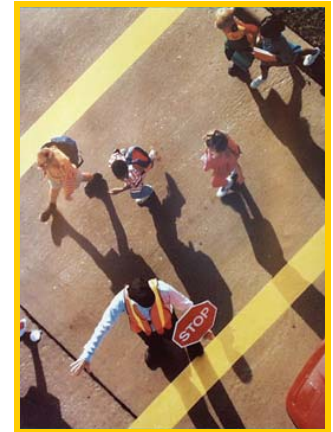
## Here They Come.....Pedestrian Safety



Starting soon schools for those of all ages will be welcoming back people as the fall term begins. The Central District does have elementary level students in our district, and I would like to ask all drivers to *slow down* in all school zones. The mixture of increased vehicle traffic and pedestrian traffic can be done safely if we are all

The moving safely into the roadway message is one for all of us regardless of age. Police refer to this problem behavior as *sudden pedestrian movement*, or darting into traffic. It simply does not give a motorist enough time to slow or stop and is a contributor to pedestrian-related errors that contribute to crashes. Even if you are not darting, be aware that ordinary every-day objects can block a motorist's view of a pedestrian. Watch for vehicles to stop before you step in front of them. Common obstructions downtown include multiple lanes of traffic, buildings that come to the edges of sidewalks, or shrubberies.

For those in the cars, stop and yield for pedestrians in crosswalks. The law requires it but common courtesy demands it.

You can expect to see officers in the school zone areas as they continue to encourage compliance with existing traffic regulations, as well as the parking and drop-off regulations around the schools.

We can all do our part starting with parents reviewing pedestrian safety strategies with your young children, encouraging the use of school crossing zones that are staffed by crossing guards, and reinforcing moving safely into the roadway from a sidewalk.
