### STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS

The City of Madison's Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2021 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website, www.cityofmadison.com/engineering/developers-contractors/standard-specifications.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

### SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)l. of the General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms.

The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

### SECTION 102.4 PROPOSAL

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid must be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided thereof on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor or submitted electronically through Bid Express (<a href="www.bidexpress.com">www.bidexpress.com</a>). Proposals will be accepted at the location, the time and the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the time and date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

### SECTION 102.5: BID DEPOSIT (PROPOSAL GUARANTY)

All bids, sealed or electronic, must be accompanied with a Bid Bond (City of Madison form) equal to at least 5% of the bid or a Certificate of Annual/Biennial Bid Bond or certified check, payable to the City Treasurer. Bid deposit of the successful bidders shall be returned within forty-eight (48) hours following execution of the contract and bond as required.

### MINOR DISCREPENCIES

Bidder is responsible for submitting all forms necessary for the City to determine compliance with State and City bidding requirements. Nothwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, the City may exercise its discretion to allow bidders to correct or supplement submissions after bid opening, if the minor discrepancy, bid irregularity or omission is insignificant and not one related to price, quality, quantity, time of completion or performance of the contract.

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

### SECTION 102.11 BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$70,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$341,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

### ARTICLE 103 AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT

The awarded Contractor shall completely execute the signing of all contract documents and submit them to City Engineering (Attn: Alane Boutelle, 1600 Emil Street, Madison, WI 53703) prior to 12:00pm on Thursday, March 17, 2022. Delays by the Contractor in submitting the required completed contract documents will not adjust the project completion date. Payment and Performance Bonds shall be dated no sooner than Wednesday, March 16, 2022.

The bidder must completely fill in the base bid. The City shall have the right to reject all bids regardless of the value of the bids submitted.

### ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

This contract is for the design and construction of a new material storage canopy at the City of Madison Engineering Operations Facility located at 1600 Emil Street. There is an existing shelter that will be demolished prior to this Public Works project, but the concrete foundation walls will be kept and reused for the new shelter. The new shelter will cover three material bays as shown in the attached exhibits. The contractor shall be responsible for state/city approved structural calculations for all components and state/city approved plans.

The scope of work includes the furnishing of all labor, materials, equipment, tools, and other services necessary to complete the work in accordance with the intent of this contract. The Contractor shall use properly functioning equipment capable of performing the tasks required. The Contractor shall furnish workers who perform quality work and who are experienced and knowledgeable in the work proposed.

### SECTION 104.1 LANDS FOR WORK

All work under this contract shall be conducted on Public Works land operated by the City of Madison Engineering Division and located at 1600 Emil Street.

### SECTION 104.2 INTENT AND COORDINATION OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The contract documents are complementary to each other and consist of all of the following:

- The City Standard Specification, 2021 Edition
- These Special Provisions including all plans and specifications as noted by the exhibits list below

### SECTION 105.5 INSPECTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall coordinate directly with any and all regulatory agencies having jurisdiction over the licensing, permitting, and inspection, of work as described in these construction documents.

The Contractor shall be familiar with Specification 01 45 16-Field Quality Control Procedures regarding City of Madison policies and procedures for Quality Assurance and Quality Control.

### SECTION 105.6 CONTRACTORS RESPONSIBILITY FOR WORK

The Contractor shall not take advantage of any discrepancy in the plans or specifications. This shall include but not be limited to apparent errors, omissions, and interpretations involving codes, regulations, and standards.

Any Contractor who identifies such a discrepancy during the bidding process shall notify the Project Architect and City Project Manager of the discrepancy prior to the "Questions and Clarifications Deadline" as noted in Section A of the bid documents.

Any Contractor who identifies such a discrepancy during the abatement process shall immediately notify the Project Architect and City Project Manager in writing and request clarification on how to proceed. See Specification 01 26 13-Request for Information (RFI).

### SECTION 105.7 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The General Contractor is responsible for reproducing all construction documents necessary to complete the Work at their own cost. This shall include plans, specifications, addenda for the General Contractor and all Sub-contractors.

### SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall be responsible for all temporary facilities including heat, toilet facilities, etc. as necessary for this contract temporary facilities shall include any fuel or service require to operate or maintain the temporary facility.

The site location shall remain fully operation to City of Madison staff, work crews, and local residents utilizing the site.

All excessive noisy activities will need to be coordinated and scheduled with the CPM for City of Madison Engineering. Madison General Ordinance 24.08 does not allow the use of any equipment used in construction between the hours of 7:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. Monday through Saturday and Sunday 10:00 AM to 7:00 P.M. in such a manner as to unreasonable interfere with the peace, comfort and quality of life of the neighboring persons of ordinary sensibilities. Loud volumes from radios/electronic devices shall not be allowed at any time.

Construction operations shall be limited to the hours between 7:30 A.M. and 6:00 P.M Mondays through Fridays, except for holidays. A request must be made to the owner forty-eight hours in advance for approval of work days or hours other than those stated above.

The Contractor shall review all other specifications within the construction documents for other requirements and coordination of work associated with this contract.

### SECTION 107.2 PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY

The Contractor shall be responsible for the protection and restoration of all new and existing work according to Specification 01 76 00 – PROTECTING INSTALLED CONTRUCTION

### SECTION 108.2 PERMITS AND LICENSING

The Contractor shall be required to apply, and obtain all permits or licenses that may be required by these contract documents regardless of ordinance, stature, or other regulatory requirement. The City of Madison will pay for all City of Madison required Permits.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any fines issued due to non-compliance with the project permits.

### SECTION 109.7 TIME OF COMPLETION

Work shall begin only after the contract is completely executed and the start work letter is received. It is anticipated that the start work letter shall be issued on or about April 11th, 2022.

The Contractor shall have reached a level of <u>Construction Closeout</u> **NO LATER THAN October 31, 2022.** See Specification 01 77 00 for the definition of construction Closeout.

### SECTION 109.7 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The fixed, agreed and liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the Contract Time, shall be calculated in accordance with Article 109 of Standard Specifications, per working day.

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED ELEVEN AND NO/100</u> (\$153,311.00) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures

and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above.
