1. New NR 151 Requirements

Eric Rortvedt reviewed the (proposed) new NR 151 Requirements. He kindly sent along the following info as a summary of his summary:

NR 151 Rule Package

The rule revision package for NR 151, 153, and 155 was sent over to the legislature July 6th for assignment to committee. They have 10 working days to complete the assignment to committee. The committee has 30 days to review the rules and may request that the agency meet with the committee or they may hold hearings on the rule. They can also request DNR to make modifications to the rule. The final documents under review by the legislature have been posted on the Wisconsin Administrative Rules web site at this location: <https://health.wisconsin.gov/admrules/public/Rmo?nRmold=1703>

UPDATE: The Legislature Senate and Assembly held hearings on this rule package in the last week of July but DNR has not yet received legislative feedback yet.

NR 151 changes with respect to erosion control and stormwater management as follows:

- Sediment control standard is changing from 80% control to 5 tons/acre-year with a 2 year implementation delay after the revised rule becomes effective (likely this fall). The hope is to have RUSLE2 model ready for when the 5 ton/ac-yr standard becomes effective.
- Revised post-construction standard apply to NOIs received after the rule becomes effective.
- Currently an exemption from post-construction standard exists for sites with no increase in parking lot and road area. This exemption is to be removed.
- The TSS reconstruction standard is proposed to be 40% and applied to parking lot and roadway areas (not 50% as was proposed in DNR's earlier Jan/Feb proposal).
- Definition of "minor reconstruction" for transportation facilities has been revised such that reconstruction that changes a vegetated conveyance system to a non-vegetated system will no longer qualify as minor reconstruction. Therefore, road reconstruction will be subject to the 40% TSS post-construction standard where vegetated conveyance systems change to a non-vegetated system.
- Infiltration standards restructured based on Connected Imperviousness (CI) as follows:
 - CI < 40% then 90% annual average infiltration maintained.
 - 40% < CI < 80% then 75% annual average infiltration to maintained.
 - CI > 80% then 60% annual average infiltration maintained.
- Infiltration exemption and exclusions were restructured based on whether source of runoff is from a potentially contaminated source, area may pose a concern with impacting groundwater, and whether area is exempt for other reasons.
- MS4 developed urban area standard (NR 151.13) of achieving 40% TSS control by March 2013 remains. However, rule acknowledges challenges in achieving the standard by 2013 and will have an extended compliance timeline of 10 years to meet the standard provided the municipality has a plan to achieve 40% TSS control in the short time possible which is feasible and cost effective.
- Regional Treatment Exclusion (NR 151.003) - The rule will no longer allow stormwater treatment credit for new stormwater basins placed within a perennial navigable water of the state. The proposed rule will allow stormwater treatment ponds for existing developed areas to be place within intermittent navigable waters where DNR ch. 30 permits are granted.

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UPDATE: Rock River TMDL Public Information Hearing is tentatively scheduled for Tues., Sept. 28th from 12:30pm to 4pm at the Lake Mills Municipal Building. Expect TMDL report to be release for public review by early September.

A question was asked about the possibility for pollutant trading. The first Rock River TMDL pollutant trading agreement has been created between Town of Middleton and the City of Verona. Dane County has also shown interest in pursuing the idea.

2. Item 2 was included prior to discussion of the revised definition for “minor reconstruction”. In previous versions, the length of road considered minor was much shorter than in the current version, and would impact most street reconstructions. As it is currently defined, most street reconstructions should still be exempt, unless curb and gutter are being added to an unimproved section of road.
