The City of Madison's Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2014 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." This requires no payment until / unless you actually bid online. You can also choose the monthly subscription plan at this time. You will, however, be asked to provide payment information. Remember, you can change your preference at anytime. You will then be able to complete your free registration and have full access to the site. Your free access does not require completion of the 'Digital ID' process, so you will have instant access for viewing and downloading. To be prepared in case you ever do wish to bid online, you may wish to establish your digital ID also, since you cannot bid without a Digital ID.

### 2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

### 2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

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To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access Targeted Business Certification the Application online www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

### 2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

### 2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.
- 2.4.1.2 Using the City of Madison's directory of certified SBEs to identify SBEs from which to solicit bids.
- 2.4.1.3 Assuring that SBEs are solicited whenever they are potential
- 2.4.1.4 Referring prospective SBEs to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division for certification.
- 2.4.1.5 Dividing total project requirements into smaller tasks and/or quantities, where economically feasible, to permit maximum feasible SBE participation.
- 2.4.1.6 Establishing delivery schedules, where requirements permit, which will encourage participation by SBEs.
- 2.4.1.7 Providing SBEs with specific information regarding the work to be performed.
- 2.4.1.8 Contacting SBEs in advance of the deadline to allow such businesses sufficient time to prepare a bid.
- 2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. 5% above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.
- 2.4.1.10 Contacting SBEs which submit a bid, to inquire about the details of the bid and confirm that the scope of the work was interpreted as intended.

### 2.4.2 Reporting SBE Utilization and Good Faith Efforts

The Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report is to be submitted by the <u>bidder</u> with the bid: This report is due by the specified bid closing time and date. Bids submitted without a completed SBE Compliance Report as outlined below

shall be deemed non-responsible and the bidder ineligible for award of this contract.

- 2.4.2.1 If the Bidder meets or exceeds the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
  - 2.4.2.1.1 **Cover Page,** Page C-6; and
  - 2.4.2.1.2 **Summary Sheet,** C-7.
- 2.4.2.2 If the bidder <u>does not meet</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
  - 2.4.2.2.1 Cover Page, Page C-6;
  - 2.4.2.2.2 **Summary Sheet,** C-7; and
  - 2.4.2.2.3 **SBE Contact Report,** C-8 and C-9. (A <u>separate</u> Contact Report must be completed for <u>each applicable</u> SBE which is <u>not utilized.)</u>

### 2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is found non-responsible for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may appeal that decision to the Small Business Enterprises Appeals Committee. All appeals shall be made in writing, and shall be delivered to and received by the City Engineer no later than 4:30 PM on the third business day following the bidder's receipt of the written notification of ineligibility by the Affirmative Action Division Manager. Postmark not acceptable. The notice of appeal shall state the basis for the appeal of the decision of the Affirmative Action Division Manager. The Appeal shall take place in accordance with Madison General Ordinance 33.54.

### 2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

### 2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

### **SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS**

### TOMPKINS DRIVE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT - 2015 CONTRACT NO. 7418

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

# For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below. Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked. If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work: Building or Heavy Construction Sewer, Water, or Tunnel Construction Local Street or Miscellaneous Paving Construction Residential or Agricultural Construction

When multiple boxes are checked, worker's wages may vary according to the type and area of work performed. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine and apply the appropriate wage rate for the specific work assigned.

### SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$55,500 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$271,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

### ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this contract shall include, but is not limited to, installation of water main, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, curb and gutter, base preparation, asphalt pavement, driveway aprons, and sidewalk.

The project limits for the work are on Tompkins Drive from Monona Drive to Joylynne Drive. The project is approximately 3150 ft. in length.

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

### SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

It is anticipated that the Contractor will need to use multiple crews and may need to work on weekends in order to complete the work under this contract within contract duration.

The Contractor shall use care around existing trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps, driveways and any other structures or amenities that are indicated on the plans to remain. The Contractor shall be aware that there are properties with landscaping and other features near the location of the new sidewalk; the contractor shall not remove these items unless specifically called out on the plans. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees, other than those shown on the plan to be removed, shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2. All other standard tree protection specifications will be strictly enforced.

