



SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

C-1

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

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The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

2.2 Contract Compliance

2.3 Certification of SBE by City of Madison

The Affirmative Action Division maintains a directory of SBEs which are currently certified as such by the City of Madison. Contact the Contract Compliance Officer as indicated in Section 2.2 to receive a copy of the SBE Directory or you may access the SBE Directory online at www.cityofinadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access the Targeted Business Certification Application online at www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.
- 2.4.1.2 Using the City of Madison's directory of certified SBEs to identify SBEs from which to solicit bids.
- 2.4.1.3 Assuring that SBEs are solicited whenever they are potential sources.
- 2.4.1.4 Referring prospective SBEs to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division for certification.
- 2.4.1.5 Dividing total project requirements into smaller tasks and/or quantities, where economically feasible, to permit maximum feasible SBE participation.
- 2.4.1.6 Establishing delivery schedules, where requirements permit, which will encourage participation by SBEs.

- 2.4.1.7 Providing SBEs with specific information regarding the work to be performed.
- 2.4.1.8 Contacting SBEs in advance of the deadline to allow such businesses sufficient time to prepare a bid.
- 2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. 5% above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.
- 2.4.1.10 Contacting SBEs which submit a bid, to inquire about the details of the bid and confirm that the scope of the work was interpreted as intended.

2.4.2 Reporting SBE Utilization and Good Faith Efforts

The Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report is to be submitted by the bidder in a separate sealed envelope marked: "ENVELOPE 2 - SBE COMPLIANCE REPORT." This report is due by the specified bid closing time and date. Bids submitted without a completed SBE Compliance Report as outlined below shall be deemed non-responsible and the bidder ineligible for award of this contract.

- 2.4.2.1 If the Bidder <u>meets or exceeds</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.1.1 Cover Page, Page C-7; and
 - 2.4.2.1.2 Summary Sheet, C-8.
- 2.4.2.2 If the bidder <u>does not meet</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.2.1 Cover Page, Page C-7;
 - 2.4.2.2.2 Summary Sheet, C-8; and
 - 2.4.2.2.3 SBE Contact Report, C-9 and C-10. (A separate Contact Report must be completed for each applicable SBE which is not utilized.)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is deemed <u>non-responsible</u> for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may, within 72 hours of receiving such notification, appeal that decision to a special appeals committee composed of three (3) members of the Affirmative Action Commission, three (3) members of the Board of Public Works and a seventh member appointed by the Mayor. All appeals must be made in writing to the City Engineer and <u>received</u> within 72 hours of City of Madison's notice. Postmark not applicable.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

N. THORNTON AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION CONTRACT NO. 6984

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.10: MINIMUM RATE OF WAGE SCALE

For this project, payment of prevailing wages (white sheet) is not required if either: a single trade accounts for 85% or more of the total labor costs of the project and the bid is less than \$48,000; or no single trade accounts for 85% or more of the total labor costs of the project and the bid is less than \$100,000. For bids not meeting either of these conditions, prevailing wages shall be required.

If required, the wages and benefits paid on the contract shall not be less than those specified in the Prevailing Wage Determination included with these contract documents for the following types of work:

	Building and Heavy Construction
	Sewer, Water, and Tunnel Construction
\boxtimes	Local Street and Miscellaneous Paving Operations
	Residential and Agricultural Construction

All bidders are notified that all labor employed on City contracts must be paid in accordance with the minimum rate of wage scale included in the Contract Documents.

For the information of the employees working on the project, a copy of the wage scale included in the contract documents and the provisions of Section 66.0903(8) of the Wisconsin Statutes shall be kept posted by the employer and in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the site of the project.

The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of each employee who worked on such City project and all other projects the employee worked in the same period, and the Contractor must keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. Such records shall, in addition, set forth the full weekly wages earned by each such employee and the actual hourly wage paid to that employee. The Contractor shall submit payroll records to the Engineer every week for those periods when work is being done on the project. Said submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

The Contractor shall ensure that employees shall be paid unconditionally and shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the City of Madison 'Minimum Rate of Wage Scale' and that each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to such employee. Questions regarding an employee's classification or rate of pay within that classification, shall

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be resolved by the practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Therefore, rate of pay, classification and work jurisdiction disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determinations by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor shall agree that the normal rate of wage paid to the Contractor's employees on other projects shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of the requirement to pay no less than the minimum rate of wage scale on a City project. Mulcting of employees on City projects by contractors, such as by kickbacks or other such devices, is prohibited.

