

SECTION B: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

The City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2013 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website at www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm or by contacting City Engineering Division, Room 115, City-County Building, 210 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., Madison, WI 53703.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102 "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103 "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

Section 102.1: Pre-Qualification of Bidders

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)l. of the Madison General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms. The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

Section 102.4: Proposals

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid musts be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of

which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided therefore on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor. Proposals will be received at the place and until the hour on the date designated in the advertisement. When sent by mail, the sealed proposal marked as indicated above shall be enclosed in an additional envelope. Proposals sent by mail, submitted in person or otherwise delivered must be in the hands of the official conducting the letting by the hour on the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

The Bidder shall execute form ERD-7777 (R.9/03), a part of these proposal pages and submit same with the bidder's proposal, if applicable. REFER TO PROPOSAL SECTION.

Section 102.5: Bid Deposit (Proposal Guaranty)

No proposal shall be considered unless either (i) it is accompanied by a bid deposit of the character and amount described in the Advertisement for Bids or (ii) a biennial bid bond in an amount and form acceptable to the City of Madison has been previously submitted.

2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commer—cially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the

commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access the Targeted Business Certification Application online at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.

- 2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. 5% above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.

 - 2.4.2.2.2 Summary Sheet, C-8; and
 - 2.4.2.2.3 SBE Contact Report, C-9 and C-10. (A separate Contact Report must be completed for each applicable SBE which is not utilized.)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed <u>non-responsible</u> for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the City Engineer and <u>received</u> within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. - A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

ELDERBERRY ROAD, PLEASANT VIEW ROAD & SAMUEL DRIVE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT - 2012 CONTRACT NO. 6782

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.10: MINIMUM RATE OF WAGE SCALE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) is not required if either: a single trade accounts for 85% or more of the total labor costs of the project and the bid is less than \$48,000; or no single trade accounts for 85% or more of the total labor costs of the project and the bid is less than \$100,000. For bids not meeting either of these conditions, prevailing wages shall be required.

If required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

	Building and Heavy Construction
	Sewer, Water, and Tunnel Construction
\boxtimes	Local Street and Miscellaneous Paving Operations
	Residential and Agricultural Construction

All bidders are notified that all labor employed on City contracts must be paid in accordance with the minimum rate of wage scale included in the Contract Documents.

For the information of the employees working on the project, a copy of the wage scale included in the contract documents and the provisions of Section 66.0903(8) of the Wisconsin Statutes shall be kept posted by the employer and in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the site of the project.

The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of each employee who worked on such City project and all other projects the employee worked in the same period, and the Contractor must keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. Such records shall, in addition, set forth the full weekly wages earned by each such employee and the actual hourly wage paid to that employee. The Contractor shall submit payroll records to the Engineer every week for those periods when work is being done on the project. Said submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

The Contractor shall ensure that employees shall be paid unconditionally and shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the City of Madison "Minimum Rate of Wage Scale" and that each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to such

employee. Questions regarding an employee's classification or rate of pay within that classification, shall be resolved by the practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Therefore, rate of pay, classification and work jurisdiction disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determinations by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor shall agree that the normal rate of wage paid to the Contractor's employees on other projects shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of the requirement to pay no less than the minimum rate of wage scale on a City project. Mulcting of employees on City projects by contractors, such as by kickbacks or other such devices, is prohibited.

These contract provisions shall apply to all work performed on the contract by the Contractor with its own organization and with assistance of laborers under its immediate superintendency and to all work performed by piecework or by subcontract. No laborer, worker, or mechanic shall be employed directly upon the site of the work except on a wage basis, but this shall not be construed to prohibit the rental of equipment from individuals.

In the event of a refusal by the Contractor to submit payroll records as required by the contract, the City of Madison shall have the option to cancel this contract and request the Surety to perform or to relet the balance of the work for bids, and in that event, to charge the Contractor for any loss which the City may incur thereby.

SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$53,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$257,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this contract shall include, but shall not be limited to, the construction of a precast concrete box culvert, installation of water main including jack and boring the main under Pleasant View Road, installation con sanitary sewer, installation of storm sewer, concrete curb and gutter, concrete sidewalk, asphaltic pavement, steel plate beam guard rail, and a high tensile wire fence system.

