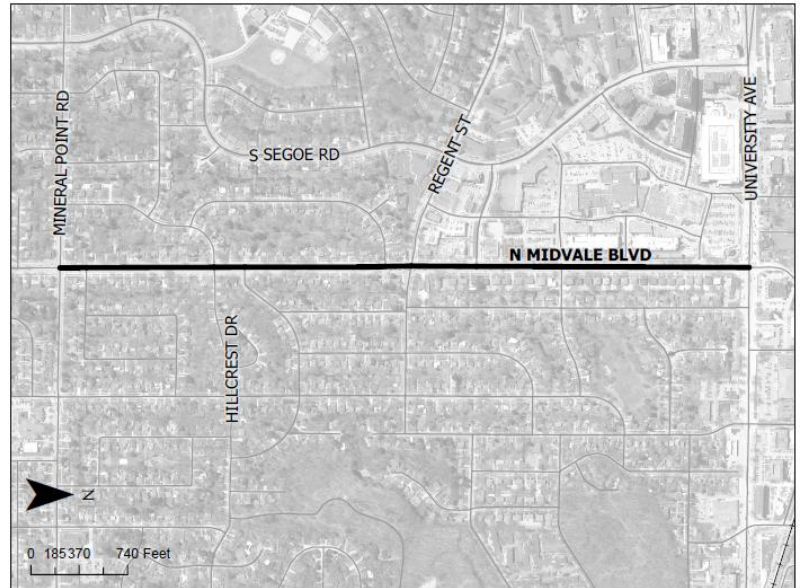
Construction Schedule & Impacts

Project Scope: The project includes asphalt pavement patching, pavement markings, tubular bollard curb extensions, and rectangular rapid flashing beacon installations.

Construction Schedule: Work is scheduled to begin during the week of June 8, 2026, and the project will be substantially completed by August 2026.

Traffic Impacts: A minimum of one travel lane will be maintained in each direction on Midvale Boulevard.

Local access will be provided, but driveway access may not be possible at times when work is being performed in front of individual properties. No parking is allowed within the construction zone during working hours (7AM to 7PM), so when driveways are inaccessible, residents will need to park on the adjacent streets outside the limits of construction. The contractor will notify impacted residents prior to driveway access being closed for an extended period, but there will likely be several short-duration closures during asphalt patching that may not have much advance notice. During these shorter disruptions, the Contractor will work with residents to provide access as quickly as possible.



Construction Sequencing: The Contractor will begin with the asphalt pavement patching. This will be followed by installation of the pavement markings, tubular bollard curb extensions, and rectangular rapid flashing beacons.

Water Shut-offs: There are no planned water shut-offs. While unlikely, emergency shut offs are possible if the existing main is damaged during construction. Affected properties are notified as soon as possible.

Refuse Collection: It will be the contractor's responsibility to allow for refuse collection to continue during construction. Please mark your address on your cart to make sure it is returned if moved. We ask that you place your carts out the evening prior to or at the very latest 6:00 a.m. the morning of your scheduled refuse/recycling day. The contractor will maintain access for private garbage collection service for adjacent businesses.

Additional Project Details – Proposed Work

Trees: Terrace trees along Midvale Boulevard may be pruned prior to construction to provide required clearance for construction equipment. There are no planned tree removals with the project. If, during construction, it is determined that any trees must be removed, adjacent property owners will be notified, prior to removal of the tree.
