Street Meets Videos are done. 2024 All Hands Meeting Planning is underway. I'm currently working on editing all videos for the All Hands Meeting next week, with script and other finishing touches, so I'm online, but head down work video editing. Waterways 2024 is officially to print. Thank you Johanna Johnson and the review team to help get that done. Still waiting on approval of our Flooding Communications Plan from Deputies.

Public Works and Private Development

Public works engineers are continuing to work on 2024 projects. Private development Engineers and Managers continue to service contracts and issue plan sets. Plans issued this month include West Town Path Phase 2A, 133 W Wilson St, American Center Plat 5th addition. Franklin St was approved at the Board of Public Works. The Mayor proposed the 2025 city executive capital budget, which includes our new streets and paths for 2025 construction. Surveying has already begun on those projects and engineers are starting to work on the new projects. A public information meeting for both MacArthur/Sycamore & John Nolen Drive are planned for next month.

Vactor crews are working on getting/staying on track with their cleaning schedule. CCTV crews are keeping busy televising sanitary/storm line for new construction and CMOM projects. Also investigating new drone technology for

CCTV'ing of large diameter pipes and storm boxes. Greenway crews keep catching up on mowing and downed trees. Construction crews continue with sanitary repairs, Waterways, never ending sinkholes and special requests. Mite crews continue their learning experience and applying it everyday. All of this while still being understaffed, which we are still interviewing for MW1/OP1 positions.

Stormwater

Janet Schmidt, Principal Engineer, Section Manager

The dry spell is over! Some places had over 4inches of rain during a large storm in mid-September causing localized flooding. Though the rain was welcome coming from lack of precip of the last 2 months, we certainly didn't need it all at once and during the night. Maddie and Emily's crews will be working on a planting workshop this fall for all the plants they started from seed. Thanks to them, OFS and the volunteers for helping with this effort. The Pheasant Branch Greenway Enhancement project and the Prairie Hills Ponds Dredging are getting ready to bid soon, with construction taking place over winter/spring. Our 4th and final Public Informational Meeting for the Spring Harbor Watershed Study went well and we will be wrapping up the final approvals of the report. Another study finalized! Great work from the modeling team to get that one finished up. And kudos to Alaina Baker on all her hard work and her first PIM presentation for a very contentious project! The Nine Springs watershed study kicked off the first PIM on 9/23 and our other studies are chugging along nicely. Other big projects next year include kicking off the West Town Pond design, Nakoma/Manitou box repairs and the Cap City Trail storm sewer repairs, not to mention wrapping up the Stormwater Vegetation Management Plan. Our 2025 street project schedules are coming out shortly so design season is just around the corner. Should be another busy year.

Sanitary Sewer

Mark Moder, Principal Engineer, Section Manager

The 2024 City street projects that include sewer replacement are now under construction or are now completed. The remainder 2024 stand-alone sanitary sewer pipe projects will be under construction soon. We have one more lining contract for a few backyard problem sewer mains with delaminating liners that will be bid yet in 2024. The 2025 street projects are now being assigned or are now under design. Private development projects for 2025: We have some key apartment complex planned occupancy dates to hit in May of 2025 that we need new sewers in place for-3401 E. Washington Ave. (Gardners Bakery redevelopment) and 838 Williamson St. The sewer reroute on E. Washington Ave. for the Gardners Bakery Redevelopment site will start construction this October. The Commercial Ave. (Hwy 30) sewer crossing project which is also associated with the Gardners Bakery site redevelopment has been bid and awarded. 838 Williamson Street (Paterson St Sewer Replacement) will begin construction in October. Fordem Ave.- First St. Sewer Replacement for 1617 Sherman Ave., will not be bid in 2024 due to Railroad Permitting which we have now started. The Lake St. sanitary sewer for the Lake Street Garage Redevelopment is now complete. Lift Stations Projects: Truax Lift Station Replacement construction is ongoing with completion set yet in 2024. The Badger Lift Station Replacement is not yet designed but construction is still planned for 2025.

Land Information/Official Map

This would include things such as billable workorders, utility compensable work done by Public Works contracts and change orders that are the responsibility of other parties. We need to get these billed out as soon as possible in order to make sure they get paid before the end of the year. It is also a good time of year to look into any consultant contracts to ensure that all work has been billed to the City and that any contracts where the work is complete are formally closed out, as well as making sure that contracts do not expire before all work is complete. If there is a contract that is about to expire but is not complete yet, please make sure to get an amendment executed before the contract term date. Once a contract expires, it can no longer be extended.
