Re: Public Information Meeting - Proposed Reconstruction of East Johnson Street in 2014

The City of Madison is proposing to reconstruct East Johnson Street from North Butler Street to North Baldwin Street in 2014. The City will host a public informational meeting regarding the project on:

This meeting is the next in a series of meetings that the City has hosted regarding the reconstruction of E. Johnson Street. The meeting is being held in order to update property owners and residents on the design and receive public input regarding the project. A short presentation will be given by City Staff at 7:00 PM to explain the proposed project and traffic limitations and access during construction. The public is invited to attend and offer comments.

The proposed project will reconstruct this segment of E. Johnson Street to a one-way, two lane urban street similar to the existing street. The existing curb & gutter, pavement and drive aprons will be replaced with the project. On-street bike lanes, enhanced pedestrian crossings, traffic signals and lighting improvements will be added. New sanitary sewer, storm sewer and water main will also be included with the project. Representatives from City Engineering, City Traffic Engineering and the Office of Business Resources will be on hand to answer questions and discuss the project.