Storm sewer work consists of installation of an 8'x4' box culvert draining to the existing greenway, and installation of storm sewer along Elderberry Road and Samuel Drive.

Sanitary sewer work consists of extension of 8" sanitary sewer up Samuel Drive, including installation of sewer access structures, and placement of new laterals.

This project consists of installing new 8-inch water main on Samuel Dr from the existing 8-inch water main at approximately Wild Indigo Ln to Elderberry Rd. Additionally, this project consists of installing new 8-inch and 12-inch water main on Elderberry Rd from Samuel Dr to approximately 300-feet west of Pleasant View Rd. The water main crossing of Pleasant View Rd is to be performed without impacting traffic on Pleasant View Rd by utilizing jack & bore trenchless installation methods with a 24-inch diameter steel casing.

SECTION 105.1: AUTHORITY OF THE ENGINEER

The Engineer shall resolve all questions which arise as to the quality and acceptability of materials furnished, work performed, manner of performance, rate of progress of the work, interpretation of the plans and Specifications, acceptable fulfillment of the contract, compensation, and disputes and mutual rights between Contractors under the Specifications. The Engineer shall determine the amount and quantity of work performed and materials furnished.

All decisions of the Engineer shall, when so requested, be rendered in writing. They shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

Any change proposed by a Contractor in SBE subcontractors, vendors or suppliers from those SBEs indicated on the SBE Compliance Report must be approved by the Engineer and the City's Manager of the Affirmative Action Division (hereafter, AAD). When requested, such decision shall be rendered in writing. Such decisions shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor or the affected SBE applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

In the event the Engineer and the AAD disagree over the proper decision to be made regarding an SBE, the Mayor shall appoint a third person to resolve the disagreement, within 30 days of appointment. The decision thus rendered may be reviewed by the Board of Public Works upon request of the Contractor or the affected SBE as set forth in Sections 105.1 and 105.2 of the City's standard specifications.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The City of Madison has been given to understand that work will be undertaken by others in approximately the same time frame and the same area as the proposed project. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to verify this information and any subsequent changes in the scheduling of the work by others and to make corrections in his/her construction timetable as required.

Alliant will be retiring two poles, along Elderberry Road west of Pleasant View Road, and replacing them with underground facilities north of the proposed street realignment and crossing Elderberry Road along the west side of Pleasant View Road. This work should be completed prior to the start of construction.

ATC will relocate the existing pole, located on the east side of Pleasant View Road, to a point approximately 50' north of the current location. This work will be completed prior to the start of construction.

ARTICLE 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All traffic control shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable, complete Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases and any required sidewalk or bike route closures, to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, at 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd, Suite 100, Madison, WI 53703, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance

with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

The Contractor will be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The Contractor shall install and maintain modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

The contractor shall supply temporary stop signs at any location where a permanent stop sign needs to be removed as part of the project.

One lane of traffic in each direction shall be maintained at all times on Pleasant View Road except as follows. Contractor may maintain two-way traffic Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 A.M. and 3 P.M. as using properly equipped flaggers and signage per the MUTCD. This will only be allowed when it is determined as absolutely necessary to construct infrastructure adjacent to Pleasant View Road.

Contractor shall have properly equipped flaggers and signage to safely allow construction vehicles to exit onto Pleasant View Road from Elderberry Road.

Elderberry Road from Fargo Trail to Pleasant View Road may be closed for a continuous 4 week period to construct the roadway. The contractor shall place a changeable message sign on Elderberry Road facing westbound traffic just west of Pleasant View Road one week prior to closing Elderberry Road.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division East, 246-4532, 1 working day prior to placement of the plates.

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

Contact Scott Langer, Traffic Engineering Division, 266-5987, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

ARTICLE 109.2 PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

The Contractor shall begin operations on or before <u>April 15, 2012</u> and will have <u>Ninety-six</u>, (96) calendar days to complete the project. If weather permits, the Contractor may begin work earlier. The Contractor shall notify the Engineer a minimum of two weeks prior to the anticipated start of work date.