These contract provisions shall apply to all work performed on the contract by the Contractor with its own organization and with assistance of laborers under its immediate superintendency and to all work performed by piecework or by subcontract. No laborer, worker, or mechanic shall be employed directly upon the site of the work except on a wage basis, but this shall not be construed to prohibit the rental of equipment from individuals.

In the event of a refusal by the Contractor to submit payroll records as required by the contract, the City of Madison shall have the option to cancel this contract and request the Surety to perform or to relet the balance of the work for bids, and in that event, to charge the Contractor for any loss which the City may incur thereby.

SECTION 102.12: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$53,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$257,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this contract shall include, but is not limited to, installation of storm sewer, curb and gutter, base preparation, asphalt pavement, asphalt path, and concrete aprons.

The project is approximately 1000 ft. in length. The project limits for the work are:

North Thornton Avenue: Through Tenney Park, from Sherman Avenue to approximately 50 feet northwest of the entrance to the parking lot for the new Tenney Park Shelter.

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 105.1: AUTHORITY OF THE ENGINEER

The Engineer shall resolve all questions which arise as to the quality and acceptability of materials furnished, work performed, manner of performance, rate of progress of the work, interpretation of the plans and Specifications, acceptable fulfillment of the contract, compensation, and disputes and mutual rights between Contractors under the Specifications. The Engineer shall determine the amount and quantity of work performed and materials furnished.

All decisions of the Engineer shall, when so requested, be rendered in writing. They shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

Any change proposed by a Contractor in SBE subcontractors, vendors or suppliers from those SBEs indicated on the SBE Compliance Report must be approved by the Engineer and the City's Manager of the Affirmative Action Division (hereafter, AAD). When requested, such decision shall be rendered in writing. Such decisions shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor or the affected SBE applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

In the event the Engineer and the AAD disagree over the proper decision to be made regarding an SBE, the Mayor shall appoint a third person to resolve the disagreement, within 30 days of appointment. The decision thus rendered may be reviewed by the Board of Public Works upon request of the Contractor or the affected SBE as set forth in Sections 105.1 and 105.2 of the City's standard specifications.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall use care around existing buildings, trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps and driveways and other improvements. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. No trees, other than those shown on the plan to be removed, shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2. Excavation and filling around trees to remain shall be minimized to avoid impact on those trees. Grading limits shown on the plans are approximate, and the Contractor shall adjust the grading limits to minimize impacts to trees and other features that are to remain.

No staging will be allowed in the new parking lot adjacent to the new Tenney Park Shelter. Contractor is advised that to use care in that park users and pedestrians may be present in the area during and after work hours. Contractor shall coordinate and provide access by Park Staff and equipment to allow removal of trash from the new Tenney Park shelter on Mondays, and at other times if needed.

The Contractor is alerted that work may be undertaken by others in approximately the same timeframe and in the same area as the proposed project. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to verify this information and any subsequent changes in the scheduling of the work by others and make corrections in his/her construction timetable as required. The City of Madison has information about the following work in the project area:

Contract No. 6656 Tenney Maintenance Bridge. Work under this contract was begun in Autumn 2012 and will be completed by June 2013. This contract has been awarded to Joe Daniels Construction Company (Contact Mike O'Brien 235-1040). Coordination will be required for work on these two contracts. For contractor's information only, plans for this project are available online at the following location:

Contractor shall repair any damage caused by construction to paved or grassed areas of the park outside the grading, in kind, at Contractor's expense.

SECTION 105.13 ORDER OF COMPLETEION

The Contractor shall not disturb the river banks, including placement of the silt curtain, prior to May 15, 2013 per the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource Permits.

SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

The Contractor shall be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The traffic control plan may need to be altered as conditions change in the field or as unexpected conditions occur. This may include relocating existing traffic control or providing additional traffic control. The Contractor shall install and maintain any necessary modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

All signing and barricading shall conform to the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD).

N. Thornton Avenue within the project limits may be closed for the duration of the project, except that the road must be open to 2-way traffic after 3 p.m. on each Friday afternoon until each Monday morning at 6:00 a.m., to allow for traffic to reach the new Tenney Park Shelter for weekend rentals. The maintained traffic lanes may be gravel-surfaced.

The Contractor will be responsible for installing and maintaining a signed bike detour for the duration of the closure. The signed bike detour will run from Sherman Ave at Thornton Ave south to Marston Ave then east to the path that runs adjacent to E Johnson St then north along the path to the bridge over the Yahara River. The contractor shall have a detour route plan approved by the City Traffic Engineer before starting work.

Type A warning lights shall be installed on all barricades used in the project per State of Wisconsin S.D.D. 15C2-4B. Contractor shall also place Type C warning lights on any barrels used to taper traffic or lane closures.

Maintain pedestrian movements at the crosswalks at the Sherman/Thornton intersection at all times.

Contractor shall have an appropriately equipped flagger at any location where construction equipment or trucks are leaving the jobsite and entering normal traffic flow.

The Contractor may remove parking within the project limits, where necessary for construction. The Contractor shall be responsible for posting and maintaining NO PARKING signs in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and the City of Madison Police Department's "Guidelines for Temporary No Parking Restrictions for Construction or Special Events".

Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

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The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681,

one (1) working day prior to placement of the plates.

The Contractor shall not remove or cover any traffic signs. For removal, replacement, or covering of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of 2 working days in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed or covered. This service is free of charge. If the Contractor removes or covers the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation or repair of, and any damage to, the signing equipment.

Contact Mark Winter, Traffic Engineering Division, 266-6543, with any questions concerning these

traffic control specifications.

SECTION 107.8 NOTIFICATION WHEN CLOSING STREET

The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of one (1) working day in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the Contractor removes the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment.

SECTION 107.10 OPENING OF SECTION OF HIGHWAY TO TRAFFIC

Upon completion of all concrete work, final surface course of pavement, landscaping, topsoil, seed or sod, the City Construction Engineer shall certify that it is complete and shall contact the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, 266-4767. The Contractor shall leave all barricades and traffic control in place until such time that the permanent pavement marking and signing has been installed by the City. The City shall notify the Contractor when the final pavement marking and signing is complete and the Contractor shall remove all temporary construction signs and barricades within 24 hours of the notification.

SECTION 107.13: TREE PROTECTION SPECIFICATIONS

The Contractor is advised to review Section 107.13 of the Standard Specifications for tree protection. Tree protection specifications are applicable except as provided below.

All trees shall be saved except those trees marked for removal on the plans, or those the Contractor is directed by the Engineer to remove in the field. Because of the intent to save trees, there are trees to be saved that are inside or very close to the construction limits. It is recognized that grading operations and root cutting of these trees may need to occur within 5 feet of these trees in order to complete the work, but care must be taken in these areas. Roots shall be cut cleanly by using a saw, axe, lopping shears, chain saw, stump grinder, or other means which will produce a clean cut. Exposed roots shall be covered as soon as excavation is complete. The Contractor shall not rip or pull roots out towards the trunk of a tree while excavating with a backhoe. The use of a backhoe to cut roots is NOT acceptable. Grading within 5' of the trees within the construction area, where absolutely required, shall be minimized. For trees in or near the work area meriting special protection as determined by The City Forestry Representative, root cutting shall be performed if needed as described in Section 107.13, and shall be paid as Bid Item 10801. Failure to notify the City Forestry Representative at least 24 hours in advance of work shall result in no payment for this item. Tree protection fencing shall be used as directed by the Engineer, and shall be paid as Bid Item 90002.

With regard to Section 107.14(g), no equipment or materials will be allowed to be parked on, or piled on areas within 5 feet of a tree. Construction traffic within 5 feet of a tree will be allowed only where

necessary to complete grading operations, as described above, at the discretion of the Construction Engineer.

