The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.10: PREVAILING WAGE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below.

Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked.

If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

- Building or Heavy Construction
- Sewer, Water, or Tunnel Construction
- Local Street or Miscellaneous Paving Construction
- Residential or Agricultural Construction

When multiple boxes are checked, worker's wages may vary according to the type and area of work performed. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine and apply the appropriate wage rate for the specific work assigned.

SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

SECTION 104.4: INCREASED OR DECREASED QUANTITIES

It is agreed and understood that the quantities of any items of work shown on the plans or in the proposal are subject to increase or decrease during the progress of the work. Additional quantities have been added to the proposal than what appears in the plans to account for additional trees determined in the field. The Engineer reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantities of any items of work, including increase or decrease of quantities by alteration of plans, as may be considered necessary or desirable during the progress of the work to satisfactorily complete the project. Such increases or decreases in quantities shall not be considered as a waiver of any conditions of the contract nor invalidate any of the provisions thereof. All terms of Section 104.5 Increase Items and Section 104.6 Decreased and Deleted Items of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction are applicable to this project.

SECTION 105.9 SURVEYS, POINTS, AND INSTRUCTION

The Contractor shall be responsible for staking out the layout of plant locations at Tenney Park according to the plan. The Contractor shall stake out the plant locations with flags and the species name written on the flags. The Contractor shall also mark a pink "X" at the plant location with spray paint. The Contractor shall give the Engineer ten business days to review plant locations prior to planting.

The Contractor shall notify the Engineer 48 hours notice prior to staking the plant locations.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY CONTRACTOR

Several utilities exist on site. The Contractor shall perform a One Call through Digger's Hotline for each site at least three days prior to beginning construction. To ensure that Parks-owned utilities are also marked, include the PARK NAME AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MARKING instructions field on the ticket, and send a copy of the ticket to the City of Madison Parks Surveyor (Dan Rodman / drodman@cityofmadison.com / tel (608)266-6674 / fax (608)267-1162).

The Contractor shall secure materials at the end of each work day to deter any potential vandalism and theft. The Contractor shall attend a pre-construction meeting prior to the start of construction.

The Contractor warrants that its services are performed, within the limits prescribed by the City, with the usual thoroughness and competence of the consulting profession; in accordance with the standard for professional services at the time those services are rendered. The Contractor shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work performed under this Agreement, and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections resulting from their negligent acts, errors or omissions without additional compensation. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damages incurred as a result of their errors, omissions, or negligent acts and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy construction.

The Contractor shall take care when accessing the site not to damage the existing utilities, concrete curb, sidewalk or asphalt pavement. Any damage shall be repaired by the Contractor per the Standard Specifications and considered incidental to this contract.

The Contractor shall be responsible for relocating utilities as necessary for digging activities.

Tenney Park is a popular public facility that is heavily used by local residents. The Contractor shall expect heavy pedestrian traffic throughout the work zones and shall be prepared to accommodate park users. Additionally, the Contractor shall be aware of the following activities, for which they will need to make special accommodations:

- The John Wall Pavilion (main park shelter) is a reservable park shelter. The Contractor shall not block doorways, drinking fountains, picnic tables, restrooms, etc. The parking lot of the John Wall Pavilion shall not be used for staging. The Contractor must work around dates when the shelter is reserved for use. The Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring at the end of each day, that the work site is left clean, orderly, free of construction debris, barricades, etc. The Contractor

may have to work around specific shelter reservation dates, and may be required to change schedules depending on special events and reserved dates.

- Park maintenance activities will occur throughout the duration of the contract. The Contractor shall accommodate mowing, trash pickup, and other maintenance activities. The Contractor may contact Craig Klinke, Parks East Operations Supervisor at 246-4508 or cklinke@cityofmadison.com with questions or concerns regarding maintenance.
- In addition to trees planted as part of this contract, additional landscaping will be planted in Tenney Park throughout the duration of this contract. The Contractor shall accommodate these additional planting activities and shall contact the Engineer regarding questions or concerns related to planting activities.

