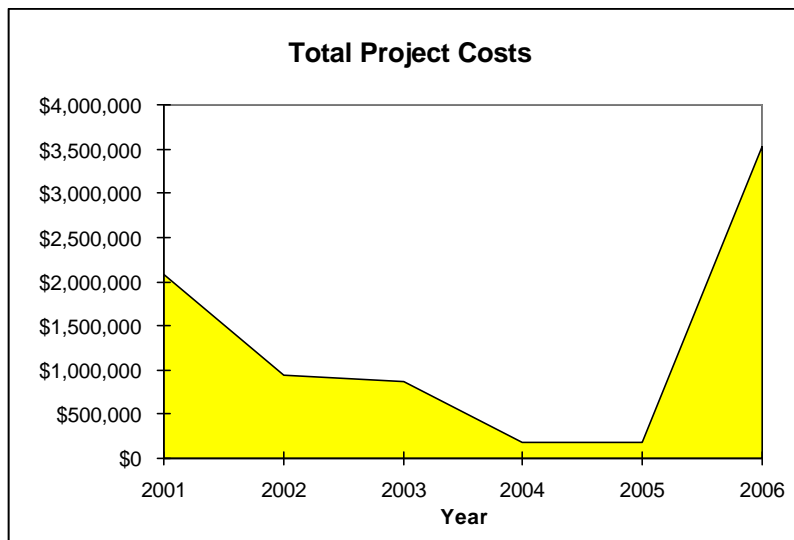

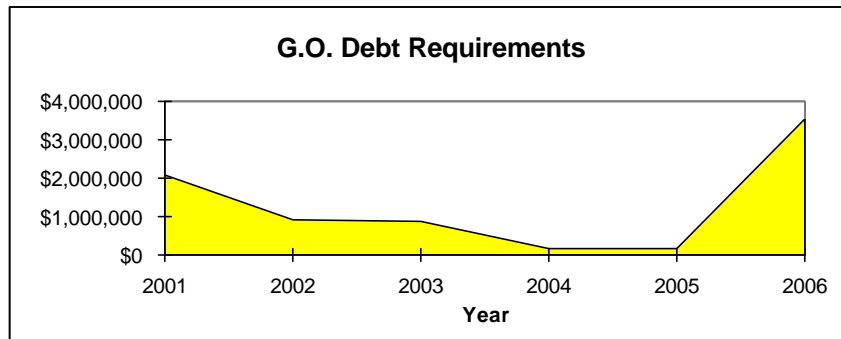

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## Capital Budget

### Fire

#### Fire Equipment

Project No. 1 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 70,000 This project includes: 1) Continual upgrading program for outdated or damaged breathing  
(O) 0 apparatus along with necessary equipment to test for certification requirements. 2)  
\$ 70,000 Replacement of equipment carried on trucks for emergency response use such as  
extrication tools, air bags, ventilation equipment, and emergency medical equipment. Current  
equipment needs replacement due to age and advancement in technology. An example of  
the age of equipment is the air bags, which are approximately 20 years. 3) Ongoing  
replacement program for fire hose, accessories and testing equipment.

#### Protective Gear

Project No. 2 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 125,000 Firefighter protective gear should be replaced every ten years. The plan is to purchase one  
(O) 0 set for every firefighter over three years; this is the second year of the plan. The worn-out  
\$ 125,000 second set will be taken out of service, and their primary set will become the backup set.  
The Department has purchased new gear only as necessary for newly hired firefighters and  
to replace damaged gear.

#### New Stations

Project No. 3 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 450,000 Fire Management and Labor have worked closely with the Department of Planning and  
(O) 0 Development and Engineering Division to analyze data on response times and territorial  
\$ 450,000 needs to identify sites for new stations. They recommended construction of three stations  
to address growth for the Northeast, Far West and Southeast areas of the City. The Fire  
Department is directed to establish a team to consider alternative facility designs and service  
delivery options (including peak time staffing) to address future service demands created by  
the changing needs of our growing City. The team will consist of representatives of Fire  
Department management, Local 311, the Mayor's Office and Comptroller's Office. Staff from  
Planning and Development and Information Services will provide support. The team will  
prepare a report that includes recommendations for design and location of the three stations  
anticipated for the future. The report should be submitted to the Common Council by June  
30, 2001.

Funds are provided in 2001 to purchase land for a Northeast and a Southeast station; the Far West Public Works site is available for a Far West station. (The land parcel purchased for the relocation of Station No. 2 on Grand Canyon Drive is no longer a good site for improving response time and, as a result, can be sold.) Some funding is included in 2003 in anticipation of a small, innovative facility which would house an engine company, to be moved from a station which currently has an engine and a ladder company. Funds for design and construction of an additional station are included in 2006.

#### NFPA 1500 Equipment

Project No. 4 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 0 The Fire Department is not in compliance with the National Fire Protection Association  
(O) 0 (NFPA) standards for equipment in fire stations to address the physical conditioning of  
\$ 0 employees to maximize job performance standards.

**General Building Improvements**

Project No. 5 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 300,000
  - (C) 0
  - \$ 300,000
- Older buildings must be upgraded to address deterioration and today's needs. In addition, the diverse work force has created needs for accommodations in the fire stations. Funding provided will allow the Department to prioritize these improvements each year after consultation with City Inspection personnel who have expertise and responsibility for maintaining Fire buildings. Funding is needed for improvements such as dormitory partitioning; window replacement due to age and inability to repair; bathroom, kitchen, locker room, study area and office remodeling; tile and/or carpet replacement; exterior building, plumbing, heating and cooling system improvements; pavement and roof replacement; and other necessary building improvement projects.

**Communications Equipment**

Project No. 6 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 1,108,000
  - (C) 0
  - \$ 1,108,000
- This is the third year of a four-year Citywide \$7.68 million Public Safety radio system replacement/upgrade. In 1999, \$1.14 million was provided for the digital infrastructure completed in 2000. A new eastside tower facility was planned for the first year but has been delayed until June 2001 when Water Utility completes an east Water Tower site. In 2000, \$2.3 million was provided to upgrade City facilities, contract for factory construction, set up and test the entire Police-Fire integrated radio system for seven City towers and the 911 dispatch interface. In 2001, \$2.41 million will include the delivery, installation and testing of the system and migration of all Fire Department field equipment to the new system. In 2002, \$1.76 million will cover the migration of all Police Department field radios. The main purpose is to meet the needs of geographic expansion, technology upgrades, equipment age of 10-15 years, provide better radio coverage in buildings and meet upcoming FCC technology requirements for radio systems.

**Maintenance Facility**

Project No. 7 Fund No.

- (B) \$ 25,000
  - (C) 0
  - \$ 25,000
- The Fire Department has responsibility for the Fire Maintenance Facility building, which is under the direction of Motor Equipment. Funding is provided for improvements in the exhaust system, steps and lube system.
