Alcohol License Review Committee: Meeting of August 19, 2026	ALRC recommends to Council to grant with conditions: Condition one shall now read: The establishment shall not sell, dispense, or give away fermented malt beverages in the original container in amounts less than the amount contained in a six-pack of 12-ounce bottles or cans. This is only applicable to fermented malt beverages which fall into the following categories of brands: Domestic Premium, Domestic Sub-Premium (which includes Value and Economy brands), Malt Liquor & similarly situated imported brands that are low-ABV (alcohol by volume) adjunct lagers or pilsners designed to compete directly for the Domestic Premium, Domestic Sub-Premium (which includes value and economy brands) and Malt liquor product market share (e.g. Bud Light, Miller Lite, Corona, Modelo, Heineken, etc.).

Landmarks Commission: Meeting of August 3, 2026, 8/3/2026	Landmarks Commission recommends that the Council deny the 93894 landmark nomination request. During the Landmarks Aug 3rd meeting, Leg 93871, the Landmarks Commission found that the building has historic value related to the vernacular context of Madison's built environment, cultural practices, or as the work/product of an architect of note, but the building itself is not historically, architecturally, or culturally significant. MGO 41.18(4) Land Divisions and Combinations. The commission shall approve a Certificate of Approval for land divisions, combinations, and subdivision plats of landmark sites and properties in historic districts, unless it finds that the proposed lot sizes adversely impact the historic character or significance of a landmark, are incompatible with adjacent lot sizes, or fail to maintain the general lot size pattern of the historic district.

The proposed funding sources are: -\$200,000 from Contingent Reserve (this line was removed from the original document) - \$75,000 from underspending in the DPCED Office of the Director Budget - \$25,000 from underspending in the DPCED EDD Budget