SECTION 105.13 ORDER OF COMPLETION

The Contractor shall complete any portions of the work in such order of time as has been stated in the contract or in such order as the Engineer may declare necessary by reason of an emergency. The order of doing the work is subject to the review of the City. Prior to beginning construction, the Contractor shall submit to the City a detailed schedule showing the sequence and anticipated dates of all planting installation operations. The Contractor will be required to work around any shelter reservations.

SECTION 107.7: MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All signing and barricading shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases, to Luke Peters, lpeters@cityofmadison.com, prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The successful bidder shall work with the City Traffic Engineering Division to develop an approved Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the approved Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The traffic control plan may need to be altered as conditions change in the field or as unexpected conditions occur. This may include relocating existing traffic control or providing additional traffic control. The Contractor shall install and maintain any necessary modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The Contractor shall maintain two-way traffic on N. Thornton Ave. and access to the Tenney Park Parking Lot at all times. The Contractor shall maintain two-way bike traffic along N. Thornton Ave. at all times, either on the street or on the parallel path.

The Contractor shall maintain two-way traffic on Marston Ave. at all times.

The Contractor shall maintain a minimum of a 12 foot travel lane in each direction on Sherman Ave. at all times.

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

The Contractor may remove parking within the project limits as indicated on the Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall be responsible for posting and maintaining NO PARKING signs in accordance with City of Madison Police Department's "Guidelines for Temporary No Parking Restrictions for Construction or Special Events".

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

Work cannot start on this contract until after the "Start to Work" letter has been received.

All planting shall be carried out at a rate so as to secure full completion within the contract times outlined in Section 109.7, the rate of progress, and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.

The fixed, agreed upon, liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the contract, unless otherwise specified in this section, shall be calculated in accordance with Article 109 of the Standard Specifications. The Contractor shall limit workdays from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday through Friday, unless approved by the Engineer in writing.

All plantings shall be installed per City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Contracts unless otherwise defined in the Special Provisions of this contract.

ARTICLE 109.5: METHODS AND EQUIPMENT

Due to the poor soil conditions and limited working areas along the shoreline, the Contractor will be expected to use small or low-earth pressure equipment. Vehicular access to the island shall be limited to the Thornton Avenue bridge. The Thornton Avenue bridge is 10' wide and can only accommodate 28,000 lbs occasional loadings for a truck with a single rear axle at a very low speed. The Contractor shall be required to submit a Methods and Equipment Plan for approval by the Engineer prior to construction. Any damage to the existing bridge shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to repair as deemed satisfactory by the Engineer.

The Methods and Equipment Plan shall identify the make and model of construction vehicles used, their weight, the full load weight with materials, and the planned haul routes for construction. The Contractor shall not be allowed to stage unplanted plants on site overnight, over weekends and/or holidays. The Contractor shall stage equipment in the parking lot along Marston Avenue. The Contractor shall be responsible for blocking off parking areas to ensure that parking spaces are available for use.

Any areas that are damaged by the Contractor including turf damage, shall be repaired by the Contractor at the Contractor's expense.

SECTION 109.7 TIME OF COMPLETION

Planting installation shall be completed in spring 2016. Spring planting for all plants shall start from the time frost is out of the ground to July 1, 2016.

Care and maintenance of plants during the 2016 growing season shall be incidental to cost of BID ITEMS 20900-20926. Landscape Maintenance for the 2017 growing season shall be paid separately under BID ITEMS 90001 – 2017 LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE.

The 2016 year growing season is defined as the time in 2016 from when plants are installed, until ground is frozen. The 2017 growing season is defined as the time beginning in 2017 from when frost is out of the ground, until the ground is frozen. Contract will be completed by December 1, 2017.

