RE: MINUTES for the Madison Area Municipal Storm Water Partnership Meeting

Underlined names above were present at the meeting

1. *Effect of 2011 Wisconsin Act 32 on 40% TSS compliance*

In the current, approved budget, the 40% TSS removal requirement within s. NR 151.13 (2)(b)2., Wis. Adm. Code, for developed urban areas has been removed (20% requirement still exists). However, the Legislature included an anti-back-sliding condition whereby any existing municipal stormwater treatment practices need to continue to be maintained. The Statute elimination of the 40% development urban area standard takes effect immediately, NR 151 language will be updated at some time in the future.

Regulation of commercial building construction sites with respect to erosion control will be moved back out of DNR's jurisdiction, and turned over to the new Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS), once the DSPS program has been set up to manage

the NOI applications. The applicable statutory changes for these 2 issues are given on pages 429 and 430 of Act 32.

2. *Timelines to update municipal ordinances*

DNR will be revising the general MS4 permit, and the revised permit will have a requirement to update ordinances to make them consistent with NR 151, Wis. Adm. Code. The compliance timeline for updating ordinance will likely be along the lines of 2 years. When the general permit is reissued, MAMSWAP permittees will either have their permit coverage transferred to a general permit, or modifications will be made to the existing permit language to include a requirement to update ordinances within the same timeframe as those covered under the general permit.

Dane County infiltration ordinance updates from March require immediate implementation, and municipalities should plan to update their own ordinances as soon as possible.

Municipalities can forward proposed ordinance language to both DNR and Dane County Land Conservation staff for review if they so choose.

3. *Rock River TMDL, etc*

The "final" version of the Rock River TMDL Report is currently being reviewed internally at DNR, though there hasn't been any feedback from the current administration as to what the next steps will be, though if the current language is approved, it will likely be sent to EPA for approval.

The UW Extension has held several workshops since Spring 2011 on the Rock River Recovery Plan. There will be a forum on August 10 in Lake Mills to discuss the proposed water quality trading framework. More info here:
