The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be gualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)I. of the General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms.

SECTION 102.4 PROPOSAL

2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access the Targeted Business Certification Application online at www.citvofmadison.com/civil-rights/contract-compliance/targeted-business-enterpriseprograms/targeted-business-enterprise. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.2.1 If the Bidder <u>meets or exceeds</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.1.1 Cover Page, Page C-6; and
 - 2.4.2.1.2 **Summary Sheet,** C-7.
- 2.4.2.2 If the bidder <u>does not meet</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.2.1 Cover Page, Page C-6;
 - 2.4.2.2.2 Summary Sheet, C-7; and
 - 2.4.2.2.3 **SBE Contact Report,** C-8 and C-9. (A <u>separate</u> Contact Report must be completed for <u>each applicable</u> SBE which is <u>not</u> utilized.)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is found non-responsible for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may appeal that decision to the Small Business Enterprises Appeals Committee. All appeals shall be made in writing, and shall be delivered to and received by the City Engineer no later than 4:30 PM on the third business day following the bidder's receipt of the written notification of ineligibility by the Affirmative Action Division Manager. Postmark not acceptable. The notice of appeal shall state the basis for the appeal of the decision of the Affirmative Action Division Manager. The Appeal shall take place in accordance with Madison General Ordinance 33.54.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. 2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION H: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this $\frac{2}{2}$ day of $\frac{1}{2}$ day of $\frac{1}{2}$ in the year Two Thousand and Twenty-One between <u>PARISI CONSTRUCTION CO., INC.</u> hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted <u>JULY 20, 2021</u>, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. Scope of Work. The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>THREE HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN</u> <u>THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE AND 05/100</u> (\$337,749.05) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

TRAFFIC CALMING AND ARTERIAL PEDESTRIAN ENHANCEMENTS - 2021 CONTRACT NO. 8570

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.11 BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$65,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$318,000 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 103 AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT

The awarded Contractor shall completely execute the signing of all contract documents and submit them to City Engineering (Attn: Alane Boutelle, 1600 Emil Street, Madison, WI 53703) prior to <u>12:00 pm on</u> <u>Thursday, July 22, 2021</u>. Delays in turning in the required completed contract documents will not adjust the project completion date. Payment and Performance Bonds shall be dated no sooner than <u>Wednesday, July 21, 2021</u>.

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

This project consists of installing traffic calming measures, pedestrian improvements and intersection updates at various locations in the City. This generally includes the installation of traffic calming islands, speed humps, traffic circles, curb and gutter, and pavement markings.

The Contractor shall view the sites prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall use care around all existing trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps and driveways that are to remain. Any items not specifically called out for removal are to remain, and this includes locations where curb work is called out on the plans to be completed with care to avoid damage to that adjacent asphalt pavement. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2.

As this contract involves work at various locations within the City of Madison, the contractor shall expect other construction to be taking place within the vicinity of this project. For a map of proposed projects around the City, contact the City of Madison, Engineering Division. The Contractor shall coordinate construction activities with other projects as necessary.

The contractor shall coordinate with all necessary utilities to have utility structures (manholes, handholes, valves, etc) adjusted as necessary. The contractor shall provide a minimum of 7 days notice to utilities prior to needing the structure adjustment.

The contractor shall coordinate the work with the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Division. The Traffic Engineering Dept. 266-4761 shall be contacted prior to construction beginning at any location.

Notify City Traffic Engineering, Troy Vant (395-1975), once conduit and bases are installed and cured. The Contractor shall coordinate their work with City crews as shown in the plans and defined in these special provisions.

The contractor shall install new conduit and bases prior to removing existing traffic signal bases. Existing traffic signal bases to be removed shall be maintained and will remain with operational signals until signals are switched over by City TE to new bases to be installed by the contractor. Contact City TE, Troy Vant (395-1975) to coordinate the necessary work to install signals in new bases and wiring work required to match to existing conduits.

SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable Traffic Control Plan to Tom Mohr, City Traffic Engineering, <u>tmohr@cityofmadison.com</u> prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The successful bidder shall work with the City Traffic Engineering Division to develop an approved Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

All signing and barricading shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

At all locations, the Contractor shall maintain two-way traffic at all times, and shall maintain access to all driveways at all times.

