Parking Reminders.....

I was reminded earlier this week as I plucked the parking ticket off of my personal car, and then went to pay the fine, that it is prudent to be mindful of the parking rules. As weather conditions bring greater chances of snow showers, I thought I would review the rules to help avoid those pesky little blue and white tickets.

For most city areas and some downtown locations, alternate side parking is in effect no matter what the weather conditions are. If you are in the isthmus portion of downtown, from the Yahara river through to Park and Proudfit Streets, you are in the *snow emergency zone*. Alternate side parking only applies in this zone when a snow emergency is declared. A snow emergency is declared when residential streets need to be cleared, and goes into effect before 9 p.m. Snow emergencies stay in place for



a minimum of 48 hours so street clearing can take place.

The rule for alternate side parking is odd side on odd calendar days and even on even, November 15 to March 15.

Of course it is best if possible to remove your vehicle from the street so they can be cleared. Parking is also available in the cashiered sections of city-owned ramps in the downtown area. During a declared snow emergency, you can park for NO CHARGE at the City ramps from 1 a.m. until 7 a.m. If you leave after 7 a.m. you are liable for any parking charges from 7 a.m. until the time you leave. When parking in the ramps overnight, please do not park on the top level so this area can be plowed. Be aware that vehicles stored in city ramps longer than 48 hours can be ticketed and towed.

The meters in the ramps are enforced 24/7.
