Context



Wingra Park Entrance Workshop Feedback Split/widen path at entrance

- Make public art or signage understated. Relate to the park environment & activities
- Rain or butterfly garden
- Low-profile seating, organic shapes
- Avoid restricting lake view
- Do not impair views of cyclists

Crazylegs Workshop Feedback

• Enhance the plaza as a:

- Meet-up point
- Destination
- Gateway
- Design opportunities:
 - Support 365-day use



- Realign & emphasize bike path
- Improve bike/ped connections & amenities
- Consider educational and/or welcome signage
- Improve site for vending and food carts
- Improve seating & gathering spaces
- Integrate mosaics along bike path and/or seat wall
- Create a traditional urban park environment with more green space

Goals & Process
