STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS

The City of Madison's Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2014 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website, www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)I. of the General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms.

The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

SECTION 102.4 PROPOSAL

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid must be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided thereof on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor or submitted electronically through Bid Express (www.bidexpress.com). Proposals will be accepted at the location, the time and the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the time and date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

The Bidder shall execute the Disclosure of Ownership form. REFER TO SECTION F.

SECTION 102.5: BID DEPOSIT (PROPOSAL GUARANTY)

All bids, sealed or electronic, must be accompanied with a Bid Bond equal to at least 5% of the bid or a Certificate of Annual/Biennial Bid Bond or certified check, payable to the City Treasurer. Bid deposit of the successful bidders shall be returned within forty-eight (48) hours following execution of the contract and bond as required.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

BRITTINGHAM PARK PAVING IMPROVEMENTS CONTRACT NO. 7325

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.10: PREVAILING WAGE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below.

Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked.

If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

Building and Heavy Construction
Sewer, Water, and Tunnel Construction
Local Street and Miscellaneous Paving Operations
Residential and Agricultural Construction

SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$54,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$264,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

SECTION 103.2: AWARD OF CONTRACT

The bid proposal contains one bid alternate. The alternate bid item may be considered in the award of the bid, based upon project budget. The City reserves the right to award the Contract to the lowest, responsible bidder, based on the Base Bid or a combination of the Base Bid plus bid alternate. The Contractor must complete both the Base Bid and the Alternate to be considered a responsive bidder.

SECTION 104 SCOPE OF WORK

This project consists of installation of new standard concrete walks, integral color and textured concrete walks, benches, landscape boulders, engineered soil planting beds, and asphalt paving.

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. The Contractor shall work with the existing utilities and to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 105.1: AUTHORITY OF THE ENGINEER

The Engineer shall resolve all questions which arise as to the quality and acceptability of materials furnished, work performed, manner of performance, rate of progress of the work, interpretation of the plans and Specifications, acceptable fulfillment of the contract, compensation, and disputes and mutual

rights between Contractors under the Specifications. The Engineer shall determine the amount and quantity of work performed and materials furnished.

All decisions of the Engineer shall, when so requested, be rendered in writing. They shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

SECTION 105.12: COOPERATION OF THE CONTRACTOR

Several utilities exist on site. The Contractor shall perform a One Call through Digger's Hotline at least three days prior to beginning construction. To ensure that Parks-owned utilities are also marked, include the park name at the beginning of the Marking Instructions field on the ticket, and send a copy of the ticket to the City of Madison Parks Surveyor (Dan Rodman / drodman@cityofmadison.com / tel (608)266-6674 / fax (608)267-1162).

The Contractor shall secure materials at the end of each work day to deter any potential vandalism and theft.

The Contractor shall attend a pre-construction meeting prior to the start of construction.

The Contractor warrants that its services are performed, within the limits prescribed by the City, with the usual thoroughness and competence of the consulting profession; in accordance with the standard for professional services at the time those services are rendered. The Contractor shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work performed under this Agreement, and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections resulting from their negligent acts, errors or omissions without additional compensation. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damages incurred as a result of their errors, omissions, or negligent acts and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy construction.

The Contractor shall take care when accessing the site not to damage the existing utilities, concrete curb, sidewalk or asphalt pavement. Any damage shall be repaired by the Contractor per City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and are considered incidental this contract.

SECTION 105.9 SURVEYS, POINTS, AND INSTRUCTION

The City of Madison Parks Division will be responsible for setting all lines and/or grades required to complete the work for the Brittingham Park Paving Improvements. Any questions regarding the layout/staking of this project should be directed to City of Madison Parks Surveyor Dan Rodman at 266-6674. Contractor shall provide Dan Rodman 48 hours notice for any survey work mobilization.

SECTION 107.7: MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All traffic control shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for Sidewalk and Bikeway Closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable, complete Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases and any required sidewalk or bike route closures, to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, at 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd, Suite 100, Madison, WI 53703, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the preconstruction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The Contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The Contractor shall install and maintain modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The Contractor shall provide ADA/Handicap Accessible pedestrian access at all intersections within the construction area at all times. Sidewalks shall be maintained on at least one side of the street at all times unless otherwise required.

