What is a Neighborhood Development Plan?

- Created for largely undeveloped areas
- Guide future development
- Guide public infrastructure and services
 - Land use, transportation, utilities, phasing
- Must be adopted before development can occur
- Does not force anyone to develop

Background

- Approximately 425 acres
- Mid-Town Rd boundary on the north and Woods Rd on east
- Ice Age Trail is planned to run through this area
- Madison Metropolitan School District & Verona Area School District



Ice Age National Scenic Trail

- Authorized in 1980 as a National Scenic Trail by Congress
- The 1,100-mile trail follows the farthest southern extent of the most recent glacial advance
- One of eight National Scenic Trails within the US
