STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS

The City of Madison's Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2021 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website, www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be prequalified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)I. of the General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms.

The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

SECTION 102.4 PROPOSAL

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid must be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided thereof on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor or submitted electronically through Bid Express (www.bidexpress.com). Proposals will be accepted at the location, the time and the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the time and date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

SECTION 102.5: BID DEPOSIT (PROPOSAL GUARANTY)

All bids, sealed or electronic, must be accompanied with a Bid Bond (City of Madison form) equal to at least 5% of the bid or a Certificate of Annual/Biennial Bid Bond or certified check, payable to the City Treasurer. Bid deposit of the successful bidders shall be returned within forty-eight (48) hours following execution of the contract and bond as required.

MINOR DISCREPENCIES

Bidder is responsible for submitting all forms necessary for the City to determine compliance with State and City bidding requirements. Nothwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, the City

may exercise its discretion to allow bidders to correct or supplement submissions after bid opening, if the minor discrepancy, bid irregularity or omission is insignificant and not one related to price, quality, quantity, time of completion or performance of the contract.

2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.
- 2.4.1.2 Using the City of Madison's directory of certified SBEs to identify SBEs from which to solicit bids.
- 2.4.1.3 Assuring that SBEs are solicited whenever they are potential sources.
- 2.4.1.4 Referring prospective SBEs to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division for certification.
- 2.4.1.5 Dividing total project requirements into smaller tasks and/or quantities, where economically feasible, to permit maximum feasible SBE participation.
- 2.4.1.6 Establishing delivery schedules, where requirements permit, which will encourage participation by SBEs.
- 2.4.1.7 Providing SBEs with specific information regarding the work to be performed.
- 2.4.1.8 Contacting SBEs in advance of the deadline to allow such businesses sufficient time to prepare a bid.
- 2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. 5% above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.
- 2.4.1.10 Contacting SBEs which submit a bid, to inquire about the details of the bid and confirm that the scope of the work was interpreted as intended.
- 2.4.1.11 Completion of Cover Page (page C-6), Summary Sheet (page C-7) and SBE Contact Reports (pages C-8 and C9) if applicable.

2.4.2 Reporting SBE Utilization and Good Faith Efforts

The Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report is to be submitted by the bidder with the bid: This report is due by the specified bid closing time and date. Bids submitted without a completed SBE Compliance Report as outlined below may be deemed non-responsible and the bidder ineligible for award of this contract. Nothwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, the City may exercise its discretion to allow bidders to correct or supplement submissions after bid opening, if the minor discrepancy, bid irregularity or omission is insignificant and not one related to price, quality, quantity, time of completion, performance of the contract, or percentage of SBE utilization.

- 2.4.2.1 If the Bidder <u>meets or exceeds</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.1.1 **Cover Page,** Page C-6; and
 - 2.4.2.1.2 **Summary Sheet,** C-7.
- 2.4.2.2 If the bidder <u>does not meet</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.2.1 **Cover Page**, Page C-6;
 - 2.4.2.2.2 **Summary Sheet,** C-7; and
 - 2.4.2.2.3 **SBE Contact Report,** C-8 and C-9. (A <u>separate</u> Contact Report must be completed for <u>each applicable</u> SBE which is not utilized.)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is found non-responsible for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may appeal that decision to the Small Business Enterprises Appeals Committee. All appeals shall be made in writing, and shall be delivered to and received by the City Engineer no later than 4:30 PM on the third business day following the bidder's receipt of the written notification of ineligibility by the Affirmative Action Division Manager. Postmark not acceptable. The notice of appeal shall state the basis for the appeal of the decision of the Affirmative Action Division Manager. The Appeal shall take place in accordance with Madison General Ordinance 33.54.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

PARK PAVING 2021 CONTRACT NO. 9039

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.11: BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$65,000 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$318,000 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

SECTION 104: SCOPE OF WORK

This project consists of site grading and asphalt paving operations related to construction and resurfacing of basketball courts and park paths.

The sites at Country Grove Park, Orlando Bell Park, and Odana School Park are asphalt paving only. City crews shall perform all grading, site preparation, base course installation, and restoration.