Contractor shall supply and maintain construction barricades to alert bicycle/pedestrian traffic of the work area for the duration of the project. The cost of supplying and maintaining the barricades is part of Bid Item 10701Traffic Control.

Southwest Bike Path barricade placement shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1. One, MUTCD Type 2 barricade 40 ft. north of the work.
- 2. One, MUTCD Type 2 barricade 40 ft. south of the North Shore Drive crossing.

The MUTCD Type 2 barricades shall have a MUTCD compliant 'CONSTRUCTION WORK AHEAD', 30" x 30" sign panel securely mounted to them. The signs shall be placed perpendicular to the path of travel and face on-coming pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Barricade mounted signs shall not encroach on the width of the bicycle/pedestrian path.

The Contractor shall minimize disruption to path traffic during construction operations. Path work shall be consolidated to the shortest timeframe possible. Contractor shall provide an alternate route around construction operations as necessary to maintain public access along the Southwest Bike Path.

Contact Thomas Mohr, Traffic Engineering Division, 267-8725, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

SECTION 107.13 TREE PROTECTION SPECIFICATIONS

The Contractor is advised to review Article 107.13 of the Standard Specifications for tree protection. Note that Articles 107.13(a) Underground Utility Excavation & Installation, 107.13(b) Curb Excavation and Installation, and 107.13(c) Sidewalk Excavation and Installation are not applicable to this project except as noted below.

The intent of these designs is to minimize the damage to those trees that remain following construction. Trees that must be protected are designated on the plans.

107.13(e) Terrace Restoration

It is recognized that grading operations and root cutting of some trees will need to occur within 5 feet of trees in order to complete the work, and care must be taken in these areas. For trees where construction operations, including grading, stone placement, filling, etc. occur within 5 feet of the trunk, construction operations near these trees shall be done under the supervision of a City of Madison Forestry Representative. The sequence to construct in these areas shall be as follows:

- 1. Trees within 5' of construction operations shall not be disturbed until inspected by a City of Madison Forestry Representative.
- 2. The Contractor shall place a yellow ribbon around the tree to highlight these trees for the equipment operator.
- 3. The ribbon shall remain until the area is fine graded and seeded or sodded. Roots shall be cut cleanly by using a saw, ax, lopping shears, chain saw, stump grinder, or other means which will produce a clean cut. Exposed roots shall be covered as soon as excavation and installation are complete. All roots over one (1) inch in diameter that are damaged shall be cleanly cut immediately back of the damaged section on the same day of the excavation. The Contractor

shall not rip or pull roots out towards the trunk of a tree while excavating with a backhoe. The use of a backhoe to cut roots is NOT acceptable.

All provisions of Articles 107.13(d), 107.13(f) Bark Abrasions and Limb Damage, 107.13(g) Soil Compaction, 107.13(h) Contractor/Foreperson Acknowledgement, and 107.13(i) Cost Recovery and Liquidated Damages are applicable to this contract.

Protection of these trees shall be paid under Bid Item 10800 – Root Cutting.

SECTION 107.2 PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY

The Contractor shall not grade, excavate, store equipment or materials or otherwise disturb any areas outside the project limits as shown on the plans, without permission of the Engineer.

SECTION 108.2: PERMITS

The following permits will be applied for by the City of Madison:

- 1. City of Madison Erosion Control Permit (EC Permit).
- 2. Wisconsin Department of Transportation Right-of-Way Permit

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of all permits and must keep a copy of each individual permit on site at all times throughout construction.

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permits including properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Engineer or his designees. This work will be paid for under the appropriate bid items, or if appropriate items are not included in the contract, they shall be paid for as Extra Work.

The City's obtaining these permits is not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction.

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

Work cannot start on this contract until after the "Start to Work" letter has been received. Construction work shall be carried at a rate so as to secure full completion within the contract times outlined in Section 109.7, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.