SECTION 109.14: MOBILIZATION

Mobilization for all activities is incidental to the corresponding bid item. Mobilization will not be paid separately.

SECTION 209: TREES, SHRUBS, PERENNIALS AND GRASSES

All planting as part of this contract shall be completed per Article 209 – Trees, Shrubs, Perennials and Grasses of the latest edition of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and as outlined in these Special Provisions.

All plantings shall be installed in spring 2016 and shall be completed by July 1, 2016.

Care and maintenance of plants during the first growing season after installation in 2016 shall be incidental to the cost of BID ITEMS 20900-20926. Landscape maintenance for the 2017 growing season shall be paid separately under BID ITEM 90000 – 2017 LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE.

The first year growing season is defined as the time in 2016 from when plants are installed, until ground is frozen. The 2017 growing season is defined as the time beginning in 2017 from when frost is out of the ground, until the ground is frozen.

Preparing the ground for planting shall be incidental to bid items 20900-20926. This includes removing woody debris including twigs, leaves, and other organic matter that has accumulated throughout the years.

If plants are being installed in areas that are receiving herbicide treatment, plants shall be planted after herbicide will no longer pose a threat to the survival of the proposed plant.

ROOT BAG TREE INSTALLATION

Excavate hole to a width of one foot wider than the ball, and 10"-12" deep. Remove all material covering the plant ball including rope, burlap, nylon bag and material on the bottom of the ball. If the root-flare is not visible on the soil's surface, lightly shave the soil from the top of the ball until the root flare is visible. Place the tree into the excavated hole so that the top of the ball rests 1 to 2 inches above the surface of the surrounding soil. Backfill as necessary, do not cover root flare.

Plants shall be watered the day of installation.

In addition to the waterings required in Subsection 209.4(g), additional waterings may be ordered by the Engineer at any time. Should conditions require such waterings, the Contractor shall water within three (3) days of notification. The volume of each watering and intervals between waterings shall depend upon weather conditions and soil moisture. Contractor shall monitor weather and soil condition of each planting.

Plants shall be guaranteed for two growing seasons from the date of installation, until substantial completion is issued. Growing seasons are defined in Section 109.7 of these Special Provisions. At any time within the period of the guarantee, the Contractor shall replace any plant which, for any reason, has died or is in a dying condition, or which has failed to flourish in such a manner or to such a degree that its usefulness or appearance has been impaired. Replacement shall include removal and repair of all affected work. The decision of the Engineer as to the necessity of replacing any plants shall be conclusive and binding on the Contractor. No more than two (2) replacements per plant shall be required.

Recognizing that male cultivars of Kentucky Coffeetree are difficult to find. The Contractor may substitute bid item *Gymnocladus dioica* 'Espresso' with *Gymnocladus dioica* 'J.C. McDaniel', *Gymnocladus dioica* 'Stately Manor', or *Gymnocladus dioica* 'Kentucky Colonel'.

All trees and shrubs shall conform to the sizes specified below.

BID ITEM 20970 – DROUGHT WATERING

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to provide drought watering in accordance with Article 209.5(j) of the City of Madison Specifications for Public Works Construction for all plants. Mobilization associated with drought watering is incidental to this bid item. Drought watering shall only be paid in 2016 for conditions defined in Article 209.5(j) of the Specifications. Drought watering in 2017 is incidental to BID ITEM 90000 - 2017 Landscape Maintenance.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Drought Watering shall be measured by unit price for additional watering visits necessary to thoroughly soak the root zones of all plants in this contract at the site. The number of watering visits shall be defined such that one watering visit thoroughly waters all of the plants in this bid item, once.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Drought Watering shall be paid for at the contract unit price each, which shall be full compensation for furnishing, transporting and watering plants; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. In order to receive payment for drought watering, the Contractor must submit proof of watering for each watering. This proof must include photos of the watering with the date and time that each watering occurred.