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on <u>MARCH 25, 2013</u>. The date of completion for all work under this contract shall be <u>MAY 24, 2013</u>. Note that the Contractor shall not disturb the river banks, including placement of the silt curtain, prior to May 15, 2013.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received.

The fixed, agreed upon, daily liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the contract shall be computed in accordance with Section 109.7 of the Specifications starting with the start date shown or the actual date work begins whichever is sooner.

SECTION 500 SEWERS AND SEWER STRUCTURES

STORM SEWER GENERAL

The storm sewer designer for this project is Sally Swenson: (608) 266-4862, sswenson@cityofmadison.com

Reconnection of existing pipes at new structures, or new pipes at new structures shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation.

BID ITEM 20101: EXCAVATION CUT

DESCRIPTION

Excavation Cut shall be in accordance with Article 201 of the Standard Specifications, except as provided below.

The intent of the design is that the existing pavement be pulverized and shaped where possible as determined by the Construction Engineer, however there are areas where the new pavement is outside the limits of the existing pavement, and areas where the new pavement grades are different elevations than the existing grades. Also, due to existing soils conditions, undercut may be required in areas outside the current paving limits, as well as within the current paving limits.

It is intended that where the existing subgrade conditions allow, and pulverize and shape is possible, that excavation to place the full depth of base course shown on the cross sections will not be required, at the discretion of the Construction Engineer. However, the plan quantity of excavation cut does include excavation to achieve the full base course depth as shown on the cross-sections, and this quantity will not be measured but will be paid as plan quantity, regardless of whether the excavation is required or not.

Any undercut or excavation directed by the Engineer beyond the limits shown on the cross sections shall be measured in the field and paid for as Excavation Cut.

No bulking/expansion or shrink factors were used when determining earthworks quantities for this project. No adjustments have been made to excavation cut and fill borrow quantities to account for topsoil, or redistribution of materials during pulverize and shape. In cut sections or at-grade sections, if

over-excavation is required to place adequate topsoil thickness, over-excavation shall be considered to be incidental to bid item 20221 – topsoil.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Excavation Cut within the limits shown on the plans and cross sections will be paid for based on the "plan quantity" as shown in the contract without measurement thereof, plus actual undercut quantities measured in the field. The plan quantity was computed by average end area based on the sections.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Excavation shall be paid for at the contract price for work as described and measured above which shall be full compensation for all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

BID ITEM 20202: FILL BORROW

DESCRIPTION

Fill shall be in accordance with Article 202 of the Standard Specifications, except as provided below.

Fill for the project shall be paid by the plan quantity as Fill Borrow, regardless of whether the fill is obtained from the excavation cut, or from a borrow site. Suitable materials obtained from excavation cut may be reused as fill within the project limits. Furnishing and placement of fill materials shall be included with this bid item and shall not be compensated separately, whether materials are obtained on-site or imported from a borrow site.

No bulking/expansion or shrink factors were used when determining earthworks quantities for this project. No adjustments have been made to Excavation Cut and Fill Borrow quantities to account for topsoil, or redistribution of materials during Pulverize and Shape. In cut sections or at-grade sections, if over-excavation is required to place adequate topsoil thickness, over-excavation shall be considered to be incidental to Bid Item 20221 — Topsoil.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Fill Borrow shall not be measured but shall be paid based on the "plan quantity." The plan quantity was computed by average end area based on the sections.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Fill Borrow shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above, which shall be full compensation for all material, labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work.

BID ITEM 20221: TOPSOIL

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include placement of topsoil within the seeding limits shown on the drawings or as directed by the Engineer in the field, in accordance with Section 202 of the Standard Specifications. Topsoil shall be placed four (4) inches thick per the Standard Specifications. Topsoil materials and placement shall be in accordance with Article 202 – Fill.

Salvaged topsoil from on site meeting the specifications may be reused. In some areas the existing topsoil thickness may be adequate and no additional topsoil may be required, however scarifying of the existing topsoil may be required.

Any required topsoil stripping or stockpiling shall be considered incidental to this bid item.