At the John Nolen Dr. location, the Contractor may reduce the exit lane from the Monona Terrace driveway down to a single lane during work hours, but both exit lanes shall be re-opened by 5:00pm on weekdays, and shall remain open on all weekends. Two travel lanes in both directions shall remain open on John Nolen Dr. at all times, and all travel lanes shall be maintained during peak hours.

School Locations

The following locations have work hour restrictions due to nearby schools:

- Inner Drive: while school is in session, work may only take place from 9:00am to 3:00pm (Tues-Fri) or from 9:00am to 1:00pm and 2:30pm to 7:00pm (Mon) or during standard hours on weekends.
- West Lakeside Street: while school is in session, work may only take place from 9:00am to 3:00pm (Tues-Fri) or from 9:00am to 1:00pm and 2:30pm to 7:00pm (Mon) or during standard hours on weekends.

Peak Hour Restrictions

Do not work during weekday peak hours (7:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.) at the following locations:

- Northport Drive
- Post Road & Todd Drive

- West Lakeside Street
- Williamsburg Way
- John Nolen Drive

Coordination with Metro

The Contractor shall email Metro Transit, <u>metronotice@cityofmadison.com</u> a minimum of 10 days prior to starting work at any location that will impact an existing bus stop or will require a bus stop to be temporarily relocated.

Maintain sidewalk access on one side of the street at all times, and provide pedestrian crossings at each intersection as necessary to maintain pedestrian access. If sidewalk must be closed for construction purposes, contractor shall ensure that all crosswalks at the end of the closed sidewalk block are fully open. In areas of sidewalk construction, if necessary to maintain the required access, the Contractor shall provide a temporary surface for sidewalk and crosswalk access. The temporary surface shall meet Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines (ADAAG) requirements and shall consist of temporary asphaltic surface, any grade of concrete, skid resistant steel plating, rubber matting, or alternative material as approved by the Construction Engineer. Gravel or base course material is not acceptable. Maintaining sidewalk is considered incidental to the contract.

In locations that require a bike lane closure, the Contractor shall sign the closure appropriately, including any detours, if required by the Traffic Engineer, or "Bikes May Use Full Lane" signage, as required.

Contractor is responsible for obtaining and installing temporary no parking signs to facilitate traffic control plan or as necessary to complete the work within the contract. The contractor shall contact John Villareal with the City of Madison Parking Utility (608-267-8756) at least 3 working days prior to needing the signs. Contractor shall post signs in accordance with the City of Madison Police Department Guidelines for temporary no parking restrictions for construction or special events. The guidelines can be found at the link listed below. This shall be considered incidental to the traffic control lump sum bid item. http://www.cityofmadison.com/business/pw/documents/guidelines_temporarynoparkingrestrictions.pdf

The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of 2 working days in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the contractor removes the signs, the contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment. The contractor shall notify The City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767 upon completion of final landscaping to have permanent signs reinstalled. The contractor shall expect a minimum of seven working days to have permanent signs reinstalled. The contractor shall leave in place all necessary traffic control until given notice by the construction engineer that permanent signing is in place and temporary traffic control may be removed.

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor may begin work as early as <u>AUGUST 9, 2021</u>. All work under this contract shall be completed by <u>NOVEMBER 20, 2021</u>.

Once the Contractor begins work at a specific location within this project, all work at that location must be completed within fourteen (14) calendar days, except as noted in the following.

Work at the John Nolen Dr. (Monona Terrace driveway) may begin no earlier than August 16, 2021, and all work at this location shall be completed by September 4, 2021. Once work begins, all work at this location shall be completed within 14 Calendar Days.

Locations that include pavement markings only shall be completed within five (5) calendar days. Once pavement markings are removed, new markings shall be installed starting the following day.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer.

BID ITEM 10701 – TRAFFIC CONTROL BID ITEM 10911 – MOBILIZATION

Traffic Control and Mobilization shall be paid as one lump sum for all project locations included in this contract.

BID ITEM 20221 - TOPSOIL

DESCRIPTION

This item shall be installed per the standard specifications and at that thicknesses specified. This includes the standard 6-inch thickness in most locations, and 10-inch thickness where indicated on the plans.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

This item will be measured by the Square Yard, regardless of the thickness.

BID ITEM 20321 - REMOVE CONCRETE PAVEMENT

DESCRIPTION

Removal of concrete islands where specified on the plans shall be paid under this bid item. This includes removal of mountable island noses. All work shall be completed in accordance with the standard specifications.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

This item shall be measured per the standard specifications, and removal of concrete islands shall be measured from the edge of gutter or outside edge of concrete.