Mail service to essentially all properties within the project limits is located at or near the front door, so it is mostly walk-up service for the mail delivery. The Contractor shall maintain safe access for mail delivery to all properties within the project limits.

All private storm sewer discharges shall be maintained for all properties in the project area.

The City of Madison is acquiring additional right-of-way and easements for work under this contract. Some work may not be able to take place until the right-of-way and easement acquisitions are finalized; this mostly applies to construction of sidewalk. The Contractor shall verify with the Engineer at the start of construction if there are any issues with performing some of the work due to the required land acquisitions.

Work under this contract may require utility relocations to install the new sanitary sewer main and storm sewer. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process and provide working area for installation of new facilities.

The contractor shall coordinate relocation of the existing AT&T buried copper (300 pair) conduit in order to install SAS #2B on Bjelde Ln. The contractor shall contact AT&T a minimum of 24 hours prior to relocating work is to be completed. The contacts for AT&T are listed below.

### SECTION 107.6 DUST PROOFING

The Contractor shall take all necessary steps to control dust arising from operations connected with this contract. When ordered by the Engineer, the Contractor shall dust proof the construction area by using power sweepers and water. Dust proofing shall be incidental with operations connected with this contract.

### SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All signing and barricading shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases, to Tom Mohr, tmohr@cityofmadison.com, prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The successful bidder shall work with the City Traffic Engineering Division to develop an approved Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

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The Contractor shall be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the approved Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The traffic control plan may need to be altered as conditions change in the field or as unexpected conditions occur. This may include relocating existing traffic control or providing additional traffic control. The Contractor shall install and maintain any necessary modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The Contractor may remove parking within the project limits as indicated on the Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall be responsible for posting and maintaining NO PARKING signs in accordance with City of Madison Police Department's "Guidelines for Temporary No Parking Restrictions for Construction or Special Events".

Tompkins Drive may be closed to through traffic, at the project limits, for the duration of the project. Local and emergency vehicle access shall be maintained at all times.

No two adjacent intersections may be closed to cross traffic simultaneously.

No work, materials, or equipment may impact any travel lanes on Monona Drive at any time.

Joylynne Drive shall remain open to traffic in both directions at all times. When necessary for construction, Joylynne Dr. may be reduced to one travel lane provided that flag persons are used in accordance with MUTCD. Once school is back in session at Glendale School (1201 Tompkins Dr.), both travel lanes on Joylynne Dr. shall be open to traffic during the main pick-up and drop-off times. The Contractor shall coordinate these times with the school.

All commercial driveways within the project limits shall remain open at all times. Maintaining access to the commercial driveways may require additional staging of the work and/or use of high early strength concrete, all of which shall be considered incidental to the traffic control item and the particular concrete items.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681, (1) working day prior to placement of the plates.

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

### SECTION 107.8 <u>NOTIFICATION WHEN CLOSING STREET</u>

All Contractors shall give the Traffic Engineer (266-4761) notice of their intent to begin work on any street at least seventy-two (72) hours in advance. The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of one (1) working day in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the Contractor removes the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment.

### SECTION 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

The Contractor shall notify the Traffic Engineering Field Operations Facility in writing so that the Traffic Engineering Division can install traffic control signs and barricades prior to the opening of the street. Traffic Engineering shall have five (5) working days once the project site is restored with topsoil, seed and

mulch to install signs and pavement marking. The Contractor shall maintain his/her traffic control and barricades until the Traffic Engineering Division has completed their work.

### SECTION 108.2 PERMITS

The City of Madison has obtained a City of Madison Erosion Control Permit and has submitted a DNR Notice of Intent (NOI) to obtain coverage under a Construction Site General Permit.

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permits by properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Construction Engineer or his designees. This work will be paid for under the appropriate contract bid items or, if appropriate items are not included in the contract, shall be paid for as Extra Work. A copy of the permit is available at the City of Madison, Engineering Division office.

This permit covers trench dewatering to a maximum of 70 gallons/minute from the project, provided appropriate control measures are in place. The City's obtaining this permit is not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction.

### SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on <u>JUNE 15, 2015</u>. The total time for completion of this contract is <u>ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE (135) CALENDAR DAYS</u>.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer, and the agreed upon date must be determined prior to the public preconstruction meeting.

