#### 2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

#### 2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may Targeted Certification online access the Business Application at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

#### 2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

#### 2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

#### 2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed <u>non-responsible</u> for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the City Engineer and <u>received</u> within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

#### 2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. ## SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

## ROYSTER CORNERS ASSESSMENT DISTRICT - 2014 CONTRACT NO. 6983

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

#### SECTION 102.10 PREVAILING WAGE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) shall be required unless the box indicating prevailing wages are not required is checked below.



Prevailing wages shall not be required when this box is checked.

If prevailing wages (white sheets) are required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

When multiple boxes are checked, worker's wages may vary according to the type and area of work performed. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine and apply the appropriate wage rate for the specific work assigned.

#### SECTION 102.12 BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$54,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$264,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

#### ARTICLE 103 AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT

The Contractor shall execute signing of this contract completely prior to **<u>SEPTEMBER 16, 2014</u>**. No exceptions or extensions to the above date will be permitted.

#### ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this contract shall include, but is not limited to, installation of water main, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, curb and gutter, base preparation, asphalt pavement, sidewalk and construction of a stormwater detention pond.

The project limits for the work are the new streets Royster Oaks Drive from Cottage Grove Road to Silas Street, Olbrich Avenue from Silas Street to Royster Avenue, Pinney Street from Silas Street to Dempsey Road, Silas Street from Pinney Street to Olbrich Avenue/Royster Oaks Drive, and the alley between Pinney Street and Royster Oaks Drive. Sidewalk will also be constructed along the north side of Cottage Grove Road, from Drexel Avenue to Dempsey Road, and along the west side of Dempsey Road from Cottage Grove Road to the railroad tracks. Improvement of Cottage Grove Road and Dempsey Road is planned as a future project.

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

#### SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The City of Madison is aware of other projects taking place in the vicinity of this project. Wisconsin DOT project 5411-02-74, will be ongoing during this project. The DOT project involves replacement of the bridge for southbound Highway 51 (Stoughton Road) over Cottage Grove Road. The work includes substantial work on Cottage Grove Road near Hwy 51, including pavement replacement and sanitary sewer. There will be traffic switches on Cottage Grove Road involved with this project, and pedestrians will be detoured off the bike path (located along the railroad north of Royster Corners) onto the sidewalk on the east side of Dempsey Road. This project is located in close proximity, approximately 300 feet east of the Royster Corners project. Coordination of traffic control and work zones will be required.

Several of the lots within the plat may have improvements being constructed on them during the time period of this project. Specifically lots 4, 5 and 6 will likely have construction occurring on them during the project, but Contractor shall anticipate that any of the lots may be being developed, shall allow other contractors access to perform this work and shall coordinate traffic control and work zones with other contractors as needed.

Utility work and conflicts are expected with this project. MG&E, AT&T and Charter will be undergrounding their facilities in the Right-of-Way of the north side of Cottage Grove Road and the west side of Dempsey Road, most likely beginning in the spring of 2015. ATC is expected to be installing a new overhead transmission line along the western and northern portion of the plat throughout 2015. Additionally, private utilities will be installing facilities to serve the new plat itself. Contractor shall coordinate their work to allow the private utilities to perform this work. The Contractor shall coordinate their work to allow access to utility companies and resolve any conflicts that may arise. Contacts for private utilities are:

There are existing monitoring wells, fences and other structures that are near or are abutting the project area. The Contractor shall use care around all existing monitoring wells, trees, fences, walls, steps and driveways that are indicated on the plans to remain. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees, other than those shown on the plan to be removed, shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2.

#### SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All signing and barricading shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable Traffic Control Plan to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the pre-construction meeting.

No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan. Peak hours shall be defined as 7:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M. Monday thru Friday. All traffic lanes on Cottage Grove Road and Dempsey Road shall remain open during peak hours.

Any and **ALL** lane closures require an electronic arrow board. The Contractor shall provide pedestrian access that is ADA/Handicap Accessible at each intersection at all times.

Two way traffic shall be maintained on Dempsey Road at all times. Flaggers may be used to maintain two directions of traffic during off-peak hours.

Access to the cul-de-sac end of Royster Avenue shall be maintained at all times. Underground utility work shall be phased to maintain a 10' gravel path to Royster Avenue south of Olbrich Avenue.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681, one (1) working day prior to placement of the plates.

Royster Oaks Drive, Olbrich Avenue, Pinney Street and the alley, within the project limits may be closed to through traffic, at the project limits, for the duration of the project. Local and emergency vehicle access shall be maintained at all times.

