

Voter Checklist

- Register to Vote — three options:
 1. Through a Special Registration Deputy at least 20 days in advance – no proof of address required
 2. Clerk's Office within 20 days of election with proof of address
 3. Election Day with proof of address
- Find out where you vote by going to <https://vpa.wi.gov>
- Bring ID to the Polls
- Bring proof of enrollment to the Polls if using your WisCard as ID
- Share this information with your friends and neighbors

Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m.

Voting in Madison as a UW Student



Our goal is for all eligible voters to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted.

Registering to Vote

No proof of address is necessary if you register with a Special Registration Deputy (SRD) at least 20 days before an election.

Many Teaching Assistants and faculty members are SRDs, as are all City of Madison librarians.

Within 20 days of an election, the only place you can register to vote is in the City Clerk's Office with proof of address. You cannot register to vote the Saturday, Sunday, or Monday before the election.

On Election Day you can register to vote at your polling place with proof of address.

When registering on Election Day or within 20 days of an election, you need to present an acceptable document to prove your address.

You can no longer prove your address by having a roommate or neighbor vouch for you.

Acceptable proof of address

Must show name at current address

- ★ WisCard if on certified list for UW-owned student housing other than Eagle Heights (must give UW Housing permission to include you on this list)
- ★ Utility bill: water, electric, cable, phone, or cell phone
- ★ Government document, such as tuition statement with your Madison address (see *Updating Tuition Address* on right)
- ★ Residential lease
- ★ WI driver's license/state ID card
- ★ Bank statement or paycheck

Photo ID

Voters must present an acceptable form of photo ID. **Your photo ID does not need to show your current address.**

Acceptable forms of photo ID

- ★ Unexpired UW Voter Identification Card with proof of current enrollment
- ★ Wisconsin driver's license/ID card*
- ★ U.S. passport*
- ★ Military ID card*
- ★ Certificate of naturalization issued within last 2 years
- ★ Unexpired Wisconsin driver's license or state ID receipt
- ★ ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin

**May not have expired earlier than the last November election (11/2/2010).*

UW Voter Identification Cards

UW-Madison will issue free Voter Identification Cards at Union South beginning January 23, 2012, to students who do not have a Wisconsin driver's license/ID card.

When using a UW Voter Identification Card for voting, you also need to present proof of current enrollment.

Proof of enrollment examples

- ★ Enrollment verification form printed on demand from the Student Center in MyUW
- ★ Printout of your current tuition bill or class schedule from my.wisc.edu
- ★ Sticker on your WisCard that you get each semester for being a member at the SERF or Natatorium
- ★ Your signed ASM bus pass for the current semester

Updating Tuition Address

1. Log into my.wisc.edu
2. At the top of the page, click the link *Student Center*.
3. When the *Student Center* window appears, scroll down until you see the section titled *Personal Information*. In the *Contact Information* box, click the link for *mailing address* or *home address* as appropriate.
4. Click *edit* next to your address and enter your updated information.

Note: it may take a day or more for your change of address to update on your tuition bill. If this is a problem, you may print out the *Student Center* screen showing your current address. Only one of the addresses needs to show your Madison address, so you may still choose to have your tuition bill mailed to your parents' house.

Printing Tuition Statement

1. Log into my.wisc.edu.
2. Click *Student Center* at top of page.
3. When *Student Center* window appears, look in the *Finances* section under the heading *My Account*, and click *View eBill/Make ePayment*.
4. Click again at the bottom right of the page where it says *View eBill/Make ePayment*. Make sure your browser allows pop-up windows.
5. You should now be on the Tuition Account eBill/ePayment page. In the section titled *Your Published eBills* you can choose to view all of your past bills (by clicking the *view all* link) or to view your most recent bills that appear in order in that section.
6. Your bill opens as a PDF file and you can print it right from that page.