The Contractor shall view the sites prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. The Contractor shall work with the existing utilities to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 104.4: INCREASED OR DECREASED QUANTITIES

It is agreed and understood that the quantities of any items of work shown on the plans or in the proposal are subject to increase or decrease during the progress of the work. The Engineer reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantities of any items of work, including increase or decrease of quantities by alteration of plans, as may be considered necessary or desirable during the progress of the work to satisfactorily complete the project. Such increases or decreases in quantities shall not be considered as a waiver of any conditions of the contract nor invalidate any of the provisions thereof. All terms of Section 104.5 Increase Items and Section 104.6 Decreased and Deleted Items of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction are applicable to this project.

All items shall be paid as plan quantity as listed in the proposal without measurement thereof. Unless there is a substantial change, no payment shall be given for changes in plan quantities listed in proposal. "Substantial" shall mean changes over 30% of the estimated plan quantity.

Items listed as "Undistributed" on the proposal page shall only be paid if determined necessary by the engineer and shall be measured in the field by the engineer.

The basketball court replacement at Tenney Park is currently under review as a historical landmark. The City may eliminate or delay all work at this site from the contract if it is not approved. No additional compensation or cost adjustments shall be made if this work is eliminated.

The path at Wingra Park is currently under review as a potential burial site. The City may modify, eliminate, or delay all work at this site from the contract if it is not approved. No additional compensation or cost adjustments shall be made if this work is eliminated.

SECTION 105.1: <u>AUTHORITY OF THE ENGINEER</u>

The Engineer shall resolve all questions which arise as to the quality and acceptability of materials furnished, work performed, manner of performance, rate of progress of the work, interpretation of the plans and Specifications, acceptable fulfillment of the contract, compensation, and disputes and mutual rights between Contractors under the Specifications. The Engineer shall determine the amount and quantity of work performed and materials furnished.

All decisions of the Engineer shall, when so requested, be rendered in writing. They shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

Any change proposed by a Contractor in SBE subcontractors, vendors or suppliers from those SBEs indicated on the SBE Compliance Report must be approved by the Engineer and the City's Manager of the Affirmative Action Division (hereafter, AAD). When requested, such decision shall be rendered in writing. Such decisions shall be final and conclusive in all matters unless within ten (10) days after such decision the Contractor or the affected SBE applies in writing to the Board of Public Works for a review of such decision.

IN THE EVENT THE ENGINEER AND THE AAD DISAGREE OVER THE PROPER DECISION TO BE MADE REGARDING AN SBE, THE MAYOR SHALL APPOINT A THIRD PERSON TO RESOLVE THE DISAGREEMENT, WITHIN 30 DAYS OF APPOINTMENT. THE DECISION THUS RENDERED MAY BE REVIEWED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS UPON REQUEST OF THE CONTRACTOR OR THE AFFECTED SBE AS SET FORTH IN SECTIONS 105.1 AND 105.2 OF THE CITY'S STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS.

SECTION 105.9: SURVEYS, POINTS, AND INSTRUCTION

The City of Madison shall be responsible for setting all other lines and/or grades required to complete the work for 2021 Park Paving. Any questions regarding the layout and staking of this project should be directed to City of Madison Parks Surveyor Dan Rodman at (608) 658-3087. The Contractor shall notify Dan Rodman no less than 24 hours prior to any layout or staking at each site.

SECTION 105.12: <u>COOPERATION BY CONTRACTOR</u>

Several utilities exist on these sites. The Contractor shall perform a One Call through Digger's Hotline for each site at least three days prior to beginning construction.

The Contractor shall secure materials at the end of each work day to deter any potential vandalism and theft.

The Contractor shall attend a pre-construction meeting prior to the start of construction. This meeting shall be conducted via Zoom software and shall be a virtual or online meeting.

The Contractor warrants that its services are performed, within the limits prescribed by the City, with the usual thoroughness and competence of the consulting profession; in accordance with the standard for professional services at the time those services are rendered. The Contractor shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work performed under this Agreement, and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections resulting from their negligent acts, errors or omissions without additional compensation. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damages incurred as a result of their errors, omissions, or negligent acts and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy construction.

The Contractor shall take care when accessing the site not to damage existing asphalt paths or the existing utilities, concrete curb, sidewalk or asphalt pavement. Any damage shall be repaired by the Contractor per the Standard Specifications at no additional cost to the city.