### **BID ITEM 20336 - PIPE PLUG**

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction latest edition Article 203.2(c), any pipe found in a trench that is less than 10" in diameter while installing a sewer facility shall be considered incidental to the pipe being installed.

Pipe plugs to be paid under this item: Two (2) - 10" San.

Any pipe plugs required to abandon or remove sewer access structure (pipes directly connected to the structure) shall be considered incidental to abandoning or removing the structure regardless of the size of the pipe being abandoned.

### **BID ITEM 20101 – EXCAVATION CUT**

Removal of any existing small timber retaining walls or planters, landscaping borders and small shrubs shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

### **BID ITEM 21001 - EROSION CONTROL PLAN & IMPLEMENTATION**

In addition to the requirements detailed in Section 210.1(a) the Contractor shall supply a dewatering plan as part of the Erosion Control Implementation Plan. At a minimum the dewatering plan shall include the Contractor's methods, practices, and or devices to perform TYPE I or TYPE II Dewatering per Section 502.1(c) Dewatering in the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) SOC Technical Standard 1061 Dewatering. If TYPE II Dewatering is expected to be used at a rate in excess of 70 gallons/minute, the dewatering plan shall also include a copy of any applicable WDNR permits.

### SECTION 210.1(d) <u>STREET SWEEPING</u>

When required, either by the erosion control plan or the Construction Engineer, the Contractor shall perform mechanical street sweeping on all streets or paved surfaces affected by construction equipment, hauling or related construction activities that result in mud tracking or siltation. Mechanical street sweeping shall be completed as directed by the Construction Engineer and shall remove all loose material to the satisfaction of the Construction Engineer. Depending on site conditions, construction activities, and hauling methods utilized by the Contractor mechanical street sweeping may be required multiple times throughout the day with an absolute minimum that all streets are clean at the end of the work day.

### BID ITEM 40202 - HMA PAVEMENT TYPE E-1

The Contractor shall install asphalt curb, at the locations indicated on the plans, to match into the existing asphalt curb on some of the cross streets. The asphalt curb shall be installed with a minimum 4" curb height, and shall be installed such that drainage is maintained. The asphalt curb shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

### BID ITEM 40410 - CONCRETE SPEED HUMP

The final locations of the concrete speed humps to be installed with this project will be provided prior to construction. It is estimated that 7 humps will be installed with this project, and each hump shall be constructed per Standard Detail Drawing 4.10.

### SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

This project shall included installing approximately 3,157 feet of new 8" & 10" PVC SDR-35/SDR-26/AWWA C900 pipe and 1322 feet of new sanitary lateral SDR-35/SDR-26, in order to reconnect approximately 53 sanitary laterals.

ASTM D3034 SDR-35 and SDR-26 sewer main and lateral as called for on the plan set shall be payable under Sanitary Sewer Main (Bid Item 50301) and Sanitary Lateral (Bid Item 50353). No additional compensation will be granted for ASTM D3034 SDR-26 pipe material

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include Neenah R-1050 castings with the new City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16) of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction latest edition. All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All existing main connections shall be field cored to accommodate existing conditions and shall be compensated under BID ITEM 50791 SANITARY SEWER TAP. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during the installation of a structure shall be replaced by the Contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish.

Contractors shall have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra excavation, disturbance, and/or sidewalk removal. No additional compensation shall be awarded for additional excavation for the replacement of a sewer lateral if work starts at the property line. If laterals called for reinstatement on the plans are to be plugged under the direction of the engineer on-site, contractors are required to use a sonde device to confirm that the laterals are not active.

All sanitary sewer laterals on this project were located by television inspection of the main and from City records. Lateral locations for the following addresses shall be confirmed during construction:

**5601 Groveland Ter. -** Two(2) laterals shown, need to confirm location of active laterals.

705 Tompkins Dr. - Two(2) laterals shown, need to confirm location of active laterals.

**809 Tompkins Dr.** - Two(2) laterals shown, need to confirm location of active laterals.

**5509 Kvamme Ln. -** Two(2) laterals shown, need to confirm location of active laterals.

**905 Tompkins Dr. –** Field locate lateral to confirm property is served from Herro Ln.

1001 Tompkins Dr - Field locate lateral to confirm property is served from Herro Ln.

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation.

