The committee system is one of the most effective ways for residents to influence City policies and activities. Boards, commissions and committees play a significant role in helping City staff, the Common Council and the Mayor make decisions that affect the lives of Madison residents.

The City of Madison values broad participation in these bodies and highly encourages people of color, persons with disabilities and members of other traditionally underrepresented groups to apply.

Committee positions are open to City of Madison residents who are at least 18 years of age and are available to attend meetings, as scheduled.



How do I get more information?

That staff person can provide specific information, such as current committee issues and expectations around membership for the boards, commissions and committees of interest to you.
