They want to make it clear to the public what the EOC has the power to change and what their limitations are. The Executive Committee is dedicated to looking at the current policies and ordinances that have created these environments and trying to find ways to change it. The EOC is working with the City Attorney's Office, Building Inspection, and Tenant Resource Center to learn more and find the gaps that can be filled with ordinance changes.
- 6. 50110 Establishing a moratorium on issuance of new alcohol licenses in downtown Madison.
  - There has not been an update provided yet. Gloria Reyes will be contacted and asked to provide a timeline.

- The EOD is working on becoming a Substantially Equivalent Agency with HUD. They are also looking into adding an ordinance or EOC Rule that provides Injunctive Relief to those filing housing discrimination complaints with the department.