### STORM SEWER GENERAL

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 2,742 feet of new storm sewer of various sizes ranging from 12" to 21".

Reconnection of existing pipes at new or existing structures, or new pipes at new or existing structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

Where a new structure is to be constructed at an existing pipe, it is expected that the contractor shall saw cut the existing pipe in the required location to accommodate the placement of the new structure. If the contractor for his or her convenience deems it more suitable to remove the existing pipe to a full joint, the additional pipe and concrete collar required to reconnect to the new structure stall be the contractor's responsibility and shall not be compensated.

Connection of new pipes to existing structures shall be accommodated with a Storm Sewer Tap – Bid Item 50792.

Precast structures are only allowed where field poured structures are not specifically called for, and no precast structures are allowed until ULO's are completed and approval of the design engineer has been received.

### BID ITEM 50353 - SANITARY SEWER LATERAL (SDR 35 & 26)

Sanitary sewer laterals shown on the construction plans were located by City television inspection and records only.

Where the existing sanitary sewer laterals are being extended to connect to the new sanitary sewer main (being installed in a different location as the existing main), pipe plugs shall be required to plug the existing sanitary sewer main on both sides of the old lateral location. The pipe plugs shall be considered incidental to the bid price for SANITARY SEWER LATERAL. All work associated with this bid item shall comply with Article 503 of the Standard Specifications.

Per the City of Madison Standard Specifications for sanitary sewer lateral construction on street reconstruction projects, Contractors are encouraged to begin installation of sanitary lateral pipe at the proposed sewer main. If Contractor starts excavation for the lateral at the property line, it shall be at the Contractor's risk. No Utility Line Openings (ULOs) will be granted for the inability to locate the sanitary lateral at the property line. Any extra excavation, disturbance or restoration will not be compensated to the Contractor looking for an existing sanitary lateral at the property line. Contractors are encouraged to have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra disturbance.

Proposed sanitary lateral locations near trees are subject to change based upon data obtained in the field and property owner involvement. Excavation near trees shall comply with Article 107.13 of the Standard

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Specifications. If 5 ft of separation from the tree to the excavation cannot be maintained, lateral replacement shall stop at the proposed curb.

### **BID ITEM 50354 - RECONNECT SANITARY LATERAL**

The first 5 feet of pipe shall be included with this bid item regardless of pipe type or fittings used. Beyond 5' shall be paid for separately (Bid Item 50353 SANITARY SEWER LATERAL).

The first 5 feet of sewer lateral pipe/ fittings measured from the sewer main shall be considered the reconnect for all sewer lateral reconnections. Lateral connections connecting to sewer access structures shall be paid for separately as a sanitary tap. 5' of lateral pipe is not considered incidental to the sanitary tap connection.

### **BID ITEM 50390 - SEWER ELECTRONIC MARKERS**

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction latest edition Section 503.3(c), each sanitary lateral shall have a minimum of two (2) electronic markers with the City providing the Contractor with the required number of electronic markers. For sanitary laterals, which only include the installation of a wye, a marker ball shall be installed directly above the wye connection to the main.

### BID ITEM 50801 - UTILITY LINE OPENING (ULO)

The work under this item shall be completed in accordance with Article 508 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. It is the discretion of the contractor to locate utilities by either a trench excavation or by a pothole technique. However, the contractor shall not be compensated more than once for multiple utilities located within a maximum distance of five (5) feet long.

### SECTION 701 PROVISIONS FOR WATER INSTALLATION AND ABANDONMENT

This project consists of installing new 8-inch pipe and fittings throughout the project limits to replace the existing 6-inch pipe. All services will be fully replaced to the property lines as shown on the plans and described in these specifications.

Visit the site prior to bidding and become familiar with existing conditions and utilities.

### BID ITEM 70053 - REPLACE 1-INCH COPPER SERVICE LATERAL

All services within the project limits shall be replaced in the right of way and coupled to the existing service pipe at the property line. Place the new curb box and stop in the terrace between the back of the new curb and the front of the new sidewalk. Note that the distance between the front of sidewalk and back of curb may vary. Where possible, excavate closely in parallel with the existing service that is being replaced.