BID ITEM 20101 – EXCAVATION CUT

The plan quantity for excavation cut includes all necessary excavation required to complete all work shown in the plans; no additional compensation will be given for excavation cut.

BID ITEM 21013 – STREET SWEEPING

This item shall be used as directed by the Engineer. It is anticipated that this item will primarily be needed at the John Nolen Dr. location; however, it may be necessary at other locations depending on how well the Contractor controls materials and disturbance at each location.

BID ITEM 21024 – SILT SOCK (12 INCH) COMPLETE (UNDISTRIBUTED) BID ITEM 21031 – INLET PROTECTION TYPE C - COMPLETE (UNDISTRIBUTED) BID ITEM 21055 – INLET PROTECTION TYPE D HYBRID - COMPLETE (UNDISTRIBUTED)

Silt Sock Complete, Inlet Protection, and any other erosion control measures shall be installed as directed by the Engineer.

BID ITEM 30131 – COLD WEATHER PROTECTION OF CONCRETE SIDEWALK & DRIVE (POLYETHYLENE) (UNDISTRIBUTED)

DESCRIPTION

This bid item shall be used for all cold weather protection that is necessary as required by the engineer or the standard specifications. This includes protection of concrete sidewalk, speed humps, or any concrete pavement or other concrete surfaces.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Cold Weather Protection shall be measured by the square foot (in plan view) of concrete protected. Overlaps of the material will not be measured.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Cold Weather Protection, as measured above, shall be paid at the contract unit price, which shall be compensation for all work and incidentals to furnish and install protective materials, securing in place, and removing protective materials.

BID ITEM 30201 - TYPE 'A' CONCRETE CURB & GUTTER

Spot curb replacement shall match the existing curb and gutter type, and shall be measured and paid as Type 'A', unless otherwise specified on the plans. All curb not specifically noted, shall be measured and paid as Type 'A' curb & gutter.

BID ITEM 40102 - CRUSHED AGGREGATE BASE COURSE GRADATION NO. 2 OR NO. 3

The Contractor shall install Crushed Aggregate Base Course Gradation No. 2 as shown on the plans and details. Additional base course material shall be installed as necessary or as directed by the Engineer in order to bring the excavated area up to the proper elevation to install the speed humps and traffic islands. No compensation will be given for base course that needs to be installed due to over excavation by the Contractor.

BID ITEM 40251 - ASPHALT MATERIAL FOR CURB FRONT FILL (UNDISTRIBUTED)

Asphalt Material for Curb Front Fill shall be installed to match the full depth of the adjacent asphalt pavement. Replacement of any base course material shall be considered incidental to this bid item, unless specifically noted otherwise on the plans and/or details.

This item shall also be used to restore pavement at any locations adjacent to speed humps where the condition of the existing pavement is not suitable for pouring the new speed humps and some asphalt pavement restoration is required in order to provide adequate spacing for formwork.

BID ITEM 40410 - CONCRETE SPEED HUMP

All concrete speed humps shall be installed per Standard Detail Drawing 4.10 (Flow Through Gutter). To install the speed humps, the adjacent pavement shall be saw cut (Bid Item 20303) and the existing pavement removed and excavated to the proper grade for the installation of the speed hump. The amount of excavation for the speed humps has already been included in the plan quantity for Excavation Cut, Bid Item 20101.

Concrete speed humps shall not be installed on top of any existing manholes/castings or in front of any driveways. If a conflict is discovered, contact the engineer to determine an alternate location of the speed hump.

Some locations include a modified cross section from the standard detail for how the speed hump matches into the existing curb and gutter. Speed humps with the modified detail will be measured and paid per the standard bid item.

SECTION 601.10 MATERIALS FURNISHED BY THE City Of Madison

The following electrical materials will be furnished to the Contractor at the Traffic Operations Shop, 1120 Sayle Street. The Contractor shall notify the Traffic Operations Shop (Ed Smith at 266-9034) twenty four (24) hours prior to picking up any materials.

BID ITEM 90001 - 7" STAMPED & COLORED CONCRETE

DESCRIPTION

This work shall be in accordance with the requirements of Part 3 of the Standard Specifications, except as herein after amended.

A separate design mix shall be provided for all areas to receive integrally colored concrete. Integrally colored concrete mix(es) shall not contain fly ash. Consider admixture recommendations for concrete mix design, however, mix design must also conform to the standard specifications. Submit the concrete mix design to the City of Madison for review.

