The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the **Targeted Business Certification Application** to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access the Targeted Business Certification Application online at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

 - 2.4.2.2.3 **SBE Contact Report,** C-8 and C-9. (A <u>separate</u> Contact Report must be completed for <u>each applicable</u> SBE which is <u>not</u> utilized.)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed <u>non-responsible</u> for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the City Engineer and <u>received</u> within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

NORTH HENRY STREET AND WEST MIFFLIN STREET ASSESSMENT DISTRICT-2014 CONTRACT NO. 7243

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below.

If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

PREVAILING WAGE

Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked.

SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$54,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$264,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this contract shall include, but is not limited to, installation of water main, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, curb and gutter, base preparation, asphalt pavement, driveway aprons, sidewalk, street lighting, pavement markings and tree grates.

The project limits for the work are on North Henry Street from W. Gilman St. to W. Gorham St. and on West Mifflin Street from N. Broom St. to N. Henry St. The project is approximately 950 ft. in length (350 ft. on N. Henry St. and 600 ft. on W. Mifflin St.).

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall use care around existing trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps, driveways and any other structures or amenities that are indicated on the plans to remain. The Contractor shall be aware that there are buildings with ground level windows, landscaping, and decorative concrete at or near the back of sidewalk that are to remain. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees, other than those shown on the plan to be removed, shall

be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2.

Private Utility Work

Utility work and conflicts are expected with this project. The Contractor shall coordinate their work to allow access to utility companies to install new facilities and resolve any conflicts that may arise. This project has multiple private utility manholes to be adjusted to finish grade. The Contractor shall coordinate adjustments with the utility companies by giving a minimum of one week (7 calendar days) notice of work areas and a schedule of when adjustments are to be completed.

It is anticipated that MG&E and Charter will be undergrounding some of their aerial facilities on N. Henry St. This work will include a new underground crossing of N. Henry St. as well as some work on private property between 409 & 415 N. Henry St. and between 410 & 414 N Henry St.

Access Issues

The Contractor shall maintain access for mail delivery and garbage/recycling pickup for all properties in the project area. The Contractor shall also maintain access to all driveways within the project limits, especially all business and commercial parking entrances. Refer to Section 107.7 Maintenance of Traffic for more information regarding access to properties and businesses, loading zones, etc.

Other Projects in the Vicinity

The City is aware of several other projects taking place in the vicinity of the project sites included under this contract. This includes some major redevelopment work on the block bounded by W. Johnson St., N. Henry St., E. Dayton St. and N. Broom St. Also, the City has planned a streetscape improvement project on N. Henry St. between W. Johnson St. and W. Mifflin St. and on W. Johnson St. between N. Broom St. and N. Carroll St. (project no. 53W1198). Work under that project will include sidewalk and tree grate replacement and the installation of street lighting. The limits of that project are immediately adjacent to the W. Mifflin St. portion of this contract; the Contractor shall coordinate work as necessary to maintain work space and access as necessary for the work to be completed on project 53W1198.

Event Dates

The Madison Marathon is holding a run on the weekend of May 24, 2014. The route uses State St. and N. Henry St. from State St. to W. Dayton St.

No work shall take place on the N. Henry St. portion of this project on August 14 through August 15. These are UW student moving dates, so the contractor shall also expect some moving to take place on the days before and after these dates.

SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All traffic control shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable, complete Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases and any required sidewalk or bike route closures, to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, at 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd, Suite 100, Madison, WI 53703, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the preconstruction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

The Contractor will be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The Contractor shall install and maintain

modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The 300 block of W Mifflin St and the 400 block of N Henry St may be closed to through traffic within the project limits for the duration of the project. Local and emergency vehicle access to all properties shall be maintained at all times. Pedestrian traffic to all properties shall be maintained at all times.

No work shall encroach into or impact traffic lanes on W Gorham St during peak traffic hours (7:00 AM - 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM - 6:00 PM, weekdays) and on days with special events. A minimum of two (2) traffic lanes shall be maintained on W Gorham St during peak traffic hours (7:00 AM - 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM - 6:00 PM, weekdays), and a minimum of one (1) traffic lane shall be maintained on W Gorham St during all other hours. The contractor shall stage their operation in such a way that lane closure time on W Gorham St is minimized. Encroachment into W Gorham St shall be approved by the City Traffic Engineer a minimum of three (3) working days in advance to verify that the work won't impact any special events. Call Yang Tao (266-4815) regarding days of special events.

