


# Existing Plan Evaluation

    - Consistent with current policies




#### Land Use

  - Mixed-Use north of East Washington
  - Low-Medium Residential (missing middle) within neighborhoods
  - Commercial and Employment at CTH CV and Hwy 51

- Neighborhood street network connections
  - Nakoosa Trail, Vernon Road, Colubmus Lane
- Removing frontage roads and excess right of way to allow better development
- Neighborhood traffic management and intersection improvements






  - Improve important on-street routes






# Neighborhood & Housing


- Incentivize affordable housing development on properties close to transit
