compaction requirements and free of organics. At a minimum, the top 3 ' of the sewer trench shall be imported select fill materials maintaining the $95 \%$ minimum density (Section 3 of SDD 5.2.2) Select Fill will be paid for by the trench foot regardless if the acceptable material is found on-site or if the material is hauled in from off-site.

## BID ITEM 50702- 5' DIAMETER SAS <br> BID ITEM 50703- 6' DIAMETER SAS

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include the Neenah R-1550-0054 with the new City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 ed.). Castings and frames not located within the pavement limits shall be drilled and tapped by the Neenah Foundry with 4 stainless steel hex bolts(See SAS Structure Table on plan sheet U-19).

## BID ITEM 50801 - UTILITY LINE OPENING (ULO)

The work under this item shall be completed in accordance with Article 508 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. It is the discretion of the contractor to locate utilities by either a trench excavation or by a pothole technique. However, the contractor shall not be compensated more than once for multiple utilities located within a maximum distance of ten (10) feet long.

## BID ITEM 90070 - REMOVE AND RESTORE GRAVEL DRIVEWAY

## DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary to remove and replace each of the driveways encountered while installing the proposed sanitary sewer main. Driveway access shall be maintained as much as possible throughout construction and at the end of each work day. The maximum length of time that driveway access may be closed is 12 hours. After construction, driveways shall be restored to their original condition with crushed stone pavement. Crushed stone shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

REMOVE AND RESTORE DRIVEWAY shall be measured as each completed unit.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

REMOVE AND RESTORE DRIVEWAY shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials labor and incidentals required to complete the work set forth in the description.

## BID ITEM 90071 -INSTALL AND REMOVE TEMPORARY DRIVEWAY WITH CULVERT

## DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary to construct temporary driveways to maintain access to properties while installing the proposed sanitary sewer main. Driveway access must be maintained throughout construction to the Keleny property, 7498 Valley View Road. After construction, the temporary driveways shall be removed and the area will need to be restored to original condition with topsoil, seed and mulch. Crushed stone shall be considered incidental to this bid item. Also included will be any culverts and any maintenance necessary to keep the temporary driveway in drivable condition. Culverts for temporary shall match the diameter of the culvert of the driveway temporarily being relocated and provide adequate drainage during the construction process.

Due to the Deep excavation on Pioneer Road, a temporary driveway is anticipated to be needed STA $44+65$ to the shared driveway to 3581 and 3577 Pioneer Road.

This item shall also be utilized if coordination of an agreeable driveway closure cannot be done.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

INSTALL AND REMOVE TEMPORARY DRIVEWAY WITH CULVERT shall be measured as each completed unit.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

INSTALL AND REMOVE TEMPORARY DRIVEWAY WITH CULVERT shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials labor and incidentals required to complete the work set forth in the description.

## BID ITEM 90072-REMOVE AND REPLACE DRIVEWAY POST AND GATE

## DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary to remove and replace the Driveway Post and Gate as called for on the plan (STA 50+75 LT 8' and STA 50+97 LT 8') if it needs to be removed to install the proposed sewer.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

REMOVE AND REPLACE DRIVEWAY POST AND GATE shall be measured by the EACH post removed.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

REMOVE AND REPLACE DRIVEWAY POST AND GATE shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials labor and incidentals required to complete the work set forth in the description

## BID ITEM 90073- REMOVE \& REPLACE FENCE

## DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary to remove and replace fencing (in kind) as called for on the plan set or encountered while installing the proposed sanitary sewer main. This is not intended for to be used for tin covered wood fence between Jovanovic and Oison Toon properties (Parcel \#0708-294-9060-6 and 3570 Pioneer Road) which is intended to be kept in place.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

REMOVE FENCE shall be measured by the Linear foot of fence removed.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

REMOVE FENCE shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials labor and incidentals required to complete the work set forth in the description

## BID ITEM 90074-SALVAGE TOPSOIL

## DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include stripping from over the sewer trench, stockpiling to one side of the exaction trench, segregation of vegetation from topsoil from over the trench. Placing the topsoil to the original depth encountered shall be paid for separately (BID ITEM 20711). All areas across permanent and temporary easements in agriculture fields are deep tilled by farmers. It shall be up to the Construction Engineer as to what qualifies as topsoil that is acceptable for stockpiling and what is
unacceptable. Unacceptable topsoil material will require being moved offsite by the contractor. Erosion measures shall be installed to prevent the migration of the stockpiled material. Erosion Control Measures shall be paid for separately under their respected bid items. Excess topsoil shall be hauled offsite and disposed of by the contractor.

Topsoil depths over cropland shall match the existing topsoil depths except for where the 12' wide SAS Access Road (BID ITEM 20218) is located. No topsoil will be placed over the $12^{\prime}$ wide SAS Access Path (gravel surface only).

