3. NR151, 153, 155 changes:
- a. There will be a hearing in next week in Madison for the proposed changes to the above ordinances. It has been confirmed by DNR staff (since the MAMSWaP meeting) that the original comment deadline of March 12 is still in effect. All comments (written and at hearings) will be reviewed and summarized. The summary will be available from DNR. Municipalities are **encouraged** to send in written comments to DNR by the deadline.
 - b. Comments can be directed to Carol Holden, Central Office, carol.holden@wisconsin.gov
 - c. The transfer of authority from Dept. of Commerce to DNR regarding NOI permits for commercial sites did not carry with it the ability for local authorities (select municipalities) to issue permits. The necessary language for this to occur is not currently included in DNR code. Until this is changed in NR216, local authorities will need to wait for a letter or email from DNR staff regarding impacts to historical sites and endangered resources. The contact at DNR is Jamie Cowles, 608-275-3325, james.cowles@wisconsin.gov. Jamie is an LTE, so if requests to him go unanswered for more than a day, you are invited to contact Eric Rortvedt or Laura Madsen.
 - d. One specific proposed change to NR151 may have significant impact to street reconstruction projects. The definition of "minor reconstruction" is proposed to be changed. As it is defined currently, it exempts most street reconstruction projects from needing to meet the 40% TSS removal post-construction. The proposed revision would not only eliminate the exemption, but it would also increase the required TSS removal to 50%. This is a good time to remind municipalities that they should submit written comments on the proposed changes to DNR by 3/12/2010.
