



SECTION B: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

The City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2013 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website at www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm or by contacting City Engineering Division, Room 115, City-County Building, 210 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., Madison, WI 53703.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102 "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103 "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

Section 102.1: Pre-Qualification of Bidders

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)l. of the Madison General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms. The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

Section 102.4: Proposals

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid musts be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of

which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided therefore on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor. Proposals will be received at the place and until the hour on the date designated in the advertisement. When sent by mail, the sealed proposal marked as indicated above shall be enclosed in an additional envelope. Proposals sent by mail, submitted in person or otherwise delivered must be in the hands of the official conducting the letting by the hour on the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

The Bidder shall execute form ERD-7777 (R.9/03), a part of these proposal pages and submit same with the bidder's proposal, if applicable. REFER TO PROPOSAL SECTION.

Section 102.5: Bid Deposit (Proposal Guaranty)

No proposal shall be considered unless either (i) it is accompanied by a bid deposit of the character and amount described in the Advertisement for Bids or (ii) a biennial bid bond in an amount and form acceptable to the City of Madison has been previously submitted.

Bid deposits of unsuccessful bidders shall be returned following the award of the contract by the Common Council. Bid deposit of the successful bidders shall be returned within forty-eight (48) hours following execution of the contract and bond as required.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

2013 PARK AND WATER UTILITY LANDSCAPE AND MAINTENANCE CONTRACT NO. 7028

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.10: MINIMUM RATE OF WAGE SCALE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) is not required if either: a single trade accounts for 85% or more of the total labor costs of the project and the bid is less than \$48,000; or no single trade accounts for 85% or more of the total labor costs of the project and the bid is less than \$100,000. For bids not meeting either of these conditions, prevailing wages shall be required.

If required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

\boxtimes	Building and Heavy Construction
	Sewer, Water, and Tunnel Construction
	Local Street and Miscellaneous Paving Operations
	Residential and Agricultural Construction

All bidders are notified that all labor employed on City contracts must be paid in accordance with the minimum rate of wage scale included in the Contract Documents.

For the information of the employees working on the project, a copy of the wage scale included in the contract documents and the provisions of Section 66.0903(8) of the Wisconsin Statutes shall be kept posted by the employer and in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the site of the project.

The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of each employee who worked on such City project and all other projects the employee worked in the same period, and the Contractor must keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. Such records shall, in addition, set forth the full weekly wages earned by each such employee and the actual hourly wage paid to that employee. The Contractor shall submit payroll records to the Engineer every week for those periods when work is being done on the project. Said submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

The Contractor shall ensure that employees shall be paid unconditionally and shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the City of Madison "Minimum Rate of Wage Scale" and that each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to such employee. Questions regarding an employee's classification or rate of pay within that classification, shall be resolved by the practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Therefore, rate of pay, classification and work jurisdiction disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determinations by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor shall agree that the normal rate of wage paid to the Contractor's employees on other projects shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of the requirement to pay no less than the minimum rate of wage scale on a City project. Mulcting of employees on City projects by contractors, such as by kickbacks or other such devices, is prohibited.

These contract provisions shall apply to all work performed on the contract by the Contractor with its own organization and with assistance of laborers under its immediate superintendency and to all work performed by piecework or by subcontract. No laborer, worker, or mechanic shall be employed directly upon the site of the work except on a wage basis, but this shall not be construed to prohibit the rental of equipment from individuals.

In the event of a refusal by the Contractor to submit payroll records as required by the contract, the City of Madison shall have the option to cancel this contract and request the Surety to perform or to relet the balance of the work for bids, and in that event, to charge the Contractor for any loss which the City may incur thereby.

SECTION 102.12 BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$53,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$257,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

SECTION 103.5 PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE BOND

The Contractor shall file with the City prior to the time of execution of the contract a Payment and Performance Bond on the prescribed form in the full amount of the contract price as security for the payment of all persons supplying labor, services, and materials for the execution of the work and the faithful performance of the contract. The bond shall remain in effect until the date of the Certificate of Substantial Completion. Substantial Completion shall be issued at the end of the two year contract. The surety furnishing this bond shall have a sound financial standing, a record of service satisfactory to the City, and shall be authorized to do business in the State of Wisconsin.