No work shall encroach into or impact traffic lanes on N Broom St during peak traffic hours (7:00 AM - 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM - 6:00 PM, weekdays) and on days with special events.

When 300 block of W Mifflin St is closed, "USE DAYTON ST FOR OVERTURE CENTER PARKING GARAGE" signs shall be provided at each end of the closure to direct traffic to Overture Center Parking Garage.

When 300 block of W Mifflin St is closed, "ALL BUSINESSES OPEN" signs shall be provided at each end of the closure.

W Gilman St shall remain open to two-way traffic at all times. The sidewalk shall remain open at all times on both sides of W Gilman St. When necessary for construction at the Henry-Gilman intersection, Gilman St may be reduced to one lane of traffic during off peak hours (peak hours are defined as 7:00 AM - 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM - 6:00 PM, weekdays) provided that properly equipped and trained flag persons are present and proper signage is in place in accordance with MUTCD.

The 10 and 100 block of N Henry St (near W Mifflin St) shall remain open to two-way traffic at all times. The sidewalk shall remain open at all times on both sides of 10 and 100 block of N Henry St. When necessary for construction at the Mifflin-Henry intersection, N Henry St may be reduced to one lane of traffic during off peak hours (peak hours are defined as 7:00 AM – 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM – 6:00 PM, weekdays) provided that properly equipped and trained flag persons are present and proper signage is in place in accordance with MUTCD. The one lane condition shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) days.

All of streets shall be vacated for move out/in traffic on August 14th and 15th.

The contractor shall call Parking Utility Maintenance Supervisor (Dan Valenza, 266-4744), a minimum of seven (7) days in advance of when any existing parking facilities need to be removed.

The contractor shall call Parking Utility (John Villarreal, 267-8756), a minimum of three (3) days in advance of when any parking meter hoods are needed.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681, 1 working day prior to placement of the plates.

The Contractor shall provide ADA/Handicap Accessible pedestrian access at all intersections within the construction area at all times. Sidewalks shall be maintained on at least one side of the street at all times unless otherwise required.

Access to all driveways within the project limits shall be provided at all times. Interruption of access to a property, which is necessary for the construction of this project, shall be granted only after discussion(s) with the affected property owner(s)/occupant(s) and only for times and durations which will minimize

impact on the property owner(s)/occupant(s). Driveways may need to be plated or High Early Strength concrete may need to be used to maintain access to driveways. Use of plates and high early strength concrete shall be considered incidental.

The Contractor may remove parking within the project limits as indicated on the Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall be responsible for posting and maintaining NO PARKING signs in accordance with City of Madison Police Department's "Guidelines for Temporary No Parking Restrictions for Construction or Special Events".

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

Contact Yang Tao, Traffic Engineering Division, 266-4815, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

SECTION 107.8 NOTIFICATION WHEN CLOSING STREET

The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the Contractor removes the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment.

SECTION 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

Upon completion of all concrete work, final surface course of pavement, landscaping, topsoil, seed or sod, the City Construction Engineer shall certify that it is complete and shall contact the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, 266-4767. The City of Madison Traffic Engineer shall have seven (7) working days to complete the signing and marking so that the street is ready to open to traffic. The Contractor shall leave all barricades in place until such time that the permanent pavement marking and signing has been installed by the City. The City shall notify the Contractor when the final pavement marking and signing is complete and the Contractor shall remove all temporary construction signs and barricades within 24 hours of the notification.

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on <u>MAY 5, 2014</u>. The total time for completion of this contract is <u>ONE</u> HUNDRED FIVE (105) CALENDAR DAYS.

Work on the N Henry St. portion of this contract shall begin on or after May 19, 2014.

Once work begins on W. Mifflin St., all work on W. Mifflin St. shall be completed within FIFTY (50) CALENDAR DAYS.

Once work begins on N. Henry St., all work on N. Henry St. shall be completed within FIFTY (55) CALENDAR DAYS.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer, and the agreed upon date must be determined prior to the public preconstruction meeting.