All pavement surfaces shall maintain a minimum grade of 0.5% unless approved in writing by the Engineer. Final asphalt surface grades shall be within 0.5% of specified grades shown on the plans and it shall be the contractor's responsibility to ensure final asphalt grades are accurate and within the acceptable margin of error.

Under no circumstances shall water pond on finished asphalt surfaces. If final asphalt grades are not within the acceptable margin of error, or are found to pond water, the contractor shall remove and replace the asphalt at no additional cost to the City. If repair or replacement in required in a path all repairs shall be a minimum of 50' in length and shall include the entire width of the path.

For basketball court construction, the contractor shall place string lines on the finished base course surface per page D-1 of the plans. Contractor shall contact City of Madison Parks Surveyor Dan Rodman at 658-3087 when base course surface is finished and schedule an inspection. The Contractor shall contact Dan Rodman at least 48 hours prior to proof subgrade elevations prior to paving. Asphalt may not be placed until base course surface has been inspected and approved.

Contractor shall test roll all areas to be paved. Test rolling for undercut determination is required at all sites and is incidental to this bid item. Test rolling shall be done with a fully loaded tri axle dump truck. Contractor shall contact Engineer at least 48 hours prior to test roll.

The Contractor may choose to use or disturb additional park or turf grass area during the asphalt paving in order to optimize the paver operation. If the Contractor chooses to place additional materials on site, use, or disturb additional area they may do so at no additional cost to the City. Any additional materials placed shall be at the Contractor's expense and shall be removed after paving is completed unless otherwise approved in writing by the Engineer. Any additional disturbed area disturbed for this purpose shall be approved in writing by the Engineer prior to paving.

Country Grove Park, Odana School Dog Park, and Orlando Bell Park:

This contract includes asphalt paving at Country Grove, Odana School and Orlando Bell Parks as identified in the plans. City staff shall be responsible for completion of all items at these sites besides asphalt paving including subgrade preparation, grading, and restoration. It is anticipated that the City's work will be completed by the following dates:

- Country Grove Park: October 7th, 2021
- Odana School Dog Park: August 30th, 2021
- Orlando Bell Park: September 25th, 2021

The Engineer shall notify the Contractor when each site is ready for asphalt paving. The Contractor shall then have 7 calendar days to schedule asphalt paving. Paving shall be complete within 20 days from notification unless approved by the Engineer. The Contractor shall visit and inspect site prior to paving and inform Engineer if any conditions are unsuitable for paving.

Orchard Ridge Park

The Contractor shall be aware that there is existing play equipment on site. This equipment shall be removed by City staff prior to work as part of this contract. New play equipment shall be installed as part of a separate contract. It is anticipated that this work (by others) shall be completed by September 15, 2021. The Contractor shall match the existing grades from the new playground which are designed to match grades shown on the plans.

Wingra Park

The path at Wingra Park is currently under review as a potential burial site. The City may modify, eliminate, or delay all work at this site from the contract if it is not approved as designed. No additional compensation or cost adjustments shall be made if this work is eliminated. The Contractor shall comply

with all recommendations of the final report received by the city including coordination and cooperation with site monitoring performed by an archeologist during construction.

It is anticipated that the City will hire an archaeologist to perform monitoring during construction activities and the Contractor shall keep them informed of progress and cooperate as needed. In the event any archaeological materials or human remains are encountered during the project, the Contractor shall halt all construction activities within the immediate area and the Principal Investigator or the Office of Historic Preservation at the State Historical Society of Wisconsin (WHS) be consulted prior to continuing work.

Contractor shall stage all equipment and materials inside the construction limits unless approved by Construction Engineer in the Construction Scheduling and Traffic Control plan.

SECTION 105.13: ORDER OF COMPLETION

The Contractor shall submit to the City a detailed schedule at or prior to the preconstruction meeting showing the sequence and anticipated dates of construction operations. The Contractor shall complete the projects during the below timeframe.

Wingra Park:

Work at Wingra Park shall begin on or after July 1, 2021 and shall be completed no later than October 15, 2021. The Contractor shall have 30 calendar days to complete work at this site once mobilized.

Orchard Ridge Park:

Work at Orchard Ridge Park shall begin on or after September 16, 2021 or as soon as the work by others on the playground replacement is complete.

