Thank you for your cooperation during the Badgers 2008 Football Season. Breese Terrace will once again be controlled 5 hours prior to 2009 game times to one hour after the conclusion of the game. The home opener is scheduled for September 5th with a 6:00pm kickoff and the hours for use of Breese Terrace are listed below. We continue to need your understanding, patience and cooperation as our nation remains under a yellow Homeland Security status.

You will again see an increased police presence in your neighborhood, especially along Breese Terrace, Summit Ave, Hoyt St, Chadbourne Ave, University Ave, and Regent St. There has also been security measures added that will hopefully increase safety at Camp Randall Stadium and in your neighborhood. Traffic flow will be restricted on Breese Terrace on game day. Procedures for the football games this season under a yellow alert are as follows:

5 hours prior to kickoff to one hour following the game – Breese Terrace: Entrance to Breese Terrace will be restricted to the Regent St. intersection. All vehicles entering Breese Terrace will be subject to search. A police canine unit will be stationed at this location to conduct exterior checks of vehicles. These canines only detect explosives. Occupants will not have to exit their vehicle during these checks. If a canine unit is not available, vehicles will need to be checked by police personnel. Those entering Breese Terrace will be asked to show verification that you are a resident or have a parking contract on Breese Terrace. Traffic on Breese Terrace will be one way from Regent St to University Ave. If you need to exit during this period, you will need to do so, (northbound), to the University Ave. intersection.

The 1600 blocks of Hoyt St, Chadbourne Ave, and Summit Ave: Access will be via Lathrop. You will not be able to access Breese Terrace from Hoyt, Chadbourne or Summit. Only residents and those with parking contracts will be allowed in the 1600 blocks of these streets, until one hour after the game. Vehicles entering Chadbourne Ave and Summit Ave will not be subject to search. Vehicles entering Hoyt St. will be subject to search as outlined above.

One hour prior to and following the game: Due to the large numbers of pedestrians using Breese Terrace before and after the game, we ask that you not drive on Breese Terrace during these times. We would ask that you advise anyone with a parking contract along Breese Terrace to be parked at least one hour prior to game time.

We want to thank you in advance for assisting us in enhancing your neighborhood's security. We also appreciate your feedback from last season's security plan and your input was taken into consideration as we planned this event. Our current plan, we believe, matches with the National yellow threat alert. In the event the National or local threat level changes, our plan will be adjusted to match the new level.
