On October 9th the architectural team (MSR Designs) that the City of Madison has hired to do pre-design work for the possible remodeling of Madison Municipal Building (MMB) and City County Building (CCB) will be in town to continue their work.

The City would like to schedule a focus group meeting with members of the Homeless Issues Committee and the Homeless Consortium.

The purpose of the focus group would be to discuss issues related to this design project and issues that may be of concern by the Homeless Issues Committee Members and The Homeless Consortium.

The discussion may include discussing possible remodeling options at MMB and CCB and how they impact the homeless population and service delivery.