BID ITEM – 90000 2017 LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

DESCRIPTION

This work shall consist of maintenance of landscaping installed in this contract at all locations during the 2017 growing season. The 2017 growing season is defined as the time beginning in 2017 from when frost is out of the ground, until the ground is frozen. Care and maintenance of plants during the 2016 growing season shall be incidental to cost of BID ITEMS 20900-20926.

Mobilization for landscape maintenance is incidental to this bid item.

This work shall include furnishing all necessary materials and performing all necessary work such as weeding, watering, renewal pruning, the removal and placement of new mulch, support staking, fertilizing, rodent protection, disposing of surplus waste materials, and such work necessary or incidental thereto to complete the item in accordance with the plans, specifications and contract.

All care is to be in accordance with the plans and specifications of this contract and the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. The Contractor shall have adequate experience and knowledge in the care of trees.

A monthly inspection of all trees shall be completed by the Contractor's licensed landscape architect or trained horticulturist. This is to assess work to be done and to locate problems which may have developed since the last inspection. The Contractor shall notify the Engineer 48 hours prior to inspection.

PRUNING

All plant material shall be inspected by the Contractor to determine need for pruning. Pruning shall be completed once each year in accordance with these specifications. All pruning shall be done at the appropriate time for each species. All plant material shall be pruned in order to stimulate tight, natural growth. Remove dead and broken branches, sucker growth and bad crotches. Pruning should develop the natural form of each individual plant. In general, tools to be used should conform to accepted horticultural practices. When/where specified or directed by the Engineer, for all B&B or CG plant stock, pruning shall consist of removing only dead, damaged, or broken branching. Pruning shall be done so that the plant retains its natural form and leaving the central leader intact.

Except when heading back, all pruning cuts shall be made at the branch bark ridge and branch collar leaving both branch features intact without leaving stubs or damaging adjacent trunk or branch tissue. When heading back or reducing a branch back to another lateral branch, all pruning cuts shall be made by bisecting the angle between the branch bark ridge and an imaginary line which is perpendicular to the branch being removed. The branch bark ridge must be left intact without leaving a stub and without damaging adjacent branch tissue. Evergreen plants shall not be pruned except to remove dead, damaged, or broken branches. All pruning cuts shall comply with the ANSI A300 current edition, see Part VIII, Standard Plates 2.04 and 2.05 for Proper Pruning Cut.

Prune and raise the canopy on all trees as specified by the Engineer. All cuts shall be clean and debris removed from the site immediately.

Mulched rings shall receive 3-4" of new shredded hardwood bark mulch by June 1, 2017. Prior to installing new mulch, existing mulch shall be removed and disposed offsite. Bark mulch shall be free of objectionable foreign material and in accordance with the Article 209 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Contracts. The Contractor is responsible for supplying mulch. When applied, care should be taken to not damage plant material. Keep mulch away from stems of plants. The Contractor is responsible for such damage.

PEST AND DISEASE CONTROL

All plant material shall be inspected during the growing season for insects and/or disease. Any pest and/or disease problem shall be reported to the Engineer to determine course of action. The remediation work shall be done on a time and material basis upon approval of the Engineer. There will be no pesticide usage on bedding plants.

WATERING OF PLANT MATERIAL

All plants shall be appropriately watered throughout the planting season to keep plants in a healthy growing condition regardless of drought condition. Watering during drought conditions are incidental to this bid item. The volume of water shall be enough to soak the root zone. Care must be taken when watering not to wash away mulch and topsoil. Mulch and topsoil displaced must be replaced immediately by the Contractor. Section 209.5 (j) Drought Watering **does not apply** to landscape maintenance bid items.