#### Bike Path Detour:

The Contractor may close and detour the Capital City Trail bike path to complete the work for a maximum allowed closure of 14 continuous calendar days total. The Contractor shall be responsible for signing, marking and maintaining the bike path detour route as shown on the plans for this project. The Contractor shall install and maintain modifications to the traffic control as ordered by the City Traffic Engineer.

Contact Luke Peters, Traffic Engineering Division, 267-1969, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

#### SECTION 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

Upon completion of all concrete work, final surface course of pavement, landscaping, topsoil, seed or sod, the City Construction Engineer shall certify that it is complete and shall contact the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, 266-4767. The City of Madison Traffic Engineer shall have seven (7) working days to complete the signing and marking so that the street is ready to open to traffic. The Contractor shall leave all barricades in place until such time that the permanent pavement marking and signing has been installed by the City, as specified in the contract. The City shall notify the Contractor when the final signing is complete and the Contractor shall remove all temporary construction signs and barricades within 24 hours of the notification.

#### ARTICLE 107.12 RAILROAD - HIGHWAY GRADE SEPARATIONS AND APPROACHES, NEW RAILROAD CROSSINGS, AND OPERATION ON RAILROAD RIGHT- OF WAY

The contractor shall contact the company representative who may be consulted by Bidders and Contractors with regard to railroad requirements of the Union Pacific Railroad. Notice must be given to at least 72 hours prior to working within twenty-five feet (25') of the Railroad Tracks. The Contractor shall obtain the authorization of the Union Pacific Railroad to work within twenty-five feet (25') of the railroad tracks prior to any work being done. Any time that work is being done within twenty-five feet (25') of the track, a flag person must be present.

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to compensate the Railroad for the flag person requirements. Prior to any work within twenty-five feet (25') of the Railroad Tracks, the Contractor shall provide to Union Pacific an estimate of the time required to perform the necessary work within twenty-five feet (25') of the Railroad Tracks and the Contractor shall pre-pay Union Pacific an estimated cost for compensation for a flag person based on the estimated time required to perform all work within twenty-five feet (25') of the tracks and the current hourly rate of compensation charged by Union Pacific for a flag

person. In the event that the pre-paid amount for flag person compensation exceeds the actual cost required for the compensation of the flag person, any excess pre-paid amount will be refunded to the Contractor. In the event that actual cost for compensation of the flag person exceeds the pre-paid estimate, the Contractor shall submit an additional pre-payment for the estimated additional cost for compensation of a flag person, prior to any work continuing within twenty-five feet (25') of the tracks.

Absolutely no staging of equipment or materials will be allowed within the railroad right-of-way.

If a Contractor violates any of these requirements, the Union Pacific Railroad reserves the right to remove and prohibit the Contractor from any further access or encroachment on the Union Pacific Railroad right of way regardless of whether or not that access or encroachment is on, under, over, intentional or inadvertent, until such time as the Contractor provides satisfactory assurances and measures to prevent any reoccurrence of such violation.

The contact information for Union Pacific Railroad and Wisconsin and Southern Railroad is listed on the permit included in these special provisions.

#### BID ITEM 10790 RAILROAD INSURANCE

The Contractor shall provide special third party protection insurance for, and in behalf of, the Wisconsin and Southern Railroad Company as well as the Union Pacific Railroad Company per Section 107.12(c) Railroad Insurance Requirements of the City of Madison Standard Specifications.

The amount of insurance to be provided shall be limited to a combined single limit amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) per occurrence for Bodily Injury Liability, Property Damage Liability, and Physical Damage to Property, with Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000) aggregate for the term of the policy with respect to Bodily Injury, Liability, Property Damage Liability and Physical Damage to Property.

#### SECTION 108.2 PERMITS

The City of Madison has submitted a DNR Notice of Intent (NOI) to obtain coverage under a Construction Site General Permit and has obtained a City of Madison Erosion Control Permit.

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permit by properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Construction Engineer or his designees. This work will be paid for under the appropriate contract bid items or, if appropriate items are not included in the contract, shall be paid for as Extra Work. A copy of the permit is available at the City of Madison, Engineering Division office. This permit covers trench dewatering to a maximum of 70 gallons/minute from the project, provided appropriate control measures are in place.

The developer's engineer has obtained a permit from Union Pacific Railroad for the proposed sewer crossing of the railroad. This permit is attached to these special provisions.

The City's obtaining these permits are not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction.

#### SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on or after <u>SEPTEMBER 29, 2014</u>. The date of completion for all work to be completed under this contract shall be <u>JULY 17, 2014</u>. The Contractor shall be required to complete the work in the time frame provided. It is anticipated that not all of the contract will be completed in Fall of 2014, however water service to lot 6 shall be completed in fall of 2014 as soon as practicable. Contractor shall suspend operations for winter and resume work in Spring.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer (Contact the Construction Engineer at 266-4089). The Contractor shall be required to limit workdays to 7:00 PM and work shall not be performed on holidays.