The Contractor shall be aware there are site access restrictions that affect the prosecution of work for a portion of the project. Some project work occurs on WisDOT property and the City of Madison is currently applying for a right-of-way improvement permit. The Contractor shall not commence construction operations on WisDOT property until written approval is provided by the City of Madison. It is anticipated the necessary approvals will be secured by 04/27/15.

The fixed, agreed upon, liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the contract, unless otherwise specified in this section, shall be calculated in accordance with Article 109 of the Standard Specifications. The Contractor shall limit workdays from 7:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday - Friday, unless approved by the Engineer in writing.

SECTION 109.7: TIME OF COMPLETION

Work on the Brittingham Park Paving Improvements project shall be completed by 07/31/2015.

BID ITEM 10701 - TRAFFIC CONTROL

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall be bid per Section 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC per this contract.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Traffic control shall be measured lump sum.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Traffic control shall be paid at the total completion of project as determined by the Engineer. This item shall not be paid in full if at any time the Contractor fails to properly erect, maintain and coordinate traffic control per Section 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC.

BID ITEM 10911 - MOBILIZATION

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all costs associated with mobilization of the Contractor to the project site.

Parking of equipment, storage of materials, and staging shall be allowed within project limits, per Section 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC and as shown on plans.

The Contractor may only enter the construction site through an area bordered by construction fencing as shown on the plans. THE CONTRACTOR MAY NOT DRIVE OR STORE EQUIPMENT ON ANY PORTION OF THE PARK OUTSIDE THE CONSTRUCTION LIMITS UNLESS INDICATED OTHERWISE ON PLANS OR DIRECTED IN THE FIELD.

The new park benches purchased by the City of Madison shall be ordered for delivery to pre-determined receiving locations as described in the individual bid item descriptions. The Contractor will provide equipment and labor for receiving, trucking and off-loading as needed.

The Contractor is responsible for restoration of any damage to the site due to construction access.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Mobilization shall be paid as a lump sum.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Mobilization shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 20101 - EXCAVATION CUT

DESCRIPTION

Excavation Cut shall consist of the loosening, loading, hauling and disposal of all materials, excluding four (4) inches of stripped existing topsoil in areas shown in the plans. Excavation cut shall be in accordance with Article 201 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Contracts.

The excavation quantities for this contract have been calculated by subtracting digital terrain models of the existing and proposed surfaces and sub surfaces within the different material areas. Cut (in place

quantities) and fill have been estimated from these models. No shrinkage factor has been applied to fill quantities to estimate net volume. The Contractor is responsible to review attached earthwork calculations. Three-dimensional Microstation (.dgn) files containing the digital terrain models used for the earthwork calculations are available.

The proposal quantity was computed by Microstation InRoads surface data volume computations and the assumptions listed above. Adjustments were made for topsoil assuming excavation of four (4) inches of existing topsoil and the placement of six (6) inches of proposed topsoil.

Excess excavated material deemed unusable shall be disposed of at a suitable location determined by the Contractor at no additional cost to the City of Madison.

Suitable materials (to be determined by the Engineer) may be reused as fill within the project limits. Placement of these fill materials shall be considered incidental to this bid item and shall not be compensated separately. All double handling and subsoil placement is included in this bid item.

Any additional undercut required due to field conditions shall be paid for at the Excavation Cut unit bid price.

Test rolling for undercut determination at all path locations is required and is incidental to this bid item.

Contractor to note all excavated areas shall be filled at the end of each work day. No excavated areas shall be "open" during non work hours.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Excavation Cut shall be measured by the cubic yard quantity as listed in the proposal page without measurement thereof.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Excavation Cut shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, tools, equipment, disposal, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 20217 - CLEAR STONE

DESCRIPTION

This item shall include the quantity of clear stone required for the construction entrance per BID ITEM 21011 – CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Clear Stone shall be measured by the ton as listed in the proposal page without measurement thereof.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Clear Stone shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, tools, equipment, disposal, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 20221 - TOPSOIL

DESCRIPTION

This item shall include all necessary work, labor and incidentals required to distribute and dispose of topsoil to meet proposed grades. Topsoil shall comply with Article 202 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

Stripped topsoil can be stockpiled on site within the construction fence boundary.