DISPOSAL

Excess material such as mulch, plant, or organic debris as a result of landscape maintenance shall be removed from the site immediately. Excess material shall be disposed offsite at a location to be determined and provided by the Contractor at no extra cost.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Landscape Maintenance shall be measured by lump sum to maintain the landscape plantings during the entire 2017 growing season.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Landscape Maintenance shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. **Landscape Maintenance shall be paid on a quarterly basis during the 2017 growing season. The Contractor shall submit documentation showing proof of inspection with each payment request.**



SECTION H: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 7th day of October in the year Two Thousand and Fifteen between DAN LARSEN LANDSCAPING, INC., hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted OCTOBER 6, 2015, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of SEVENTY-THREE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR (\$73,974.00) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
4. **Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors**

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided unless otherwise noted in Section D: Special Provisions, Subsection 102.10 – Minimum Rate of Wage Scale.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of

materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include pre-apprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the

contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourney persons. Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

- a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the

names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.

- b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract. In addition, if DWD finds that a contractor or subcontractor violated the prevailing wage law, DWD will assess liquidated damages of 100% of the wages owed to employees.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate and DWD prevailing wage requirements are attached hereto as Sec. I of the contract.

5. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement

Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.

3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

6. Substance Abuse Prevention Program Required. Prior to commencing work on the Contract, the Contractor, and any Subcontractor, shall have in place a written program for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees as required under Wis. Stat. Sec. 103.503.

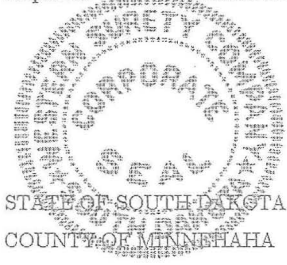

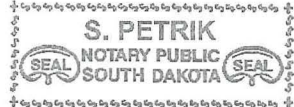

(4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

(a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.

2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.

3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages.