The Contractor shall also notify the City Engineer (contact the Construction Engineer at 266-9091) a minimum of 48 hours prior to the desired start date. The Engineer shall schedule a pre-construction meeting prior to the start of construction.

SECTION 107.8 NOTIFICATION WHEN CLOSING THE STREET

The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of one (2) working day in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the Contractor removes the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment.

SECTION 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

Upon completion of all concrete work, final surface course of pavement, landscaping, topsoil, seed or sod, the City Construction Engineer shall certify that it is complete and shall contact the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, 266-4767. The Contractor shall leave all barricades and traffic control in place until such time that the permanent pavement marking and signing has been installed by the City. The City shall notify the Contractor when the final pavement marking and signing is complete and the Contractor shall remove all temporary construction signs and barricades within 24 hours of the notification. Contractor, upon notifying the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, shall provide a clean street for pavement marking. Failure to do so will result in delays to contractor being able to open the street.

SECTION 108.2 PERMITS

The City of Madison has received permission from the Wisconsin Historical Society to proceed with the construction in the area of an uncataloged burial site within the project limits (Uncataloged Burial Site: DA-1418/BDA-0608). The Phase 1archaeological survey has determined that the most likely location of the burial site would be at the southeast corner of Pleasant View Road and Elderberry Road. No human remains were found during the investigation and the Wisconsin Historical Society has authorized the construction within the boundary of DA-1418'BDA-0608 provided that a "qualified archeologist", as specified under Wis. Stats. § 157.70(1)(i) and Wis. Admin. Code § HS 2.04(6), monitors all ground disturbing activities. The City will hire an archeologist to monitor any land disturbing activities.

If human bone is discovered during construction, all work must cease immediately and the Burial Sites Preservation Officer must be contacted at 1-800-342-7834 for compliance with Wis. Stat. § 157.70 which provides for the protection of human burial sites.

If archaeological or paleontological materials are encountered, work must cease and the Compliance Section of the Historic Preservation Division of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin shall be contacted at 1-608-262-2970 to insure compliance with (1) 36 CFR 800.11, the Regulations of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation Governing the 106 Process; or (2) S. 44.40, Wis. Stats.

ARTICLE 203.2 DISPOSING OF MATERIALS

The Contractor shall comply with Section 203.2 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction with regard to salvaging castings.

ARTICLE 210 EROSION CONTROL

The standards specifications for Erosion Control are supplemented as follows. The Contractor shall be responsible for final stabilizing (seeding/matting/sodding/...as called for in the contract) the disturbed terrace area within 10 calendar days after the pouring of adjacent curb and gutter, unless alternate phasing is approved by the Construction Engineer. This specification shall be interpreted by the Contractor to require multiple trips to the job site by the landscaping subcontractor and the Contractor shall plan for that to occur.

ARTICLE 501 SEWER AND SEWER STRUCTURES GENERAL

STORM SEWER GENERAL

The designer of this project is Lisa Coleman (266-4093) lcoleman@cityofmadison.com.

Reconnection of existing pipes at new structures, or new pipes at new structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

Where a new structure is to be constructed at an existing pipe, it is expected that the contractor shall saw cut the existing pipe in the required location to accommodate the placement of the new structure. If the contractor for his or her convenience deems it more suitable to remove the existing pipe to a full joint, the additional pipe and concrete collar required to reconnect to the new structure stall be the contractor's responsibility and shall not be compensated.

If there are structures where the pipe walls are to be poured into the structure roof of both the pipe walls and the structure casting are to be poured in the structure roof, the contractor shall not be provided additional compensation for complying with the structure requirements detailed on the storm sewer chart and plans.

Precast structures are only allowed where field poured structures are not specifically called for, and no precast structures are allowed until ULO's are completed and approval of the design engineer has been received.

SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

The designer of this project is Lisa Coleman (266-4093) lcoleman@cityofmadison.com.

This project consists of installation of 8" sanitary sewer main, Sewer Access Structures (SASs) and installation of laterals. Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing new PVC SDR 35 at the sizes and locations that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include Neenah R-1550-0054 castings with the City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, latest edition.) All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All existing lateral and main connections shall be field cored to accommodate existing conditions and shall be compensated under BID ITEM 50791 SANITARY SEWER TAP. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during installation of a structure shall be replaced by the contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish.

