You will be asked for a payment subscription preference, since you may wish to bid online someday. Simply choose the method to pay on a 'per bid' basis. This requires no payment until / unless you actually bid online. You can also choose the monthly subscription plan at this time. You will, however, be asked to provide payment information. Remember, you can change your preference at anytime. You will then be able to complete your free registration and have full access to the site. Your free access does not require completion of the 'Digital ID' process, so you will have instant access for viewing and downloading. To be prepared in case you ever do wish to bid online, you may wish to establish your digital ID also, since you cannot bid without a Digital ID.

2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

The Affirmative Action Division maintains a directory of SBEs which are currently certified as such by the City of Madison. Contact the Contract Compliance Officer as indicated in Section 2.2 to receive a copy of the SBE Directory or you may access the SBE Directory online at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may Application access the Targeted Business Certification online www.citvofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.
- 2.4.1.2 Using the City of Madison's directory of certified SBEs to identify SBEs from which to solicit bids.
- 2.4.1.3 Assuring that SBEs are solicited whenever they are potential sources
- 2.4.1.4 Referring prospective SBEs to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division for certification.
- 2.4.1.5 Dividing total project requirements into smaller tasks and/or quantities, where economically feasible, to permit maximum feasible SBE participation.
- 2.4.1.6 Establishing delivery schedules, where requirements permit, which will encourage participation by SBEs.
- 2.4.1.7 Providing SBEs with specific information regarding the work to be performed.
- 2.4.1.8 Contacting SBEs in advance of the deadline to allow such businesses sufficient time to prepare a bid.
- 2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. 5% above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.
- 2.4.1.10 Contacting SBEs which submit a bid, to inquire about the details of the bid and confirm that the scope of the work was interpreted as intended.

2.4.2 Reporting SBE Utilization and Good Faith Efforts

The Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report is to be submitted by the <u>bidder</u> with the bid: This report is due by the specified bid closing time and date. Bids submitted without a completed SBE Compliance Report as outlined below

shall be deemed non-responsible and the bidder ineligible for award of this contract.

- 2.4.2.1 If the Bidder <u>meets or exceeds</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.1.1 **Cover Page**, Page C-6; and 2.4.2.1.2 **Summary Sheet**, C-7.
- 2.4.2.2 If the bidder <u>does not meet</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.2.1 **Cover Page**, Page C-6; 2.4.2.2.2 **Summary Sheet**, C-7; and
 - 2.4.2.2.3 SBE Contact Report, C-8 and C-9. (A <u>separate</u> Contact Report must be completed for <u>each applicable</u> SBE which is not utilized.)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed <u>non-responsible</u> for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the City Engineer and <u>received</u> within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

JOHNS STREET AND EMIL STREET UTILITIES WITH RESURFACING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT CONTRACT NO. 7381

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto:

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below. Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked. If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work: Building or Heavy Construction Sewer, Water, or Tunnel Construction Local Street or Miscellaneous Paving Construction Residential or Agricultural Construction

When multiple boxes are checked, worker's wages may vary according to the type and area of work performed. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine and apply the appropriate wage rate for the specific work assigned.

SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$54,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$264,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

This contract consists of three (3) separate project locations. The work shall consist of replacing sanitary and storm sewer, water main, removing and replacing concrete curb and gutter, sidewalk and drive aprons, excavation cut, crushed aggregate base course and resurfacing the roadway, as noted in the specifications and on the plans.

The Contractor shall view all sites prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

Johns Street – Olbrich Avenue to Cottage Grove Road

Work shall include replacing sanitary sewer main and water main and laterals on the street. Storm sewer inlets and leads as needed. Curb & gutter, drive aprons shall be replaced where defective or necessary to facilitate the utility replacement; street will be

excavated, new 10" crushed aggregate base course consisting of ONLY gradations 2 and gradation 3(top few inches for leveling purposes only) with 3.5" of 12.5 mm, type E-0.3 asphaltic pavement.

Emil Street – Damon Road to west end

Work shall include replacing sanitary sewer main and water main and laterals on the street. Storm sewer inlets and leads as needed. Curb & gutter, drive aprons shall be replaced where defective or necessary to facilitate the utility replacement; street will be excavated, new 10" crushed aggregate base course consisting of ONLY gradations 2 and gradation 3(top few inches for leveling purposes only) with 4.5" of 12.5 mm, type E-0.3 asphaltic pavement.

