# FAQ Answers



### How does Public Health handle dog bites?

- Report all animal bites to Public Health
- Discuss risk for rabies and vaccination status
- Call the Animal Services dispatch number at (608) 255-2345 or report animal bites <u>online</u>

OF MADISC

- Advice in the case of a dog or cat bite:
  - Check to see if the bite broke skin
  - Call vet to find out vaccination status
  - Exchange information
  - Monitor for signs and symptoms of rabies

### Are backyard chickens allowed in Madison?

- Backyard chickens are allowed in Madison
- Protect yourself from Salmonella
  - Don't put hands that have been in contact with chickens near mouth

- Supervise children under 5 closely
- Wash hands after handling chickens
- Don't let chickens in your home
- Prevent rat infestations

# What kind of testing happens to ensure beaches are safe for swimming?

OF MADIS

- Beach monitoring from Memorial Day to Labor Day
- Testing for *E.coli* bacteria and blue-green algae
- Publish results on website, email, signs.
- Conditions change quickly
- Request water testing for a water event
  - Call (608) 266-4821 to schedule

# How often are restaurants inspected? How does that process work?

- We inspect restaurants and other retail food establishments
- Routine inspections happen once a year
  - Food handling
  - Food temperature and storage
  - Overall hygiene
- Re-inspections happen in the case of health code violations

- Pregnancy support
  - Nurse-Family Partnership Program
  - Prenatal Care Coordination Program
  - WIC Program
- Lactation, breastfeeding, and chestfeeding support
  - Lactation Support Line: (608) 243-0449
  - Help getting a free breast pump, if eligible: (608) 267-1111

I am working with a family in my district who is struggling, what low to no cost healthcare resources are available through Public Health?

- Free immunizations
  - Flu, Tdap, HPV, Hepatitis A/B, Meningitis, MMR, Pneumococcal, Varicella
  - We provide free immunizations to adults who do not have insurance that pays for immunizations or who qualify because of risk factors or age.

- Free or low cost testing for HIV and STIs
- Breast and cervical cancer screening