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer work.

SECTION 701 PROVISIONS FOR WATER INSTALLATION AND ABANDONMENT

This project consists of installing new 8-inch water main on Samuel Dr from the existing 8-inch water main at approximately Wild Indigo Ln to Elderberry Rd. Additionally, this project consists of installing

new 8-inch and 12-inch water main on Elderberry Rd from Samuel Dr to approximately 300-feet west of Pleasant View Rd.

The water main crossing of Pleasant View Rd is to be performed without impacting traffic on Pleasant View Rd by utilizing jack & bore trenchless installation methods with a 24-inch diameter steel casing.

As depicted on the plans, the existing ATC overhead electric pole shown in conflict with the proposed water main at approximately STA 51+75 will be relocated approximately 60-ft north by March 1, 2013 (by others).

As depicted on the plans, Alliant Energy will be converting overhead electric facilities to underground electric lines west of Pleasant View Rd. This conversion includes two new underground electric installations crossing Elderberry Rd just west of Pleasant View Rd, approximately where the existing overhead crossing is located. Coordinate the Alliant Energy underground electric installations with the water main installation to avoid conflicts during construction.

Once the new systems have passed the pressure and water quality tests, install new water service laterals to the new water mains unless the service is to be abandoned.

View the sites prior to bidding and become familiar with existing conditions and utilities.

SECTION 702 MATERIALS

Furnish all materials, labor and equipment necessary to complete this project except the tapping sleeves, tapping valves and tapping valve boxes.

SECTION 703 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Perform all work in accordance with these provisions and the 2013 Edition of the City of Madison Standard Specifications, adopted December 11, 2012. Keep all valves accessible and functioning throughout the duration of the work or directed otherwise by the Water Utility representative.

In addition to the Standard Specifications, all new water service lateral installations shall include a capped tail-pipe extending 10-feet beyond the public right-of-way into the property of the proposed improvement.

WATER UTILITY GENERAL NOTES FOR SPECIFIC WORK:

WN1 Replace the existing lead service with a new copper service.

WN2 Extend and reconnect the existing copper service to the new water main.

WN3 Existing service to be abandoned when water main is cut-off.

WN4 Disconnect service from the old water main and reconnect the existing copper water service lateral to the new water main.

WN5 Relocate the existing fire hydrant.

WN6 Abandon water valve access structure.

WN7 Furnish and install the new top section for the water access structure.

WN8 Abandon the valve box.

WN9 Furnish the ditch, compaction and all materials and labor for the installation of new service lateral.

WN10 Remove and salvage existing hydrant.

WN11 Replace the existing copper service with a new copper service.

BID ITEM 20707 WIDOT MIX #30 SEEDING

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include seeding with WIDOT Mix #30 at the locations shown on the drawings in the ditches or as directed by Engineer. This work shall be in accordance with Article 207 of the Standard Specifications, except as provided below.

Seed Mix shall be Mix #30 as set forth in Section 630 of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's 2013 Standard Specifications for Highway Construction.

Seed at rate of 4 pounds/1000 square feet. Submit any substitutions and to Engineer for approval.

This item shall include placement of soil stabilizer and fertilizer on all areas seeded in accordance with Section 207.3(f) of the Standard Specifications.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

WIDOT Mix #30 Seeding shall be measured by the square yard in accordance with Section 207.4.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

WIDOT Mix #30 Seeding will be paid for at the contract price per square yard of seeding in accordance with Section 207.5, which shall be payment in full for furnishing, handling, and storing all seed; for preparing the seed bed and sowing the seed; for furnishing, hauling and placing soil stabilizers and fertilizer; for maintenance of the work and repair of all damaged areas, and for furnishing, all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. Topsoil and ECRM shall be paid separately under their respective bid items.

BID ITEM 21080 EROSION MATTING CLASS II TYPE B ORGANIC

Work under this bid item shall include provision and installation of Class II type B Erosion Control Revegetative Mat (ECRM) to be installed within the limits shown on the Drawings, or as directed by the Construction Engineer.