Excess material shall be disposed offsite at a location to be determined and provided by the City at no extra cost to the City. The location shall be within the City of Madison. Double handling, stockpiling and placing topsoil is included in this bid item.

Contractor to note - the Engineer is to be called to inspect and approve the finish grade prior to seeding and mulching.

The topsoil quantities for this contract have been computed by Microstation InRoads surface data volume computations and the assumptions listed above. Adjustments were made for topsoil assuming excavation of four (4) inches of existing topsoil and the placement of six (6) inches of proposed topsoil.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Topsoil shall be measured by the square yard quantity as listed in the proposal page without measurement thereof.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Topsoil shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, tools, equipment, disposal, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 20701 - TERRACE SEEDING

DESCRIPTION

This work shall consist of preparing seed beds, furnishing and sowing the required seed, furnishing and applying the required stabilizers, fertilizer, and mulching material on all disturbed areas including areas damaged by construction activities, in accordance with Article 207 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. Seed mixture shall be either in whole, or a mixture of the City of Madison sun terrace mix and shade terrace mix applied appropriately based on shady and sunny areas of the construction site.

Since construction is limited to within the construction fence, no additional compensation shall be given for seeding quantities beyond what is specified in this contract.

Contractor to note – the Engineer shall be called to inspect and approve the finish grade prior to seeding and mulching.

Contractor is responsible for obtaining seed bed germination per Article 207 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, regardless of site conditions.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Terrace Seeding shall be measured by the square yard quantity as listed in the proposal page without measurement thereof.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Terrace Seeding shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 21013 - STREET SWEEPING

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include the street sweeping of the entrances and exits from the project onto adjacent streets when they are affected by construction activities. Street sweeping shall be completed as directed by the Engineer and shall remove all loose material to the satisfaction of the Engineer. It is expected that sweeping may be required on a daily basis depending on the hauling methods utilized by the Contractor.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Street Sweeping, shall be measured by lump sum for the duration of the project.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Street Sweeping shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, tools, equipment, disposal, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Unless there is a significant change, no payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal.

BID ITEM 21024 - SILT SOCK (12 INCH) - COMPLETE

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to install, maintain and remove silt sock at locations shown on the plans and around any subsoil/topsoil staging piles and to install, maintain and remove additional undistributed silt sock as a precautionary measure to address emergency erosion control. The proposal quantities include an additional 200 linear feet of undistributed silt sock. It is probable that the additional linear feet of undistributed silt sock will be reduced or eliminated from the proposal quantities.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Silt Sock (12 inch) - Complete, shall be measured by linear foot for the completed work as described above.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Silt Sock (12 inch) – Complete, shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 21063 - EROSION MATTING, CLASS 1 URBAN TYPE A - ORGANIC

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include installation of Erosion Matting, Class I Urban Type A - Organic at locations identified on plans.

Work under this bid item shall be as set forth in the latest edition of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, except the Contractor shall note that special care with anchorage devices shall be required so as to not injure users of the park. Anchorage devices for the mat are required to be a product identified on the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Erosion Control Product Acceptability List (PAL) under the category of "Anchoring Devices for Class I, Urban Erosion Mat.

Anchorage devices shall be completely biodegradable, and photobiodegradable or metal anchorage devices shall not be allowed. Materials deemed to present a hazard from splintering or spearing shall not be approved, including solid wood devices.

Photobiodegradable matting is not allowed.

Erosion Matting, Class I Urban Type A – Organic installed correctly with correct anchorage, staple pattern, and overlap shall be paid at the contract price. To verify the staple pattern, the Contractor shall provide to the Engineer a Manufacturer's recommended staple pattern for the type of matting installed.

Trimming of the Erosion Matting, Class I Urban Type A – Organic required to accommodate existing tree locations shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Erosion Matting, Class I Urban Type A – Organic shall be measured by the square yard.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Erosion Matting, Class I Urban Type A shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, tools, equipment, disposal, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Unless there is a significant change, no payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal.

BID ITEM 30301 - CONCRETE 5-INCH SIDEWALK

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to install new 5" thick concrete sidewalk and the installation of 6" of gravel base, where shown on the plans.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Concrete 5-Inch Sidewalk shall be measured by the square foot.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Concrete 5-Inch Sidewalk shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, tools, equipment, disposal, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Unless there is a significant change, no payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal.

