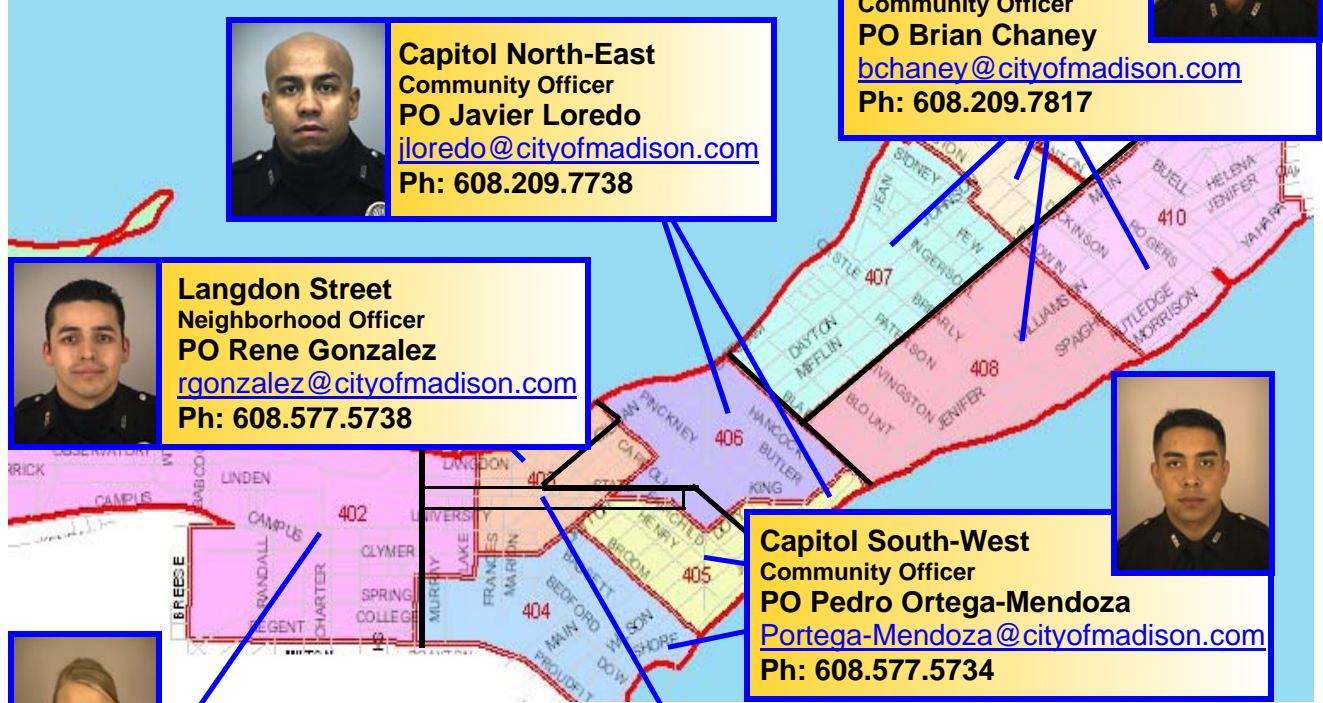

Person Crimes: Batteries

| 12/8 | 2:30 am | 100 Blk W Washington | Officers respond to disturbance. While making arrest, suspect bite an officer. Suspect charged with felony battery. |
| 12/8 | 2:11 am | 100 Blk N Ingersoll | Roommates get into a heated argument after an evening of drinking, and one roommate uses a broken glass that causes a serious cut to the head of the victim. |
| 12/12 | 1:40 am | 400 Blk E Wilson | Disturbance involving fight between two couples resulted in male suspect biting male victim several times. Suspect charged with Substantial Battery. |
| 12/14 | 12:22 am | 400 Blk Washburn | Officers responding to traffic incident are obstructed by suspect who struck out at officers, causing minor injuries to an officer. Suspect charged with Battery to Police Officer. |
| 12/20 | 11:24 am | Marquette School | Suspect struck student and staff. |
| 12/21 | 8:13 pm | 1000 Blk Jenifer | Victim reported being battered by live-in boyfriend. Victim reluctant to cooperate due to fear of suspect. |

| 12/27 | 2:13 am | 400 Blk W Gorham | Officer initially dispatched to subject having difficulty breathing, later determined a physical altercation had taken place between 2 victims and 2 to 4 suspects described as male whites, muscular, shaved heads, white t-shirts who fled from scene. |