The Class II Type B Erosion Control Revegetative Mat (ECRM) shall be one of the products listed in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Erosion Control Product Acceptability List (PAL), under the category "Erosion Mat, Class II, Type B." Erosion matting supplied shall conform to Wisconsin Department of Transportation requirements for this category of erosion mat. Erosion matting supplied shall have the additional requirement that netting and stitching used in the mat shall be organic and biodegradable (i.e, no plastic netting or mat components will be allowed.)

Contractor shall submit the name of the specified product proposed for use as well as the manufacturer's recommended installation instructions (for Channel or Waterway applications), including but not limited

to: recommended anchoring devices, (i.e., type of stakes or staples); overlap; anchor trench configuration; and anchoring pattern. The Contractor shall provide this submittal at the preconstruction meeting. Where any discrepancy exists between installation methods called on out the Standard Plate "EROSION MAT" in the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and the manufacturer's specifications, the Engineer shall have the final authority to specify the installation method used.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Erosion matting shall be measured by the square yard in place, not including runout in anchor trenches or overlap.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

The area of erosion matting, measured as provided above, shall be paid for at the contract unit price per square yard for erosion matting, which shall be full compensation for furnishing and placing all materials; for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining and anchoring; and for all labor, tools equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. Any matting installed incorrectly shall result in all matting to be paid at half the contract price. Incorrectly installed matting shall be defined as matting which is not installed in compliance with the conditions as laid out in these standard specifications. Seeding is not included in this item and will be measured and paid separately.

BID ITEM 30451 BOULDER RETAINING WALL

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include construction of a field stone retaining wall at the upstream end of the box culvert. The purpose of the retaining wall is to keep the 3H:1V slope down from the street from extending past the end of the new box culvert at the sides of the culvert entrance. The retaining wall shall be constructed in accordance with S.D.D. 2.06, to the grades shown on the plan, or as directed by the Construction Engineer.

This item shall include providing and installing the field stone for the wall, and grading as needed to install the wall. Filter fabric to be placed behind the wall shall be paid separately as Item 20233 Riprap Filter Fabric Type HR.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

This item shall be measured by the square footage of exposed face of the completed wall.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

This item, measured as provided above, shall be paid for at the contract price per square foot. Price shall include payment in full for all materials, equipment, labor, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as described above.

BID ITEM 50390 SEWER ELECTRONIC MARKERS

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction (Latest Edition) Article 503.3c, each sanitary lateral to be installed shall have a minimum of two (2) electronic markers with the City providing the Contractor with the required number of electronic markers. For

sanitary laterals which only include the installation of a wye, a marker ball shall be installed directly above the wye connection to the main.

BID ITEM 50501 8 ' X 4' BOX CULVERT

DESCRIPTION

This item shall include all work, materials, coordination, labor and incidentals necessary to provide and install an 8' x 4' box culvert as shown on the plan set, and as detailed here. The Contractor shall be responsible for providing the box, coordinating delivery of the box, unloading and other incidentals associated with the installation, including all joint material, bedding, filter fabric and backfill. The box culvert provided shall conform to ASTM C1433 Table 1 for HS-20 loading with zero to two (0<2) feet of cover.

The contractor shall abide by the following guidelines when installing the box culverts:

- 1) The subgrade for the boxes shall have riprap filter fabric placed on all exposed subgrade areas prior to placement of the bedding stone for the boxes. The cost of filter fabric shall not be paid separately but shall be included in this bid item.
- 2) I foot of 3" clear stone shall then be placed on the geotextile as bedding stone. The cost of clear stone shall not be paid separately but shall be included in this bid item.
- 3) For portions of the box culvert under the pavement and sidewalk, backfill shall be in accord with SDD 5.2.1 & SDD 5.2.2. Provision and placement of backfill is included in the price of this bid item. Pipe backfill shall be included in this bid item.
- 4) For portions of the box outside of the pavement and sidewalk, backfill shall be clay. Compaction shall be required in 8" maximum lifts. Provision and placement of clay backfill shall not be paid separately but shall be included in this bid item.
- 5) The joints of the box culverts shall be sealed with Sealtight across the inside bottom and up one (1) foot on the inside vertical walls. Sealwrap shall be used to seal the remainder of the inside box culvert joints, and completely down the outside vertical sides of the box. Installation of all joint material is included in the price of the box culvert.