SECTION 107.7: MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

The contractor shall only stage equipment within the disturbance limits shown on the plans. All equipment shall be stored and all staging shall be confined to the area inside the construction fencing as shown on the plan or as described under Section 107.7.

If additional traffic control is desired the Contractor shall submit a proposed Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases, to Tom Mohr, tmohr@cityofmadison.com, prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved any additional requested traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed.

All signing and barricading shall conform to Part VI of the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), the State of Wisconsin Standard Facilities Development Manual (including Chapter 16 – Standard Detail Drawings) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures.

The Contractor shall be responsible for installing and maintaining traffic control in accordance with the approved Traffic Control Plan and as directed by the City Traffic Engineer. The traffic control plan may need to be altered as conditions change in the field or as unexpected conditions occur. This may include relocating existing traffic control or providing additional traffic control. The Contractor shall install and maintain any necessary modifications or additions to the traffic control, as directed by the City Traffic Engineer, at no cost to the City.

Badger Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the north side of Burdette Ct bordering Badger Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Baxter Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the south side of Englehart Dr bordering Baxter Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Country Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the east side of East Pass bordering Country Grove Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Marlborough Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on Lilac Ln to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Odana School Dog Park:

The Contractor may use the dog park parking lot as a staging area for construction equipment. Contractor shall notify the engineer 48 hours prior to mobilizing to site.

Orchard Ridge Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the east side of Loruth Terrace bordering Orchard Ridge Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Orlando Bell Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the north side of S Thompson Dr bordering Orlando Bell Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Walnut Grove Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the west side of N Westfield Rd bordering Walnut Grove Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

Tenney Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on the north side of N Thornton Ave bordering Tenney Park to use as a staging area for construction equipment. Access to this site shall be via the bridge at N Thornton Ave only per sheet 8.1 of the plans.

Wingra Park:

The Contractor may remove parking on Arbor Dr to use as a staging area for construction equipment.

The Contractor shall provide and place signs for a marked path detour route as shown on pages TC-1 through TC-3 on the plans. Installation and maintenance off all traffic control measures shall be paid for under BID ITEM 10707- TRAFFIC CONTROL. All traffic control signage shall be placed on site 7 days prior to path closure.

Contractor is responsible for obtaining and installing temporary no parking signs to facilitate traffic control plan or as necessary to complete the work within the contract. The contractor shall contact John Villareal with the City of Madison Parking Utility (608-267-8756) at least 3 working days prior to needing the signs. Contractor shall post signs in accordance with the City of Madison Police Department Guidelines for temporary no parking restrictions for construction or special events. The guidelines can be found at the link listed below. This shall be considered incidental to the traffic control lump sum bid item.

The Contractor shall not remove traffic signs. For removal or replacement of traffic and parking signs, contact the City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., a minimum of 2 working days in advance of when any existing signs need to be removed. This service is provided free of charge. If the Contractor removes the signs, the Contractor will be billed for the reinstallation of, and any damage to, the signing equipment. The Contractor shall notify The City of Madison Traffic Engineering Field Operations, 1120 Sayle Street, 266-4767 upon completion of final landscaping to have permanent signs reinstalled. The Contractor shall expect a minimum of seven working days to have permanent signs reinstalled. The Contractor shall leave in place all necessary traffic control until given notice by the Engineer that permanent signing is in place and temporary traffic control may be removed.

SECTION 107.13: TREE PROTECTION SPECIFICATIONS

The Contractor is advised to review Article 107.13 of the Standard Specifications for tree protection. Note that Articles 107.13(a) Underground Utility Excavation & Installation, 107.13(b) Curb Excavation and Installation, and 107.13(c) Sidewalk Excavation and Installation are not applicable to this project except as noted below.

The intent of these designs is to minimize the damage to those trees that remain following construction. Contractor shall not grade, excavate, store materials or equipment or otherwise disturb areas within five (5) feet of any tree to remain in accordance with Article 107.2 of the Standard Specifications. Contractor shall take care at all times to conduct operations in a way that avoids damage to any trees not designated for removal. All above precautions are considered incidental to other items of the work.