Note that only one mobilization shall be paid for the project. No additional payment shall be made for winter shutdown and re-mobilization in the Spring of 2015.

#### SECTION 109.9 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The fixed daily liquidated damages shall be in accordance with section 109.9 of the Standard Specifications for failure to complete work within the allotted timeframe.

# BID ITEM 20101 and 90002 EXCAVATION CUT and FILL – SALVAGE FROM EX. CUT OR IMPORT

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under these items shall include all excavation and fill required for street and sidewalk construction shown on the cross sections as well as within the limits of the pond shown on the plans, excluding clay fill for the pond to be paid separately. These items shall be in accordance with Article 201 and 202 of the Standard Specifications except as provided below.

No bulking/expansion or shrink factors were used in determining earthworks quantities for this project. Estimated earthworks quantities for this project are summarized below:

22462 cy (unclass. ex. plan quant pond, includes over-ex to install clay) 1917 cy (unclassified ex. plan quantity from road cross-sections) <u>2041 cy</u> (estimated undercut, assumed 1' over 40% of road area) 26420 cy (total excavation cut paid under Item 20101)

- 2762 cy (less additional estimated quantity of fill to be brought in by

Developer after initial survey but before project beginning)

5967 cy (total fill to be paid under Item 90002)

Clay fill for pond liner - see bid item number 90032 -Stormwater Pond Clay Liner

No adjustments have been made to the above quantities to account for topsoil. In cut sections, if overexcavation is required to place adequate topsoil thickness, over-excavation shall be considered to be incidental to Bid Item #20221 – Topsoil.

The Developer will be bringing in additional fill for road construction, between the time of the initial survey, and the project beginning. The City will perform a supplemental survey of the area where fill is being placed in order to re-calculate the estimate additional quantity of fill to be brought in by developer above.

Fill for road and pond construction shall be either suitable material removed during excavation, or if excavation cut material is unsuitable or insufficient, suitable material shall be brought to the site for placement, at no additional cost. The plan quantity of fill required to build the project shall be paid, regardless of whether the fill is derived from on-site excavation, or brought to the site. No breakout of quantities is available for general fill vs. select fill; the entire fill quantity from the pond plan and the street cross sections is included in the fill volume summarized above.

Note that excavation of approximately 1139 cy of nitrogen contaminated soil (see Bid Item 90033) is included in the unclassified excavation quantity above. Excavation of the nitrogen contaminated soil is

included with this bid item, but segregating and stockpiling of the nitrogen-contaminated soil is to be compensated under Bid Item 90033. This item 90033 is intended to compensate for additional efforts to manage the contaminated soil, beyond excavation.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

The pay quantity for Excavation Cut will be the sum of the quantity for "unclassified excavation" and for additional excavation, including undercut.

The quantity of unclassified excavation to be paid for as Excavation Cut shall be as set forth above without measurement thereof. Additional excavation, including undercut shall be measured in the field, and the volume in cubic yards shall be computed from those measurements. The contract quantity shall be adjusted upward or downward accordingly to determine the final pay quantity.

The pay quantity for Fill – Salvage from Ex. Cut or Import shall be by the adjusted plan quantity. The pay quantity shall be sum of the fill plan quantities for the pond and road set forth above, less the recalculated quantity of fill brought in by the developer after initial survey but before project beginning. The re-calculated quantity of fill brought in by the developer shall be calculated by City Engineering by taking the difference between the digital terrain models of the initial survey and the supplemental survey to be done by the City after the Developer's filling is complete. No additional payment shall be made for fill regardless of whether the fill is derived from excavation cut or is imported to the site.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

The contract price for Excavation Cut and Fill-Salvage from Ex. Cut or Import shall be payment in full for these items as set forth above and as described in Article 201 and 202, including excavation, placement of fill, and disposal of excess or unsuitable materials.

#### BID ITEM 21001 EROSION CONTROL IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

In addition to the requirements detailed in Section 210.1(a) the Contractor shall supply a dewatering plan as part of the Erosion Control Implementation Plan. At a minimum the dewatering plan shall include the Contractor's methods, practices, and or devices to perform TYPE I and/or TYPE II Dewatering per Section 502.1(c) Dewatering in the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) SOC Technical Standard 1061 Dewatering. If TYPE II Dewatering is expected to be used at a rate in excess of 70 g.p.m. the dewatering plan shall also include a copy of any applicable WDNR permits.