Suspect sees victim's wallet, takes it, and removes cash and flees. Suspect: male white, 30, 6'2", 280 pounds, muscular. |
| 12/15 | 7:26 pm | 100 Blk MLK Blvd | Sub shop on MLK was robbed by a male black, 20 to 30 years old, 6'1", 180, with a mustache wearing a black "eskimo" coat, fur around hood, and blue jeans. No weapon seen, just implied. |

Tavern Safety Training

Our Community Policing Team (CPT) has recently conducted 2 of 3 winter training sessions on Tavern Safety. This comprehensive training – offered to interested tavern owners, managers, and staff – covers a variety of topics. These include: Legal Issues, Effective Response, Capacity Concerns, IDs – Fake or Real, and MPD Philosophy/Enforcement Efforts. The CPT partners with the City Alcohol Policy Coordinator, the Madison Fire Department, and the Dane County Tavern League to conduct these trainings quarterly, and they have been well received by those who have attended.

The last Tavern Safety training for the winter session will be held on **Wednesday, February 11, 2009, from 5:00 PM – 8:00 PM** at Madhatters Bar (322 West Gorham Street). No pre-registration is necessary. The next round of trainings will be offered in June of this year. Look for dates/times in future newsletters.

POLICE PARTNERS UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN POLICE DEPARTMENT

Many downtown residents and visitors have probably noticed that there are more squad cars that say *Police* than just the white ones with the familiar MPD logo, including dark blue cars with a University logo.

The main portion of the campus shares a border with the Central District. While the University has police to provide services to the campus, MPD frequently works closely with University Police and staff. I have asked my counter-part at the UW Police Department to provide a snapshot of their agency.

UW-Madison Police Department Captain Karen Soley

I would like to take a moment to introduce you the UW-Madison Police Department. At times the public has had confusion understanding the differences between our department and the other jurisdictions which border us, such as the Madison Police, Capitol Police and Shorewood Hills Police. Each of these agencies is a separate agency with jurisdictional areas.

The jurisdiction of the UW-Madison Police Department is property that is owned or leased by the University of Wisconsin-Madison. The main campus body has over 300 buildings, but we have property located throughout the county and state. Our primary jurisdiction does not include off-campus student housing such as private residence halls or sorority and fraternity houses.

Our police officers are sworn law enforcement officers for the State of Wisconsin. The police officers are deputized for Dane County and can take action on violations occurring in the county outside of our primary jurisdiction. In addition, we have non-sworn security officers who also patrol the campus and its buildings and have a strong crime prevention focus. Beyond the patrol and security services, our Department also serves the campus in the areas of Emergency Management, which plans and prepares for dealing with disasters on campus, and Infrastructure Security, which participates in the planning of large construction projects on campus and access control.

The public is invited to visit our website at www.uwpd.wisc.edu. In addition to department information, we post our 60 Incident Log which shows case type and location for cases occurring in the past 60 days. The availability of this information is a Clery requirement. There is also a link to the University's Safety Report which is produced annually. Our website also contains a variety of brochures, many of which relate to crime prevention and our most recent Annual Report.

With the various jurisdictions converging in this area coupled with the large student population living off-campus, often in city of Madison neighborhoods near campus, it is extremely important for all of the police departments to work together. Criminals do not pay attention to jurisdictional lines, nor do disasters or crises. Over the years we have developed a close working relationship with the Madison Police Department, especially the Central District. We have partnered in safety and crime prevention presentations, safety initiatives, and other collaborations. We have also shared resources in criminal investigations and operations aimed at apprehending criminals in the downtown and campus area. Our departments routinely share information with one another regarding crimes, events and activities that may impact both departments.

Our department also interacts with various neighborhoods around campus. Often this comes as part of large campus events that may have a specific impact on a neighborhood. One example of this is work done in conjunction with UW Athletics and the Breese Terrace neighborhood for the home Badger football



games and the impact to the neighborhood, especially after the 9/11 terrorist attacks.
