Our Goal

for each eligible voter to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted

April Election

- Prepared for 100% turnout
- Absentee numbers are about half what they were last April
- Absentee numbers are about one-quarter what they were in 2020



Last April

- Two-vote difference in an Alder race on Election night with two provisional ballots
- One provisional counted at canvass
- Recount ended in a tie



Presidential Preference

1. Pick a party

Presidential Preference Vote Choose a party in which to vote Fill in the oval next to your party

choice, like this: • . Choose only 1.

2. Vote for one candidate within that party

Presidential Preference Vote

In the Presidential Preference Vote:

- You may vote for only ONE candidate.
- · You may vote in only ONE party.
- If you choose a party, votes cast in that party will be counted.
 Votes cast in any other party will not be counted.
- If you do not choose a party and you vote in more than one party, no votes will be counted.

Special Instructions for Presidential Preference Vote

Choose the party in which you will vote. Within the party you have chosen, you have ONE of three choices:

1. Vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot in the party you have chosen.

2. Vote for an uninstructed delegation from Wisconsin to the national convention of the party you have chosen.

3. Write the name of another person to become the presidential candidate of the party you have chosen.

Fill in ONE oval in ONE party.

Only a Party Selected

- Tabulator will accept ballot
- Party designation will be counted
- No candidate for president gets a vote
- Other offices on ballot will be counted

- We may not select a party on behalf of an absentee voter

- Back-up ballot in case official ballot does not arrive in time

A and B Ballots

- Set aside "A" Ballots for the end of the night
- Count the "A" Ballot if we did not count a "B" Ballot for that voter

MPD De-Escalation Training

- Distance and time help resolve situations
- It's hard to maintain agitated state for a long time
- Simply moving a big step away can completely disrupt plans to attack
- Don't let the person be between you and the exit



MPD De-Escalation Training

- Minimize distractions
- Barriers (table, chair) can help avoid attacks
- Have a second official stand behind you
- Don't turn your back on person
- Establish a code word/phrase to have someone call or text 911



Guidance from MPD

- If someone if following you, proceed to a well-lit area (not home) and call 911
- Provide detailed description (car color, make, license plate, person operating car)

- Clearly marked
- Automatic door, bell call, or greeter at door
- Path free of obstacles
- Rugs securely fastened or removed

Van-Accessible Parking Space



Name & Address

- Voters not able to state name & address may have someone else state it for them
- May present name & address in writing for poll worker to announce



Signing Poll Book

- Exempt from signing if unable to do so because of a physical disability
- "Exempt by order of inspectors" in signature box



Accessibility Tools

- Signature guides
- Magnifying sheet
- Pen and paper
- Seating for voters unable to stand in line




Accessible Booth

Legs at least 36 inches apart in the front



ExpressVote

- Turning radius of 5 feet by 5 feet
- Table 28 to 34 inches high
- 36 inches wide for approach
- Privacy screen
- Voter using mobility device should not have to ask for a chair to be moved away



ExpressVote

- Large print
- High contrast
- Touch screen
- Spanish translation



ExpressVote

- Braille keypad unfasten Velcro
- Option to hide screen
- Volume and tempo control
- Compatible with sipand-puff devices



Voter Privacy



Braille Ballots

- Voter may request that Clerk's Office send a braille ballot to the polls, or through the mail as an absentee
- Remade by poll workers



Assistance Marking Ballot

- Voter may have anyone assist them in marking the ballot, other than their employer or union representative
- Documented on poll book, "Assisted by" and then name & address of assistant
- Assistant signs the ballot

Certification of Voter Assistance

I certify that I marked or read aloud this ballot at the request and direction of a voter who is authorized under Wis. Stat. §6.82 to receive assistance.

Signature of assistor

Communication

- Speak directly to the voter rather than their assistant or interpreter
- Do not shout
- Interaction with voter should not make them feel like an inconvenience



People-First Language

- Put the person before the disability because the disability does not define the person
- Voters with disabilities" rather than "disabled voters"



Be Patient

- Be considerate of the extra time it may take a voter to complete a task
- Don't assume that the voter needs your help
- Remember, not all disabilities are visible



Disabilities Affecting Speech

- Provide unhurried attention
- Do not try to complete their sentences
- Do not interrupt
- Ask for clarification if needed



Visual Impairments

- Greet voter by letting them know who and where you are
- If voter requests assistance walking, allow them to take your arm and let them know as you approach steps, inclines, or turns



Hearing Impairments

- Maintain eye contact
- Your facial expressions, gestures, and body movements help communicate
- Do not shout or speak in voter's ear
- Pen and paper may help



Mobility Devices

- A mobility device is part of a voter's personal space
- Do not touch a mobility device unless voter asks you to do so



Service Animals

- Do not pet or interact with the animal
- The service animal is working and should not be interrupted



Dementia

- Voter may look confused or lost, repeat questions, or have difficulty communicating
- Help them focus by making eye contact
- Speak slowly and clearly
- Pause between sentences
- Give time to respond



Communicating with Voters who may have Dementia

- There are enough people living with dementia in Wisconsin to fill Lambeau Field & American Family Park
- May look confused or lost, repeat questions, or have difficulty communicating
- Help them focus by making eye contact
- Speak slowly and clearly



Communicating with Voters who may have Dementia

- Pause between sentences
- Rephrase
- Give time to respond



Do

- Reduce distractions
- Point to help them understand
- Put directional signs at eye level
- Reassure
 - It's okay.
 - Take your time.
 - I'm here to help.



Airport Analogy

- Picture yourself in a busy airport in another country where you don't speak the language.
- How do you feel?
- That is how a person with dementia might feel in the polling place