#### BID ITEM 21002 EROSION CONTROL INSPECTION

Work under this bid item shall be for weekend inspections (inspections required for rain events, half inch or larger, that occur on a Friday or Saturday) by the Contractor after half inch or greater rain events or as directed by the construction engineer. All weekly inspections and rain event inspections required during the work week (Monday-Friday) shall be completed by the City of Madison construction inspector.

#### ARTICLE 501 STORM SEWER STRUCTURES

501.1 Description

#### STORM SEWER GENERAL

The storm sewer designer for this project is Corey Stelljes. He may be contacted by phone at (608) 266-9721 or by email at cstelljes@cityofmadison.com.

Reconnection of existing pipes at new structures, or new pipes at new structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the

new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

Where a new structure is to be constructed at an existing pipe, it is expected that the contractor shall saw cut the existing pipe in the required location to accommodate the placement of the new structure. If the contractor for his/her convenience deems it more suitable to remove the existing pipe to a full joint, the additional pipe and concrete collar required to reconnect to the new structure shall be the contractor's responsibility and shall not be compensated.

If there are structures where the pipe walls are to be poured into the structure roof or both the pipe walls and the structure casting are to be poured in the structure roof, the Contractor shall not be provided additional compensation for complying with the structure requirements detailed on the storm sewer chart and plans.

Precast structures are only allowed where field poured structures are not specifically called for, and no precast structures are allowed until ULO's are completed and approval of the design engineer has been received.

#### SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

The Sanitary Sewer designer for this project is Corey Stelljes. He may be contacted at (608) 266-9721 or cstelljes@cityofmadison.com.

Sanitary sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 2798 feet of new 8" PVC and 1949' of sanitary sewer lateral at locations and lateral sizes that are specified on the plan set and in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include Neenah R-1550 castings with the new City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16) of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 ed. All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All existing main connections shall be field cored to accommodate existing conditions and shall be compensated under BID ITEM 50791 SANITARY SEWER TAP. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during the installation of a structure shall be replaced by the Contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish. ASTM D3034 SDR 35 sewer main and lateral as called for on the plan set shall be payable under Sanitary Sewer Main (BID ITEM 50301) and Sanitary Sewer Lateral (BID ITEM 50353.). Sanitary lateral regardless of size shall be paid under BID ITEM 50353.

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection and erosion control measures that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation.

#### BID ITEM 50202 <u>TYPE II DEWATERING</u>

#### Groundwater Control

Groundwater is expected to be encountered during excavation for the sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and pond. The Contractor shall be responsible for managing both groundwater and surface water throughout the construction site. This shall include management of contaminated groundwater if encountered. Contaminated groundwater is known to exist on site as shown on page U-14 of the plan set.

The Contractor shall manage storm water and groundwater in accordance with WDNR permits and regulations. If high-capacity dewatering, or Type II Dewatering, is required, the Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining the necessary WDNR permits. Payment for work, equipment, materials, and incidentals necessary to manage Type I Dewatering shall be considered incidental to the construction activity being performed at the time (i.e. sanitary sewer installation, water main installation, etc.). This shall include the appropriate management of any contaminated groundwater. Payment for work,

equipment, materials, and incidentals necessary to manage Type II Dewatering shall be included in this item. This shall include the appropriate management of any contaminated groundwater.

Groundwater and storm water from outside the plume area shown on page U-14 may be discharged to the storm sewer system, provided appropriate sediment removal has taken place. Contaminated groundwater from inside any of the plumes shall be discharged to the sanitary sewer system after appropriate sediment removal has taken place and the appropriate permits have been obtained from the City of Madison. This may include storm water that has entered the trench and become contaminated. Prior to the disposal of contaminated water in the sanitary sewer system, the Contractor shall obtain the necessary City of Madison permits.

Potentially contaminated zones of groundwater are marked on the construction plan set on page U-14. Groundwater and storm water from inside the plume area shown on page U-14 shall be discharged to the sanitary sewer system. The contractor shall conform with the requirements of Section 205 of the Standard Specifications, pertinent parts of the Wisconsin Administrative Code (Department of Natural Resources Environmental Investigation and Remediation of Environmental Contamination, Chapters NR 700-736), as shown on the construction plan set, and as supplemented herein. Comply with all permit requirements and applicable regulations, and monitor the discharge volume of potentially contaminated water generated as necessary to meet the permit requirements. This bid item is intended for all sub-surface utility work for which dewatering may be necessary including sanitary sewer, water main, storm sewer, electrical, stormwater pond, and traffic signal construction.

The contractor shall obtain a *City of Madison Permit to Discharge to the Sanitary Sewer* compliant with all local ordinances and state statutes. The permit will require that the Contractor monitor the volume of total water discharged into the sanitary sewer and will determine the necessary reporting frequency. The City will be responsible for obtaining the necessary approvals from the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) for disposal of potentially contaminated groundwater. This approval will be issued at the same time as the *Permit to Discharge to the Sanitary Sewer*. Submit a dewatering plan to the City of Madison for approval with the application for *Permit to Discharge to the Sanitary Sewer*.