BID ITEM 40102 - CRUSHED AGGREGATE BASE COURSE GRADATION NO. 2

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include provision and installation of 6 inches of Crushed Aggregate Base Course Gradation No. 2 for concrete sidewalk construction and 9 inches of Crushed Aggregate Base Course Gradation No. 2 for asphalt path construction.

All aggregate base course shall extend 6 inches beyond the proposed pavement edge and shall have 3 inches of topsoil and terrace seed over the extended gravel base to be paid for under BID ITEM 20221 – TOPSOIL and 20701 – TERRACE SEEDING for all paved paths.

The Contractor shall contact City of Madison Surveyor Dan Rodman at 209-7012 at least 48 hours prior to proof subgrade elevations prior to paving.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Crushed Aggregate Base Course Gradation No. 2 shall be measured by the plan ton quantity as listed in the proposal page without measurement thereof.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Crushed Aggregate Base Course Gradation No. 2 shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 40201 – 3 INCH DEPTH HMA PAVEMENT TYPE E-0.3

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary for the Contractor to provide and install 3 Inch Depth HMA Pavement Type E-0.3 in accordance with these plans and specifications and the latest edition of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

3 Inch Depth HMA Pavement Type E-0.3 shall be measured by the ton as listed on the proposal page.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

3 Inch Depth HMA Pavement Type E-0.3 shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Unless there is a substantial change directed by the Engineer, no payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal. For purposes of this item, "substantial" shall mean changes over 20% of the estimated quantity.

BID ITEM 40321 - UNDERCUT

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all equipment, labor and incidentals necessary to undercut areas of path according to Section 403.4 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. Areas needed to be undercut shall be determined by the Engineer after the final test rolling is done and before paving. The cost per SY for undercut (Bid Item 40321), includes the removal, trucking and disposal of the

undercut material. All undercut material is to be disposed of offsite, in a location to be determined and provided by the contractor, at no extra charge to the City.

The filling of undercut areas with pulverized material or breaker run as described in Section 403.4 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction is incidental to this item.

The test rolling is included as a part of Bid Item 20101 Excavation Cut.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Undercut shall be measured in the field per square yard.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Undercut, as measured above, shall be full compensation for all labor, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work as described above. If no Undercut is necessary, no compensation for this bid item shall be assessed.

BID ITEM 90001 - CONSTRUCTION FENCING (PLASTIC)

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary for the Contractor to provide, install, maintain and remove construction fence from the project site as shown on the plans.

Construction fencing shall be installed to discourage access to the construction area by the general public during the course of the project. Fencing shall be maintained throughout construction and adjusted or removed at the request of the Engineer.

This fence shall be highly visible (orange), constructed of a plastic web, and able to withstand the expected amount of use it shall receive on a construction site. Relocation of fencing may be required as the work progresses. No extra payment shall be made for temporarily opening and re-closing the fence, or relocation of the fencing as needed to perform the work. Fencing shall be left in place until construction operations are complete.

Construction fencing shall be International Orange color, high-density polyethylene mesh conforming to the following:

- Mesh opening: 1 inch minimum to 3 inch maximum
- Height: 4 feet
- Ultimate tensile strength: Avg 3000 lb per 4' width (ASTM D638)

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Construction Fence (Plastic) shall be measured by the plan linear foot quantity as listed in the proposal page without measurement thereof.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Construction Fence (Plastic) shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 90002 - BENCH INSTALLATION

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary for the Contractor to assemble and install the CityView Bench by Sitescapes, Inc., model CV1-1010-DF-Backed Bench, cast ends, six foot length, surface mounted at the locations specified on the plans. Benches shall be installed centered on the designated concrete pad with the bench's back aligned with the edge of concrete. No portion of the bench shall extend beyond the edge of concrete. All handling and installation shall be according to manufacturer's specifications. The complete installation specifications shall be included in the shipment of equipment from the vendor.

