# 1	Question Is there still a bike/pedestrian tunnel under John Nolen planned, or hast that been scrapped?	Answer We evaluated the feasibility of an overpass/underpass structure. That report can be found on our website. At this time we do not have the construction of a structure programmed. The current design does not preclude it being built in the future.
2	Any concerns that narrowing the width of the lanes would affect buses and larger vehicles?	The city has lane widths of 10' on other major arterial streets. Those include: E Washington Ave, E Johnson St, University Ave, and Atwood Ave. All have larger vehicles and have been successful in this regard.
3	Will the new lighting meet Dark Sky standards? The City of Duluth successfully reduced illumination of a major thoroughfare. See https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HxVXDTVCS1o	Yes, the lighting will meet Dark Sky standards. The color temperature is 3000K.

5	During the construction, what is the anticipated traffic increase through the bay creek neighborhood, especially during rush hour? Has there been any thought in placing temporary traffic lights along Olin or Lakeside, or other mechanisms to ensure there isn't significant congestion?	We do not expect a significant increase on Lakeside Street due to congestion. Drivers who reach Lakeside Street will have already cleared the most congested area. For Olin AveOlin already takes the maximum amount of traffic during the morning commute. However, there will likely be a slight increase due to adjusted signal timing. This past summer, we installed a new pedestrian flasher (RRFB) at Lake Ct in preparation of this project and will continually monitor this traffic during construction.
6	How will events take place with one lane of traffic in either direction, especially those that take place at Monona Terrace, to include Ironman WI.	Ironman bicyclists currently use a travel lane, and will do the same during construction. This means northbound traffic will be closed to general traffic for Ironman 2026. This segment of John Nolen Dr is expected to be completely open for Ironman 2027.
7	Proposed upgrades for Capital City Trail will clearly benefit pedestrians and all trail users, especially at intersections. However, will improvements (or enforcement?) address conflicts and reduced safety for trail users from the increasing use of Madison area trails - including the pathway along John Nolan Drive - by large electric motorcycles which do not require riders to pedal and move at high speeds, which are different from ebikes which only assist cyclists.