#### BID ITEM 50390 SEWER ELECTRONIC MARKERS

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2014 Edition Article 503.3(c), each sanitary lateral shall have a minimum of two (2) electronic markers with the City providing the Contractor with the required number of electronic markers. For sanitary laterals, which only include the installation of a wye, a marker ball shall be installed directly above the wye connection to the main.

#### SECTION 701 PROVISIONS FOR WATER INSTALLATION AND ABANDONMENT

The project limits fall between two water pressure zone boundaries. These boundaries must remain separated by closed valves as shown on the plans. Do not operate boundary valves without permission and coordination with the Engineer.

View the site prior to bidding and become familiar with existing conditions and utilities.

#### SECTION 703 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Perform all work in accordance with these provisions and the City of Madison *Standard Specifications For Public Works Construction, 2014 Edition* (adopted January 21, 2014) or most recent.

#### BID ITEM 70003 FURNISH AND INSTALL 8-INCH PIPE & FITTINGS

The connection to Cottage Grove Road requires 10-inch pipe and fittings. 10-inch pipe and fittings will be measured and paid under the 8-inch bid item.

#### BID ITEM 70050 FURNISH AND INSTALL 1-INCH SERVICE LATERALS

Follow the Standard Specifications for this item, with the following exception:

Method of Measurement: Measured by each completed unit.

#### BID ITEM 90001 ROUNDABOUT CURB

#### DESCRIPTION

This item shall include construction of the roundabout curb in the locations shown on the plans in accordance with the provided detail. Construction of the curb shall be in accordance with Article 301 and 302 of the Standard Specifications.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Roundabout curb shall be measured for payment along the edge of gutter.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Roundabout curb shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above which shall be full compensation for all labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

#### BID ITEM 90030 STORM CONTROL

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, equipment, and incidentals required to control dry and wet weather flow in the storm sewer system during the reconstruction project. The Contractor shall take all necessary steps to protect the new and existing storm mains from damage during construction and to accommodate the existing flows during construction.

This item includes all storm control necessary for all aspects of the Construction.

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, equipment, and incidentals required to control dry and wet weather flow in the storm sewer system during the reconstruction project to minimize damage to the treatment structure during installation of the structure and during concrete cure times.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Storm Control shall be measured by the lump sum for all flow control necessary throughout construction.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Storm Control shall be paid for at the contract price, which shall be full compensation for all work as outlined in the description.

#### BID ITEM 90031 BORE AND JACK 24" C900 STORM SEWER PIPE

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include the installation and material cost to BORE AND JACK 24" C900 STORM SEWER PIPE with casings. Work under this item shall include all work, materials, pipe, equipment, and incidentals required to install storm sewer pipe P-71 on the plan set under the railroad tracks.

The sewer shall be installed by boring and jacking at the location and elevations shown on the plan set. Included with this bid item is a suitable sized "casing pipe". The casing pipe must be sized in order for the inner sewer pipe to properly fit within the casing pipe. The inner pipe material may require differing casing pipe sizes, which shall be at the discretion of the Contractor. All costs for furnishing and installing the steel casing pipe, casing spacers, access and receiving pits, and all work necessary to jack and bore sections shall be included.

Included in this item is the excavation and backfilling of the receiving pits. Disposal of the excess material shall be by the Contractor off site at a location to be determined by the Contractor. Backfilled material shall meet City of Madison Standard Specifications for road construction. Necessary work and materials to adequately secure the pits with full cover or security fencing shall be incidental to this bid item. Any dewatering necessary for the construction and maintenance of the pits (Dewatering - Type I) shall be considered incidental to this bid item. Any dewatering Type II needed for this item shall be covered under bid item 50201 Dewatering Type II. Also incidental to this bid item shall be the removal and replacement of items required to install the new sewer and casing: culverts, private storm sewer pipe, and storm sewer access structures.

The Contractor is informed that the casing pipe specified shall be the minimum of 30"diameter. The Contractor is responsible to complete installation of a casing pipe under this item and should he/she deem it necessary to utilize a larger diameter casing pipe that shall be the Contractor's option and is included in this item.

Only 88' of bore and jack shall be paid. If the contractor chooses to install additional storm sewer by bore and jack method it shall be at their own expense and shall not be compensated.