SECTION 104 SCOPE OF WORK

This project consists of landscaping and maintenance at various City of Madison project sites.

The Contractor shall view the sites prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located and to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 105.1 <u>AUTHORITY OF THE ENGINEER</u>

The Engineer shall resolve all questions which arise as to the quality and acceptability of materials furnished, work performed, manner of performance, rate of progress of the work, interpretation of the plans and Specifications, acceptable fulfillment of the contract, compensation, and disputes and mutual rights between Contractors under the Specifications. The Engineer shall determine the amount and quantity of work performed and materials furnished.

All decisions of the Engineer shall, when so requested, be rendered in writing. They shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

SECTION 105.9 SURVEYS, POINTS, AND INSTRUCTION

The City will be responsible for staking out layout of plant locations at BB Clarke Park, Burrows Park, Glenway Golf Course, James Madison Park, Paunack Park, Reindahl Park, Tenney Parking Lot, Thut Park, Vilas Park, Warner Park and Waunona Park. The Contractor is responsible for staking out all other landscape/plant locations. Any questions regarding the layout and staking of this project should be directed to Sarah Lerner at the Parks Division at 261-4281.

The Contractor shall give the Engineer 48 hours notice prior to planting at the above identified locations.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY CONTRACTOR

Several utilities exist on site. The Contractor shall perform a One Call through Digger's Hotline for each site at least three days prior to beginning construction.

The Contractor will not be allowed to store equipment and materials within the construction limits. The contractor shall secure materials at the end of each work day to deter any potential vandalism and theft.

A pre-construction meeting will be required prior to the start of construction. The pre-construction meeting will be for all site locations. There will not be a separate pre-construction meeting for each site.

Vilas Park is of archeological significance, if the Contractor encounters human remains and artifacts the Contractor must STOP WORK IMMEDIATELY AND CONTACT SARAH LERNER AT THE CITY OF MADISON, 261-4281.

The Contractor warrants that its services are performed, within the limits prescribed by the City, with the usual thoroughness and competence of the consulting profession; in accordance with the standard for professional services at the time those services are rendered. The Contractor shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work performed under this Agreement, and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections resulting from their negligent acts, errors or omissions without additional compensation. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damages incurred as a result of their errors, omissions, or negligent acts and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy construction.

SECTION 105.13 ORDER OF COMPLETION

The Contractor shall complete any portions of the work in such order of time as has been stated in the contract or in such order as the Engineer may declare necessary by reason of an emergency. The order of doing the work is subject to the review of the City. Prior to beginning construction, the Contractor shall submit to the City a detailed schedule showing the sequence and anticipated dates of all planting installation operations.

SECTION 107.14 WEAPONS PROHIBITION

Contractor shall prohibit, and shall require its subcontractors to prohibit, its employees from carrying weapons, including concealed weapons, in the course of performance of work under this Contract, other than while at the Contractor's or subcontractor's own business premises. This requirement shall apply to vehicles used at any City work site and vehicles used to perform any work under this Contract, except vehicles that are an employee's "own motor vehicle" pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 175.60(15m).

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

All planting installation shall occur in spring 2013 and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion within the contract times outlined in Section 109.7, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.

The fixed, agreed upon, liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the contract, unless otherwise specified in this section, shall be calculated in accordance with Article 109 of the Standard Specifications. The Contractor shall limit workdays from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, unless approved by the Engineer in writing.

All plantings shall be installed per City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Contracts unless otherwise defined in the Special Provisions of this contract.

SECTION 109.7 TIME OF COMPLETION

Work cannot start on this contract until after the "Start to Work" letter has been received. Installation of B&B plants shall be planted from the time frost is out of the ground to June 1st. Deciduous, grass or perennial container grown plants may be planted from the time frost is out of the ground until July 1st. Care and maintenance of plants during the first growing season after installation in 2013 shall be incidental to cost of BID ITEMS 20901-20954. Landscape Maintenance for the second growing season shall be paid separately under BID ITEMS 90001-90021.

The first year growing season is defined as the time in 2013 from when plants are installed, until ground is frozen. The second growing season is defined as the time beginning in 2014 from when frost is out of the ground, until the ground is frozen. Contract will be completed by December 1, 2014.

BID ITEM 20701-TERRACE SEEDING

DESCRIPTION

This work shall consist of preparing seed beds, furnishing and sowing the required seed, furnishing and applying the required stabilizers, fertilizer, and mulching material at the locations specified on the plans and at existing lawn damaged by construction activities, all in accordance with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction Article 207. Seed mixture shall be either in whole, or a mixture of the City of Madison sun terrace mix and shade terrace mix applied appropriately based on shady and sunny areas of the construction site.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Seeding shall be measured by the square yard. The following list includes all park sites which require terrace seeding, with their approximate square yardage of needed seed:

- Tenney Park Bathhouse 73 square yards
- Warner Park Sign 25 square yards

Water Utility Well No. 20, 2829 Prairie Road – 8 square yards

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Terrace Seeding shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Unless there is a significant change (greater/lesser than 10%), no payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal.

SECTION 209: TREES, SHRUBS, PERENNIALS AND GRASSES

Bid Items 20901-20954 shall be for planting. All planting as part of this contract shall be completed per Article 209 – Trees, Shrubs, Perennials and Grasses of the current City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and as outlined in these Special Provisions.

209.4(a) General

Installation of B&B plants shall be planted from the time frost is out of the ground to June 1st. Deciduous, grass or perennial container grown plants may be planted from the time frost is out of the ground until July 1st. There are no fall plantings in this contract.

209.6(b) Care

Care and maintenance of plants during the first growing season after installation in 2013 shall be incidental to cost of BID ITEMS 20901-20954. Landscape Maintenance for the second growing season shall be paid separately under BID ITEMS 90001-90021.

The first year growing season is defined as the time in 2013 from when plants are installed, until ground is frozen. The second growing season is defined as the time beginning in 2014 from when frost is out of the ground, until the ground is frozen.

The Contractor shall properly care for all plants while the payment and performance bond remains in effect. Proper care of plants shall consist of doing such watering, weeding, cultivating, pruning, spraying, securing of braces and guys, wrapping, re-mulching and such other work as may be necessary to keep the plants in a neat appearance and in a healthy growing condition. No additional compensation will be given to Contractors for watering related to dry conditions, except as specified in Subsection 209.6(c).

It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to thoroughly water and care for plants, especially during the ten (10) day period after initial planting. No additional compensation will be given for watering during the first ten (10) days of initial planting, regardless of drought status.

In addition to the waterings required in Subsection 209.4(g), entitled Planting, additional waterings may be ordered by the Engineer at any time, for the duration of the guarantee period. Should conditions require such waterings, Contractor shall water within three (3) days of notification. The volume of each watering and intervals between waterings shall depend upon weather conditions and soil moisture. Contractor shall monitor weather and soil condition of each planting.

Care must be taken when watering not to wash away mulch and topsoil. Mulch and topsoil displaced by the Contractor must be replaced immediately per section 209.4(k).

209.6(c) Guarantee

Plants shall be guaranteed for two growing seasons from the date of installation. Growing seasons are defined in Section 209.6(b) Care of these Special Provisions. At any time within the period of the guarantee, the Contractor shall replace any plant which, for any reason, has died or is in a dying

condition, or which has failed to flourish in such a manner or to such a degree that its usefulness or appearance has been impaired. Replacement shall include removal and repair of all affected work. The decision of the City as to the necessity of replacing any plants shall be conclusive and binding on the Contractor. No more than two (2) replacements per plant shall be required after acceptance.