Badger Yard Storm Improvements – Engineering Operations and Streets West facility

Work shall include installing storm sewer and storm sewer treatment devices within the Engineering Operations/Streets West yard. Asphalt trench patching will be required.

SECTION 104.4 INCREASED OR DECREASED QUANTITIES

The Contractor shall note that some bid item quantities may increase or decrease based on what is encountered in the field. If the actual field conditions vary from the plan quantity, no additional compensation shall be given for increasing or decreasing quantities. Any overruns shall be paid for under the appropriate bid item(s) without any penalty or change to the bid price for the associated bid item. The Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any deletions to the contract. No change to the unit bid price will be allowed for changes to the quantities.

The Contractor shall note that the bid items for sidewalk removal and replacement may increase or decrease based on what is encountered in the field. It was anticipated that 100 SF of sidewalk removal and replacement would be required for each of the sanitary lateral replacements. It is also anticipated that there will be 20' of curb & gutter replaced for each lateral that is replaced with this project.

SECTION 104.10 CLEANING UP

Excess concrete from finishing operations and from spillage on adjacent sidewalk and curb & gutter shall be removed immediately. Excess concrete or mortar from the finishing operation and spillage into SASs and inlets shall be removed immediately.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall use care around existing trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps, driveways and curb that are indicated on the plans to remain. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees, other than those shown on the plan to be removed, shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2.

The Contractor shall maintain access for property owners, mail delivery and garbage/recycling pickup for all properties in the project area. Special coordination for each project location shall be as follows:

Johns Street

Follow Section 107.7 Maintenance of Traffic for all work in Cottage Grove Road.

Emil Street

1405 Emil Street has hours of operation from 8am to 2am daily. Planned water shut offs will be coordinated not to disrupt normal operation of the business. City Engineering has obtained a noise variance for this project location for work to be completed outside normal work hours.

1600 Emil Street will have construction activity for a garage expansion starting during the same time period of this contract. All work shall be coordinated with the garage expansion contractor to complete all work within these contract documents.

Badger Yard Storm Improvements

The Contractor shall coordinate work within this area with Engineering Operations and Streets department to move equipment and material prior to construction. A minimum of five work days notice shall be given before work starts. Coordination shall be the same as above for 1600 Emil Street.

Utility Replacements

Madison Gas & Electric will be installation new gas mains on both street project locations. The proposed locations for gas main replacements are as follows: Johns Street – new 2-inch PE main 3 ft north of existing main, Emil Street – new 4-inch PE main 4 ft north of existing 4-inch steel main. No schedule for this work has been planned.

SECTION 107.1 PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND SAFETY

Access to businesses and commercial driveways shall be maintained at all times. The Contractor shall coordinate with parking lot property owners to maintain access and notify residents of access routes.

The Contractor shall properly barricade and light all work areas. Sidewalk forms, form pins and other items incidental to the work shall not be left or stored on the sidewalk or in the sidewalk area.

If sidewalk exists on both sides of any given block, the Contractor shall complete all repairs and reopen the sidewalk on one side of the block before beginning repairs on the opposite side of the block.

The Contractor shall backfill along both sides of the newly poured sidewalk immediately following removal of the sidewalk forms.

SECTION 107.2 <u>PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY AND PROPERTY OWNERS</u>

Care shall be taken not to disturb property irons, sod areas and retaining walls on private property. Sidewalk forms, form pins and other items incidental to the work shall, at no time, be placed on private property.

SECTION 107.6 <u>DUST PROOFING</u>

The Contractor shall take all necessary steps to control dust arising from operations connected with this contract. When ordered by the Engineer, the Contractor shall dust proof the construction area by using power sweepers and water. Dust proofing shall be incidental with operations connected with this contract.

SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All signing and barricading shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall follow the Traffic Control Plan provided in the plan set to phase construction of the sanitary sewer within Cottage Grove Road.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable Traffic Control Plan, for all other aspects of construction to Tom Mohr, Traffic Engineering Division, tmohr@cityofmadison.com. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The successful bidder shall work with the City Traffic Engineering Division to develop an approved Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall

not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the approved Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The traffic control plan may need to be altered as conditions change in the field or as unexpected conditions occur. This may include relocating existing traffic control or providing additional traffic control. The Contractor shall install and maintain any necessary modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The Contractor may remove parking within the project limits as indicated on the Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall be responsible for posting and maintaining NO PARKING signs in accordance with City of Madison Police Department's "Guidelines for Temporary No Parking Restrictions for Construction or Special Events".