SECTION 109.2 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for failure to complete the work at any of the locations in section 109.2 of these Special Provisions in timeframes specified in said section shall be \$670. per calendar day. In the event that more than one project location is not completed in the timeframe

specified, the maximum fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages shall not exceed \$855. The fixed, agreed, and liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the contract in the timeframe specified in Section 109.2 of these Special Provisions shall be \$855 per calendar day.

BID ITEM 20336 - PIPE PLUG

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 Edition Article 203.2(c), any pipe found in a trench that is less than 10" in diameter while installing a sewer facility shall be considered incidental to the pipe being installed.

Any pipe plugs required to abandon or remove a sewer access structure (pipes directly connected to the structure) shall be considered incidental to abandoning or removing the structure regardless of the size of the pipe being abandoned.

BID ITEM 20801 - SODDING

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall consist of preparing sod beds, furnishing and installing sod in accordance with Article 208 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and as supplemented below.

MATERIALS

All sod used under this contract shall be a tall fescue variety. The Contractor is responsible for choosing a fescue sod that will be appropriate for the site conditions. The sod must consist primarily of fescue grasses that will blend in with the surrounding non-disturbed lawn and will tolerate weekly mowings. Acceptable tall fescue varieties will be turf types only and include, but are not limited to: Grande II, ATM, 3rd Millennium SRP, Aggressor, Spyder LS, Firenza, and Wolfpack. Forage type varieties of fescue and Kentucky bluegrass sod varieties will be rejected.

The Contractor shall submit to the Engineer a spec sheet for the variety of fescue sod that is selected prior to the installation. Installation of the sod may only proceed after the variety of sod has been approved.

ARTICLE 301 CONCRETE AND CONCRETE MATERIALS

HIGH EARLY STRENGTH CONCRETE

This special provision describes the use of high early strength concrete in accordance with the requirements of the standard specifications and as hereinafter provided.

High early strength concrete (on curb, driveway & sidewalks) shall be used to meet the established contract schedule, to maintain access to commercial drive, and to maintain pedestrian access to businesses within the project limits. All use of high early strength concrete shall be incidental to the specific bid item.

All concrete used on City of Madison Public Works projects shall comply with the following subsections of Article 501, "Concrete" of the latest edition of the Standard Specifications for Highway and Structure Construction of the State of Wisconsin, Department of Transportation, Division of Highways:

501.2 Materials

501.3 Construction

BID ITEM 30342 - 4'X8' TREE GRATE (INCLUDING FRAME) BID ITEM 30343 - 5'X5' TREE GRATE (INCLUDING FRAME)

Prior to installation of the tree grates, the Contractor shall verify the locations of the grates with the Engineer and City Forestry. Verification of the sites may include excavating the location down to the

depth of tree planting so that it may be inspected by the Engineer and City Forestry. This site verification shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

The Contractor shall maintain the tree grate support and safety measures until trees are planted in the new grates. It is anticipated that City Forestry will plant the new trees during the fall/early winter of 2014. The Contractor shall coordinate with City Forestry regarding the schedule of the planting and the removal of the safety/support measures.

SECTION 500 SEWERS AND SEWER STRUCTURES

SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

The Sanitary Sewer designer for this project is Elia E. Acosta. She may be contacted at (608) 266-4096 or eacosta@cityofmadison.com .

Henry Street

Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 404 feet of new 10" PVC SDR 35, and 203 feet of sanitary sewer lateral SDR 35 at locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Mifflin Street

Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 299 feet of new 8" PVC SDR 35, 75 feet of new 10" PVC SDR 35, and 232 feet of sanitary sewer lateral SDR 35 at locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include Neenah R-1550 castings with the City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 ed.). All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All existing main connections shall be field cored to accommodate existing conditions and shall be compensated under BID ITEM 50791 SANITARY SEWER TAP. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during the installation of a structure shall be replaced by the Contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish.

All sanitary sewer laterals shown on this plan were located by television inspection and City records only. No laterals were located with a locator device for this project.

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation.

ARTICLE 501 - STORM SEWER AND SEWER STRUCTURES GENERAL

STORM SEWER GENERAL

The Storm Sewer designer for this project is Elia E. Acosta. She may be contacted at (608) 266-4096 or eacosta@cityofmadison.com.