Following the completion of the replacements, a re-inspection will be made prior to final acceptance. All replacement plantings are to be selected and tagged by the Engineer prior to being brought to the job site. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to notify the Engineer forty-eight (48) hours prior to any replacement plantings as to what they are to be planting and in what location.

Prior to the termination of the guarantee period and issue of substantial completion, the Contractor shall request a final inspection by the City. All plants found unacceptable for reasons herein before stated shall be replaced at the first planting season and thereafter the responsibility for such plants or material shall lie with the City, no additional guarantee period will be required for these plantings.

The Contractor shall include in the bid items for plants for Hiestand Park reshaping and expanding the existing plant bed as shown on plan sheet L-7 (BID ITEMS 20931, 20944, 20948, and 20931).

The Contractor shall include in the bid item for plants for Olive Jones Park mulching the entire area within the two retaining walls shown on plan sheet L-14 (BID ITEM 20905).

The Contractor shall include in the bid item for plants at the Vilas Zoo Park Sign reshaping and expanding the existing plant bed as identified on plan sheet L-20 (BID ITEM 20929).

BID ITEM 20970 - DROUGHT WATERING - NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to provide drought watering in accordance with Article 209.5(j) of the City of Madison Specifications for Public Works Construction for all plants in this contract at the following sites:

- BB Clarke Park
- Burrows Park
- Glenwood Park
- Glenway Golf Course
- Hammersley Park Sign
- Lost Creek Park Sign
- Odana Golf Course
- Olive Jones Park
- Paunack Park Memorial
- Thut Park Memorial
- Waunona Park Memorial

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Drought Watering – Neighborhood Parks shall be measured by unit price for additional watering visits necessary to thoroughly soak the root zones of all plants in this contract at the park sites listed above. The number of watering visits shall be defined such that one watering visit thoroughly waters all of the plants in this bid item, once.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Drought Watering - Neighborhood Parks, shall be paid for at the contract unit price each, which shall be full compensation for furnishing, transporting and watering plants; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. In order to receive payment for drought watering, the Contractor must submit proof of watering for each watering. This proof must including photos of the watering with the date and time that each watering occurred.

BID ITEM 20971 - DROUGHT WATERING - COMMUNITY PARKS

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to provide drought watering in accordance with Article 209.5(j) of the City of Madison Specifications for Public Works Construction for all plants in this contract the following sites:

- Hiestand Park Sign
- James Madison Park Memorial
- Marshall Park
- Reindahl Park Memorial
- Tenney Park
- Vilas Park
- Warner Park

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Drought Watering – Community Parks shall be measured by unit price for additional watering visits necessary to thoroughly soak the root zones of all plants in this contract at the park sites listed above. The number of watering visits shall be defined such that one watering visit thoroughly waters all of the plants in this bid item, once.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Drought Watering – Community Parks shall be paid for at the contract unit price each, which shall be full compensation for furnishing, transporting and watering plants; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. In order to receive payment for drought watering, the Contractor must submit proof of watering for each watering. This proof must including photos of the watering with the date and time that each watering occurred.

BID ITEM 20972 - DROUGHT WATERING - WATER UTILITY

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to provide drought watering in accordance with Article 209.5(j) of the City of Madison Specifications for Public Works Construction for the following sites:

- 2929 Prairie Road
- 2757 University Avenue
- 5130 University Avenue

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Drought Watering - Water Utility shall be measured by unit price for additional watering visits necessary to thoroughly soak the root zones of all plants in this contract at the sites listed above. The number of watering visits shall be defined such that one watering visit thoroughly waters all of the plants in this bid item, once.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Drought Watering — Water Utility shall be paid for at the contract unit price each, which shall be full compensation for furnishing, transporting and watering plants; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. In order to receive payment for drought watering, the Contractor must submit proof of watering for each watering. This proof must including photos of the watering with the date and time that each watering occurred.

BID ITEMS - 90000-90021 LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

DESCRIPTION

This work shall consist of maintenance of landscaping installed in this contract at all locations as identified in these plans during the second growing season and shall be paid under BID ITEMS 90001-90021. Care and maintenance of plants during the first growing season after installation shall be incidental to cost of BID ITEMS 20901-20954.

