STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS

The City of Madison's Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2020 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website, www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be gualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid. In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)I. of the General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms.

The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

SECTION 102.4 PROPOSAL

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid must be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided thereof on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor or submitted electronically through Bid Express (<u>www.bidexpress.com</u>). Proposals will be accepted at the location, the time and the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the time and date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

SECTION 102.5: BID DEPOSIT (PROPOSAL GUARANTY)

All bids, sealed or electronic, must be accompanied with a Bid Bond (City of Madison form) equal to at least 5% of the bid or a Certificate of Annual/Biennial Bid Bond or certified check, payable to the City Treasurer. Bid deposit of the successful bidders shall be returned within forty-eight (48) hours following execution of the contract and bond as required.

MINOR DISCREPENCIES

Bidder is responsible for submitting all forms necessary for the City to determine compliance with State and City bidding requirements. Nothwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, the City may exercise its discretion to allow bidders to correct or supplement submissions after bid opening, if the minor discrepancy, bid irregularity or omission is insignificant and not one related to price, quality, quantity, time of completion or performance of the contract.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

TRAFFIC MEDIAN REVEGETATION AND MAINTENANCE CONTRACT NO. 8930

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.11 BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$63,500 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$311,500 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this contract shall take place in select traffic medians and traffic calming devices throughout the city of Madison, as identified in Attachment A- Maps. Project areas range in size from 44 square feet to 14,000 square feet. This contract consists of two separate projects as follows:

<u>Project 1</u>: Maintaining a prairie mix previously seeded/installed by others in fall of 2019 in the medians as noted in Attachment A as directed by the Project Manager.

<u>Project 2</u>: Removing existing turf, seeding with one of two seed mixes provided by City Engineering, establishing, and maintaining the newly installed seeds by the Contractor in spring 2020 in the medians as noted in Attachment A as directed by the Project Manager.

For both projects, all work shall be in accordance with the plans and specifications of this contract and the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. The Contractor shall have adequate experience and knowledge in the planting and care of grasses, groundcover and prairie plants native to Wisconsin. This work shall include furnishing all necessary **mowing equipment (with a mowing deck that can be raised 6 inches), tools, and materials** in order to perform all necessary work in accordance with the specifications and contract. **Please note that brush cutters are not considered a suitable substitute for mowers.** Maintenance shall include timely mowing, manual weeding, trash/ debris removal in order to establish the new and existing native groundcover as appropriate for each plant species as directed by the Project Manager.

NOTE: Clear lines of sight for vehicles, pedestrians, and bicyclists must be maintained at all times, especially by crosswalks and intersections. The Contractor shall trim back plants as needed for visibility or as directed by the Project Manager.

NOTE: Many of these roads are County highways, and although the traffic medians are maintained by City Engineering, the Contractor is required to obtain a "Permit to Work in County Trunk Highway Right-of-Way" which can be found at this link: <u>https://highway.countyofdane.com/permits</u>. The fees will be waived.

Work for this contract shall begin when the start letter is issued to the Contractor (approximately August 17, 2020) and end on October 15, 2021.

The Contractor shall view the sites prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions and access to work sites. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with existing underground and overhead utilities and to resolve conflicts if a construction project arises. The Contractor shall follow Digger's Hotline regulations prior to all digging and planting.

Maintenance of existing/remaining turf grass in medians is <u>not</u> part of this contract and the Contractor does <u>not</u> need to mow, but shall be cooperative if City staff is mowing at the same time of the Contractor's scheduled maintenance. SECTION 104.10 CLEANING UP

The Contractor shall be responsible for daily cleanup of work area every day, per the standard specifications. The Contractor shall use caution and be required to immediately clean the spillage of any earth or other materials onto street right-of-way.

The Contractor shall also be responsible for cleaning any tracking on pavement or repairing any rutting in turf areas caused by the Contractor during the execution of landscaping work performed under this contract.

SECTION 104.4 INCREASED OR DECREASED QUANTITIES

The quantities for this contract have been estimated for the purpose of bidding. Efforts were made to get an accurate estimate of all bid item quantities, however, there is a possibility that some quantities will be increased or decreased. The Project Manager reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantities of any items of work. No revisions in the unit price bid shall be made in the event these items are increased or decreased.

SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

Traffic Control for all activities is incidental to the corresponding bid item. **Traffic Control will not be paid separately.**

All traffic control shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable, complete Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases and any required sidewalk or bike route closures, to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, at 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd, Suite 109, Madison, WI 53703, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the preconstruction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The Contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor.