It is recognized that grading operations and root cutting of some trees will need to occur in order to complete the work, and care must be taken in these areas. For trees where construction operations, including grading, trenching, stone placement, filling, etc. occur within 5 feet of the trunk, or where a tree marked No Root Cut "(NRC)" on the plan, construction operations shall be done under the supervision of a City of Madison Forestry Representative. The sequence to construct in these areas shall be as follows:

- 1. Trees within 5' of construction operations shall not be disturbed until inspected by a City of Madison Forestry Representative.
- 2. The Contractor shall place a yellow ribbon around the tree to highlight these trees for the equipment operator.
- 3. The ribbon shall remain until the area is fine graded and seeded or sodded. Roots shall be cut cleanly by using a saw, ax, lopping shears, chain saw, stump grinder, or other means which will produce a clean cut. Exposed roots shall be covered as soon as excavation and installation are complete. All roots over one (1) inch in diameter that are damaged shall be cleanly cut immediately back of the damaged section on the same day of the excavation. The Contractor shall not rip or pull roots out towards the trunk of a tree while excavating with a backhoe. The use of a backhoe to cut roots is NOT acceptable.

All provisions of Articles 107.13(d), 107.13(f) Bark Abrasions and Limb Damage, 107.13(g) Soil Compaction, 107.13(h) Contractor/Foreperson Acknowledgement, and 107.13(i) Cost Recovery and Liquidated Damages are applicable to this contract.

Protection of these trees is shown on the plans as No Root Cut (NRC) and shall be paid under Bid Item 10803 – ROOT CUTTING.

The normal work hours for Forestry staff: 7:00 AM - 3:00 PM, Mon-Fri. The Contractor shall provide a minimum 24 hours' notice to Forestry staff for inspection.

A City of Madison Erosion Control permit has been obtained and weekly inspections will be completed by The Contractor weekly and at all times following storm events, and this work will be paid for under the appropriate bid item. See **SECTION 210.1(a)**. The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permits by properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures and items shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Construction Engineer or his designees. A copy of the permit is available at the City of Madison, Engineering Division office.

Copies of these permits will be provided to Contractor prior to start of construction. The Contractor must keep a copy of each individual permit on site at all times throughout construction.

The City's obtaining these permits is not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction.

SECTION 109.2: PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on this project on or before **July 26, 2021**, or as soon as the contract has been fully executed. If it is desirable to begin work before the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the Engineer (contact the Engineer at cstelljes@cityofmadison.com or 266-6518.) The date of completion shall be **June 1, 2022**.

Work cannot start on this contract until after the "Start to Work" letter has been received. Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on the mailed notice to do so that was sent to the Contractor. Construction work shall be carried at a rate so as to secure full completion within the contract times outlined in Section 109.7, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement. Definite notice of intention to start work shall be given to the Engineer at least seventy-two (72) hours in advance of beginning work.

The fixed, agreed upon, liquidated damages for failure to complete all work within the contract, unless otherwise specified in this section, shall be calculated in accordance with Article 109 of the Standard Specifications. The Contractor shall limit workdays from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday - Friday, unless approved by the Engineer in writing.

ARTICLE 109.5: METHODS AND EQUIPMENT

Tenney Park:

Vehicular access to the island shall be limited to the Thornton Avenue bridge. The Thornton Avenue bridge is 10' wide and can only accommodate 20,000 lbs loadings for a truck with a single rear axle at a very low speed. Any damage to the existing bridge due to use outside of approved methods and equipment plan, shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to repair as deemed satisfactory by the Engineer. The Contractor shall be required to submit a Methods and Equipment Plan for approval by the Engineer prior by to construction.

The Methods and Equipment Plan shall identify the make and model of construction vehicles used, their weight, the full load weight with materials, and the planned haul routes for construction. The Contractor shall not be allowed to stage unplanted plants on site overnight, over weekends and/or holidays.

BID ITEM 10911 - MOBILIZATION

DESCRIPTION

Work under this item shall include all costs associated with mobilization of the Contractor to each park location. Parking of equipment, storage of materials, and staging shall be allowed within the construction fencing shown on plans. The Contractor may only enter the construction site through the construction entrance as shown on the plans. The Contractor may not drive or store equipment on any portion of the park outside the construction limits unless indicated otherwise on plans or directed in the field.

BID ITEM 20101 – EXCAVATION CUT

DESCRIPTION

Excavation Cut shall consist of the loosening, loading, hauling and disposal of all materials. Excavation cut shall be in accordance with Article 201 of the Standard Specifications.