Prior to seeding, topsoil and the seed bed shall be approved by Parks Division Staff (Tom Maglio 266-6518).

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Topsoil shall be measured by the square yard.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Topsoil shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above, which shall be full compensation for all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this item of work, including segregating, stockpiling, and preparing salvaged topsoil, furnishing topsoil from off-site as needed, placing, grading and raking finished surface.

BID ITEM 20405: BRUSH CLEARING

DESCRIPTION

This item shall include clearing of all brush, trees less than 3" diameter, shrubs, windfalls, logs, and other vegetation within the grading limits, from approximately STA 7+75 to STA 10+75 along the left (north) side. All trees in this zone, greater than 3" diameter, shall be saved, except those marked on the plans for removal. The Contractor is strongly encouraged to visit the site prior to bidding in order to become familiar with site access and the quantity of brush removal.

Brush clearing shall consist of removing all unmarked small trees, brush, and shrubs and herbaceous vegetation and completely removing them from site. Smaller trees and brush shall be removed within 1 inch below proposed finished grades. Any fill required to backfill holes where stumps are removed shall be considered incidental to this bid item. All clearing shall be done by sawing brush near the ground line. Under no circumstances is the Contractor permitted to pull trees from the ground or use methods which will significantly disturb existing root systems.

This item shall include removal of windfalls, and logs present within the work area.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

This item shall be measured by the station along the station line.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

This work, measured as provided above, will be paid for at the contract price which shall be considered full compensation for furnishing all labor and equipment for all clearing actually performed, and for the handling and disposal of all debris resulting from brush clearing.

BID ITEM 20230 - HEAVY RIPRAP (GLACIAL STONE) IMPORT

DESCRIPTION

This item shall include the provision, stockpiling, and placement of natural glacial rock or field stone (non-sedimentary rock). The stone sizing shall comply with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation definition of Heavy Riprap. The rock shall be durable stone hauled from an off-site source. The stone shall be sound, hard, dense, resistant to the action of air and water, and free from seams, cracks, or other structural defects. The stone shall consist of varying sizes and weights. Any stone that has been cracked either by shipping, handling, or placing and does not meet the specified size range shall be removed from the project and replace. The Engineer shall review and approve stone before the Contractor brings it on-site.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Heavy Riprap (Glacial Stone) Import shall be measured by the ton of stone brought to the site and placed. The quantity on the proposal page was estimated and assumes that no existing riprap may be salvaged from the existing riprap on site. The actual quantity is expected to vary depending on how much existing stone can be salvaged from the site. No change in the bid price shall be approved should this item be increased or decreased.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Heavy Riprap (Glacial Stone) Import shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above, which shall be full compensation for all material, labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this work.

BID ITEM 20602: OBLITERATE STREET

DESCRIPTION

Obliterate Street shall be in accordance with Article 206 of the Standard Specifications, except as provided below.

This item is intended to compensate for removal of the portions of the existing street outside the limits of the new pavement, including the asphalt pad south of station 5+90.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Obliterate Street shall not be measured but shall be paid as a lump sum.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Obliterate Street shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above, which shall be full compensation for all material, labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this work.

BID ITEM 40311 - PULVERIZE & SHAPE

Pulverize and Shape shall be in accordance with Section 403.3 of the Standard Specifications, except as provided below.

Excess material from Pulverizing & Shaping existing pavement shall first be used as needed in areas of the roadway that additional material is needed to construct the pavement at the proposed grades, if approved by the Construction Engineer. If there is still additional material, it shall be used as necessary for base under the proposed path or in any other locations where this type of material will meet the City Standard Specifications. Use of this material in other locations on the project site shall be considered incidental to this bid item. If excess material still remains, it shall be removed from the site at no additional cost to the City.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Pulverize and Shape shall not be measured but shall be paid based on the "plan quantity". The plan quantity was computed based on the square yardage of the proposed asphalt within the street, regardless of the fact that new and old pavement areas differ.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Pulverize and Shape shall be paid at the contract price for work as described and measured above, which shall be full compensation for all material, labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete this work.