Emil Street and Johns Street may be closed to through traffic, at the project limits, for the duration of the project. Local and emergency vehicle access shall be maintained at all times. Access to all driveways within the project limits shall be provided at all times. Interruption of access to a property, which is necessary for the construction of this project, shall be granted only after discussion with the affected residents and only for times and durations which will minimize impact on the residents.

Badger Yard project work shall not open trenches until 7:30 a.m. and have trenches backfilled between 2:00pm and 3:30pm each workday (Monday-Friday) as necessary for City vehicle departure and arrival from the Streets department garage. The contractor shall have a minimum of three (3) steel plates on-site at all times to provide temporary access for City vehicles within a reasonable time (15 minutes). Steel plates shall also be used to cover structures overnight as needed.

Any work required for waste water pumping on Emil Street to the downtown stream manhole in Fish Hatchery Road shall be discussed during the preconstruction meeting for proper notifications and scheduling. If this work is required, it will take place outside of normal work hours and during non-peak times.

The Contractor shall supply temporary stop signs at any location where permanent stop signs need to be removed.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681, (1) working day prior to placement of the plates.

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

SECTION 107.8 NOTIFICATION WHEN CLOSING STREET

All Contractors shall give the Traffic Engineer (266-4761) notice of their intent to begin work on any street at least seventy-two (72) hours in advance. The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of one (1) working day in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the Contractor removes the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment.

SECTION 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

The Contractor shall notify the Traffic Engineering Field Operations Facility in writing so that the Traffic Engineering Division can install traffic control signs and barricades prior to the opening of the street. Traffic Engineering shall have five (5) working days once the project site is restored with topsoil, seed and mulch to install signs and pavement marking. The Contractor shall maintain his/her traffic control and barricades until the Traffic Engineering Division has completed their work.

SECTION 108.2 PERMITS

The City of Madison has submitted a DNR Notice of Intent (NOI) to obtain coverage under a Construction Site General Permit for the Johns Street and Emil Street projects separately.

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permits by properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Construction Engineer or his designees. This work will be paid for under the appropriate contract bid items or, if appropriate items are not included in the contract, shall be paid for as Extra Work. A copy of the permit is available at the City of Madison, Engineering Division office.

This permit covers trench dewatering to a maximum of 70 gallons/minute from the project, provided appropriate control measures are in place. The City's obtaining this permit is not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction:

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on or before <u>MARCH 16, 2015</u>, weather permitting. The time of completion shall be <u>JUNE 26, 2015</u>.

The Contractor shall note that this project includes an expedited schedule and that the Contractor shall anticipate multiple crews as required to complete the work in the time frame provided and under the traffic restrictions outlined in these provisions:

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer (contact the Construction Engineer at 266-4089). The Contractor shall be required to limit workdays to 7:00 PM and work shall not be performed on holidays.

The Contractor shall phase work for the two different project locations to minimize the road closures. The work shall be phased as follows:

- Emil Street 60 CALENDAR DAYS
- Johns Street 60 CALENDAR DAYS
- Badger Yard Storm Improvements 30 CALENDAR DAYS and shall not begin before <u>APRIL</u> <u>20, 2015</u>. This restriction is weather permitting, due to possible snow plowing operations.

SECTION 109.9 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The fixed daily liquidated damages shall be in accordance to the section 109.9 of the Standard Specifications for failure to complete work within the allotted timeframes for each project location given herein.

BID ITEM 10701 - TRAFFIC CONTROL

BID ITEM 10702 - TRAFFIC CONTROL FOR STORM SEWER INSTALLATION

BID ITEM 10703 - TRAFFIC CONTROL FOR WATER MAIN INSTALLATION

BID ITEM 10704 - TRAFFIC CONTROL FOR SANITARY SEWER INSTALLATION

BID ITEM 10911 - MOBILIZATION

BID ITEM 10912 - MOBILIZATION FOR STORM SEWER INSTALLATION

BID ITEM 10913 - MOBILIZATION FOR WATER MAIN INSTALLATION

BID ITEM 10914 - MOBILIZATION FOR SANITARY SEWER INSTALLATION

Traffic control and mobilization bid items shall be a lump sum bid item for each project location with the contract where applicable. All costs associated with mobilization for the Badger Yard project location will be included in mobilization for storm sewer installation.

