- II. Review and Approval of Hiestand Implementation Strategy, Common Council Resolution and Adoption Schedule** **30 Minutes**
- Hiestand Neighborhood Plan/Implementation Strategy will be introduced to the Madison Common Council for adoption as part of the City of Madison Comprehensive Master Plan. During the adoption process, at least *six* City Boards and Commissions (Plan Commission, Board of Public Works, CDBG Commission, Parks Commission, Ped/Bicycle/Motor Vehicle Commission, and Board of Estimates) will review the plan recommendations for approval. Neighborhood representation is expected at these meetings.
- III. Neighborhood Plan Implementation** **60 Minutes**
- The Hiestand Neighborhood Plan is an advisory document for initiating, directing and managing change within the neighborhood. Inclusion of neighborhood improvement projects in the capital or operating budgets, work plans, or other sources of funding from state or federal governments are possible ways to implement plan recommendations.
- **Discussion of Community Development Block (CDBG) Grant Projects** by Nancy Dungan, CDBG Office. At the end of the planning process, Hiestand Neighborhood will receive \$126,300 to implement eligible improvement projects. Ms. Dungan will discuss possible projects with you.
  - **Discussion of Traffic-Related Neighborhood Plan Recommendations** by Bonnie Schmidt, Safe Community Coalition, will be available to briefly discuss how their group is ready to work on a priority project with the Hiestand Neighborhood. (See enclosed information).
- IV. Update on Neighborhood Planning Grant Funding** by Sue Hankes. **15 Minutes**
- The Hiestand Neighborhood Association applied for City monies to help fund neighborhood projects.

- Public Informational Meeting on the proposed pedestrian/bicycle route along the drainage way. Engineering and Traffic Engineering want to gauge the support of affected property-owners. We will need to talk about a process to provide accurate information and garner support for this priority plan recommendation.