BID ITEM 90001 - FURNISH & INSTALL PVC CONDUIT

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all equipment, labor and incidentals necessary to furnish and install 2" Schedule 80 PVC conduits across the asphalt paths where shown, according to the Standard Specifications for Public Works Contracts and State of Wisconsin Electrical Codes. The price per linear foot for the installation of the new conduit (Bid Item #90001), is to include the purchase and installation of the PVC pipe, trenching, backfilling and the installation of tracer wire in the conduit. The contractor will also be responsible for cleaning out the inside of the conduits and taping up the ends. Ends of the conduits shall extend at least 2' past the edge of pavement and shall be sealed with end caps.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Furnish and install PVC conduit shall be measured per linear foot.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Furnish and install PVC conduit, as measured above, shall be full compensation for all materials, labor, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work as described above.

BID ITEM 90002: TEMPORARY FENCING

DESCRIPTION

This item includes furnishing and installation of temporary construction fencing as directed by the Engineer. Minor relocation of fencing may be required as the work progresses. No extra payment shall be made for temporarily opening and re-closing the fence, or minor relocation of the fencing as needed to perform the work.

Construction fencing shall be International Orange color, high-density polyethylene mesh conforming to the following:

• Mesh opening: 1 inch min to 3 inch max

Height: 4 feet

Ultimate tensile strength: Avg 3000 lb per 4' width (ASTM D638)

Posts shall be conventional metal "T" or "U" shaped posts. Fencing shall be installed according to the manufacturer's recommendations.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Temporary fencing shall be measured by the linear foot installed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Cost for temporary fencing shall be paid for according to the contract unit price. Price shall include payment for providing and installing temporary fence and appurtenances, maintenance of fencing as required, creating and closing temporary openings as needed, and removal of fencing and appurtenances including furnishing all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to perform the work.

BID ITEM 90030 - SITE WATER CONTROL

DESCRIPTION

This bid item shall include all work necessary to control water on the site. This shall include any dewatering, storm water control, or surface water control necessary for any portion of the work. Should dewatering be necessary, the Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining and complying with the proper permits from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. The Contractor shall submit a water control plan to the Engineer prior to the start of work. The plan shall detail how storm water and groundwater will be managed on the site.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Site Water Control shall be measured as a lump sum for all work required to control water at the site for the duration of the project.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Site Water Control shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract price, which shall be considered full compensation for all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to control water, either in the form of storm water, surface water, and groundwater that may be encountered at the site.

BID ITEM 90031 - SILT CURTAIN

DESCRIPTION

Work under this bid item shall include all labor, materials, and incidentals required to furnish and install silt curtain for the installation of structure S-1 and pipe P-1, or as deemed necessary by the Construction Engineer. The silt curtain shall meet the requirements of, and be installed according to, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Technical Specification 1070, which is attached as a supplement to the Special Provisions section.

METHOD OF MESUREMENT

Silt Curtain shall be measured per lineal foot of barrier installed, maintained, and removed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Silt Curtain shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for that the contract price, which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to install silt curtain as a sediment barrier for the culvert inlet, the culvert outlet, or both.

BID ITEM 90032 - 8 INCH NON-METALLIC STORM SEWER PIPE

DESCRIPTION


This bid item shall include all materials, labor and incidentals necessary to provide and install 8 Inch Non-Metallic Storm Sewer Pipe as shown on the plan set. Materials and installation shall be in accordance with Section 504 of the Standard Specifications.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

8 Inch Non-Metallic Storm Pipe shall be measured per lineal foot of pipe supplied and installed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

8 Inch Non-Metallic Storm Pipe shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for that the contract price, which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, labor, and incidentals required to install silt curtain as a sediment barrier for the culvert inlet, the culvert outlet, or both.

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SECTION G: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 27 day of Fubrus in the year Two Thousand and Thirteen between SPEEDWAY SAND & GRAVEL, INC., hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted <u>FEBRUARY 26, 2013</u>, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE</u> <u>THOUSAND, NINE HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN DOLLARS AND SEVENTY CENTS</u> (\$253,927.70) being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Wage Rates for Employees of Public Works Contractors

General and Authorization. The Contractor shall compensate its employees at the prevailing wage rate in accordance with section 66.0903, Wis. Stats., DWD 290 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and as hereinafter provided.