All benches shall be purchased by the City of Madison and ordered for delivery from the bench vendor to the City's pre-determined receiving location. The benches shall be available at the City of Madison Goodman Maintenance Facility, 1402 Wingra Creek Parkway. The Contractor shall provide equipment and labor for loading, trucking and off-loading as needed.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Bench Installation shall be measured per each individual installed bench.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Bench Installation shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM - 90003 ENGINEERED SOIL WITH BARK MULCH

DESCRIPTION

This work shall include all material, labor and equipment necessary to remove existing soil within the area identified for plantings to a depth of eighteen (18) inches and replace with eighteen (18) inches of engineered soil. The composition of the engineered soil is 30% topsoil, 40% organic matter and 30% sand. The amended areas shall receive 3-4" of new shredded hardwood bark mulch.

Hardwood bark mulch shall be provided by the City of Madison at the City's pre-determined mulch receiving location. The bark mulch shall be available at the City of Madison Transfer Station, 121 E. Olin Ave. The transfer station's hours of operation are 7:30 am to 2:30 pm, Monday thru Friday, excluding City holidays. The Contractor shall contact Bill Durkin at the City of Madison Streets Department (phone: 608-266-4911) a minimum of seven (7) working days prior to any anticipated dates of wood fiber mulch pick up. The Contractor shall provide equipment and labor for loading, trucking and off-loading as needed.

Excavated material deemed unusable shall be disposed of at a suitable location determined by the Contractor at no additional cost.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Engineered Soil With Bark Mulch shall be measured in square yards as listed in the proposal page.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Engineered Soil With Bark Mulch shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, disposal and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. No payment shall be given for changes in quantities listed in proposal page.

BID ITEM 90004 – LANDSCAPE BOULDER PLACEMENT

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, labor and incidentals necessary for the Contractor to place landscape boulders at the locations shown on the plans (see Sheet 3.1).

All landscape boulders <u>shall be provided by the City of Madison</u>. The Contractor shall provide equipment and labor for loading, trucking and off-loading as needed.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Landscape Boulder Placement shall be measured per each individual installed boulder.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Landscape Boulder Placement shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, placement, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 90005 - ADJUST SAS SPECIAL

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include adjusting Sanitary Sewer Access Structure castings as called for on the plan set to the final proposed grades. This bid item is required because the casting adjustment would result in greater than the allowed 9" of vertical adjustment to set the casting to the final grade, or not enough adjustment was available in the existing structure.

The sewer access structure being called for adjustment (SAS 4954-016) is a 5x5 square poured in place manhole and the structure currently has 24" of brick adjustment. The structure has a flat top roof that the brick adjustment rests upon. This sewer access structure is located over a City 36" diameter sanitary sewer main. Installation of adjustment rings on top of the existing brick adjustment will not be allowed.

Contractor shall remove all brick adjustment and shall install a 4' diameter barrel section(s) on top of the poured in place structure. Trowelable mastic shall be placed on the poured in place manhole rooftop and pour a concrete collar around where the barrel section connects to the existing manhole roof. The precast barrel section shall be centered over the casting opening. If the existing casting is offset, the rooftop shall be sawcut to create an opening centering the barrel section of the manhole structure.

Precast concrete barrel sections and manhole adjustment rings shall meet the requirements of Article 507.3, as well as SDD 5.7.2 and 5.7.15 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition. The City's standard frame and cover (SDD 5.7.16) shall be supplied and installed with this special provision.

Adjust SAS Special shall be completed in accordance with Article 507.3 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition. This bid item will require adjustment rings to be removed and concrete barrel sections to be removed and reinstalled. The maximum allowed adjustment on the Sewer Access Structure shall not exceed 9 inches and the final configuration of the structure shall be in accordance of SDD 5.7.2 and 5.7.15 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition.

Sawcutting the existing poured in place manhole roof, installing mastic and concrete collars shall all be considered incidental to this bid item. Changing of barrel sections and adjustment rings as needed to attain the proper final grade shall also be considered incidental to this bid item

Castings remove shall be delivered by the contractor to City Engineering's Service Building (1602 Emil Street).

