This permit is for Pyrotechnics and Flame Effects Before a Proximate Audience (indoor and outdoor events). This permit application can also be used for Fire Performance Art, which includes fire juggling, fire eating, fire dancing and other attended manually controlled fire effects.

General Requirements for Pyrotechnics Special Effects Before a Proximate Audience can be found in MGO 34.5608, IFC chapter 56, NFPA 1123 and NFPA 1126.

General Requirements for Fire Performance Art and Flame Effects Before a Proximate Audience can be found in MGO 34.308, IFC chapter 308 and NFPA 160.

An application for a permit shall be submitted at least **thirty (30) days** in advance of the date set for the performance and shall contain the following:

- ◆ A general summary of the performance, including safety plan information.
- ◆ An indoor floor plan of a venue shall include dimensions of the performance area, distance to audience, seating, equipment layout, rooms, aisles and exits. An outdoor site plan shall also include distances to the audience, buildings, roadways and public pathways, and other special conditions.
- ◆ Written permission from the property owner or their representative, approved Street Use permit, or explanation why neither are necessary.
- ◆ A resume of experience detailing the applicant's experience with pyrotechnics, flame effects or fire art performances. The resume should state (5) previous experiences (refer to NFPA 1126, Annex C).
- ◆ Copies of valid ATF and/or United States DOT licenses allowing the applicant to transport and handle the materials that will be used as part of the event, as applicable.
- ◆ Certificate of Insurance naming the City of Madison as the certificate holder. The certificate must indemnify the City. The minimum amount shall be \$1,000,000.

- ◆ **Public Safety.** The permittee shall be responsible for immediately cancelling or terminating any event in the interests of public safety should such a cancellation or termination be necessary .
- ◆ **Special Conditions.** The Chief may impose special conditions on a permit as deemed appropriate under the circumstances of the planned event.
- ◆ **Compliance with all applicable codes and standards are the responsibility of the permit holder.**