This item includes all necessary removal and disposal of, off site at a location to be provided by the Contractor, excess trench excavation. Further, the work under this item includes any stockpiling and reuse of trench spoils for backfill of the trench.

The Contractor shall be responsible for coordinating delivery of the box, unloading and other incidentals associated with the installation.

The Contractor is made aware that the box culvert crosses over an existing 15" sanitary sewer. Contractor shall protect this existing utility.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Box Culvert shall be measured by the linear - foot for box culvert provided and installed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Box Culvert shall be measured as stated above and shall be paid at the contract price which shall be full payment for all work as laid out in the description.

BID ITEM 50511 8' x 4' BOX CULVERT WINGWALL

DESCRIPTION

This item includes all necessary work, materials, preparation, curing, and incidentals necessary to construct a box culvert wingwall and splash pad in accord with Standard Detail Drawing 5.5.1 in the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

It is intended, as shown on the detail drawing, that the footings, splash pad and cut off walls shall be constructed on a 12" thick bed of three (3) inch clear stone. This clear stone shall be considered incidental to this bid item. The wingwall footings shall also be constructed on a 12" thick bed of three-inch clear stone, and the area below the splash pad shall be filled with clear stone as noted on the detail.

The area surrounding and behind the wingwalls shall be backfilled with clay, this shall be considered to part of the work required for this item and no separate payment shall be made.

Excavation required for installation of the wingwall is to be included in this item.

This item shall be constructed in accordance with Part III of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Box Culvert Wingwall shall be measured as a completed unit in the field as each wingwall is completed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Box Culvert Wingwall shall be measured as stated above and shall be paid at the contract price which shall be full payment for all work as laid out in the description.

BID ITEM 90001 STEEL PLATE BEAM GUARD

BID ITEM 90002 STEEL PLATE BEAM GUARD ENERGY ABSORBING TERMINAL

Bid Items 90001 STEEL PLATE BEAM GUARD and 90002 STEEL PLATE BEAM GUARD ENERGY ABSORBING TERMINAL shall be constructed in accordance with Section 614 of the 2012 edition of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Standard Specifications and the Standard Detail Drawings included in this contract.

BID ITEM 90003 HIGH TENSILE WIRE FENCE (4')

Bid Item 90003 HIGH TENSILE WIRE FENCE (4') shall consist of furnishing and installing an 8-strand, 12 ½ gauge galvanized wire fence in accordance with Section 616 of the 2012 edition of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Standard Specifications. Ground rods shall be installed approximately every 150 feet.

Payment for Bid Item 90003 HIGH TENSILE WIRE FENCE (4') shall be full compensation for excavating; for setting posts including placing concrete; for erecting and tensioning all fencing components; for installing grounds; and for removing and disposing of all debris, excess excavation, and surplus materials.

BID ITEM 90030 DEWATERING

DESCRIPTION

This item is intended to cover any and all dewatering required for installation of storm sewer, installation of the box culvert, construction of the box culvert wingwall, and construction of the sanitary sewer. Dewatering shall be in accordance with Article 502 of the Standard Specifications. Note that contractor shall be responsible for obtaining any permits required by DNR for this work, and for complying with such permits, including any reporting requirements.

The Contractor shall be responsible for designing a dewatering plan to fit his/her construction methods and for permitting said plan if that is required.

The Contractor shall be aware that any dewatering (including trench dewatering) shall be treated prior to discharge. The pumped water shall be treated to remove suspended solids. At a minimum, this treatment shall include running the pump water through a geotextile sediment bag, prior to discharge to the storm sewer. This geotextile sediment bag shall have a 0.040 mm apparent opening size (AOS). If, at the determination of the Construction Engineer, this treatment process is not providing sufficient sediment removal the Contractor shall add a polymer to the sediment bag. These polymers shall comply with the WDOT standards for Polyacrylamide Soil Stabilizers and shall conform to the WDOT's Product Acceptability List (PAL) for Soil Stabilizers, Type B.

