
2000-2023 Active Attack Data

Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events



Officers teaching CRASE are trained through Advance Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT[™]). The Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) course is designed and built on the Avoid Deny Defend[™] strategy developed by ALERRT in 2004.

Per the US Department of Homeland Security, "an Active Shooter is an individual or individuals actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area; in most cases, active shooters use a firearm (s) and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims." If you experience an active shooter event, follow the Avoid Deny Defend strategy:
