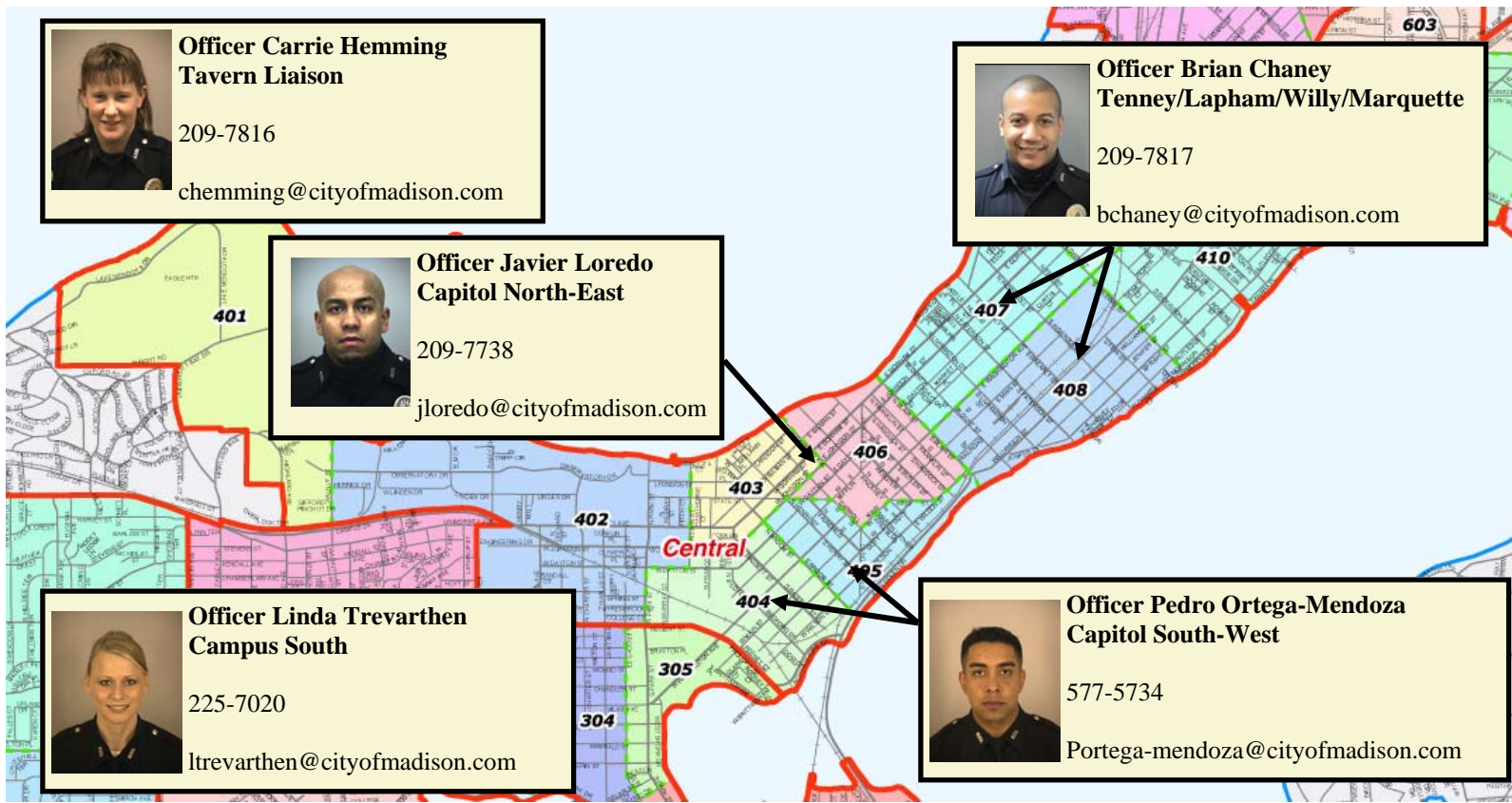

Each Madison Police District has a full-time community policing team, or CPT. The community policing teams do not generally respond to calls for service; instead, they focus pro-actively on problems and issues in the district. Their focus can vary depending on crime patterns and other trends in the district. The teams also focus on traffic enforcement, problem-solving and community outreach. A typical week for a CPT officer can include executing a drug-related search warrant, performing a traffic enforcement project, attending a community meeting, conducting surveillance or looking for a wanted person.

Each community policing team officer is assigned a geographic portion of the district (reflected above). The officers are responsible for monitoring crime patterns and neighborhood issues within their area.