Henry Street

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 440 feet of new storm sewer of various sizes ranging from 12" to 15" at locations shown on the plan and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Mifflin Street

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 37 feet of new 12" storm sewer at location specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Reconnection of existing pipes at new or existing structures, or new pipes at new or existing structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new

sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

Where a new structure is to be constructed at an existing pipe, it is expected that the contractor shall saw cut the existing pipe in the required location to accommodate the placement of the new structure. If the contractor for his or her convenience deems it more suitable to remove the existing pipe to a full joint, the additional pipe and concrete collar required to reconnect to the new structure stall be the contractor's responsibility and shall not be compensated.

Connection of new pipes to existing structures shall be accommodated with a Storm Sewer Tap – Bid Item 50792.

Precast structures are only allowed where field poured structures are not specifically called for, and no precast structures are allowed until ULO's are completed and approval of the design engineer has been received.

BID ITEM 50353 - SANITARY SEWER LATERAL (SDR 35)

Sanitary sewer laterals shown on the construction plans were located by City television inspection and records only.

Per the City of Madison Standard Specifications for sanitary sewer lateral construction on street reconstruction projects, Contractors are encouraged to begin installation of sanitary lateral pipe at the proposed sewer main. If the Contractor starts excavation for the lateral at the property line, it shall be at the Contractor's risk. No Utility Line Openings (ULOs) will be granted for the inability to locate the sanitary lateral at the property line. Any extra sidewalk removal will not be compensated to the Contractor looking for an existing sanitary lateral at the property line. Contractors are encouraged to have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal.

Proposed sanitary lateral locations near trees are subject to change based upon data obtained in the field and property owner involvement. Excavation near trees shall comply with Article 107.13 of the Standard Specifications. If 5 ft of separation from the tree to the excavation cannot be maintained, lateral replacement shall stop at the curb.

Each sanitary sewer lateral shall have a maximum of 4 sidewalk squares and 20' of curb and gutter removed and replaced. No additional compensation shall be awarded beyond this amount for the replacement of a sewer lateral. If laterals called for reinstatement on the plans are to be plugged under the direction of the engineer on-site, contractors are required to use a sonde device to confirm that the laterals are not active.

BID ITEM 50354 - RECONNECT SANITARY LATERAL

The first 5 feet of pipe shall be included with this bid item regardless of pipe type or fittings used. Beyond 5' shall be paid for separately under Bid Item 50353 SANITARY SEWER LATERAL.

The first 5 feet of sewer lateral pipe/ fittings measured from the sewer main shall be considered the reconnect for all sewer lateral reconnections. Lateral connections connecting to sewer access structures shall be paid for separately as a sanitary tap. 5' of lateral pipe is not considered incidental to the sanitary tap connection.

SECTION 601 <u>ELECTRICAL</u>, <u>GENERAL</u> REQUIREMENTS

The City of Madison Traffic Engineering Division will remove existing lighting poles as necessary and install new poles and wire. The contractor shall cooperate fully with the City in staging the removal and

construction of conduit and structures so that street lights remain in service until new lights are operating. The existing underground street lighting conduit shall be protected during contractor's utility installation phases.

The existing signal and lighting poles, conduits, handholes, and manholes not scheduled for removal or abandonment shall be protected during construction. If the contractor believes that damage to such facilities is unavoidable, the contractor shall not damage or remove any facilities until the City Traffic Engineering electrical inspector has reviewed and approved such actions. Any damage or removal of City electrical conduit, wire, fiber, or structures, without the specific approval by the City Traffic Engineering electrical inspector shall be promptly repaired or replaced by and at the expense of the contractor. The City may elect to do repair work with City crews. The cost for any repair work done by the City will be billed to the contractor.

SECTION 601.10 MATERIALS FURNISHED BY THE CITY OF MADISON

The following electrical materials will be furnished to the Contractor at the Traffic Operations Shop, 1120 Sayle Street. The Contractor shall notify the Traffic Operations Shop (Dennis Rowe at 266-9034) twenty four (24) hours prior to picking up any materials. Complete quantities of an item shall be picked up on one appointment unless Dennis Rowe agrees to a partial quantity disbursement.

SECTION 604.3 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

The LB-1 base shall be five feet deep.

SECTION 701 PROVISIONS FOR WATER INSTALLATION AND ABANDONMENT

This project consists of water main improvements on W. Mifflin Street and N. Henry Street. A general outline of the work is as follows:

- N. Henry St.: This block will involve work to replace the existing 4-inch water main with new 12-inch main, and reconnection of all services on the street as shown on the plans.
- W. Mifflin St.: This block will involve work to replace the existing 4-inch water main with new 12-inch and 10-inch main, and reconnection of all services on the street as shown on the plans.

