The HOME Investment Partnerships American Rescue Plan Program (HOME-ARP) provides funding to HOME Participating Jurisdictions (PJs) to reduce homelessness and increase housing stability across the country.

Home-ARP, \$915,700

CDBG, or Community Development Block Grant, is a federal program administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). It provides annual funding to states and local governments for community development

CDBG, \$365,000

HOME Tenant-Based Rental Assistance is another federal program with different types TBRA options, but the most common type provides payments to make up the difference

TBRA, \$300,000

The Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) is a federal program designed to assist