Topsoil Salvaged from the Keleny property that is not used for the topsoil trench restoration in front of the Keleny property (STA $12+16$ to STA $18+40$ ) shall be stockpiled as called for on the plans set STA $17+60$ or on the Keleny property (Keleny to provide a Right of Entry if needed).

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

SALVAGED TOPSOIL shall be measured by the Square Yard.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

SALVAGED TOPSOIL shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials labor and incidentals required to complete the work set forth in the description.

## BID ITEM 90075 - TOPSOIL PLACEMENT- FARMLAND

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction for placement of topsoil (salvaged or imported) to match the topsoil depths encountered: $30^{\prime \prime}$ topsoil depth minimum in the tilled farmland ( 36 " maximum). No topsoil shall be placed over the SAS Access Road. Seeding, mulching and watering in farm field shall be paid for separately under the seed mix item: BID ITEM 20703 - TEMPORARY SEEDING. The proposed deep topsoil depths adjacent to the SAS Access Road are intended to be the salvaged topsoil from the original trench excavation paid for separately under BID ITEM 90074 SALVAGE TOPSOIL. The locations of the TOPSOIL PLACEMENT- FARMLAND are STA $18+32$ to STA $40+00$, and STA $53+77$ to STA $84+25$.

With STA 53+77 to 68+10 (CHANG PROPERTY) adjacent to Pioneer Road, the 20' permanent easement shall have 6 " topsoil and the Temporary Easement shall match the existing topsoil depths (estimated 30 " to $36^{\prime \prime}$ depth). All of the seeding adjacent to Pioneer Road shall have sun terrace seeding- BID ITEM 20701 - SUN TERRACE SEEDING.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

TOPSOIL PLACEMENT FARMLAND shall be measured by the Trench Foot

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

TOPSOIL PLACEMENT FARMLAND shall be measured as above and paid at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, and incidentals to complete the work as outlined in the description.

## BID ITEM 90076 - TOPSOIL(6") PLACEMENT- GENERAL

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction for providing and placement of topsoil $6^{\prime \prime}$ depth (salvaged or imported) in the roadside ditches, terraces, and easements adjacent to Right of Ways. Seeding, mulching, fertilizing, soil stabilizing and watering shall be paid for separately under the seed mix items: BID ITEM 20701 - SUN TERRACE SEEDING. If there is not enough salvageable topsoil from the project, topsoil shall be brought in from offsite. It is anticipated that there will be an adequate amount of salvaged topsoil on-site. Topsoil hauled
in from offsite shall be included with this bid item. All work shall be completed in conformance with Article 202 of the Standard Specifications.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

TOPSOIL( $6^{n}$ ) PLACEMENT- GENERAL shall be measured by the Trench Foot

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

TOPSOIL(6") PLACEMENT- GENERAL shall be measured as above and paid at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, and incidentals to complete the work as outlined in the description.

## BID ITEM 90077 - BORE \& JACK 21" DIAMETER SANITARY SEWER AND CASING

## DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include the installation and material cost to BORE AND JACK 21" Diameter Sewer sanitary sewer main with casings. The sanitary sewer shall be installed by boring and jacking where included with this bid item is a suitable sized "casing pipe". The casing pipe must be sized by the contractor in order for the inner sanitary sewer lateral to properly fit within the casing pipe. All costs for furnishing and installing the steel casing pipe, casing spacers, access and receiving pits, and all work necessary to push the casing pipe shall be included.

Included in this item is the excavation and backfilling of the receiving pits. Disposal of the excess material shall be by the Contractor off site at a location to be determined by the Contractor. Backfilled material shall meet City of Madison Standard Specifications for road construction- 2014 Edition. Necessary work and materiais to adequately secure the pits with full cover or security fencing shall be incidental to this bid item. The $21^{\prime \prime}$ diameter sanitary sewer being installed with the casing will be included as incidental to this Bore and Jack bid item.

The Contractor is informed that the casing pipe specified shall be at a minimum of $36^{\prime \prime}$ diameter or as large as deemed necessary by the contractor to successfully complete the work in accordance with the construction plans.

The sanitary sewer main inside the casing shall be ASTM F679, PS 115

## MATERIALS

Bore and Jack shall include all materials necessary to install the $21^{1 "}$ sanitary sewer pipe in accord with the requirements above. A casing pipe included with this item shall be in accord with the following:

- ASTM specification A139 Grade B or AWWA specification C200
- Outside diameter as specified by the Contractor
- Not coated or cathodically protected, no hydrostatic testing required
- $0.5625^{\prime \prime}$ minimum thickness (See chart on Sheet U-1 for casing thickness requirements)
- Specified minimum yield strength, SMYS, of at least 35,000 psi
- New and unused pipe
- Straight and round pipe
- Beveled ends for butt welding

The Contractor shall submit the following to the Engineer for approval prior to ordering of materials and the start of construction:

- Certificate of compliance for the steel casing pipe
- Materials for sand or pea gravel
- Materials for casing spacers and distances between spacers
- Materials and methods for bulkheading the casing ends


## CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Contractor will be allowed to use wood blocking and/or pipe spaces to suspend the pipe in casing pipe to obtain the proper design slope. Both will be considered acceptable installation methods. The design slope will be verified by a City surveyor and if the slope is back-pitched or not at an acceptable slope, the Construction Engineer will require the pipe be adjusted.