"Public Works" shall include building or work involving the erection, construction, remodeling, repairing or demolition of buildings, parking lots, highways, streets, bridges, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, sanitary sewers, water mains and appurtenances, storm sewers, and the grading and landscaping of public lands.

"Building or work" includes construction activity as distinguished from manufacturing, furnishing of materials, or servicing and maintenance work, except for the delivery of mineral aggregate such as sand, gravel, bituminous asphaltic concrete or stone which is incorporated into the work under contract with the City by depositing the material directly in final place from transporting vehicle.

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"Erection, construction, remodeling, repairing" means all types of work done on a particular building or work at the site thereof in the construction or development of the project, including without limitation, erecting, construction, remodeling, repairing, altering, painting, and decorating, the transporting of materials and supplies to or from the building or work done by the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof, and the manufacturing or furnishing of materials, articles, supplies or equipment on the site of the building or work, by persons employed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or Agent thereof.

"Employees working on the project" means laborers, workers, and mechanics employed directly upon the site of work.

"Laborers, Workers, and Mechanics" include preapprentices, helpers, trainees, learners and properly registered and indentured apprentices but exclude clerical, supervisory, and other personnel not performing manual labor.

Establishment of Wage Rates. The Department of Public Works shall periodically obtain a current schedule of prevailing wage rates from DWD. The schedule shall be used to establish the City of Madison Prevailing Wage Rate Schedule for Public Works Construction (prevailing wage rate). The Department of Public Works may include known increases to the prevailing wage rate which can be documented and are to occur on a future specific date. The prevailing wage rate shall be included in public works contracts subsequently negotiated or solicited by the City. Except for known increases contained within the schedule, the prevailing wage rate shall not change during the contract. The approved wage rate is attached hereto.

Workforce Profile. The Contractor shall, at the time of signature of the contract, notify the City Engineer in writing of the names and classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Agents proposed for the work. In the alternative, the Contractor shall submit in writing the classifications of all the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractors and Agents and the total number of hours estimated in each classification for the work. This workforce profile(s) shall be reviewed by the City Engineer who may, within ten (10) days, object to the workforce profile(s) as not being reflective of that which would be required for the work. The Contractor may request that the workforce profile, or a portion of the workforce profile, be submitted after the signature of the contract but at least ten (10) days prior to the work commencing. Any costs or time loss resulting from modifications to the workforce profile as a result of the City Engineer's objections shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Payrolls and Records. The Contractor shall keep weekly payroll records setting forth the name, address, telephone number, classification, wage rate and fringe benefit package of all the employees who work on the contract, including the employees of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents. Such weekly payroll records must include the required information for all City contracts and all other contracts on which the employee worked during the week in which the employee worked on the contract. The Contractor shall also keep records of the individual time each employee worked on the project and for each day of the project. Such records shall also set forth the total number of hours of overtime credited to each such employee for each day and week and the amount of overtime pay received in that week. The records shall set forth the full weekly wages earned by each employee and the actual hourly wage paid to the employee.

The Contractor shall submit the weekly payroll records, including the records of the Contractor's subcontractors and agents, to the City Engineer for every week that work is being done on the contract. The submittal shall be within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the end of the Contractor's weekly pay period.

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Employees shall receive the full amounts accrued at the time of the payment, computed at rates not less than those stated in the prevailing wage rate and each employee's rate shall be determined by the work that is done within the trade or occupation classification which should be properly assigned to the employee.

