The Director is responsible for planning and evaluation of library services, fiscal management, directing the activities and staff of the Library, and for carrying out the policy directives of the Library Board and working actively with the Madison Public Library Foundation.

The Community Services Manager-Central Library oversees print and digital educational library services and extensive collections and programs at the Central Library, as well as the Library's public website and internal web services System-wide Interloan Services, and Home Services.

Jane Roughen, Community Services Manager - Branches 266-8685

The Community Services Manager-Branched is responsible for planning, supervising and overseeing eight neighborhood libraries which offer high interest book and media collections, educational programs for children and adults, Internet assistance, and community meeting space, and oversees the development of library services to children and youth.

The Circulation Services Supervisor works out of the Central Library and has the responsibility for the efficient and effective operation of all Madison Public Library public circulation services as well as oversight of the day-to-day circulation functions, delivery and shelving at the Central Library.

The Technical Services Supervisor is responsible for developing library collections, including selecting, ordering, acquiring, processing and cataloging all library materials and for creating and maintaining a database of library materials (LINKcat) for the LINK automated consortium.