Polymer would be added to the sediment bag in amounts as recommended by the manufacturer based on the pump rates being experienced on the site.

If necessary the Contractor shall obtain, from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR), in accordance with Paragraph 144.025(2)(e), Wisconsin Statutes, permits for all groundwater control wells which singly or in aggregate produce 70 or more gallons per minute. All wells shall be drilled and sealed in accordance with requirements of the WDNR for installing and abandoning wells. The address for obtaining well permits is:

Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Private Water Supply Section BOX 7921 Madison, Wisconsin 53707

The Contractor shall be solely responsible for choosing a method of groundwater control, which is compatible with the constraints defined. The Contractor shall be responsible for the adequacy of the groundwater control system and shall take all necessary measures to insure that the groundwater control operation will not endanger or damage any existing adjacent utilities or structures.

The method or methods shall be designed, installed and operated in such a manner to provide satisfactory working conditions and to maintain the progress of work. The methods and systems shall be designed so as to avoid settlement or damage to adjacent property in accordance with the applicable legislative statutes and judicial decisions of the State of Wisconsin. All required pumping, drainage and disposal of groundwater shall be done without damage to adjacent property or structures, or to the operations of other contractors and without interference with the access rights of public or private parties.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Dewatering shall be measured as a single lump sump for all dewatering necessary throughout construction.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Dewatering will be paid for at the contract sum price, which shall be full compensation for all work as provided in the description.

BID ITEM 90031 STORM CONTROL

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, equipment, and incidentals required to control wet weather flow in the storm sewer and in the channel where the box culvert is to be installed during the construction project. The contractor should expect only minor flows in the channel during dry weather, however the channel can be expected to fill rapidly during rain events. The Contractor shall take all necessary steps to protect the new storm sewer, structures and channels from damage during construction and to accommodate the existing flows during construction.

This item includes all storm control necessary for all aspects of the Construction. This item is not for control of groundwater.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Storm Control shall be measured as a single lump sump for all storm control necessary throughout construction.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Storm Control will be paid for at the contract sum price, which shall be full compensation for all work as provided in the description.

BID ITEM 90070 ADJUST SAS SPECIAL

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include adjusting Sanitary Sewer Access Structure castings as called for on the plan set to the final proposed grades. This bid item is required because the casting adjustment would result in greater than the allowed 9" of vertical adjustment to set the casting to the final grade. Installation of casting as called for on the plan shall be considered incidental to this bid item. Rotation of an existing cone sections shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

Precast concrete barrel sections and manhole adjustment rings shall meet the requirements of Article 507.3, as well as SDD 5.7.2 and 5.7.15 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition.

Adjust SAS Special shall be completed in accordance with Article 507.3 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition. This bid item will require adjustment rings to be removed and concrete barrel sections to be installed. The maximum allowed adjustment on


the Sewer Access Structure shall not exceed 9 inches and the final configuration of the structure shall be in accordance of SDD 5.7.2 and 5.7.15 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction – Latest Edition.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

This item shall be measured as a completed unit, which shall include all materials, equipment, labor, and incidentals necessary to complete the work.

SECTION G: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 27 day of Februs in the year Two Thousand and Thirteen between R.G. HUSTON COMPANY, INC., hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted <u>FEBRUARY 26, 2013</u>, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>SIX HUNDRED NINETY-TWO THOUSAND</u>, <u>EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY-EIGHT DOLLARS AND THIRTY-FIVE CENTS</u> (<u>\$692,878.35</u>) being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include preapprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourneypersons. Apprentices and subjourneypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

- a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.
- b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

5. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Director of Affirmative Action.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX



(a) Each contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent performing work on a project of public works that is subject to this section shall keep full and accurate records clearly indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person performing the work described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

- (a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.
- 2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
- 3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages. 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

BUILDING OR HEAVY CONSTRUCTION

Includes sheltered enclosures with walk-in access for the purpose of housing persons, employees, machinery, equipment or supplies and non-sheltered work such as canals, dams, dikes, reservoirs, storage tanks, etc. A sheltered enclosure need not be "habitable" in order to be considered a building.