An employee's classification shall not be changed to a classification of a lesser rate during the contract. If, during the term of the contract, an employee works in a higher pay classification than the one which was previously properly assigned to the employee, then that employee shall be considered to be in the higher pay classification for the balance of the contract, receive the appropriate higher rate of pay, and she/he shall not receive a lesser rate during the balance of the contract. For purposes of clarification, it is noted that there is a distinct difference between working in a different classification with higher pay and doing work within a classification that has varying rates of pay which are determined by the type of work that is done within the classification. For example, the classification "Operating Engineer" provides for different rates of pay for various classes of work and the Employer shall compensate an employee classified as an "Operating Engineer" based on the highest class of work that is done in one day. Therefore, an "Operating Engineer's" rate may vary on a day to day basis depending on the type of work that is done, but it will never be less than the base rate of an "Operating Engineer". Also, as a matter of clarification, it is recognized that an employee may work in a higher paying classification merely by chance and without prior intention, calculation or design. If such is the case and the performance of the work is truly incidental and the occurrence is infrequent, inconsequential and does not serve to undermine the single classification principle herein, then it may not be required that the employee be considered to be in the higher pay classification and receive the higher rate of pay for the duration of the contract. However, the Contractor is not precluded or prevented from paying the higher rate for the limited time that an employee performs work that is outside of the employee's proper classification.

Questions regarding an employee's classification, rate of pay or rate of pay within a classification, shall be resolved by reference to the established practice that predominates in the industry and on which the trade or occupation rate/classification is based. Rate of pay and classification disputes shall be resolved by relying upon practices established by collective bargaining agreements and guidelines used in such determination by appropriate recognized trade unions operating within the City of Madison.

The Contractor, its Subcontractors and Agents shall submit to interrogation regarding compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Mulcting of the employees by the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents on Public Works contracts, such as by kickbacks or other devices, is prohibited. The normal rate of wage of the employees of the Contractor, Subcontractor, and Agents shall not be reduced or otherwise diminished as a result of payment of the prevailing wage rate on a public works contract.

Hourly contributions. Hourly contributions shall be determined in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD. 290.01(10), Wis. Admin. Code.

Apprentices and Subjourneypersons. Apprentices and subjourneypersons performing work on the project shall be compensated in accordance with the prevailing wage rate and with DWD 290.02, and 290.025, respectively, Wis. Admin. Code.

Straight Time Wages. The Contractor may pay straight time wages as determined by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.04, Wis. Admin. Code.

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Overtime Wages. The Contractor shall pay overtime wages as required by the prevailing wage rate and DWD 290.05, Wis. Admin. Code.

Posting of Wage Rates and Hours. A clearly legible copy of the prevailing wage rate, together with the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(10)(a) and (11)(a), Wis. Stats., shall be kept posted in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place at the project site by the Contractor and such notice shall remain posted during the full time any laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on the contract.

Evidence of Compliance by Contractor. Upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall file with the Department of Public Works an affidavit stating:

- a. That the Contractor has complied fully with the provisions and requirements of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., and Chapter DWD 290, Wis. Admin. Code; the Contractor has received evidence of compliance from each of the agents and subcontractors; and the names and addresses of all of the subcontractors and agents who worked on the contract.
- b. That full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records will be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Evidence of Compliance by Agent and Subcontractor. Each agent and subcontractor shall file with the Contractor, upon completion of their portion of the work on the contract an affidavit stating that all the provisions of Sec. 66.0903(3), Wis. Stats., have been fully complied with and that full and accurate records have been kept, which clearly indicate the name and trade or occupation of every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor in connection with work on the project. The records shall show the number of hours worked by each employee and the actual wages paid therefor; where these records shall be kept and the name, address and telephone number of the person who shall be responsible for keeping them. The records shall be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following the completion of the project of public works and shall not be removed without prior notification to the municipality.

Failure to Comply with the Prevailing Wage Rate. If the Contractor fails to comply with the prevailing wage rate, she/he shall be in default on the contract.

5. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

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If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Director of Affirmative Action.

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Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or five thousand dollars (\$5,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract.

(3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.
- 2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.
- 3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages. 5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

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BUILDING OR HEAVY CONSTRUCTION

Includes sheltered enclosures with walk-in access for the purpose of housing persons, employees, machinery, equipment or supplies and non-sheltered work such as canals, dams, dikes, reservoirs, storage tanks, etc. A sheltered enclosure need not be "habitable" in order to be considered a building. The installation of machinery and/or equipment, both above and below grade level, does not change a project's character as a building. On-site grading, utility work and landscaping are included within this definition. Residential buildings of four (4) stories or less, agricultural buildings, parking lots and driveways are NOT included within this definition.