This Sewer Access Structure adjustment work will need to be inspected by the City Construction Engineer. Contactor shall contact the construction engineer, John Fahrney, 266-9091 24 hours in advance of doing the work to arrange for inspection.. If there are any questions regarding this special provision, contact Mark Moder of City Engineering at 261-9250, mmoder@cityofmadison.com.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

This item shall be measured as a completed unit, which shall include all materials, equipment, labor, and incidentals necessary to complete the work in accordance with the description.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

This item, measured as provided above, shall be paid for at the contract price bid for each sanitary Sewer Access Structure satisfactorily adjusted in accordance with Article 507 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition.

BID ITEM 90006 ADD ALTERNATE A - INTEGRAL COLOR WITH TEXTURE FOR SIDEWALK

DESCRIPTION

Add Alternate A work includes the addition of integral color and surface texture to the concrete sidewalk areas shown on the plans. This work shall be in accordance with the requirements of Part III of the Standard Specifications, except as herein after amended.

The base bid condition for Add Alternate A is Bid Item 30301, Concrete 5-Inch Sidewalk. The quantity for Bid Item 30301 includes all sidewalk shown; Add Alternate A is to integrally color and provided surface texture to the sidewalk areas as identified on the plans.

MATERIALS

The concrete mix design shall be the same as the bid item "Concrete 5-Inch Sidewalk", except as follows:

Concrete designated as colored in the plans and specifications shall contain the proper proportion of approved admixture for Color-Conditioned Concrete in the color as selected by the City. Basis of design is Davis Colors (800-356-4848, www.daviscolors.com), color: DAVIS COLORS 61078 @ 6 lbs. per 94 lb. Bag of Gray Type II Cement. The color conditioning admixture shall be integral through the full depth of the concrete, and shall be a single-component, colored, water-reducing, set-controlling admixture, factory formulated and packaged in cubic yard dosage increments, not multiple additives and pigments added separately into the mix. Product shall comply with ASTM C 494.

Curing compound shall comply with ASTM C309, Type 1, class A.

Submit the concrete design mix, the manufacturer's complete technical data sheets for the colored admixture and curing compound, and a color sample to the Engineer for review.

CONSTRUCTION

Mockup. At location on Project site selected by Engineer and a minimum of 28 days prior to commencement of the work, place and finish 10 feet by 10 feet, divided by control joints into 4 equal panels. For accurate color, the quantity of concrete mixed to produce the sample should not be less than 3 cubic yards (or not less than 1/3 the capacity of the mixing drum on the ready-mix truck) and should always be in full cubic yard increments. Excess material shall be discarded according to local regulations. Construct mockup using processes and techniques intended for use on permanent work, including curing

procedures. Include samples of control, construction, and expansion joints in sample panels. Mockup shall be produced by the individual workers who will perform the work for the Project.

Work shall not commence until a mockup of acceptable workmanship has been approved by the Engineer; only one mockup shall be included for payment. Accepted mockup provides visual standard for work, and shall remain through completion of work for use as a quality standard for finished concrete. Retain samples of cements, sands, aggregates and color additives used in mockup for comparison with materials used in remaining work. Remove mockup when directed by Engineer.

Placing and Finishing Concrete. The Placing and Finishing Concrete shall conform to Article 303.2, except as follows:

Applied surface texture: Custom finish compost material shall be provided by the City. Contact the Engineer at least 14 days in advance of installation. The Contractor shall place 4" of compost over the concrete while still impressionable, evenly distributed and separated. Any pieces of compost greater than 3" in any one direction shall be removed. Lightly roll the compost in place to provide impressions that are a maximum of ¼" in depth, and keep in place during the curing period. After curing, Contractor shall remove compost and wash all compost from path.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Add Alternate A - Integral Color with Texture for Sidewalk, shall be measured by the square foot installed and accepted.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Add Alternate A - Integral Color with Texture for Sidewalk, measured as stated above, is full compensation for providing all materials, including, joint fillers, joint sealers, and expansion joints; for preparing the foundation; backfilling and disposing of surplus material; for placing, finishing, protecting, and curing; and restoring the work site.

	"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.				
	"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.				
	"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of				

materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include pre-apprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the

contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourney persons. Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Article V

Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor.