The first year growing season is defined as the time in 2013 from when plants are installed, until the ground is frozen. The second growing season is defined as the time beginning in 2014 from when frost is out of the ground, until the ground is frozen.

This work shall include furnishing all necessary materials and performing all necessary work such as weeding, watering, renewal pruning, the removal and placement of new mulch, support staking, fertilizing, dead-heading, shovel edging, rodent protection, disposing of surplus waste materials, and such work necessary or incidental thereto to complete the item in accordance with the plans, specifications and contract.

All care is to be in accordance with the plans and specifications of this contract and the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. The Contractor shall have adequate experience and knowledge in the care of perennials, grasses, trees and shrubs.

A monthly inspection of all landscape areas shall be done by the Contractor's licensed landscape architect or trained horticulturist. This is to assess work to be done and to locate problems which may have developed since the last inspection. The Contractor shall notify the Engineer 48 hours prior to inspection.

PRUNING

All plant material shall be inspected to determine need for pruning. Pruning shall be completed once each year in accordance with these specifications. All pruning shall be done at the appropriate time for each species. Pruning includes perennials, shrubs, low evergreen plantings and planted trees. All plant material shall be pruned in order to stimulate tight, natural growth. Remove dead and broken branches, sucker growth and bad crotches. Pruning should develop the natural form of each individual plant. Evergreen trees and shrubs shall be pruned ONLY with a hand pruner to assure conserving their natural form. In general, tools to be used should conform to accepted horticultural practices. When/where specified or directed by the Engineer, for all BR, B&B, or CG plant stock, pruning shall consist of

removing only dead, damaged, or broken branching. Pruning shall be done so that the plant retains its natural form and leaving the central leader intact.

Except when heading back, all pruning cuts shall be made at the branch bark ridge and branch collar leaving both branch features intact without leaving stubs or damaging adjacent trunk or branch tissue. When heading back or reducing a branch back to another lateral branch, all pruning cuts shall be made by bisecting the angle between the branch bark ridge and an imaginary line which is perpendicular to the branch being removed. The branch bark ridge must be left intact without leaving a stub and without damaging adjacent branch tissue. Evergreen plants shall not be pruned except to remove dead, damaged, or broken branches. All pruning cuts shall comply with the ANSI A300 current edition. See Part VIII, Standard Plates 2.04 and 2.05 for Proper Pruning Cut

Pruning of perennials shall consist of removing the previous year's growth without damaging the new emerging growth and taking down finished perennials as required.

Prune trees and raise the canopy on all trees as specified by City staff.

All spireas to be renewal pruned to within 4"-8" of the ground in early spring or late fall.

All cuts shall be clean and debris removed from the site immediately.

MULCH

Mulched plant beds and mulch rings shall receive 3-4" of new shredded hardwood bark mulch by June 1, 2014. Prior to installing new mulch, existing mulch shall be removed and disposed offsite. Bark mulch shall be free of objectionable foreign material and in accordance with the Article 209 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Contracts. The Contractor is responsible for supplying mulch.

When applied, care should be taken to not damage plant material. Keep mulch away from stems of plants. Landscaper is responsible for such damage.

WEEDING AND DEAD-HEADING

Planting beds shall be kept weed free, primarily by hand weeding, on a weekly schedule. All flowerbeds shall be deadheaded on a weekly schedule as needed. Herbicides shall not be used on planting beds.

Landscape Maintenance for Marshall Park shall include weeding and watering of all plants in the Holocaust Memorial (BID ITEM 90009).

PEST AND DISEASE CONTROL

All plant material shall be inspected during the growing season for insects and/or disease. Any pest and/or disease problem shall be reported to the City to determine course of action. The remediation work shall be done on time & material basis upon approval of the City. There will be no pesticide usage on bedding plants.

