

What is Redistricting?

Redistricting in the City of Madison is the process of redrawing the City's wards and alder district based on population changes that have occurred over the last decade.

Through redistricting, the population within each alder district is equalized so residents across the City have equal representation on the Common Council.



Why is **Redistricting** important?

Redistricting determines which communities, neighborhoods, or groups of people are assembled into aldermanic districts, wards, and polling places.

The City has formed a Redistricting Committee to lead the redistricting process.