#### SITE ACCESS

The bike path adjacent to the site shall be closed from Dennett Dr to Dempsey Rd. The contractor may access the site from the bike path by way of Ring st. The contractor shall be responsible for any damage to the bike path caused by construction activities including repaying if necessary. The need for repaying shall be determined by the field engineer and the contractor shall not be compensated for this work. Any repaying shall be done in segments a minimum of 25 feet in length with saw cuts at both ends.

#### MATERIALS

Bore and Jack shall include all materials necessary to install the 24" C900 storm sewer pipe in accord with the requirements above including the 24" C900 storm sewer pipe. A casing pipe included with this item shall be in accord with the following:

- ASTM specification A139 Grade B or AWWA specification C200
- Outside diameter as specified by the Contractor
- Not coated or cathodically protected, no hydrostatic testing required
- See chart on page U-16 for minimum casing thickness

- Specified minimum yield strength, SMYS, of at least 35,000 psi
- New and unused pipe
- Straight and round pipe
- Beveled ends for butt welding

The Contractor shall submit the following to the Engineer for approval prior to ordering of materials and the start of construction:

- Certificate of compliance for the steel casing pipe
- Materials for sand of pea gravel
- Materials for casing spacers and distances between spacers
- Materials and methods for bulkheading the casing ends

#### CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Prior to installing pipe in the casing, a set of prefabricated spacers shall be strapped to the pipe at 8' intervals. The spacers shall be set so that the pipe does not touch the casing. Pipe joints shall be made outside of the casing. Sand or Pea gravel shall be washed or blown into the casing to the spring line of the pipe to provide bedding under the pipe.

#### Pipe Spacers:

Non-Centered stainless Steel spacers (PSI S8GN-2 http://www.pipelineseal.com/pdf\_lit/csem&bg.pdf or approve approved equivalent) shall be installed in the casing pipe at varying to the new sewer main to set the sewer main to the desired slope. Spacers shall be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications with maximum spacing of 8'.

The untrenched construction shall be performed by dry auger boring and jacking. Water jacking for excavation of the soil is not allowed. The use of water to facilitate removal of spoil is permitted. The untrenched construction shall extend beneath the Wisconsin and Southern Railroad and to the limits shown on the plan set.

For the casing installation, the bore hole diameter shall be essentially the same as the outside diameter of the pipe. In soft, unstable soil, the auger shall be inside the casing, but no undersized, so as not to create a void between the casing and the soil. If voids should develop or if the bore hole diameter is greater than the outside diameter of the pipe by more than approximately 1 inch, the voids shall be pressure grouted.

Connection of adjacent lengths of steel pipe shall be done by continuous, circumferential, field butt welding in accordance with AWWA C206. The connection shall result in a straight and true casing with a watertight seal.

The conduit pipe shall be installed on line and grade through the casing pipe. Install approved casing spacers at the approved distances. Fill the annular space between the casing and carrier pipe with the approved material (sand or pea gravel).

Take care to ensure that developed thrust pressures do not disturb existing utilities in or around the bore pit area.

Upon completion of the work, the contractor shall restore the property to its pre-construction condition. Wisconsin & Southern Railroad shall have the rights to request additional restoration if it is determined that the restoration efforts are unsatisfactory.

The Developer's engineer has obtained a permit for this work from the railroad and this permit is included with the special provisions. The contractor shall comply with all requirements of this permit including but

not limited to notifying the Manager of Track Maintenance at least 72 hours in advance of entering the railroad corridor. Contact information is listed in the permit.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Bore and Jack shall be measured as a lump sum for successful completion of the 24" sanitary sewer pipe and larger casing pipe as described above. Only 88' of bore and jack shall be paid. If the contractor chooses to install additional sanitary sewer by bore and jack method it shall be at their own expense and shall not be compensated.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Bore and Jack shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description, materials, and method of construction. Only 88' of bore and jack shall be paid. If the contractor chooses to install additional sanitary sewer by bore and jack method it shall be at their own expense and shall not be compensated.

#### BID ITEM 90032 STORMWATER POND CLAY LINER

#### DESCRIPTION

This item includes all work necessary to provide and place one two (2) foot (finish depth) lift of clay liner over the stormwater management pond as shown on page U-15. This item shall include placement of clay fill at the locations shown on the plans and cross sections or as directed by the Engineer in the Field. The stormwater management pond shown on page U-15 shall have a clay liner installed in all areas below elevation 856.04. The top of the clay lining shall have a finish grade as shown in the plan set.

The clay lining shall be compacted to a level of permeability equal to or less than 1 X 10 cm/sec with suitable equipment.

Soils used in clay liner construction shall have a minimum plasticity index of 7 with no values less than 5 as tested by Atterberg Limit tests (ASTM D-4318), a minimum of 50% passing the number 200 sieve, and a recompacted in-place permeability as specified on the construction plans. Soils shall have average liquid limit value of 16 with no value less than 14.

