New Analysts Hired

The Madison Police Department has hired two new analysts to work with data on crimes and larger scale problems.

They have already begun to meet with district captains at a regularly scheduled meeting to discuss crime trends and patterns. This broad discussion can then lead to more detailed analysis based on observations by command staff or the analysts.

Crime analysis, mapping and in-depth problem evaluation have proven their value in MPD, with countless examples of how the careful use of analyzed data can be used by managers to direct resources. This started with the in-depth look at the role of alcohol in crime statistics in the downtown area back in 2004.

Both men work out of the City-County Building, so say hello if you see them in the downtown area.

Person Crimes: Batteries

8/1	1:00 am	900 Blk W Johnson	Citizen interjects in domestic between male and female in a vehicle. Citizen gets multiple lacerations and strangled by male suspect. Suspect flees with female and crashes in a rollover. Suspect arrested and charged with Strangulation, DC, Battery, Causing Injury While OWI, 3rd Offense OWI, Reckless Driving, and OAR.
8/2	10:00 pm	10 Blk N Carroll	Two individuals were walking when suspect confronts one of them, subsequently battering victim significantly in the face. Suspect charged with Substantial Battery and DC.
8/10	2:00 am	400 Blk E Wilson	Fight on dance floor led to significant injuries. Suspect charged with Substantial Battery.
8/25	12:00 pm	1000 Blk Williamson	Acquaintance of victim spent the night, left, then returned with drugs. Victim locked suspect out of apartment but he kicked in door. Suspect charged with Burglary and Battery.
8/26	7:02 pm	400 Blk State St	Victim sitting in Peace Park approached by suspect and punched several times. Suspect charged with Battery.

Person Crimes: Robbery

Date	Time	Location	Details
7/31	11:50 am	1100 Blk Spring St	Suspect entered bank, threatened he had a bomb, demanded cash, and fled the bank. Witness followed and confronted suspect who again stated he had a bomb. UW police tracked the suspect and took him into custody. Charged with Robbery and Parole Hold.
8/9	3-4 am	1100 Blk Regent	Victim claims to have been jumped by 7 to 8 men and robbed. Suspects: M/W, 25, 5'7", black ponytail; M/B, 25, 5'7"; M/B, 25 5'11", 215, armed with a black handgun. Wallet removed and then left at scene.

Person Crimes: Sexual Assault

8/3	500 Blk State St	Two females walking home indicated that a male grabbed the buttocks of one on two occasions. Suspect charged with 4th Degree Sexual Assault.
8/10	10 Blk W Dayton	Victim, incapacitated by alcohol, passes out in friend's room who returns to find unknown suspect having sexual contact with victim who is completely unresponsive. Suspect: male Hispanic, 20 to 25, 5'7", dark curly hair.

7/30	8:30 pm	20 Blk E Gorham	Verbal argument between two men escalated into physical fight with one man picking up a knife and threatened to kill the other. Witness blocked suspect from victim and took the knife out of his hand. Suspect charged with DC While Armed.
8/7	9:00 pm	100 Blk N Butler	Argument between male and female led to both becoming armed with knives and threatening each other. Both charged with DC While Armed.
8/12	4:00 pm	1800 Blk Fordem	Disturbance between ex-roommates results in fight. Suspect charged with Physical Abuse of a Child.

Male found hiding in a closet, refused to come out; physical altercation ensued. Female began to physically intervene with efforts to secure male. Altercation resulted in injured officer. Both charged with two counts of Obstructing/Resisting.
8/29	4:28 pm	400 Blk State St	Argument between two homeless men, one found to be carrying and threatening with a knife. Suspect charged with DC While Armed.