Most of the existing water service laterals within the project limits are of an unknown size and record. These services are assumed, but not guaranteed by the Water Utility to be ¾-inch copper. Replace laterals of 1-inch or less with 1-inch copper. If a lateral greater than 1-inch is identified in the field, replace it with the equal size and consult the Engineer.

Refer to sections 704.10 and 704.9. Method of measurement and payment in this contract shall be per each completed service replacement, and also includes abandonment of the existing curb box.

### BID ITEM 70105 - PIPE PLUG FOR WATER MAIN INSTALLATION

This bid item applies only to pipes which are 10-inches in diameter or larger. Pipe plugs applied to pipes less than 10-inches in diameter are considered incidental to the related work, and will not be compensated in this bid item.

### SECTION 703 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Perform all work in accordance with these provisions and the City of Madison Standard Specifications For Public Works Construction, 2014 Edition (adopted January 21, 2014).

### SECTION 703.4.4 REMOVAL OF CONFLICTING UTILITY PIPES

Abandoned utilities which conflict with new water main installations are to be removed from the trench and properly disposed of. Utility pipes to be removed that are in the same trench as new water main will not be additionally compensated, and are considered to be part of the new pipe installation. This applies to any abandoned pipe or conduit that is identified on the plans for removal, or any unidentified abandoned pipe or conduit that is smaller than 10 inches in diameter. Removal of unidentified abandoned pipe or conduit that is 10 inches in diameter or larger will be considered as Extra Work.

If the utility to be removed ends along a pipe run, as opposed to ending at a structure, end the removal with a saw cut of the existing pipe and plug the remaining end(s) as directed by the Engineer. Refer to bid item "Pipe Plug for Water Main Installation" for applicable practice.

### SECTION 703.8 WATER MAIN SHUTOFFS

Ensure that all street-facing and/or visible entrances and all addresses of multi-unit properties are included separately in the notification distribution.

With notification distributions, it is recommended to include a request to avoid using water fixtures, faucets or water-sensitive appliances during the service interruption, and then opening an outside spigot or cold water faucet on the lowest level of the property after service has been restored.

When requested and furnished by the Engineer, post terrace signs as part of the notification distribution. Carefully remove and return all posted terrace signs to the Engineer upon completion of the service interruption.

In the case of an emergency or an unplanned shut-off, notify all affected residents and property owners during or immediately after the water is turned off.

Minimum requirements for all planned shut-offs:

- Provide 2 working days notice to affected water users.
- The shut-off may not begin earlier than 8:00 AM.
- The shut-off may not exceed 8-hours.
- In the event a planned shut-off is anticipated to require more than 8-hours, re-notify all affected water users prior to the expiration of the time limit listed on the original notification.

Perform all shut-offs as proposed in the Contract Documents. The proposed shut-offs are provided for reference purposes to aide planning connection point isolation and preparing water user notification lists for planned outages. Propose any alternative connection methods which differ from the proposed shut-off in accordance with Article 703 – 'Repairs and Alterations'.

Obtain prior authorization from the Engineer and be responsible for all valve turnings. Be properly equipped at all times for doing such work.

Any water service or plumbing problems which arise as a result of either planned or emergency water main shutoffs or any associated work, are the Contractor's responsibility to promptly resolve at no cost to the City or Madison Water Utility.

It is required to close all service valves and/or curb stops at properties without accessible hose spigots or other outside plumbing connections.

### SECTION 703.12.1 DISCOVERY OF LEAD SERVICE LATERALS

Notify the Engineer immediately upon discovery of any active lead service laterals. Do not proceed with the service replacement work until authorized by the Engineer.

Coordinate the replacement of lead service laterals with the property owner and the property owner's plumber. Assume that the property owner may have delays in making the connection to the new copper service. To the extent practical, plan for up to 14 calendar days where the excavation at the curb stop may have to remain open while the old service remains in use. Protect and maintain all excavations throughout this delay with attention to public safety. No additional compensation will be considered due to the impact of this delay or the failure to coordinate with the impacted property owner or plumber.

If authorized by the Engineer, to meet project schedule requirements or weather constraints, the new copper service may be temporarily connected to the existing lead service.

### SECTION 703.15.3 <u>HYDROSTATIC PRESSURE TESTING</u>

Maximum test segment length: 1,200-feet.