Clay materials shall contain no sod, brush, roots, frozen soil, or other perishable materials. Rock particles larger than 3 inches shall be removed prior to compaction of the clay.

Pond surfaces shall be graded to remove surface irregularities and shall be scarified or otherwise acceptably scored or loosened to a minimum depth of 2 inches. The moisture content of the loosened material shall be controlled as specified for the clay liner, and the surface materials shall be compacted and bonded with the first layer of the clay liner as specified for subsequent layers of clay liner.

The clay liner shall not be placed until the required foundation preparation has been completed and the foundation has been inspected and approved by the Field Engineer. The clay liner shall not be placed upon a frozen surface, nor shall snow, ice, or frozen material be incorporated in the clay liner.

The clay liner shall be placed in lifts. The thickness of each lift before compaction shall not exceed the smaller of 6 inches or the length of the teeth of the footed compactor used.

The distribution of materials throughout the clay liner shall be essentially uniform, and the clay liner shall be free from lenses, pockets, streaks, or layers of material differing substantially in texture, moisture content, or gradation from the surrounding material.

If the surface of any layer becomes too hard and smooth for proper bond with the succeeding layer, it shall be scarified to a depth of not less than 2 inches before the next layer is placed.

Clay compaction and documentation shall meet all standards as specified in NRCS Wisconsin construction specification 204, earthfill waste storage facilities. Clay shall be placed in 8" to 12" lifts and compacted with a sheepsfoot roller (or other equipment deemed acceptable by Construction Engineer).

All fill around pipes and outlet structures consist of this same type of clay and shall be installed following the same construction methods.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Stormwater Pond Clay Liner within the limits shown and described on the plans will be paid for based on "plan quantity" as shown in the Contract without measurement thereof.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Stormwater Pond Clay Liner shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above which shall be full compensation for all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

#### BID ITEM 90033 STOCKPILING OF NITROGEN-CONTAMINATED SOIL

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all work, materials, equipment, and incidentals required to segregate. and stockpile nitrogen-contaminated soil per these special provisions.

Residual nitrogen-contaminated soil associated with the Royster Clark fertilizer plant exists on site as shown on page U-14 of the plan set. Nitrogen-contaminated soil is only found within this zone below elevation 854. Nitrogen-contaminated soil for purposes of this bid item shall be defined as soil excavated from within the zone shown on page U-14 of the plan set, and excavated from below elevation 854.0.

It is anticipated that excavation of nitrogen-contaminated soil will occur during construction of the stormwater management pond and during some installation of sanitary sewer and water main. While working with the contaminated material, the contactor shall comply with all federal, state, and local regulations.

During excavation of the pond the City Surveyor shall mark the limits of the 854 contour within the pond area, to delineate the zone of contaminated soil. Material excavated from this area shall be hauled and stockpiled on site in the northwest area of Lot 2, as directed by the Owner (Ruedebusch Development) or the Construction Engineer. This is the lot located immediately to the east of the pond.

Contaminated soil will be encountered while digging utility trenches within the street area from approximately station 11+10 to 13+10, below elevation 854. Contaminated soil excavated from the utility trenches below elevation 854 shall be placed in the Nitrogen-contaminated soil stockpile, if determined to be unsuitable trench backfill material by the Construction Engineer. The entire quantity (91cy) of trench excavation below elevation 854 within this zone shall be paid, regardless of whether soil is reused as trench backfill or placed in the stockpile, and is included in the quantity on the proposal page.

Stockpile shall be piled in a stable arrangement and rough graded as directed by Ruedebusch. Following . deposition of soil in the stockpile, Ruedebusch shall be responsible for erosion control of the stockpile.

The contractor shall control operations in the contaminated soil areas to minimize the quantity of contaminated soil excavated. The contractor shall only excavate contaminated soils as required by the construction plan set, and shall only place contaminated soils in the designated stockpile. There shall be no additional compensation for over excavated materials, unless directed by the Construction Engineer. The contractor shall use loading and hauling practices that are appropriate to prevent any spills or releases of contaminated soils or residues. If spills or releases occur, immediately notify the field

engineer. Immediately recover all contaminated soil, residue, and any new contamination that was caused by the spill or release. Prior to hauling, sufficiently dewater soils so as not to contain free liquids.

Note that the excavation of contaminated soil is not included in this bid item, but shall be compensated under Bid Item 20101 Excavation Cut. This item 90033 is intended to compensate for additional efforts to manage the contaminated soil, beyond excavation.

No additional environmental construction inspection or testing of the contaminated soil is required by City Engineering or DNR.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

STOCKPILING OF NITOGEN-CONTAMINATED SOIL shall not be measured but shall be paid by the plan quantity.