The excavation quantities for this contract have been calculated by subtracting digital terrain models of the existing and proposed surfaces and sub surfaces. Cut (in place quantities) and fill have been estimated from these models. The following items have been used to calculate Excavation Cut:

- Removal of existing topsoil (6 inches)
- Excavation to subgrade under proposed base course area
- Net change in subgrade elevation by subtraction of digital terrain models
- Existing asphalt and base course removal

No shrinkage factor has been applied to fill quantities to estimate net volume. Three-dimensional AutoCAD Civil 3d (.dwg) files containing the digital terrain models used for the earthwork calculations are available upon request.

The proposal quantity for excavation cut and fill was computed by Three-dimensional AutoCAD Civil 3d (.dwg) surface data volume computations and the assumptions listed above. Adjustments were made for topsoil assuming excavation of six (6) inches of existing topsoil, placement of six (6) inches of proposed topsoil, placement of aggregate base per typical sections, and placement of three (3) inches of asphalt.

Excess excavated material deemed unusable shall be disposed of off-site at a suitable location determined by the Contractor at no additional cost to the City of Madison.

Suitable materials (to be determined by the Engineer) may be reused as fill within the project limits. Placement of these fill materials shall be considered incidental to this bid item and shall not be compensated separately. All double handling and subsoil placement is included in this bid item.

Any additional undercut required due to field conditions shall be paid for under BID ITEM 40321 – UNDERCUT.

Test rolling for undercut determination is required at all sites and is incidental to this bid item. Test rolling shall be done with a fully loaded tri axle dump truck. Contractor shall notify construction engineer at least 24 hours prior to test rolling.

Contractor to note all excavated areas shall be filled at the end of each work day. No excavated areas shall be "open" during non-work hours.

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of ______(\$_____) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. **Affirmative Action.** In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered. The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures

and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.

- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

- 5. Substance Abuse Prevention Program Required. Prior to commencing work on the Contract, the Contractor, and any Subcontractor, shall have in place a written program for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees as required under Wis. Stat. Sec. 103.503.
- 6. **Contractor Hiring Practices.**

Ban the Box - Arrest and Criminal Background Checks. (Sec. 39.08, MGO)

This provision applies to all prime contractors on contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2016, and all subcontractors who are required to meet prequalification requirements under MGO 33.07(7)(I), MGO as of the first time they seek or renew pre-qualification status on or after January 1, 2016. The City will monitor compliance of subcontractors through the pre-qualification process.

a. Definitions. For purposes of this section, "Arrest and Conviction Record" includes, but is not limited to, information indicating that a person has been questioned, apprehended, taken into custody or detention, held for investigation, arrested, charged with, indicted or tried for any felony, misdemeanor or other offense pursuant to any law enforcement or military authority.

"Conviction record" includes, but is not limited to, information indicating that a person has been convicted of a felony, misdemeanor or other offense, placed on probation, fined, imprisoned or paroled pursuant to any law enforcement or military authority.

"Background Check" means the process of checking an applicant's arrest and conviction record, through any means.

- **b. Requirements.** For the duration of this Contract, the Contractor shall:
 - 1. Remove from all job application forms any questions, check boxes, or other inquiries regarding an applicant's arrest and conviction record, as defined herein.

- 2. Refrain from asking an applicant in any manner about their arrest or conviction record until after conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 3. Refrain from conducting a formal or informal background check or making any other inquiry using any privately or publicly available means of obtaining the arrest or conviction record of an applicant until after a conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 4. Make information about this ordinance available to applicants and existing employees, and post notices in prominent locations at the workplace with information about the ordinance and complaint procedure using language provided by the City.
- 5. Comply with all other provisions of Sec. 39.08, MGO.
- **c. Exemptions:** This section shall not apply when:
 - 1. Hiring for a position where certain convictions or violations are a bar to employment in that position under applicable law, or
 - 2. Hiring a position for which information about criminal or arrest record, or a background check is required by law to be performed at a time or in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this ordinance, including a licensed trade or profession where the licensing authority explicitly authorizes or requires the inquiry in question.

To be exempt, Contractor has the burden of demonstrating that there is an applicable law or regulation that requires the hiring practice in question, if so, the contractor is exempt from all of the requirements of this ordinance for the position(s) in question.