Use only clean, disinfected containers and equipment to add make-up water at the end of the pressure testing to return to the original starting pressure of the test. Refill measurements are to be done with a graduated container, measured in ounces.

The Engineer reserves the right to require make-up water be added at any point during the pressure test if the test pressure drops more than 5 psi during the test, which restarts the 2 hour testing duration. Furnish all equipment, labor, and supplies necessary to apply pressure to the pipeline in a manner satisfactory to the Engineer.

### **BID ITEM 90001 - PRUNE TREE**

### **DESCRIPTION**

This bid item includes all work, materials, labor, equipment and incidentals necessary to prune trees as needed to perform the work under this contract without causing damage to the existing trees. There are several trees within the project limits that potentially have limbs hanging out into the work zone; however, due to the location of the tree, City Forestry is unable to perform the pruning prior to construction.

Prior to performing any pruning, the Contractor shall first verify with the Engineer that pruning of the tree is necessary. All pruning work shall be performed in accordance with the City of Madison Standard Specifications Section 209.4(e) and Standard Detail Drawing 2.05. The Contractor shall limit the pruning to only what is absolutely necessary to perform the work under this contract, but the amount of pruning should be sufficient so that no limbs are damaged while performing the work. The pruning on any tree shall be limited to maximum height of 14 ft. The Contractor shall have a certified arborist on site while performing any tree pruning, and the arborist shall direct the pruning activities.

The Contractor shall also note that some species of trees may not be pruned at the time of year that this work is to take place. If the Contractor encounters any of these types of trees, work shall be performed around the tree without any pruning.

### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Prune Tree shall be measured be each tree acceptably pruned.

### BASIS OF PAYMENT

This item, measured as provided above, will be paid for at the contract unit price per square foot, which price shall be payment in full for furnishing all material, labor, tools, equipment, formwork and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

### BID ITEM 90002 - REMOVE, SALVAGE & REINSTALL FENCE

### **DESCRIPTION**

This Bid Item includes all labor, equipment, materials and incidentals necessary to Remove, Salvage and Reinstall Fence at the locations indicated on the plans or as directed by the engineer. Work under this bid item applies to fencing of all materials including chain link, wood, plastic or any other type of fence that may be encountered with this project.

The Contractor shall remove the existing fence, including the posts, without causing any damage to the fencing or posts; if the Contractor causes any damage to the chain fencing or posts, the damaged portions shall be repaired or replaced at no additional cost to the City. Once removed, the Contractor shall store the fence in a secure location from the time it is removed and until it is reinstalled. It is the Contractor's responsibility to ensure that the fencing is not stolen or lost when removed. If stolen, lost or damaged, the Contractor shall replace the fencing at no additional cost to the City.

The Contractor shall re-install the fence in the same manner that it was installed prior to this work. It is advised that the Contractor take photos and measurements of any fence that is removed to verify that the fence is reinstalled in the same manner as prior to construction. It may not be possible to reinstall the fence in the exact same location as prior to construction due to the installation of new sidewalk.

Any area disturbed by this work shall be restored with 4" of topsoil, seed and erosion mat, which shall be paid under the appropriate bid items.

### **METHOD OF MEASUREMENT**

Remove, Salvage and Reinstall Fence shall be measured by the Linear Foot acceptably completed.

### **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

Remove, Salvage and Reinstall Fence, as measured above, shall be paid at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for labor, equipment, hauling, storage and incidentals necessary to acceptably complete the work as described.

### BID ITEM 90003 - REMOVE & SALVAGE FENCE (UNDISTRIBUTED)

### **DESCRIPTION**

This Bid Item includes all labor, equipment, materials and incidentals necessary to Remove and Salvage Fence at the locations indicated on the plans or as directed by the engineer. Work under this bid item applies to fencing of all materials including chain link, wood, plastic or any other type of fence that may be encountered with this project.

The Contractor shall remove the existing fence, including the posts, without causing any damage to the fencing or posts; if the Contractor causes any damage to the chain fencing or posts, the damaged portions shall be repaired or replaced at no additional cost to the City. Once removed, the Contractor shall coordinate with the adjacent property owner to place the fence at a location agreeable to the property owner.