The quantity was calculated using a digital terrain model of the pond, and calculating the volume of soil to be excavated within the contaminated soil zone overlaying the pond area, below elevation 854. The additional 2' over-excavation required for clay liner installation was accounted for in this calculation.

If Construction Engineer directs that additional soil from outside the pond area is to be stockpiled (not including utility trenches), the volume of that additional quantity shall be measured in the field and shall be computed by the method of average end areas.

#### **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

STOCKPILING OF NITOGEN-CONTAMINATED SOIL shall be paid for at the contract price, which shall be full compensation for segregating contaminated soil, hauling soil to the stockpile, any temporary stockpiling, placing soil in the stockpile, grading stockpile, maintaining stockpile, and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work.

#### BID ITEM 90070 SANITARY SEWER STRUCTURE JOINT SEAL

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item includes all work, materials, equipment, and incidentals required to seal sanitary sewer structure external joints. Manhole joint seal shall be minimum of nine (9) inches wide, and consist of flexible rubberize seal conforming to ASTM C923 held in place with stainless steel compression bands or butyl adhesive tape conforming to ASTM C877 or heat shrink sleeve over visco-elastic adhesive sealant.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Sanitary Sewer Structure Joint Seal is measured as each joint of sanitary sewer structure sealed as described above.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Sanitary Sewer Structure Joint Seal will be paid for at the contract price, and is considered full compensation for all work as listed above.

#### BID ITEM 90071 SANITARY SEWER ACCESS ROAD PERMANENT

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all materials, labor and incidentals necessary to grade an access path in accordance with Standard Detail Drawing S.D.D. 5.1.4 at the locations provided on the plan set and as directed by the field engineer. Seed, mulch, and fertilizer shall be paid separately.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Sanitary Sewer Access Road Permanent, as described above shall be measured by trench foot as installed in the field.

#### BASIS OF PAYMENT

Sanitary Sewer Access Road Permanent, as measured above, shall be full compensation for all work, materials and incidentals to complete the work as described above.

#### BID ITEM 90072 WASTEWATER CONTROL- HEAVY FLOW

#### DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include wastewater control (bypass pumping of the sewer being replaced) in the amount of 3200 gpm. All work shall be done in conformance of Part V of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction- Latest Addition. It is anticipated that pumping trucks will need to be utilized while structure 6444-012 along the railroad tracks is under construction.

Work under this item includes all equipment, labor, materials, coordination, and incidentals required to control or divert, to the engineer's satisfaction, sanitary sewer flows during reconstruction of the 21" main on the job.

Contractor shall provide a pump with a capacity of 3200 gallons per minute and all associated equipment required to maintain a functioning sanitary sewer system during construction. Clean site thoroughly to the satisfaction of the engineer prior to the resumption of any construction operations.

#### METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Wastewater Control- Heavy Flow is measured as a single lump sum unit of work acceptably completed.

#### **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

Wastewater Control- Heavy Flow will be paid for at the contract price, and is considered full compensation for all work as listed above.







NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>TWO MILLION THREE HUNDRED</u> <u>SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED TWENTY AND 82/100</u> (\$2,371,620.82) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.

#### 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

**General and Authorization.** The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided unless otherwise noted in Section D: Special Provisions, Subsection 102.10 – Minimum Rate of Wage Scale.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include pre-apprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

**Establishment of Wage Rates.** The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

**Workforce Profile.** The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

**Payrolls and Records.** The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the

contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

**Hourly contributions.** Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

**Apprentices and Subjourney persons.** Apprentices and sub journeypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

**Straight Time Wages.** The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

**Overtime Wages.** The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

**Posting of Wage Rates and Hours.** A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

**Evidence of Compliance by Contractor.** Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the

names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.

b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

**Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor.** Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefore; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

### Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

#### Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

### Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

### Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

### Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

### Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.

Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

### Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

### Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

- 7. The day before if January 1, July 4 or December 25 falls on a Saturday.
- 8. The day following if January 1, July 4 or December 25 falls on a Sunday.

### s. 66.0903 (10) RECORDS; INSPECTION; ENFORCEMENT.

(a) Each contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent performing work on a project of public works that is subject to this section shall keep full and accurate records clearly indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person performing the work described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

### s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

(a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.

2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.

3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages. 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

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# BUILDING OR HEAVY CONSTRUCTION

For classification purposes, the exterior height of a residential building, in terms of stories, is the primary consideration. All incidental items such as site work, driveways, parking lots, private sidewalks, private septic systems or sewer and water laterals connected to a public system and swimming pools are included within this definition. Residential buildings of five (5) stories and above are NOT included within this definition.