Contractor shall provide a 12"x12" sample of the colored concrete, which will be reviewed and approved by the City prior to final installation. Provide a minimum of 3 days notice to the Engineer in order to schedule review of the sample.

Excess concrete material from mockups can be used elsewhere per the Engineers approval if the mix design meets the standard requirements of the secondary use.

MATERIALS

Integral-mix colored admixture shall conform to the requirements of ACI 303.1, ASTM C979, ASTM C494 and ASSHTO M194. Admixture shall be a single-component, colored, water-reducing, set-controlling admixture containing no calcium chloride with coloring agents that are lime-proof and ultra-violet resistant. The admixture shall be factory formulated and packaged in cubic yard dosage increments, not multiple additives and pigments added separately into the mix.

The specific color for the islands is noted on the plan sheets.

All surfaces shall be cured uniformly. The concrete shall never be covered with plastic sheeting.

Curing compound shall comply with ASTM C309 and be of same manufacturer as colored admixture, for use with integrally colored concrete. All placing, finishing, curing, joint sealing, and patching shall be in accordance with the admixture manufacturer's recommendations.

Imprinting Pattern: Use a 6" x 6" cobblestone pattern.

CONSTRUCTION

Add color pigment to concrete mixture according to manufacturer's written instructions and to result in hardened concrete color consistent with approved samples.

Protect all adjoining areas of concrete prior to pouring colored concrete. Perform any finishing work as necessary to prepare the colored concrete for stamping as recommended by the pattern manufacturer.

Set stamp pattern in accordance to the manufacturer's specified methods. Check all depths of imprints by tool-to-tool surface leveling. Perform tooling and finishing as stamping tools are removed after imprinting. Eliminate all squeeze joints between stamping tools, if any, with hand tools prior to concrete setting.

Joint the concrete in accordance with the standard specifications amended as follows: Saw joints such that the saw joint follows the concrete recess.

Apply curing compound per manufacturer's recommended coverage rate and to meet curing requirements of the City of Madison Standard Specifications.

7" Stamped & Colored Concrete shall match the visual appearance of the approved reference samples. Replace any not conforming to the reference samples at the Contractor expense.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

7" Stamped & Colored Concrete shall be measured by the square foot installed and accepted.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

7" Stamped & Colored Concrete, measured as stated above, is full compensation for providing all materials, including concrete, joint fillers, joint sealers, and expansion joints; for excavating and preparing the foundation; backfilling and disposing of surplus material; for placing, finishing, protecting, and curing; and restoring the work site.

BID ITEM 90002 - SEEDING, NO-MOW (UNDISTRIBUTED)

DESCRIPTION

This special provision describes the provision and placement of no mow seed mix within the median areas of the project.

MATERIALS

The contractor shall supply seed mix that meets the specification detailed below. Availability of specific species may be limited. Substitutions for individual species may be permissible and shall be approved by the Engineer prior to seed mix order. Seed mix shall include a mix of salt-tolerant "road mix" fescues and pollinator favorites.

23.5% Celestial Creeping Red Fescue 23.0% SR5130 Chewings Fescue 23.0% Marco Polo Sheep Fescue 23.0% Gladiator Hard Fescue 4.5% White Dutch Clover 2.25% Self Heal 0.75% Creeping Thyme

CONSTRUCTION

Seed shall be placed according to the supplier's recommendations and per Article 207 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. Application rate shall be 0.25 lbs per 100 Square Yard.

MEASUREMENT

Seeding, No-Mow will be measure by the Square Yard, acceptably installed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

This item, measured as provided above, will be paid at the contract unit price, which shall be full compensation for providing and placing seed mix as described.

BID ITEM 90003 - 8 INCH CONCRETE FLUSH ISLAND

DESCRIPTION

8 Inch Concrete Flush Island shall be installed at the locations indicated on the plans and per the detail drawings. All work shall be completed in accordance with Part III of the Standard Specifications. Concrete islands shall be installed to a depth of 8 – Inches and shall be sloped such that water will drain away from the center of the island. The concrete islands shall be poured to be monolithic with control joints installed per the standard specifications.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

8 Inch Concrete Flush Island will be measured by the Square Foot, acceptably installed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

8 Inch Concrete Flush Island, measured as provided above, shall be paid at the contract unit price which price shall be full compensation for all work, hauling, materials, equipment, forming, base preparation and incidentals necessary to complete the work as set forth in the description.