The Contractor will be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The Contractor shall install and maintain modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

Local and emergency vehicle access to all properties shall be maintained at all times. Contractor shall maintain commercial driveways at all times. The Contractor shall maintain sidewalk on all sides of a street, as well as all crosswalks and ramps at all times.

Lane closures shall be limited to 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on weekdays or any time on weekends, with the exception of home UW Football Saturdays. The weekday peak-hour work restriction may be lifted during any governmental "Stay at Home" order due to COVID-19, if the Contractor obtains approval from City Traffic Engineering. Left turn lanes shall remain open at all times to maintain turning movements. However, if two left turn lanes are present, one of the turn lanes may be closed. Cross street traffic shall be maintained at all times.

All lane closures shall be completed using appropriate signing per the M.U.T.C.D including an electronic arrow board. No construction equipment or materials shall be stored in the roadway or street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours. Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is outside the project limits as shown on the approved plan.

SECTION 109.14 MOBILIZATION

Mobilization for all activities is incidental to the corresponding bid item. Mobilization will not be paid separately.

Article 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it desirable to begin work before or after the above mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer, and the agreed upon date must be determined prior to the preconstruction meeting.

The Contractor is made aware that the start work date listed above may be delayed, due to concerns and problems addressing the effects of COVID-19. This change is at the discretion of the Engineer.

The Contractor shall limit workdays to 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. within the roadway, greenway or pond unless approved by the Engineer in writing.

BID ITEMS

BID ITEMS 90001.1 - 90001.3 : PROJECT 1- MAINTAIN PREVIOUSLY SEEDED MEDIANS 2020

DESCRIPTION

This Bid Item shall include all necessary equipment, labor and incidentals required to mow, weed and maintain each of the three (3) traffic median planting beds included in this description two (2) times. These medians were seeded in 2019 with a mix of fescues and forbs. The plant species list can be provided by the Project Manager. The two (2) planting bed maintenance occurrences shall take place approximately every 4-6 weeks depending on the weather AND as directed by the Project Manager from late summer 2020 until October 15, 2020.

Mobilization and Traffic Control costs shall be included as part of this Bid Item.

- 90001.1 Williamson St between Blair St and Blount St
- 90001.2 Waban Hill at Chippewa Dr (at Council Crest) -traffic calming circle
- 90001.3 South High Point Rd at McKee Rd

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Maintain Previously Seeded Medians 2020 shall be measured as Each (EA) for all planting beds under this Bid Item being maintained once.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Planting Bed Maintenance shall be measured as described above and shall be paid for at the contract unit price which shall be full compensation for all work, materials, tools, equipment, labor, hauling, storage, and incidentals required to complete the work as set forth in the description. Partial Payment requests shall be reviewed and authorized by the Project Manager.

BID ITEM 90002.1 - 90002.5 : PROJECT 2- REMOVE TURF AND INSTALL NEW SEED MIX 2020

DESCRIPTION

This Bid Item shall include all necessary work, labor and incidentals required to remove existing turf, and install either the low-mow turf, or short-grass prairie seed mix provided and as directed by the Project Manager in each of the twenty (20) medians listed in this description in late fall between October 16 and December 31, 2020.

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SECTION H: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this <u>H</u> day of <u>August</u> in the year Two Thousand and Twenty between <u>QUERCUS LAND STEWARDSHIP SERVICES, LLC</u> hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted <u>JULY 21, 2020</u>, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. **Scope of Work.** The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

- 2. Completion Date/Contract Time. Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. Contract Price. The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>THIRTY-SEVEN THOUSAND THREE</u> <u>HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100</u> (\$37,350.00) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures

and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.

- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. - 2. Refrain from asking an applicant in any manner about their arrest or conviction record until after conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 3. Refrain from conducting a formal or informal background check or making any other inquiry using any privately or publicly available means of obtaining the arrest or conviction record of an applicant until after a conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 4. Make information about this ordinance available to applicants and existing employees, and post notices in prominent locations at the workplace with information about the ordinance and complaint procedure using language provided by the City.
- 5. Comply with all other provisions of Sec. 39.08, MGO.
- **c. Exemptions:** This section shall not apply when:
 - 1. Hiring for a position where certain convictions or violations are a bar to employment in that position under applicable law, or
 - 2. Hiring a position for which information about criminal or arrest record, or a background check is required by law to be performed at a time or in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this ordinance, including a licensed trade or profession where the licensing authority explicitly authorizes or requires the inquiry in question.