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Any area disturbed by removing the fence shall be restored with topsoil, seed and erosion mat, which shall be paid under the appropriate bid items.

### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Remove & Salvage Fence (undistributed) shall be measured by the Linear Foot acceptably completed.

### **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

Remove & Salvage Fence (undistributed), as measured above, shall be paid at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for labor, equipment, hauling, storage and incidentals necessary to acceptably complete the work as described.

### **BID ITEM 90004 - REMOVE FENCE**

### **DESCRIPTION**

This Bid Item includes all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to Remove Fence at the locations indicated on the plans or as directed by the engineer. Work under this bid item applies to fencing of all materials including chain link, wood, plastic or any other type of fence that may be encountered with this project.

The Contractor shall remove the existing fence, including the posts, and shall remove the fence from the site. All work to remove and dispose of the fence shall be in accordance with Article 203 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications.

Any area disturbed by removing the fence shall be restored with 4" of topsoil, seed and erosion mat, which shall be paid under the appropriate bid items.

### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Remove Fence shall be measured by the Linear Foot acceptably completed.

### **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

Remove Fence, as measured above, shall be paid at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for labor, equipment, hauling, storage and incidentals necessary to acceptably complete the work as described.

### BID ITEM 90005 - REMOVE RETAINING WALL

### **DESCRIPTION**

This Bid Item includes all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to Remove Retaining Wall at the locations indicated on the plans or as directed by the engineer. Work under this bid item applies to walls of most materials including boulder, block, stone or any other type of permanent wall that may be encountered with this project. Removal of small timber walls are not covered under this bid item and removal of those types of walls shall be considered incidental to Bid Item 20101 Excavation Cut.

The Contractor shall remove only the portion of the retaining wall that is necessary to complete the work under this contract. The entire retaining wall is not to be removed unless it is completely in conflict with the sidewalk or other work under this contract. Removal of the retaining wall shall include removal of all materials used in the construction of the wall including any fabric, drain tile or any base material that would not be considered suitable fill. All work to remove and dispose of the retaining wall shall be in accordance with Article 203 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications.

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When removing only a portion of the wall, the Contractor shall take care to remove the necessary portion of the wall while not disturbing the structural integrity, stability or the aesthetics of the portion of the wall that is to remain. Proper removal of a portion of the wall may require salvaging some of the materials of the removed portion of the wall to taper or rebuild the end of the wall to match into the new grade or sidewalk. This work may include some additional excavation, base and fabric placement to maintain the proper structure of the wall. This work shall be performed at the direction of the engineer. Any reconstruction work of the wall shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

Removal of a portion of the wall may also require some additional grading including fill placement and compaction in a manner that will not disturb the portion of the wall that is to remain. Additional grading and sloping work shall be performed as directed by the engineer and shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

Any area disturbed by removal of the retaining wall or a portion there of shall be restored with 4 inches of topsoil, seed and erosion mat, which shall be paid under the appropriate bid items.

### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Remove Retaining Wall shall be measured by the Square Foot of exposed wall that is removed and acceptably completed.

### **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

Remove Retaining Wall, as measured above, shall be paid at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for labor, equipment, hauling, storage and incidentals necessary to acceptably complete the work as described.

### **BID ITEM 90006 – REMOVE PILLAR**

### DESCRIPTION

This Bid Item includes all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to Remove Pillar at the locations indicated on the plans or as directed by the engineer. The Contractor shall first investigate with the engineer to determine if the pillars need to be removed. If possible, the pillars are to remain.

It is expected that the pillars are constructed of concrete and masonry, and the removal shall include removal of any base or foundation materials. The removal of the pillars shall be completed in accordance with Article 203 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications.

There are existing light fixtures on top of the pillars. The Contractor shall remove the light fixtures along with removing and/or abandoning any electrical wiring in accordance with the local electrical codes.

Any area disturbed by removing the pillars shall be restored with 4" of topsoil, seed and erosion mat, which shall be paid under the appropriate bid items.

### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Remove Pillar shall be measured by Each pillar acceptably removed.

### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Remove Pillar, as measured above, shall be paid at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for labor, equipment, hauling, storage and incidentals necessary to acceptably complete the work as described.