5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

PREVAILING WAGE – Contractors

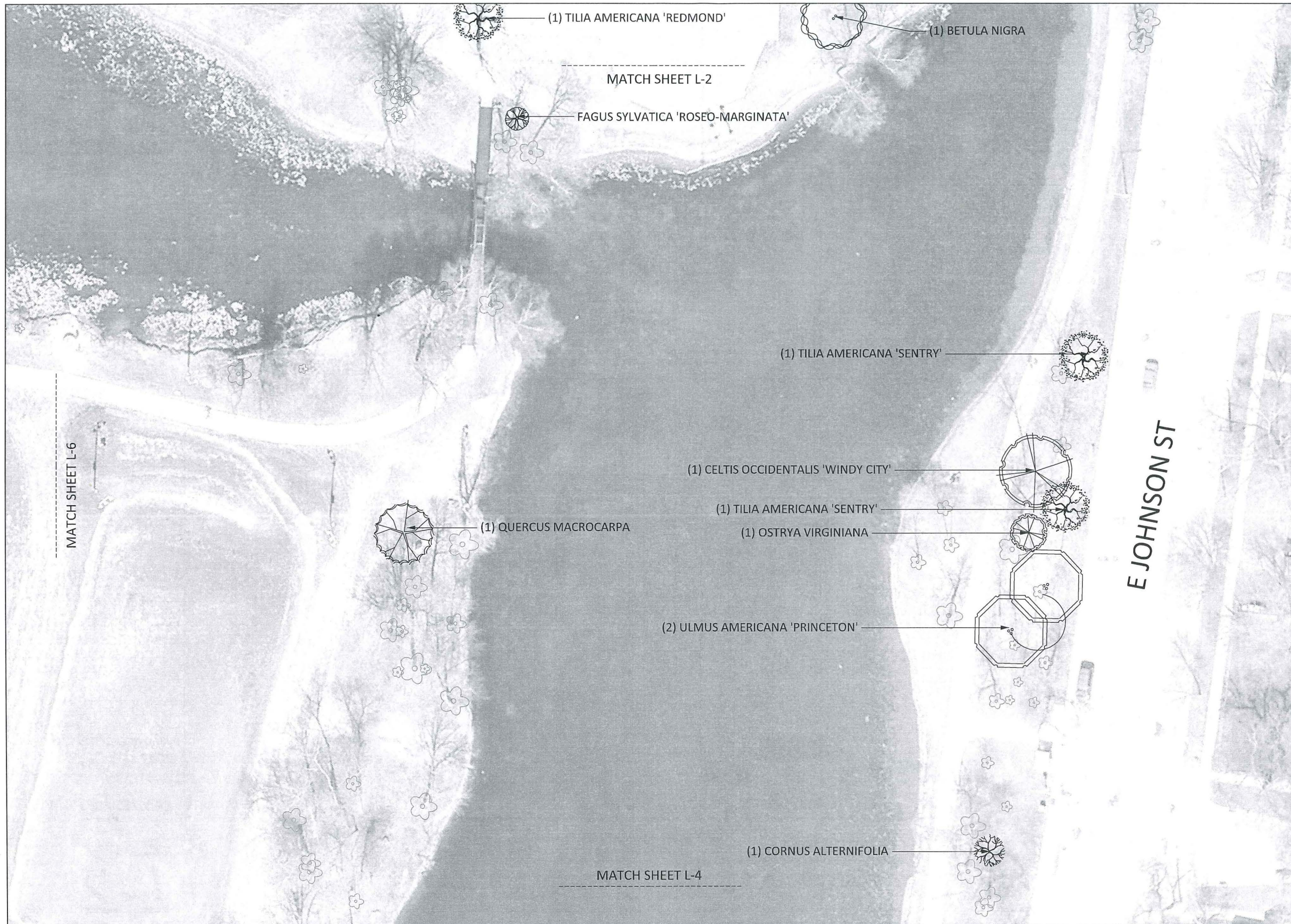
Any public works project that has a total estimated project cost that equals or exceeds prevailing wage project thresholds requires a prevailing wage rate determination issued by the Department of Workforce Development (DWD). Public works include erecting, constructing, remodeling, repairing, demolishing, alterations, painting and decorating projects for a local governmental unit or state agency. State law excludes minor service or maintenance work, warranty work, or work under a supply-and-installation contract. There is a statutory definition for most of these exclusions. The prevailing wage laws that apply to local governmental units and their contractors are §§66.0903 and 103.503, Wis. Stats. The prevailing wage laws that apply to state agencies and their contractors are §§103.49 and 103.503, Wis. Stats. The applicable administrative rules for all prevailing wage projects are DWD 290 and DWD 294, Wis. Adm. Code. These laws include provisions that apply to all contractors and subcontractors working on prevailing wage projects.

Any contractor or subcontractor working on a local governmental unit or state agency's public works project that equals or exceeds current prevailing wage project thresholds must do all of the following:

- Receive and review the project's prevailing wage rate determination (i.e., white sheet).
- Tell subcontractors the project is subject to state prevailing wage law and include the prevailing wage rate determination in the construction contract, or if there is no written contract, provide a copy of the project determination to each subcontractor.
- Hire subcontractors who do *not* appear on the "Consolidated List of Debarred Contractors."
- Have a written substance abuse testing program in place that fulfills the requirements of §103.503, Wis. Stats., before commencing work on the project.

- Notify subcontractors that if DWD finds that a contractor or subcontractor violated the prevailing wage law, DWD will assess liquidated damages of 100% of the wages owed to employees.
- Apply to DWD for subjourney wage rates prior to employing these individuals on the project.
- Receive and retain a completed Affidavit of Compliance from each subcontractor brought on to the project before providing final payment to those subcontractors.
- Submit a completed Affidavit of Compliance to the contractor who brought the subcontractor on to the project before receiving final payment for the project.
- Maintain payroll records for 3 years that comply with §§66.0903(10)(a) or 103.49(5)(a), Stats. and DWD 274.06.
- Respond to requests from DWD or the project owner to provide payroll records and/or respond to prevailing wage complaints filed by employees or third parties.
