Regarding the Chapter 30 - Grading Permit for which we received coverage (attached) from the Wisconsin DNR, no work will be occuring below the Ordinary High Water Mark of Lake Mendota. The nearest work to the lake is extending three 2" PVC Pipes from the new shelter building to the edge of the Lake for a future clean water system by the County, but we instruct them to be stopped one-foot from the Ordinary High Water Mark on Sheet C600 (last page).