### BID ITEM 90160 - LOWER AND INSULATE SERVICE

### DESCRIPTION

In addition to replacing the water services, include additional copper and excavation to lower services where they cross the proposed storm sewer at conflicting elevations. Services include properties along the south right-of-way between STA 16+00-20+00; 24+50-25+50; 35+00-38+00; or as approved by the Engineer.

Install 1 sheet of standard insulation between the copper service and the storm sewer where they cross. The vertical separation between the bottom of the storm sewer and the insulation shall be no less than 6-inches. The vertical separation between the insulation and the copper service shall be no less than 6-inches.

Insulation applied as part of this work will <u>not</u> be additionally compensated through bid item 70101; it is considered incidental to this item.



NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

Scope of Work. The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- Completion Date/Contract Time. Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar
  days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the

  PROVISIONS, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this

- 3. **Contract Price**. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SEVENTY AND 2/100 (\$2,250,970.02)</u> Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

**General and Authorization**. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided unless otherwise noted in Section D: Special Provisions. Subsection 102.10 – Minimum Rate of Wage Scale.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of

materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include pre-apprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

**Establishment of Wage Rates.** The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the

contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

**Hourly contributions.** Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

**Apprentices and Subjourney persons.** Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

**Straight Time Wages.** The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

**Overtime Wages.** The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

**Posting of Wage Rates and Hours.** A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

**Evidence of Compliance by Contractor.** Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the

names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.

b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

**Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate.** If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract. In addition, if DWD finds that a contractor or subcontractor violated the prevailing wage law, DWD will assess liquidated damages of 100% of the wages owed to employees.

**Establishment of Wage Rates.** The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate and DWD prevailing wage requirements are attached hereto as Sec. I of the contract.

5. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

# Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

#### Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

#### Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

#### Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

#### Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

#### Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

#### Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

#### Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

6. Substance Abuse Prevention Program Required. Prior to commencing work on the Contract, the Contractor, and any Subcontractor, shall have in place a written program for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees as required under Wis. Stat. Sec. 103.503.

(10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
- 3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages.
- 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

#### PREVAILING WAGE - Contractors.

Any public works project that has a total estimated project cost that equals or exceeds prevailing wage project thresholds requires a prevailing wage rate determination issued by the Department of Workforce Development (DWD). Public works include erecting, constructing, remodeling, repairing, demolishing, alterations, painting and decorating projects for a local governmental unit or state agency. State law excludes minor service or maintenance work, warranty work, or work under a supply-and-installation contract. There is a statutory definition for most of these exclusions. The prevailing wage laws that apply to local governmental units and their contractors are §§66.0903 and 103.503, Wis. Stats. The prevailing wage laws that apply to state agencies and their contractors are §§103.49 and 103.503, Wis. Stats. The applicable administrative rules for all prevailing wage projects are DWD 290 and DWD 294, Wis. Adm. Code. These laws include provisions that apply to all contractors and subcontractors working on prevailing wage projects.

Any contractor or subcontractor working on a local governmental unit or state agency's public works project that equals or exceeds current prevailing wage project thresholds must do all of the following:

- Receive and review the project's prevailing wage rate determination (i.e., white sheet).
- Tell subcontractors the project is subject to state prevailing wage law and include the prevailing wage rate determination in the construction contract, or if there is no written contract, provide a copy of the project determination to each subcontractor.
- Hire subcontractors who do not appear on the "Consolidated List of Debarred Contractors."
- Have a written substance abuse testing program in place that fulfills the requirements of §103.503, Wis. Stats., before commencing work on the project.

- Notify subcontractors that if DWD finds that a contractor or subcontractor violated the prevailing wage law, DWD will assess liquidated damages of 100% of the wages owed to employees.
- Apply to DWD for subjourney wage rates prior to employing these individuals on the project.
- Receive and retain a completed Affidavit of Compliance from each subcontractor brought on to the project before providing final payment to those subcontractors.
- Submit a completed Affidavit of Compliance to the contractor who brought the subcontractor on to the project before receiving final payment for the project.
- Maintain payroll records for 3 years that comply with §§66.0903(10)(a) or 103.49(5)(a), Stats. and DWD 274.06.
- Respond to requests from DWD or the project owner to provide payroll records and/or respond to prevailing wage complaints filed by employees or third parties.