## Blocking Method:

Prior to installing pipe in the casing, a set of four wood blocks ( 8 ' intervals) throughout the sewer main length. The blocks shall be set so that the pipe does not touch the casing. Pipe joints shall be made outside of the casing. Sand or Pea gravel shall be washed or blown into the casing to the spring line of the pipe to provide bedding under the pipe.

Pipe Spacers Method:
Non-Centered stainless Steel spacers (PSI S8GN-2 http://www.pipelineseal.com/pdf lit/csem\&bg.pdf or approve approved equivalent) shall be installed in the casing pipe at varying to the new sewer main to set the sewer main to the desired slope. Spacers shall be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications with maximum spacing of $8^{\prime}$.

The untrenched construction shall be performed by dry auger boring and jacking. Water jacking for excavation of the soil is not allowed. The use of water to facilitate removal of spoil is permitted. The untrenched construction shall extend beneath the pedestrian underpass to the limits shown on the plan set.

For the casing installation, the bore hole diameter shall be essentially the same as the outside diameter of the pipe. In soft, unstable soil, the auger shall be inside the casing, but no undersized, so as not to create a void between the casing and the soil. If voids should develop or if the bore hole diameter is greater than the outside diameter of the pipe by more than approximately 1 inch, the voids shall be pressure grouted.

Connection of adjacent lengths of steel pipe shall be done by continuous, circumferential, field butt welding in accordance with AWWA C206. The connection shall result in a straight and true casing with a watertight seal.

The conduit pipe shall be installed on line and grade through the casing pipe. Install approved casing spacers at the approved distances. Fill the annular space between the casing and carrier pipe with the approved material (sand or pea gravel).

Take care to ensure that developed thrust pressures do not disturb existing utilities in or around the bore pit area. Any damage to utilities- public or private will be the responsibility of the contractor to repair.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Bore and Jack 21" Diameter Sewer shall be measured by the lineal foot for successful completion of the 21 " sanitary sewer pipe with larger casing pipe as described above from end to end of the casing.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

Bore and Jack 21" Diameter Sanitary Sewer shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for a the contract price per Linear Foot, which shall be full compensation for furnishing pipe and casing, and all work, materials, labor and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Sanitary sewer outside the limits of the casing will be measured and paid for separately.

## BID ITEM 90078 - CONCRETE SLURRY PLACEMENT APRON END WALLS

Work under this bid item shall include placing Grade A-FA concrete slurry between the concrete apron endwalls as show on the plan set: STA $49+60$ RT $25^{\prime}$ and $49+70$ LT $25^{\prime}$. Concrete slurry shall extend from the base of the endwall to the top of the apron endwall for the length of the endwall( $98^{\prime \prime}$ ) to $+2^{\prime}$. The finished surface along the top of the pipes shall have a brush surface finish.

All work shall be competed in accordance with Article 301 the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

## METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

CONCRETE SLURRY PLACEMENT APRON END WALLS shall be measured by the each void area between the apron endwalls.

## BASIS OF PAYMENT

CONCRETE SLURRY PLACEMENT APRON END WALLS shall be measured as above and paid at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, and incidentals to complete the work as outlined in the description.

## SECTION H: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 3 of day of Sentulu in the year Two Thousand and Fourteen between SPEEDWAY SAND \& GRAVEL, INC. hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted SEPTEMBER 2, 2014, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. Scope of Work. The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

2. Completion Date/Contract Time. Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED NINETY-ONE AND $97 / 100(\$ 1,608,291.97)$ Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.

## 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided unless otherwise noted in Section D: Special Provisions, Subsection 102.10 - Minimum Rate of Wage Scale.
"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.
"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.
"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of
materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the buiiding or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.
"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.
"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include pre-apprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the
contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourney persons. Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. $66.0903(10)(a)$ and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:
a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the
names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.
b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.
5. Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

## Articles of Agreement

Article I
The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

## Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

## Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous piaces available to employees and applicants for employment.

## Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

## Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

## Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5\%) of the contract price, or five thousand doilars $(\$ 5,000)$, whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

## Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

## Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

s. 66.0903 (10) RECORDS; INSPECTION; ENFORCEMENT.
(a) Each contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent performing work on a project of public works that is subject to this section shall keep full and accurate records cleariy indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person performing the work described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

## s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

(a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.
2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages. 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.
