Quick Guide for Provisional Voters Returning to the Polls with ID before 8 p.m.

Updated 2/2024

- 1. Issue a voter slip number. Record the voter slip number on the poll book.
- 2. Discard provisional ballot and issue a new ballot.

If the voter is in a hurry, they can insert the ballot marked earlier into the tabulator. That ballot is not a secret ballot, though.

The best practice is to issue a new ballot to the voter. First, the voter should partially tear their sealed provisional envelope. They discard that envelope by putting it in the discarded ballot envelope.

- 3. Document on the lilac Provisional Ballot Reporting Form:
 - Method of providing information: in-person
 - Date and time voter returned to the polls
 - Name of poll worker who checked the voter's ID
 - Voter slip number issued to the voter (not the PV #)
- **4. Document** that the voter returned with ID and was issued a regular ballot. This goes on the incident log of the Inspectors' Statement.
- **5.** This voter is no longer provisional. Do not include them in your provisional count (second page of Inspectors' Statement).