WATERING OF PLANT MATERIAL

All plants shall be appropriately watered throughout the planting season to keep plants in a healthy growing condition regardless of drought condition. Watering during drought conditions are incidental to this contract. The volume of water shall be enough to fill the root zone and soak down to a good depth. Care must be taken when watering not to wash away mulch and topsoil. Mulch and topsoil displaced must be replaced immediately by the Contractor. Provisions 209.5 (j) Drought Watering do not apply to landscape maintenance bid items.

DISPOSAL

Excess material such as mulch, plant, or organic debris as a result of landscape maintenance shall be removed from the site immediately. Excess material shall be disposed offsite at a location to be determined and provided by the Contractor at no extra cost to the City.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Landscape Maintenance shall be measured by lump sum for each individual site to maintain the landscape plantings during the second growing season.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Landscape Maintenance shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Unless there is a significant change, no payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal. Landscape Maintenance shall be paid on a quarterly basis during the second growing season. The Contractor shall submit documentation showing proof of inspection with each payment request.

BID ITEM 90022- MARSHALL PARK HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL MULCH, WEED AND PLANT REMOVAL

DESCRIPTION

There are existing plants at the Marshall Park Holocaust Memorial. This bid item shall include hand weeding, pruning dead branches, and replacing the existing mulch at the existing plant beds in spring 2013. Herbicide shall not be used. This bed item also includes removing the existing dead plants shown on the plan that are being replaced as part of this contract.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Marshall Park Holocaust Memorial Mulch, Weed and Plant Removal shall be measured lump sum.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Marshall Park Holocaust Memorial Mulch, Weed and Plant Removal shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM - 90023 WARNER PARK SIGN CLEARING AND GRUBBING

DESCRIPTION

This work shall include all material, labor and equipment necessary to clear and grub vegetation as indicated on the Warner Park Sign landscape plan per Article 204 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Warner Park Sign Clearing and Grubbing shall be measured lump sum.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Warner Park Sign Clearing and Grubbing shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

<u>BID ITEM - 90024 WATER UTILITY - 2829 PRAIRIE ROAD WEED EXISTING LANDSCAPE</u> BED

DESCRIPTION

This work shall include mulching and weeding existing landscape bed at the location identified on plans. This work shall be completed in spring of 2013.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Water Utility - 2829 Prairie Road Weed Existing Landscape Bed shall be measured lump sum.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Water Utility - 2829 Prairie Road Weed Existing Landscape Bed shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM - 90025 REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT OF PLANTING SOIL

DESCRIPTION

This work shall include all material, labor and equipment necessary to remove existing topsoil within the area identified for plantings to a depth of twenty-four (24) inches and replace with twenty-four (24) inches of engineered topsoil. The composition of the engineered topsoil is 30% topsoil, 40% organic matter and 30% sand.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Removal and Replacement of Planting Soil shall be measured in cubic yards. The following list includes all park sites which required removal and replacement of planting soil:

- Warner Park Sign 7 cubic yards
- Hammersley Park Sign 7 cubic yards
- Hiestand Park Sign 10 cubic yards
- Lost Creek Park Sign 9.5 cubic yards

BASIS OF PAYMENT

SECTION G: AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted _____MARCH 5_, 2013, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>FIFTY THOUSAND</u>, SIX HUNDRED <u>FORTY-SIX DOLLARS & FIFTY CENTS</u> (\$50,646.50) being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include preapprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourneypersons. Apprentices and subjourneypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

- a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.
- b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

5. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Director of Affirmative Action.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract.



s. 66.0903 (10) RECORDS; INSPECTION; ENFORCEMENT.

(a) Each contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent performing work on a project of public works that is subject to this section shall keep full and accurate records clearly indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person performing the work described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

- (a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.
- 2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
- 3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages. 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

BUILDING OR HEAVY CONSTRUCTION

Includes sheltered enclosures with walk-in access for the purpose of housing persons, employees, machinery, equipment or supplies and non-sheltered work such as canals, dams, dikes, reservoirs, storage tanks, etc. A sheltered enclosure need not be "habitable" in order to be considered a building.
