## **Types of Force Used By Officers**

From January 1st through March 31st of 2025, Madison Police Officers responded to 35,167 calls for service. In that time, there were 86 citizen contacts in which officers used recordable force\* during their encounter. This means that in the 1st quarter, MPD officers used recordable force 0.24% of the time when engaging with our citizens. Each of these force incidents documented by officers was reviewed for compliance with MPD standard operating procedures.