BID ITEM 20221 - TOPSOIL

BID ITEM 20701 - TERRACE SEEDING

BID ITEM 21063 - EROSION MATTING, CLASS I, TYPE A - ORGANIC

For the Badger Yard location, restoration shall be limited to no more than 20 ft on either side of the sewer pipe corridor (P-10 – P-13 and S-11 and S-12 along the East alignment, and P-14 – P-16 and S-13 – S-16 along the Far East alignment). For this specific location, all restored areas shall have 6 in of topsoil.

BID ITEM 20336 - PIPE PLUG

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 Edition Article 203.2(c), any pipe found in a trench that is less than 10" in diameter while installing a sewer facility shall be considered incidental to the pipe being installed.

Pipe plugs to be paid under this item: Johns Street 8 – 10" San

Any pipe plugs required to abandon or remove a sewer access structure (pipes directly connected to the structure) shall be considered incidental to abandoning or removing the structure regardless of the size of the pipe being abandoned.

ARTICLE 302 CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER

Concrete curb and gutter at driveway locations as shown in the plan, known to have large truck traffic, shall have three (3) one-half (1/2) inch round epoxy coated reinforcing rods extending throughout the gutter pan. The curb in this street segment shall be paid by bid item 90001 Type "A" Modified Concrete Curb & Gutter.

ARTICLE 403.21 REMOVE AND REPLACE CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER- RESURFACING

Most of the curb and gutter will be standard TYPE A curb and gutter. If the Contractor encounters curb on gutter that is not the typical TYPE A curb and gutter, they will be required to remove and replace in kind, unless directed otherwise by the Engineer, at no additional cost or compensation.

BID ITEM 40391 - REMOVE AND REPLACE 5 INCH CONCRETE SIDEWALK - RESURFACING

Remove and Replace 5 Inch Concrete Sidewalk – Resurfacing shall include the removal and replacement of concrete sidewalk in front of the Streets Department public and employee entrance (1501 W Badger Road) as necessary for the installation of structures S-11 and S-12, tapping of T-2 and T-3, installation of P-10, P-11, P-12, and P-13, and cutting and plugging of the existing 30" RCP between AS 4665-018 and AS 4665-017

SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

Johns Street

Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 1,120 feet of new 15" PVC SDR 26/35/AWWA C900, and 820 feet of sanitary sewer lateral SDR 26/35 at locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Emil Street

Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 1,100 feet of new 8" PVC SDR 35 and 150 feet of sanitary sewer lateral SDR 35 at locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include Neenah R-1550 castings with the new City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16) of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 ed. All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All existing main connections shall be field cored to accommodate existing conditions and shall be compensated under BID ITEM 50791 SANITARY SEWER TAP. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during the installation of a structure shall be replaced by the Contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish.

Contractors shall have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal. Each sanitary lateral shall have a maximum of 4 sidewalk squares removed and replaced. No additional compensation shall be awarded beyond this amount for the replacement of a sewer lateral. If laterals called for reinstatement on the plans are to be plugged under the direction of the engineer on-site, contractors are required to use a sonde device to confirm that the laterals are not active.

All sanitary sewer laterals on these projects were located by television inspection of the sewer main and City records from the main.

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation.

STORM SEWER AND SEWER STRUCTURES GENERAL

STORM SEWER GENERAL

Johns Street

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 120 feet of new storm sewer of various sizes ranging from 12" to 15" and approximately 280 feet of 15" cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) at locations shown on the plan and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Emil Street

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 1,020 feet of new storm sewer of various sizes ranging from 12" to 18" at locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Badger Yard

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 825 feet of new storm sewer of various sizes at locations shown on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Reconnection of existing pipes at new or existing structures, or new pipes at new or existing structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

Where a new structure is to be constructed at an existing pipe, it is expected that the contractor shall saw cut the existing pipe in the required location to accommodate the placement of the new structure. If the contractor for his or her convenience deems it more suitable to remove the existing pipe to a full joint, the additional pipe and concrete collar required to reconnect to the new structure stall be the contractor's responsibility and shall not be compensated.

Connection of new pipes to existing structures shall be accommodated with a Storm Sewer Tap - Bid Item 50792.

Precast structures are only allowed where field poured structures are not specifically called for, and no precast structures are allowed until ULO's are completed and approval of the design engineer has been received.

BID ITEM 50202 - TYPE II DEWATERING

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection and dewatering that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation. It is anticipated that with the high groundwater table at the Johns Street project location, that dewatering will be necessary with Point wells. Placing a pump in the trench will be considered Type 1 Dewatering which is considered incidental to the pipe installation.

BID ITEM 50226 - UTILITY TRENCH PATCH TYPE III

In conjunction with standard trench patch payment, trench patch for S-14 shall be paid with an additional 30 feet of trench patch.

BID ITEM 50353 - SANITARY SEWER LATERAL (SDR 26 & SDR 35)

Sanitary sewer laterals shown on the construction plans were located by City television inspection and records only.

Where the existing sanitary sewer laterals are being extended to connect to the new sanitary sewer main (being installed in a different location as the existing main), pipe plugs shall be required to plug the existing sanitary sewer main on both sides of the old lateral location. The pipe plugs shall be considered incidental to the bid price for SANITARY SEWER LATERAL. All work associated with this bid item shall comply with Article 503 of the Standard Specifications.

Per the City of Madison Standard Specifications for sanitary sewer lateral construction on street reconstruction projects, Contractors are encouraged to begin installation of sanitary lateral pipe at the proposed sewer main. If Contractor starts excavation for the lateral at the property line, it shall be at the Contractor's risk. No Utility Line Openings (ULOs) will be granted for the inability to locate the sanitary lateral at the property line. Any extra sidewalk removal will not be compensated to the Contractor looking for an existing sanitary lateral at the property line. Contractors are encouraged to have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal.

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Proposed sanitary lateral locations near trees are subject to change based upon data obtained in the field and property owner involvement. Excavation near trees shall comply with Article 107.13 of the Standard Specifications. If 5 ft of separation from the tree to the excavation cannot be maintained, lateral replacement shall stop at the curb.

Each sanitary sewer lateral shall have a maximum of 4 sidewalk squares and 20' of curb and gutter removed and replaced. No additional compensation shall be awarded beyond this amount for the replacement of a sewer lateral.

BID ITEM 50354 - RECONNECT SANITARY LATERAL

The first 5 feet of pipe shall be included with this bid item regardless of pipe type or fittings used (SDR 35, SDR 26, Ductile Iron or AWWA C900). Beyond 5' shall be paid for separately (Bid Item 50353 SANITARY SEWER LATERAL or Bid Item 90071 SANITARY SEWER LATERAL (PRESSURE)).

The first 5 feet of sewer lateral pipe/ fittings measured from the sewer main shall be considered the reconnect for all sewer lateral reconnections. Lateral connections connecting to sewer access structures shall be paid for separately as a sanitary tap. 5' of lateral pipe is not considered incidental to the sanitary tap connection.

BID ITEM 50390 - SEWER ELECTRONIC MARKERS

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 Edition Section 503.3(c), each sanitary lateral shall have a minimum of two (2) electronic markers with the City providing the Contractor with the required number of electronic markers. For sanitary laterals, which only include the installation of a wye, a marker ball shall be installed directly above the wye connection to the main.

ARTICLE 701 - PROVISIONS FOR WATER INSTALLATION AND ABANDONMENT

WATER MAINS GENERAL

Johns Street

Water work on Johns St consists of installing approximately 1,300-feet of new 8-inch and 6-inch water main between Olbrich Ave and Cottage Grove Rd as shown on the plan and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Emil Street

Water work on Emil St consists of installing approximately 1,000-ft of new 8-inch, 6-inch and 4-inch water main between Damon Dr and the west end as shown on the plan and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Coordination of Service Interruptions

Coordinate all work requiring service interruptions in accordance with the Standard Specifications. Additionally, coordinate and schedule service interruptions with any affected commercial, industrial or business customers to occur at mutually agreeable times which minimize inconvenience to the customers. These connections may be required to occur outside of standard contract hours, as authorized by prior resolution. Service interruption driven work occurring outside of contract hours, as necessary, is considered incidental to the water main construction and no additional compensation will be considered. Notify the Water Utility Engineer and Construction Inspector when scheduling any work outside of approved Contract hours – do not proceed until authorized by the Engineer.

