Details	<p>On 6/22/2012, at approximately 11:26am, Madison Police responded to a weapons offense that occurred in the 1100 block of E. Wilson Street. Officers were told that a male subject had produced a gun in a conflict, and was still inside the residence when they arrived. The suspect, later identified as Farhan Parekh, owned a silver Crossfire and while officers were talking to the complainant (Brandon Gabrielse), the vehicle started to leave the residential complex.</p> <p>Officer pursued the vehicle, and made a high risk felony stop near the 10 block of N. Ingersoll Street. Farhan was ordered from the vehicle at gun point, and after a search of the car, a FNH 9mm handgun was located inside of a bag. Farhan immediately pointed out that he did hold a concealed carry permit issued by the State of Wisconsin, and suggested that his detention by police constituted an illegal arrest!</p> <p>Police investigated this matter further, and determined that Farhan pointed the handgun at Gabrielse after an intimate interlude had been interrupted between Farhan and Gabrielse's 24-year-old ex-girlfriend. Tempers flared, and Gabrielse demanded Farhan leave his residence immediately, as he felt he had been disrespected in his own home. Farhan drew his weapon and chambered a round of ammunition. Gabrielse quickly fled the residence, but punched/damaged a door before leaving both Farhan and ex-girlfriend in his home. Both males were arrested on charges listed above, and conveyed to The Dane County Jail.</p> <p>People should be reminded that The Wisconsin Department of Justice does</p>
