Households **must live** within the MOM service area, which is West Madison (west of Midvale Blvd., north of the Beltline), Middleton, and Cross Plains or live in/have a child enrolled in the Middleton-Cross Plains Area School District to be eligible for services. For information, referral, housing application assistance, tenant/landlord mediation, security deposit assistance, eviction prevention. There is also a food pantry and clothing available.