BID ITEM 90004 – PAVEMENT MARKING EPOXY, YIELD LINE TRIANGLE (2'X3')

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include the furnishing and application of yield line pavement markings as shown on the plans. The pavement markings shall conform to all aspects of the current edition of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Standard Specifications, Part 6 Section 646 & Section 647 as they pertain to the bid items within this section, except for the measurement of items described in the following section, shall apply.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Shall be measured by Each 24 inch x 36 inch pavement marking, acceptably installed, as shown on the plan.

BID ITEM 90005 – BARK MULCH

DESCRIPTION

This work shall consist of furnishing and installing bark mulch as shown on the plans and details, and as herein provided.

MATERIALS

Provide shredded hardwood mulch that is a natural brown color, and is free of any chemically treated wood or other deleterious substances. Bark mulch shall be shredded finely to be free of any pieces larger than 4 inches.

CONSTRUCTION

Place bark mulch at the locations and to the depths indicated on the plans and details. Rake mulch such that it is even and does not bury any existing landscaping that is to remain. Ensure that mulch won't overtop or be washed out from within the planter bed.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Bark Mulch shall be measured by the Square Yard, lightly compacted and accepted in place.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

This item, measured as provided above, will be paid for at the contract unit price, which price shall be payment in full for furnishing and installing all material, and for all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

SECTION E: BIDDERS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

TRAFFIC CALMING AND ARTERIAL PEDESTRIAN ENHANCEMENTS - 2021 CONTRACT NO. 8570

Bidder must state a Unit Price and Total Bid for each item. The Total Bid for each item must be the product of quantity, by Unit Price. The Grand Total must be the sum of the Total Bids for the various items. In case of multiplication errors or addition errors, the Grand Total with corrected multiplication and/or addition shall determine the Grand Total bid for each contract. The Unit Price and Total Bid must be entered numerically in the spaces provided. All words and numbers shall be written in ink.

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>THREE HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN</u> <u>THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE AND 05/100</u> (\$337,749.05) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures

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and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.

- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

5. Substance Abuse Prevention Program Required. Prior to commencing work on the Contract, the Contractor, and any Subcontractor, shall have in place a written program for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees as required under Wis. Stat. Sec. 103.503.

6. Contractor Hiring Practices.

Ban the Box - Arrest and Criminal Background Checks. (Sec. 39.08, MGO)

This provision applies to all prime contractors on contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2016, and all subcontractors who are required to meet prequalification requirements under MGO 33.07(7)(I), MGO as of the first time they seek or renew pre-qualification status on or after January 1, 2016. The City will monitor compliance of subcontractors through the pre-qualification process.

a. **Definitions.** For purposes of this section, "Arrest and Conviction Record" includes, but is not limited to, information indicating that a person has been questioned, apprehended, taken into custody or detention, held for investigation, arrested, charged with, indicted or tried for any felony, misdemeanor or other offense pursuant to any law enforcement or military authority.

"Conviction record" includes, but is not limited to, information indicating that a person has been convicted of a felony, misdemeanor or other offense, placed on probation, fined, imprisoned or paroled pursuant to any law enforcement or military authority.

"Background Check" means the process of checking an applicant's arrest and conviction record, through any means.

- **b. Requirements.** For the duration of this Contract, the Contractor shall:
 - 1. Remove from all job application forms any questions, check boxes, or other inquiries regarding an applicant's arrest and conviction record, as defined herein.

- 2. Refrain from asking an applicant in any manner about their arrest or conviction record until after conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 3. Refrain from conducting a formal or informal background check or making any other inquiry using any privately or publicly available means of obtaining the arrest or conviction record of an applicant until after a conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 4. Make information about this ordinance available to applicants and existing employees, and post notices in prominent locations at the workplace with information about the ordinance and complaint procedure using language provided by the City.
- 5. Comply with all other provisions of Sec. 39.08, MGO.
- c. **Exemptions:** This section shall not apply when:
 - 1. Hiring for a position where certain convictions or violations are a bar to employment in that position under applicable law, or
 - 2. Hiring a position for which information about criminal or arrest record, or a background check is required by law to be performed at a time or in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this ordinance, including a licensed trade or profession where the licensing authority explicitly authorizes or requires the inquiry in question.

To be exempt, Contractor has the burden of demonstrating that there is an applicable law or regulation that requires the hiring practice in question, if so, the contractor is exempt from all of the requirements of this ordinance for the position(s) in question.