SECTION 703 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Perform all work in accordance with these provisions and the City of Madison Standard Specifications For Public Works Construction, 2014 Edition.

In addition to standard water shutoff notification requirements, coordinate with the Water Utility and the following contacts in scheduling water shutoff operations:

- 318 W. Mifflin St. (Overture Parking Ramp)

BID ITEM 90001 - DECOMPOSED GRANITE

DESCRIPTION

This bid item is to provide decomposed granite for the tree openings where the trees are too large for tree grates. Provide uniform 4" depth to surface of tree opening. Full 4" depth may not be possible at all locations due to tree roots. Do not damage tree roots for installation of Decomposed Granite.

MATERIALS

Decomposed Granite is to be orange/red in color. Contractor shall submit sample to Engineer prior to ordering or installing.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Decomposed Granite shall be measured by square foot of installed material.

Depending on the amount of disturbance to the Temporary Crosswalk, maintaining that temporary access may require removing and relaying the material in the same location.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

The department will measure Temporary Crosswalk as Each Temporary Crosswalk acceptably installed, maintained and removed in a single location.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

This item, measured as provided above, will be paid for at the contract unit price which is full compensation for furnishing, loading, hauling material; for preparing the foundation; for furnishing, placing, maintaining, and removing temporary surface material; for reconstructing or relaying the temporary surface material; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work.

This special provision describes constructing a plastic fence between the construction zone and all sidewalk open to the public, or as directed by the Engineer and as hereinafter provided. Fence shall extend to the ground to be detectable by cane for the blind.

Provide notched conventional metal "T" or "U" shaped fence posts. Provide fence fabric meeting the following requirements.

Drive posts into the ground 12 to 18 inches or use other Engineer approved method to secure posts. Space posts at 7 feet.

Use a minimum of three wire ties to secure the fence at each post. Weave tension wire through the top row of strands to provide a top stringer that prevents sagging.

Overlap two rolls at a post and secure with wire ties.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

City Engineering will measure Fence Safety by the linear foot along the base of the fence, center to center of posts. Fence that is moved or removed and replaced for construction activities on the same side of the street will not be measured and paid again.

B. Construction Methods

Work shall be completed in accordance of ATC's utility crossing requirements. Mix design and installation method will be in accordance with the materials section or ATC's requirements.

Each concrete truck will provide a batch mixture ticket prior to material placement. If a truck driver does not have the batch mixture ticket, that load will be rejected. During and prior to placement, take all necessary precautions not allow the Fluid Thermal Backfill material to segregate.

Contractor shall remove all debris and standing water from the trench prior to the placement of the Fluid Thermal Backfill.

If the Fluid Thermal Backfill is being placed around coated pipes, contractor shall not dump material directly on the pipe; use a baffle, such as a sheet of plywood or similar method, to deflect the fill material.

Fluid Thermal Backfill ATC Crossing shall be measured by each completed utility crossing. The amount of Fluid Thermal Backfill is estimated to be one cubic yard per crossing. Any additional Fluid Thermal Backfill used will be considered incidental to the contract unit bid price. BASIS OF PAYMENT

Fluid Thermal Backfill ATC Crossing shall be paid for at contract price which shall be full payment for all work, materials, and incidentals necessary to complete the work in accordance with the description and as shown on the plan set. 

BID ITEM 90160 - SALVAGE EXISTING VALVE OR FITTING

After the connected existing water main has been abandoned, expose and remove the specified valve or fitting and salvage for the Madison Water Utility.

Capping or plugging the existing abandoned water main shall be included in this work.


SOIL BORING LOCATION PLAN West Mifflin Street and North Henry Street Madison, Wisconsin

Scope of Work. The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>EIGHT HUNDRED FIVE THOUSAND</u> <u>SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-EIGHT DOLLARS AND TWENTY-SIX CENTS</u> (\$805,778.26) being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided unless otherwise noted in Section D: Special Provisions, Subsection 102.10 – Minimum Rate of Wage Scale.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of

materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include pre-apprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the

contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourney persons. Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis, Admin, Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the

names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract

b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.

3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. 

(4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

(3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
- 3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages. 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party
- 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.