BID ITEM 90001 - TYPE "A" MODIFIED CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary to install TYPE "A" CURB AND GUTTER with reinforcement.

MATERIALS

See sheet D-1 in the plan set for details on materials of this bid item.

CONSTRUCTION

See Sheet D-1 in the plan set for details on construction of this bid item.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

TYPE "A" MODIFIED CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER shall be measured by the installed linear foot.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

TYPE "A" MODIFIED CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER shall be measured as described above which shall be full compensation for all work, materials and incidentals to complete the work as described above.

BID ITEM 90030 - 15" RCP FIELD BEND

DESCRIPTION

Where shown on the drawings, the Contractor shall provide a 15" pipe bend. This bend shall be a field constructed bend.

Where the field poured bend is constructed the bend shall be reinforced with welded wire fabric and shall utilize fiber reinforced concrete in the concrete collar itself.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Individual or multiple precast bend sections that are assembled to provide the total angle required will be measured for payment as a single precast bend. 15" RCP Field Bend shall be measured per unit basis for each bend completed.

8 Inch PVC Storm Pipe shall be used for payment of 8" storm sewer pipe. All material, excavation and bedding shall be in accord with Section 5 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications. Pipe payment shall include any pipe bends necessary.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

8 Inch PVC Storm Pipe shall be by the lineal foot acceptably installed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

8 Inch PVC Storm Pipe shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above which shall be full compensation for all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

BID ITEM 90033 - SCREEN TREATMENT STRUCTURE

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all necessary work, materials, and incidentals necessary to construct the treatment structure with the installation of static tilted "Coanda effect" wedge-wire screens at the location called for in the plan set.

The dimensions of the treatment structure shall conform to those indicated in the construction detail sheets. The wires shall be tilted 5 degrees from a plane perpendicular to the supporting bars, with all wires shall be welded in a workman like manner.

The support bars shall be rectangular in form, and sized and spaced to accommodate the hydraulic loading of up to 2 feet without damage to the screen. The screen material shall be free of weld spatter. The screen assemblies shall be as manufactured by Hydroscreen, 2390 Forest Street, Denver Colorado

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80207 (phone 1-303-333-6071, email rkweir@aol.com) or approved equal. All screen shall be manufactured in a flat condition; screen that is cut and straightened after a cylindrical manufacturing process is not acceptable.

The Contractor shall install the screen according to manufacturer's specifications and guidance and shall be anchored to the concrete on twelve inch centers with 3/8" anchor bolts.

Bidder shall submit the name and qualifications of its screen supplier to the City Design Engineer with its bid for this project. The supplier shall have been in business for a period of a minimum of five years, and have completed at least three similar installations. A minimum of three references, including contact information, shall be supplied to the City Design Engineer with the bid.

Prior to construction, the Contractor shall submit plans and/or details for the screens, including but not limited to mounting and bracing/support information, to the City Design Engineer for approval.

BID ITEM 90034 - HYDRODYNAMIC TREATMENT DEVICE 1

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all necessary work, materials, and incidentals necessary to provide and install a Contech Engineered Solutions LLC Model CDS5678-D at the location called for in the plan set. This device shall have City of Madison standard castings. Castings shall be inset in structure lid.

Installation of the CDS5678-D hydrodynamic treatment device shall be completed in accord with the specifications and guidance provided by the manufacturer of the product. As part of the work required for this item, the Contractor shall coordinate final design of the device with the manufacturer and coordinate all delivery and installation issues.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Hydrodynamic Treatment Device 1 shall be measured as a completed unit upon complete construction of the structure in the field.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Hydrodynamic Treatment Device 1 shall be paid for at the contract price, which shall be full compensation for all work, materials and incidentals to complete the work as explained in the description above.

BID ITEM 90035 - HYDRODYNAMIC TREATMENT DEVICE 2

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all necessary work, materials, and incidentals necessary to provide and install a Contech Engineered Solutions LLC Model CDS5653-D at the location called for in the plan set. This device shall have City of Madison standard castings.

Installation of the CDS5653-D hydrodynamic treatment device shall be completed in accord with the specifications and guidance provided by the manufacturer of the product. As part of the work required for this item, the Contractor shall coordinate final design of the device with the manufacturer and coordinate all delivery and installation issues.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Hydrodynamic Treatment Device 2 shall be measured as a completed unit upon complete construction of the structure in the field.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Hydrodynamic Treatment Device 2 shall be paid for at the contract price, which shall be full compensation for all work, materials and incidentals to complete the work as explained in the description above.

BID ITEM 90036 - 8' X 8' STORM SAS WITH WEIR

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all necessary work, materials, and incidentals necessary to construct an 8'x8' storm sewer access structure with a concrete bypass weir at the location called for in the plan set.

The dimensions of the structure shall conform to those indicated in the construction detail sheets. Included with this item shall include all materials for building the structure including: concrete, epoxy-coated rebar reinforcement, clear stone, and heavy riprap filter fabric. Cold weather protection (if used) for installation of the structure shall be incidental to the contract. Construction of this structure shall be in accord with Section 507 of the Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 Edition and specified herein.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

8' X 8' Storm SAS with Weir shall be measured as a completed unit upon complete construction of the structure in the field.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

8' X 8' Storm SAS with Weir shall be measured as described above which shall be full compensation for all work, materials and incidentals to complete the work as explained in the description above.

BID ITEM 90037 - REMOVE AND REPLACE CHAIN LINK FENCE

DESCRIPTION

The Contractor shall remove, salvage and reset the chain link fence as needed at the Badger Yard project location. The limits of this work shall be as necessary to install the proposed storm sewer. The bid item will be full compensation for all work necessary including any incidental items to remove, salvage and reset the fence and post to match existing condition.

BID ITEM 90070 - WASTEWATER CONTROL- HEAVY FLOW

Work under this bid item shall include wastewater control (bypass pumping of the sewer being replaced) in the amount of 450 gpm. If the Contractor starts excavation for the lateral at the property line, it shall be at the Contractor's risk. No Utility Line Openings (ULOs) will be granted for the inability to locate the sanitary lateral at the property line. Any extra sidewalk removal will not be compensated to the Contractor looking for an existing sanitary lateral at the property line. Contractors are encouraged to have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal.

Proposed sanitary lateral locations near trees are subject to change based upon data obtained in the field and property owner involvement. Excavation near trees shall comply with Article 107.13 of the Standard Specifications. If 5 ft of separation from the tree to the excavation cannot be maintained, lateral replacement shall stop at the curb.


Each sanitary sewer lateral shall have a maximum of 4 sidewalk squares and 20' of curb and gutter removed and replaced if the sidewalk and curb are not being called for replacement with the street portion of the project. No additional compensation shall be awarded beyond this amount for the replacement of a sewer lateral.

Sanitary Sewer Lateral (Pressure) shall be measured by the linear foot of pipe in accordance with Section 503.4 of the standard specifications.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Sanitary Sewer Lateral (Pressure) shall be measured as described and shall be paid at the contract unit price for all materials, labor, equipment and incidentals necessary to acceptably complete the work as described.

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

- 2. Completion Date/Contract Time. Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED NINETY-FOUR THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY AND 40/100</u> (\$1,594,980.40) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided unless otherwise noted in Section D: Special Provisions, Subsection 102.10 – Minimum Rate of Wage Scale.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the

contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done. but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourney persons. Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the

names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.

b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

5. Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.

3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

- (a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.
- 2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
- 3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages.

 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party
- and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

BUILDING OR HEAVY CONSTRUCTION TO THE SECOND OF THE SECOND

includes sheltered enclosures with walk-in access for the purpose of housing persons, employees, machinery, equipment or supplies and non-sheltered work such as canals, dams, dikes, reservoirs, storage tanks, etc. A sheltered enclosure need not be "habitable" in order to be considered a building. The installation of machinery and/or equipment, both above and below grade level, does not change a project's character as a building. On-site grading, utility work and landscaping are included within this definition. Residential buildings of four (4) stories or less, agricultural buildings, parking lots and driveways are NOT included within this definition.
